



They were also rewarded with Modern, New Vogue and Latin section trophies – a fantastic effort, considering the championship attracted some 550 competitors from Australia wide.


Andrew's parents, Glenda and Bruno, owners of



# MAKE AND **MINGLE**

#### The Glory Lily: (Gloriosa Rothschildiana)

The Glory lily is a native of tropical Africa, but is easily grown here in warm sheltered positions. This lily needs full sun and rich well drained soil. Water freely in summer and liquid feed every 2 weeks. It is a frost tender plant.

The strong slender stems put forth tendril climbers, so needs support as it grows. When fed well this growth is prolific and needs a trellis or wire support for its tendrils to cling to. Slender stems produce scattered. broadly lance-shaped dark green leaves. In summer, upper leaf axils carry large, yellow and red flowers, each with six sharply reflexed, wavy edged petals, changing to dark orange or deep red. The yellow stamens protrude prominently.

The buds hang down as an upside down closed umbrella, but as it grows and opens up the petals curl backwards and the yellow stamens protrude in a bright yellow colour. The flowers can grow to a width of 12cm.in diameter. These are spectacular flowers and last for quite a time on the plant.

This lily grows from a tuber & when the plant has died completely down the tubers are then lifted and stored in a cool dry place. I wrap mine in newspaper & keep in a box in the garage until they begin to become white or purplish on the ends of the tuber & then plant them in a good rich soil. The tubers, when planted, are reasonably straight, but when they have grown, flowered and died down they will have become a horse shoe shape. These tubers when lifted are to be broken in half before storing for the winter.

## WINE & FOOD

Beaconsfield has taken another step away from being a semi quiet, even folksy rural town. Aldi have been joined by a host of new shops and businesses. Eight of them are associated with food of some description. Together with our Post Office and Chemist leaving their old sites the whole dynamics of our town will change and will take some time adjusting to; the bend in Wood St may even become less of a hazard.

At the time of writing I was not able to speak to all of the eight new food operators so the following is a limited overview.

Shop 2 is **Flakey Jakes** operated by Jim Findikakis. Jim has been in the 'fish and chip' business for 15 years at Frankston and offers fresh fish cooked while you wait, hamburgers and souvlaki.

Shop3 is Asian Feast, Sushi and Noodle Bar and Chinese Takeaway.

Shop 4 is a **Subway** outlet.

Shop 5 is OH Yes! Charcoal Chicken, Plus operated by Michael Christophorou offering charcoal chicken, pork and lamb chops, souvlaki, kebabs, fish and hokkien noodles, plus to takeaway.

Shop 6 is Café Rendezvous operated by Effie Atkins and Dr Tony Atkins. Effie is well known as the original operator of Berwick Chicken followed by Delphini Café in 1998 and has been in the industry some 25 years. Breakfast, lunch, coffee and cake served in a quiet, invitingly comfortable atmosphere is their aim. I can recommend the coffee.

Shop 7 is **Dwyer Fresh Seafood** operated by Gary and Lois Dwyer. Gary has operated the fresh fish van at Officer Weigh Station siding for the past 17 years. Gary proudly tells of early customers who are now friends and of now serving their children. Gary is a qualified Chef.

Shop 8 is Beaconsfield Fresh Fruit and Veg operated by brothers Joe and Frank Trifodi who have 10 years experience at the Markets. Joe and Frank will deliver wholesale to local Restaurants and Hotels. They will offer a competitive price for produce delivered fresh from the Markets.

Shop 10 is **The Healthology Shop** providing a range of healthfoods, etc.

While visiting the Officer Organics, Fruit & Vegie Cafe/Juice Bar, operated

by Kristina Morgan within the Wood St, Gym complex I noticed that the old Butchers Shop is carrying a sign 'Bulls Raw Sushi & Steak Bar" — more next issue.

Twenty three food related sites now exist in Beaconsfield; shopping or eating in/from every site could take years for the average family. While it may be exciting to see all of this new activity we should not forget all our old faithfuls who have worked hard to serve us for many years — they deserve our continued support.



Wine The holiday period has been a quiet time for seeing new wines. So lets revisit some 2003 favourites. Vintage Cellars Robe Chardonnay around \$14 is a very classy wine and of a quality way above its asking price. I have enjoyed every mouthful. McWilliams Hanwood Chardonnay, 2002, \$8-10 is an excellent house white as is Chrismont King Valley Riesling, 2003, \$14. Chrismont is also my favourite vineyard for 2003. Yalumba Barossa Shiraz. 2001, \$14, just slips down. My favourite available is Gembrook Hills Pinot Noir. 2001, \$28 at the cellardoor. One of the best wines ever seen but unavailable until April, 2004 is the Yering Station Reserve Shiraz, around \$55 and worth every

dollar and will be in short

supply.

#### PIPELINE TO BEACONSFIELD RESERVOIR



Photo taken c.1950. Photo E.Whiteside Collection. This photo shows a section being laid as it went through Whiteside's orchard at Officer.

The original pipe-line carrying water from the Beaconsfield reservoir to the Mornington Peninsula and naval base was laid down between the years 1914 - 1921. Most seaside towns on the peninsula were reticulated by then and parts of Berwick, lower level, had been connected by 1924. The concrete pipes were made by the Hume brothers of Officer (the firm

later moved to Beaconsfield). Almost 1300 pipes were required to cover 2 miles.

The line was replaced, with larger pipes, after some 30 years of use, and it was installed alongside the old pipeline.

# MEETING THE NEEDS OF POPULATION GROWTH by Tammy Labato, MP, Member for Gembrook

With projections for the population of Beaconsfield to grow at an annual rate of 20% until at least 2006, with a subsequent growth rate of 9.5% after that, this area presents a challenge in terms of meeting the needs of a burgeoning population and ensuring they have the services and facilities necessary.

One way that the State Government is meeting this challenge was through its establishment of the Beaconsfield Ambulance Service in 2001. From July 2001 until January 2003, the crews at Beaconsfield and Upper Beaconsfield responded to 483 cases. The volume of cases in the Shire of Cardinia has increased by more than 45% since 1999.

Another impact of local growth on the community is

at the local primary school. Beaconsfield Primary School is experiencing a huge increase in student numbers to meet the needs of new residents. The school was advised in December 2003 that they are able to move to the Master Planning Stage. This allows the school to appoint an architectural firm to complete a school master plan. The additional facilities and classrooms that are planned for the school will ensure that high quality education will continue to be delivered in the local area.

With my background in Community Development, I am also very conscious of the need to create communities, not estates. Simple things like walking, instead of driving the car, creates an opportunity to get

to know your neighbours. When residents belong to local organisations such as the Beaconsfield Progress Association, the CFA or any one of the sports, service or activities clubs in the area, they are helping create a community just by being involved. When they shop locally and visit the playground or reserve they do the same.

When the Minister for Victorian Communities, John Thwaites MP, and I drove through the Beaconsfield estates last December, we talked about how communities can be more workable and functional. The construction of Beaconsfield Community Complex provides the area with an opportunity to reach out to new residents and involve them so that the


#### TAX AUDITS AND PENALTIES

With the introduction of selfassessment some years ago, the Australian Tax Office (ATO) is better able to use its resources to audit more tax returns than previously. The most common forms of audit are: Data matching of information from Banks, Public Companies, Other Financial Institutions and Centrelink to amounts disclosed in Income tax returns eg. Interest, Dividends

- Substantiation of Expenses for employees claiming in excess of \$300 for work related expenses. This may require the completion ٥f Questionnaire with detailed information of expenses claimed. Questionnaires are also extensively used for property rental returns. Taxpayers are normally made aware of these audits prior to their income tax returns being prepared.
- 3. Desk Audits similar to 2. above except that the audit is carried out at the Australian Taxation Office and supporting documentation usually must be provided.
- 4. Business Audits may cover specific areas or industries e.g. Cash economy in the building and construction industry, fringe benefits tax, tax schemes, losses from non-commercial activities or merely a review of accounting or tax records.

Australian Taxation Office authorized staff have access to all books and documents of taxpayers including computer records necessary to carry out an audit. The extent of the audit to be conducted is normally notified in advance by ATO authorized staff to the taxpayer as well as their tax-agent and appointments are made at a mutually convenient time at the taxpayer's business premises or residence.

If there is income tax payable as a result of an audit or review then penalties are usually payable on the tax shortfall. In addition a general interest charge is applied to all debts calculated on a daily basis. The general interest currently is approximately 13.5%p.a. Penalties are normally 25%, 50% or75% of the tax shortfall. The penalties payable depend on various factors including amount of tax shortfall, whether the taxpayer has taken reasonable care or has a reasonably arguable position, is reckless or alternatively if there is intentional disregard for income tax laws or blatant tax avoidance. In addition, the extent of co-operation with the ATO and voluntary disclosures made before or during an audit may reduce penalties.

There are various administrative penalties and non-lodgment penalties which in some cases can result in prosecution of taxpayers.

It is important to lodge all returns by due dates. In the event of understating income or over claiming deductions voluntary disclosures to ATO should be made as

soon as you become aware thereof. If you are audited by the ATO you should assist and not hinder the ATO otherwise penalties will be more severe. You should seek the advice of an accountant who has experience in these circumstances.

# Beaconsfield Reservoir, Early Days - 2003

In the early years of World War 1 it became apparent an adequate water supply for Flinders Naval Base was a necessity. The State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, the responsible authority, chose Toomuc Creek as the water source, and Haunted Gully as the site for the storage reservoir. In 1916 a weir was built on the Toomuc and the water brought by open channel to the reservoir.

Haunted Gully was quite famous, having first came to public attention in 1869 when Prince Albert, Duke of Edinburgh, Queen Victoria's second son, whilst staying at Bowman's Inn, was taken by Geordie Craik and a group of men on

a very successful kangaroo hunt in Haunted Gully.

Soon after, in 1872, gold was discovered in the gully by H.J.Valentine, the Haunted Gully diggings becoming a recognised goldfield. An early history states that as many as 200 men were working on the diggings at one stage. Mining records show that quite a lot of alluvial gold was recovered.

The establishment of this goldfield enabled the Victorian Government in 1876 and 1877 to use the provisions of Section 49, the "goldfield" section of the 1869 Land Act to survey, subdivide, and offer for selection all the previously

unselected land on the southern slopes of the Beaconsfield Range. At least 190 blocks of 20 acres or less were made available for selection - the Parish map looked like a spider's web.

A license to occupy these 20 acres properties, cost £1 - after improvements were made the selector could purchase his land for £1 per acre. Not surprisingly within 12 months all were taken up.

#### Beaconsfield Reservoir, Early Days - 2003

In 1877 all of Haunted Gully was in 20 acre lots except for an area at the southern end of the gully which the surveyors designated "Water Conservation," a wetlands region of some 30 plus acres, resulting from a small creek which ran down the gully.

This was the area that the Commission selected for the reservoir, at the same time acquiring seventeen of the 20 acre blocks surrounding the reservoir site as a buffer. The reservoir was formed by the sides of the gully, and blocked at the southern end by a large brick based earth levy bank, which was built during 1917. (photoonpage 19)

Once the land was cleared, large horse drawn scoops widened and deepened the gully, using the earth obtained to build the levy These scoop operators were very skilled and had to be very careful, if the scoop dug too deeply or struck a root, they could be thrown over the scoop resulting in serious injury. The finished reservoir had an area of 13 ha, and a capacity of 200 million gallons.

Within a short time the demands on the reservoir were more than Toomuc Creek could supply. In 1925-1926 the Commission introduced the natural flow of the Upper Bunyip River by an aqueduct, providing 1,700 million gallons per annum to the reservoir. The Toomuc Creek source was then discontinued.

After the second World War a weir was made on the Tarago River near Jindivik, and a 16 mile aqueduct built to convey 2,600 million gallons per annum into the existing Bunyip-Beaconsfield Race which was enlarged to cope with this extra supply. A second stage of this project, a storage reservoir on the Tarago, provided an additional 7,500 million gallons annually.

The reservoir now supplied the Hallam Valley, Berwick, Cranbourne and other smaller inland towns, the Port Phillip Bay towns from Frankston to Portsea, the Westernport Bay area (Hastings, Bittern, Flinders Naval Base) and the high level area of Dandenong and Springvale. A tunnel was built through Mt. Misery, at first an open cut, but after several collapses, concrete pipes were pushed through and well packed with rock, allowing some of the water to flow to the Lysterfield Reservoir.

The catchment area of the Tarago River contains 86 sq km of State Forest, and 28 sg km of privately owned farmland. The water derived from the State forest area is of good quality, but the runoff from the farmland contains soil, fertiliser, and organic matter, which goes into the eastern branch of the Tarago. This water is poorer in both quality and colour than the main stream. Alarm was caused in April 1991 when a bluegreen algal bloom occurred on the Tarago.

Melbourne Water was created in September that year, and from that time the Mornington Peninsula has been supplied with water from the Cardinia Reservoir. A pipeline was built from the Tarago Reservoir joining with

the Cardinia Reservoir pipeline, enabling intermediate towns to be supplied from either reservoir if necessary.

In 1997 Melbourne Water decided that the Bunyip Main Race, stretching from the Beaconsfield Reservoir to Cannibal Creek, some 26 km long and 50 metres wide at least, as well as the Beaconsfield Reservoir were surplus to its requirements, offering them to Cardinia Council in July 1998. At one the Council time contemplated subdivision and sale of some of the reservoir land to cover management expenses, but the suggestion of such a sale brought fierce local opposition, and resulted in the formation of a Friends of Beaconsfield Reservoir Committee.

The fact that the site was fenced, and had been maintained in a relatively pristine state for a long time resulting in very little weed intrusion, plus the diversity of wildlife on the land and its stable water supply from its own catchment, made it a very valuable conservation area. The following year the Council proposed the preservation of the reservoir and the main race in public ownership.

The Friends opinion of its conservation value was confirmed in 2003 when Melbourne Water commissioned BIOSIS to undertake a flora and fauna study - the results indicate the site is of State conservation significance and possibly of national interest.

It now appears that as the site is part Crown Land vested in Melbourne water and part freehold Melbourne Land, the land will remain in public ownership.

#### Something to try from Kristina

#### Kids and Adults alike love a stir-Fry

Many kids love noodles and stir-fried vegetables. Cut all vegetables into sticks or bite size pieces before starting cooking. To make stir-frying easier, green vegetables like beans, broccoli, asparagus, celery and other hard vegetables like carrots can be softened by boiling for 3 - 4 minutes then add to stir-fry.

To stir-fry, heat wok well, add little oil then stir in vegetables. Start cooking the hard vegetables first, like carrots and celery, after few minutes add softer vegetables, like broccoli or cauliflower. Keep stirring, then lastly add very soft vegetables like beansprouts and spinach.

If vegetables start to burn add 2 tbsp water down side of the wok. Stir and finish cooking by adding lid and steaming vegetables until cooked. Cook noodles according to directions drain and mix together.

Stir -Fry Flavour - Add chopped garlic, ginger or a spice like cumin, at the beginning of the cooking. Flavoursome sauces like soy sauce, mushroom or oyster sauce can be added at the end as well as herbs like coriander and parsley.

One of these producers is Andrew Powell who supplies my shop with deliously fresh picked salad and other vegles has a property in Bayles since December 2002. Andrew had previously been farming at Pearcedale on the Mornington Peninsula between 1991 and 1999 until the farm was sold. He had attained A Grade Organic Certification with BFA when the farm was sold due to divorce. This property had been untenanted for 2 years and many trees/shrubs overgrown with ivy growing over many tank stands.

Much work has been done to clean up the farm and open up around the house area. Old and dying large Cypress trees at the very rear of the house were removed in March 2003 before they fell on the

house. The teardrop shaped garden and clothes line are where the trees stood.

An organic inspection/audit was carried out in May 2003 and more soil and tissue tests taken. The property received 'Conversion to Organic' certification with NASAA and would expect to be A Grade certified within 3 years.

The first crops were planted in early June 2003 (onions, carrots, snow peas, sugar snap peas, lettuce, coriander, broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, turnips, beetroot and parsley) and commenced some harvesting in September. Crops are direct seeded every fortnight to ensure a continuous supply and


also seeded up into cell trays where required. Until the end of the year there will be limited quantities of some produce due to poor germination, weeds and more weeds. Everything is sown and picked by hand together with the weeding.

Companion planting methods are used to help control bugs and indigenous trees are being planted in windbreaks to attract the birds. The lady birds are multiplying everyday and doing their job whilst the worms are plentiful in the around doing their job too!

Andrew is running the farm single-handed. His brother-in-law (Mark) works one day a week. Andrew's mother (Pauline) and Aunt (Barb) help out every fortnight. But the results are worth it for Taste, Health and Environment and you can purchase it locally at Officer Organics located in the Beaconsfield Gym Complex on Wood Street.

# CARDINIA CATCHMENT LANDCARE

As autumn approaches our Landcare group, together with the other eight groups in Cardinia Shire, are planning their planting days. For these we rely on volunteers and landowners who have previously had assistance as well as family and friends of the property owner. We have found that it is possible to plant 500 plants in a morning quite comfortably which is then follow by lunch. Often we return to a property in the following season complete the task.

These days are very satisfying and enjoyable. We now start to see the results of earlier plantings and how quickly indigenous plants grow and transform previously cleared areas. It is good to hear of the return of small birds and other wildlife.

This season we are planting into five properties located in Upper Beaconsfield. Harkaway and Officer. Our group is active in Casey and Cardinia and receives some funding from both councils as well as from state and federal governments.

As a group we are involved in water quality monitoring along Cardinia Creek. We also intend to do more mammal surveys on private property using hair tubes. This is an effective way to discover which small animals live on your property and the health of habitat. These activities are possible because of the larger Landcare network supported by the Cardinia Environment Coalition. Meetings are held regularly with representatives from each Landcare group and other Friends groups active in the area. It is encouraging working with likeminded people who share a love of the natural bushland and its

creatures and who are prepared to work to protect them – especially as the rampant spread of suburban Melbourne impacts on us all.

You may be interested in attending some of the courses offered Peppermint Ridge Farm in Tynong North - just past Mill Valley Ranch. These include Small Property Management workshops covering small property design, farm animal care. management and bushland and waterways. Diploma of Conservation and Land Management and Farm Bis approved courses are also offered. If you are a Cardinia Shire resident you would probably be eligible for a subsidy. His efforts to apply this doctrine can be seen by all and sundry, and recoiling in horror and disgust the far sighted and moderate thinkers wonder how the desire for wealth and power so distort the perceptions of those to whom we look for a better behaviour in their dealings with our ravaged planet. The great American humorist Will Rogers was once asked by a friend what he should invest his money in. Rogers replied," Land."

When his friend asked him why he suggested land, Rogers said simply," Because they ain't making any more." The analogy here is clear, we have one earth, "and they ain't making another one."

The American Indians were living examples of love of nature and caring for the planet. These are the words Chief Luther Standing Bear, a Lakota Indian.

"The Lakota was a true naturist – a lover of nature. He loved the earth and all the things of the earth, the attachment growing with age. The old people came literally to love the soil and they sat or reclined on the ground with a feeling of being close to a mothering power. It was good for the skin to touch the earth and the old people liked to remove their moccasins

and walk with bare feet on the sacred earth. The tipis were built upon the earth and their altars were made of earth. The birds that flew in the air came to rest upon the earth and it was the final abiding place of all things that lived and grew. The soil was soothing. strengthening, cleansing and healing. The old Lakota was wise. He knew that man's heart away from nature becomes hard: he knew that lack of respect for growing, living things soon led to lack of respect for humans too. So he kept his youth close to its softening influence."

Those words were written two centuries ago. Have we really advanced all that far? The earth really is our mother, and we all only get one mother! May the year be kind to you all.




