



Whilst not much appears to be happening on the commercial development Council is keeping a close eye on this which will prove to be a real focal point if some of the ideas being floated come to fruition.

continued use of the public meetings as a clearinghouse of community concerns and a vehicle of debate and discussion so that developed ideas and issues can be presented in a cohesive manner to the relevant body (not always council). There are many issues affecting the town. Some major like traffic flow and road safety, and some less important (but not unimportant) like the removal of trees, maintenance issues and recreational problems. Traffic issues are currently the subject of a strategy, the features of which are likely to come into effect with each phase of development in the town.

The recent death on Beaconsfield Avenue highlights the need for some form of device to slow traffic down on this piece of road. While we can never take steps to avoid every risk this part of the town appears particularly vulnerable and is in need of some special attention. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the families and friends of those involved.

IMPROVEMENT WORKS AT **BOB BURGESS RESERVE**

The Bob Burgess Reserve in Beaconsfield is being redeveloped through a partnership between Cardinia Shire, the State Government and local community.

The Cardinia Shire has allocated funds in the budget to carry out landscaping and improvement works in the reserve and surrounding creek environment. Additional funding has been secured from the State Government's Community Jobs Program to employ 13 local jobseekers for a period of 13 weeks to carry out the work. This team is due to commence work in the first week of October.

The Bob Burgess Reserve is located on the Cardinia Creek behind the main shopping precinct on the Old Princes Hwy in Beaconsfield. The reserve is mainly open-space and remnant native creekside vegetation. The area has been the site of many community events in the past such as the cup eve bonfire, outdoor movie events and carols by candlelight.

The Bob Burgess Reserve was so named in recognition of the contributions made by the late Bob Burgess to the Beaconsfield and Officer Communities. Bob was associated with the Officer Primary School, the Scouts, Football and Cricket Clubs, St Francis Xavier School and the Beaconsfield Fire Brigade where he was appointed life member status and held the position

of captain unopposed for 20 years.

The redevelopment of this reserve is to be the first step in implementing an integrated open space strategy for Beaconsfield as identified in the recently adopted Beaconsfield Township Strategy. The location of the Bob Burgess Reserve within the town centre and adjacent to the Cardinia Creek makes it an ideal location to:

- Create user friendly links from the reserve to the shopping precinct;
- Develop passive recreational facilities consistent with the Parks Victoria vision for a linear park, and linear pedestrian/ cycling path along Cardinia Creek.

The Community Jobs Program will be initially focusing on the area behind Taco Bills and Beaconsfield Pizza with the possible extension of these works at later stages. Works for this area will include:

- Control and/or eradication of noxious and environment weeds and revegetation of local native species along the creek.
- Bank stabilisation. landscaping and strategic tree planting.
- Upgrading of open space for recreation purposes.
- Construction walking paths linking to strategic Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve.

IMPROVEMENT WORKS AT BOB BURGESS RESERVE (Continued)

Participants in the project will be paid award wages and also receive approximately 110 hours of training through the Central Gippsland Institute of Technical and Further Education, which will contribute to the attainment Certificate Horticulture (Landscape). Funding for this training is also provided through the Community Jobs Program.

The Beaconsfield Fire Brigade as a tribute to their former leader has already undertaken some weed removal and improvement works in the reserve. It is envisaged that council's redevelopment plans will enhance this preliminary work and extend the scope to the overall creek environment. Cardinia Shire would like to thank the brigade for their efforts.

This project is seen as providing multiple community benefits in providing opportunities for training and employment, facilities and infrastructure for the people of Beaconsfield and surrounding areas and rehabilitation of the natural environment. As sense of community ownership over the project will ensure the long-term viability of the facilities created.

A steering committee has been established oversee the project and includes groups such as the Progress Association and the Fire Brigade however comments or ideas from the public are welcome. **Further** information be can obtained from Anthony Hester at Cardinia Shire Council on 5945 4238.

The Lang Lang committee will conduct their ceremony at the Lang Lang Hall between 8.30am and 10.00 am and the Pakenham activities will commence with the Australia Day march to the Pakenham Racecourse where the ceremony will

begin at 12.00 noon. This will be followed by a free sausage sizzle, entertainment and free rides for children.

An important part of the Shire's planning centres around the selection of awards for the Australia Day Citizen of the Year, Young Citizen of the Year and the Community Event of the Year. Nomination for these awards close on Monday November 5th, 2001.



MAKE AND MINGLE

One of our regulars at Make and Mingle is Mrs. Olga Wynn. Olga sews well and makes many of her own clothes. She is noted for her beautiful cross-stitch cards, which she designs herself and works for a special occasion gift. She has tried many crafts and at present is working on glass painting with lovely results.

Olga was born in Saigon in Indo-China (now Vietnam) where she grew up speaking French. In 1932, the family moved to Penang, where she learnt English.

The family moved a few years later to Singapore, where Olga started her first job in a library but then she and her family experienced the horrors of WWII, while living in Singapore and virtually lost everything and had to start again. Olga was looking for a job once more and was offered a position in

typing shorthand at the local prison. She was very unsure about taking a job in such a place as she had seen such misery during the war, but was persuaded to try the job.

She was thankful for the kindness she was shown by one of the prison officers, James Wynn, who later invited her to go out with him and they were married not long after.

They came to Australia in 1959 and lived in Salisbury House in Upper Beaconsfield. They always thanked God for the move, as there was public transport and they met an Australian family, Kath and Rosemary Savage and their two sons. After three years the Wynns built a house on a block nearby.

Olga and Jimmy were blessed with two children Solange and James.

Sadly, Jimmy passed away not long after his 70th Birthday in 1987. This was

a real shock to Olga and she felt she did not want to go on, but she had a wonderful friend in Kath Roberts (previous postmistress in Beaconsfield). Kath knew exactly what she had gone through as she had experienced this herself. She told her about Make and Mingle, but she was not interested, she was hurting so much. Kath persevered and she weakened, Heather Young collected her and was very kind. When she arrived she was met by Carol Ronalds who put her at her ease with her warmth and friendliness and she was introduced to everyone. Olga was a very shy person, when put into a room full of strangers and yet a certain peace came over her and she knew that God had sent her a lifeline she so badly needed. Although only for two hours a week, she so looked forward to going.

Olga wants to tell anyone who is lonely or hurting, to do themselves a favour and come to Make and Mingle.





RIDE THE HOWITT TRAIL

On Saturday and Sunday 3rd and 4th of November there is a Bike Ride being held from Sale to Lakes Entrance and back to Sale again. Overall the distance is some 350 kilometres but all on bitumen without very many challenging hill climbs. It's an annual event held by Gippsland Base Hospital.

This year, locals Ralph Smith and Ted Horton are going to ride the two-day event. It may be ridden in total or, together with a support car, may be ridden in relay. Ralph and Ted are looking for more riders from this area to join them. It is a very sociable event riding this scenic trail and the Saturday is spent together with other riders at a Camping Ground at the Golf Course end of Lakes Entrance. It is not a race and can be ridden at one's own pace.

The route this year takes riders north of the main highway on the Saturday to Briagalong and Lindenow outside Bairnsdale then north of Nicholson and through to Tambo River. Finally riding down the steep hill into Lakes Entrance a hearty evening meal awaits.

Returning the next day, the route takes riders south of the main highway to Paynesville and then further south parallel to the Princes Highway. It will finish before dark on the Sunday. The distance will require riders to ride an average of 22 to 25 km's per hour but as with all these group events, drafting pulls you along at a greater speed with less effort.

Costing only \$36 per team member and \$26 for students, the event is reasonably priced. This covers insurance, evening meal, breakfast and souvenir mug. Bunkhouse accommodation is available at \$4 each or tent sites at \$1 each in Lakes Entrance.

FRIENDS OF THE CARDINIA CREEK SANCTUARY

Spring is an exciting time in the reserve with many of the wild flowers in full display such as the Twining Glycine and the Common Apple Berry. It is also a good time to remove many weed species before they start to set seed. Pittosporum at this time of year has bright lime-green new growth and is easily spotted from a distance through the bush. Other weeds being targeted include For-Get-Me-Not, Winter Cherry, Spanish Heath, Broom plus a range of introduced grasses such as Kikuyu, Couch, Yorkshire Fog, Wild Oat and Panic Veldt...

Parks Victoria has allocated the Friends Group two grants to help with current activities. The first grant is for \$1500.00 to assist in the construction of a boardwalk in Allen St. Reserve over the particularly wet patch near the swimming hole. The second grant is for \$4750.00 to assist in revegetation works in the sanctuary.


Recent storms have caused several large trees and numerous wattles to fall across the tracks so please be careful when walking through the park. In other news, Work for the Dole will begin working late September, supporting the hard work done by corrective services. Also a student from Deakin University will begin recording the spread of Wandering Jew through the reserve.

Despite signs clearly displaying that horse and

trail bike riders are not permitted in the reserve, a small number of people appear persistent to break to rules. Trail bikes are a threat to public safety and cause damage to the track surrounding and environment. Horses also cause soil disturbance. which leads to erosion, but the main problem with horses is the weeds that they spread through droppings and disturbance. Some of the worst areas in the reserve for weed invasion are along the track margins. intention for making this point was not to blame anyone or any particular group but to make these individuals aware of the damage that their actions are causing.

The next working bee will be held on the 28th of October starting at 9.00am, meeting at the car park opposite Holm Park Rd. Morning tea will be provided and everyone is welcome.



the Spring among wildflowers of northern W.A. indeed a special experience. At times Anne and I would just shake our heads at the enormity of the scene.

Just a simple slip and a tumble forward among the wildflowers and Anne's right leg is broken in two places. X-rays, Hospital, wheelchairs

and an early flight home.

When you are a keen cook it is easy to fall into the trap of de-valuing the effort that goes into planning and preparing interesting and varying meals over 34 years (in our case). Four weeks in the chair and another four or so to go and my limited repertoire is indeed stretched and becoming boring. I take my hat of to all those out there who carry out the role of providing for their family on a day to day basis.

Asparagus in coming into season and will be available till around Christmas. We are great fans of asparagus and for this struggling cook it has been a great boon.

Bring the steamer to full steam, drop in the asparagus and three minutes later it can be used in so many ways. On its own with a simple sauce, cut into a warm chicken salad or in a noodle soup; sheer bliss. Our current favourite and simple way is to toss in quality olive oil and a little balsamic vinegar and scatter three crushed cashews per five spears (approx).

Wine. With Spring nearly with us our meals change and we tend to move outside to eat or share a glass of wine. Riesling comes into its own in this situation. The current stand-out bargain is Jacob's Creek Riesling 2001, around \$7. Taylors Clare Valley Riesling 2001, around \$12, has done well at shows. The best top end Riesling has a contender in Petaluma Riesling, 2001, around \$18-20.

Two well priced quality Pinot Noirs are Yering Station 2001 and a new wine made by Rob Dolan of Yarra Ridge fame, under the Sticks label (he is a tall man). Both around \$20.

THE VOICE OF THE BAPTIST CHURCH

That the twenty first century opens with a devastating attack on America should deeply disturb us but should not surprise us. Jesus Himself said there would always be war and rumours of war (Mat 24:6). The bible is under no allusions as to the depth of depravity within the human heart (James 4:1). Humans are capable of the most terrible atrocities.

But could not a God of love have stopped the carnage of the 11th September? The obvious answer is "yes". So why didn't He? By way of an answerer let me say, I am not perfect, therefore is God supposed to step in and stop me every time I go

to do something wrong? If I start to take my car up above the speed limit should God stop my foot from pressing the accelerator? Well He could, but then we would have a world full, not of perfect people, but of perfect robots. God did not created robots.

That God allows evil does not mean for one second that He is disinterested in it. In fact God has promised that He will judge every act of evil ever committed (Rom 2:6, Rom 14:12, 2Cor 5:10, Rev 20:12&13). That God does not judge all evil in this life should never ever be seen as a sign that God does not judge.

Should we then forgive those who have perpetrated such evil? Yes and no. 'Yes' in the sense that we must not hold bitterness in our hearts. Jesus tells us to love our enemies (Mat 5:44). We are to be those that feed our enemies if they are hungry (Rom 12:20). But 'no' in the sense that God has given authority to the state to restrict, restrain and punish evil doers (Rom 13:1-4). So we must be careful as individuals not to become full of anger and set out and attack our enemies, but at the same time the legitimate authorities be they police or army must act to arrest and bring to justice all who have done wrong.

Lastly we need to hear the words that Jesus spoke when some people came to talk to Him about a mass murder (Luke 13:1). Jesus simply pointed out that we are all going to die. So the real issue is not whether one dies at the hands of evil or whether one dies peacefully at home or whether one dies early in life or late in life, the real issue is are you ready to die? Are you ready to face the judgement seat of God?

Jesus came to save us from the judgement. That is why Christians call Him saviour.



HIGHER EDUCATION CONTRIBUTION SCHEME (HECS)



Students undertaking tertiary courses are usually liable to pay fees, which vary with the type and length of the course.

These fees can be paid in a lump sum or alternatively accumulated as a HECS debt and paid as additional PAYG withholding tax from Wage and Salaries when income exceeds a certain level, which is currently \$23,242, p.a. If a taxpayer elects to accumulate the HECS debt, then the debt is increased by CPI changes, which amounted to approx. 5% for the latest year. The amount of the for **HECS** income repayment purposes is calculated as follows:

- person's taxable income ,plus
- add back any net rental loss, plus
- add reportable fringe benefits grossed up.

The HECS thresholds and repayment rates for 2001/2002 are as follows:



Alternatively to paying the HECS debt through the tax system, the student has three options:

- 1.Under to "Pay New" option, the student pays 75% of that semesters' HECS amount by a nominated date (i.e. a discount of 25%)
- 2. Under the "Partial Upfront" option the student receives a 25% discount on any upfront payment of \$500 or more made before the census date.
- 3.Under the "Voluntary Payment Bonus" option the student receives a 15% discount on any payment of \$500 or more against their HECS debt. e.g. reduce HECS debt by \$1,000 if you make a payment of \$850.

As you can see from the above, there are strong financial incentives to pay wholly or partially upfront or make voluntary bonus payments. Alternatively, payment of HECS through the tax system can take 10-15 years to repay a debt of \$15,000 to \$20,000 after allowing for CPI increases.



Recent rains have been more than welcome to our very dry gardens. Unfortunately the winds that came with the rain tend to dry the soil very quickly.

It is now that we need to prepare for the forthcoming dry summer. Mulching is essential for the long dry periods to conserve moisture.

When it rains (hopefully) in summer, water can be caught in containers for use on other sections of the garden. Water from the laundry rinse cycle & the bathroom could also be collected.

Place a bucket under the bathroom, laundry & kitchen taps to catch the water which usually runs down the plugholes while waiting for the hot water to run through.

Weeds take moisture from shallow rooted plants, so remove them & use them as a mulch material. Many plants provide their own mulch with fallen leaves, which compact around their base.

Do not mulch material right up against the trunk of the plants as some materials can cause burning of the bark and kill the plant.

OUR NATURAL WORLD

by Peter Hansen

The Ancient City of Jericho. famous in Biblical history, is the world's oldest known settlement. It is located in the Jordan valley, north of the Dead sea and west of the Jordan river, and is about 244 m { about 800 feet } below sea level, making it the lowest City on earth. Its climate is hot and dry in summer and mild in winter, supporting the growth of such crops as dates, bananas and citrus fruits. The mound that is the remains of that ancient city is now known as Tell es-Sultan, beside a spring known as Elisha's fountain. The location of that spring is thought to be the reason why the first settlers camped there, eventually leading to the eventual establishment of the city, we know as Jericho.

The original walls of Jericho are the result of seismographic activity producing a great rift extending from the Sea of Galilee, to northern Africa. These natural defences made the site an ideal locale for trade, apart from her beauty and good water supply from wells, later extended into very effective irrigation systems. indicating a shift from prehistoric nomadic life, to settled forms of life.

These attributes made her the source of envy and a coveted possession for invaders of ancient Palestine. As a sea of green in an otherwise barren desert landscape, and her importance as the trade route entrance to the western cities, Jericho was of major importance to invaders and traders alike.

The City fell to many invaders over the centuries, including the Persians, Alexander the Great, Herod the Great, various Arab invaders, the Crusaders, who were eventually defeated by the great Muslim leader, Salidan. In 1840 the Egyptian General Ibrahim Pasha razed the City when he withdrew his Army to Egypt.

Points of interest in Jericho include a 6th century Synagogue, Hisham's Palace. and St. George's Monastery. Located nearby are the Mount of Temptation, which according to New Testament tradition, is the place where the Devil tempted Christ, and the caves of Qumran, where the Dead Sea scrolls were discovered in 1947.

Archeologists have, very heavily investigated the famous Biblical epic of the destruction of the walls of Jericho, over the last 2 centuries, and modern methods including carbon dating, have found no hard evidence of such events. The attack by Joshua and the children of Israel, was, according to conventional dating, supposed to have taken place at the end of the Early Bronze Age, ending about 2100 BC Thus the evidence was 700 years to early for it to have been destroyed by Joshua, and in fact although there was a late Bronze Age city in the 14th Century, nothing survives to illustrate the Biblical account.

Regardless of the controversy surrounding these far off events, the history of this fabled City is forever etched in the hearts and minds of all who enjoy the thought of magical and mighty deeds of an age of wonders.





This was exactly as it was when we first moved here. Di was such a friendly teacher and she did a marvellous job as principal.



We sure need more rain but the grass has not heard of the shortage because my grass grows an inch a day and I can hardly fit in my work with the mowing.

Last week I rebuilt 2 timber decks which after nineteen years were considered below par. The merbau had lasted well but the material it was nailed to was rotting. This could have been avoided if the builder had used treated pine or cypress instead of OB or hardwood. The owner also complained that it felt springy. I did need some extra support and when we built in those extra joists if felt nice and solid. Probably the extra timber and the choice of treated pine made the job a \$100 dearer but had it been done like that originally, it would

have lasted twice as long – saving \$1500.

I would discourage anyone who would use varnished timber on the exterior of a house. These days acrylic paints can last six to eight years in our temperate climate but varnished don't last half that time and if not maintained correctly become water stained and very unsightly. Buy the best quality paint, apply it well and sit back secure that it will protect your house for years.


