 - Colin Ross has become the new Mayor
 - Federal government has given money for resealing Holm Park reserve car park which will start this summer
 - The skate park design has been finalised. It will be a great design and will commence soon and finish in the new year
 - O'Neil reserve will have a master plan at Glismann Road Community
 Consultation will happen. The Car park is incorporated into the master plan.
 - Kenilworth Avenue being sealed was moved forward 2 years and will cost 2.5 million from the developer. It will be built in two sections – first section is Brunt Road to the Bridge – later the bridge to railway cross over
 - There is a shared pathway on the railway side of Kenilworth, and the road speed limit will be 60km

PRESIDENT'S REPORT BPA. MEETING

Welcome to all members and visitors to tonight's meeting. Our Guest Speakers tonight are Celeste and Anita, Cardinia Shire Planners to discuss the Beaconsfield Design and Development Overlays. (Amendment C220)

I review Cardinia Shire Council meeting agendas. The only meeting I have attended was the election of the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Appointment of Delegates. Congratulations to Cr Colin Ross on being elected as Mayor and Cr Brett Owen on being elected as Deputy Mayor, as well as Ranges Ward Councillors being elected as Delegates. We look forward to continuing our good working relationship with Councillors and Council staff.

The Summer Edition of the Beaconsfield Banner is underway with the date for submissions of advertising and articles extended to Sunday 19 November. Editor Andrew Brewster will discuss the status of the Summer Edition of the Beaconsfield Banner. I encourage all members to assist in obtaining advertising and articles. In the past month I have visited a number of businesses and organisations as well as emailing approximately 40 previous advertisers aimed mostly to promote the Beaconsfield Banner Advertising.

The Touchscreen Project is well advanced with the unit ready for delivery and installation. There has been a number of meetings in the past month with the Supplier, our IT person, Cardinia Shire Council and Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Centre. Ann Taylor is busy researching and writing a large amount of text necessary for the Interactive Touchscreen Unit. A definite date for delivery, installation and finalisation of the Touchscreen Unit is not possible; however, a number of people are expending significant time and energy in completing the Project.

The Christmas Window Competition has received great response from Beaconsfield Retailers and is a great initiative to build festive spirit in our wonderful town this Christmas. This competition has been led by Tania and Bronwyn and I greatly appreciate their efforts. It has also assisted in promoting BPA with retailers and the Community and will have continuing long term benefits.

We have received a response from Vic Roads via Cr Brett Owen on our requests for improvements to the Old Princes Hwy and O'Neil Road Intersection, Old Princes Hwy Merge into Princes Hwy and also reducing the 80km/h speed limit on a section of Old Princes Highway to 70km/h to have a uniform speed limit of 70km/h for Old Princes Hwy. Unfortunately all these proposals were rejected by Vic Roads mainly due to a Vic Roads Officer's observations when conducting a site inspection during afternoon/evening peak period. I plan to discuss this report with the Vic Roads Engineer and we should continue making representations to improve these roads and intersections.
