Hello everyone. Now that the caretaker period has commenced, this will be my last report until after the November council elections, so I thought I would take the opportunity to list some of the achievements I have been proud of over the last three years.

Firstly, the opportunity to serve as a councillor has been a wonderful experience for me. Two years as the Mayor of the shire has opened my eyes to the diversity of our community and the great people who make up the residents and ratepayers across the 1280 square kms of your fair land. Service to the community

has been my entire professional life and I have enjoyed every minute of that service.

I was delighted to oversee the construction of the **Beaconsfield Community** Complex. This is clearly one of the icons of the shire and I trust will be enjoyed by many people for years to come. The sealing of Kenilworth ave and Station street has been a great asset for motorists and residents in Beaconsfield and with the construction of the Bryn Mawr bridge I look forward to a further reduction of traffic in our township.

I was pleased to advocate for the completion of

concreting the Wood street footpath from the station to the shops and extending the railway station car park. I advocated for 2 years for the construction of the Brunt road traffic lights and now see that project coming to completion. The next phase is to work for footpaths between the Panorama Estate and the BCC, this will create a safe pathway for residents.

It was great to be able to fund new playground equipment next to the O'Neil road oval. This facility is very well used and it is great to see all the families using it during the week and on the weekends. I advocated for






Thank you to Cr Garry Runge, for his ongoing support of the BPA and most importantly. Beaconsfield. His time and



TAKING CHARGE OF YOUR TOWN

Residents of Beaconsfield are showing concern about the growing development around our business district and residential area and the lack of input they feel that they have about the way the permits are issued.

We as residents have got every right to ask questions and object, if appropriate, to any development being proposed for our town.

If you are not sure to whom or where to object you can always visit the BPA Website, contact the Secretary or ring or email your local councillor.

The committee and members of the Beaconsfield Progress Association can't be left responsible to see every permit notice in town. If vou see a permit application in your vicinity, don't just assume someone from the BPA has. It is vital that residents let us know so that we can also look at the proposal.

If you don't like what is being proposed don't leave it to somebody else to object. Chance is that nobody will act and the development will get 'rubber stamped'. It's too late when the permit has been issued.

At the September Progress Meeting, Cr. Runge confirmed these comments and added it was important to take ownership of our town. He outlined the process of issueing a permit. 5 objections need to be received before councillors are made aware of the application.

Beaconsfield residents need to be more active in their objections to permits - Don't leave it to someone else!!





COTTAGE GARDENS

Firstly, I am very pleased to have received such a good response to my strong sentiments on the environmental issues printed in last Banner.

It concerns me greatly that the original vacinity of Beaconsfield is becoming a "box city" where there is no provision made for leisure for the youth of the township to amuse themselves.

But, let us beautify our gardens and think on what we would like to look upon as we look out our windows and when we stand at the front gate and look at our gardens from that angle. Also, the aromas that we would like to have wafting into our windows and doorways.

Low shrubs and bushes, such as camelias, the various coloured chinese lanterns, the perfumed mexican orange blossom, the magestic proteas, azaleas, the tall strong strelitzia can be grown towards the back of the gardens with other smaller colourful plants grown in front.

Magnolias can also be kept trimmed each year so they don't grow too large and out of shape. Truly beautiful trees to have in your garden.

Gardens that are colour coordinated are very attractive gardens. Blue and mauve flowers growing with white ice-berg standard roses can make a very elegant garden.

Cottage gardens can bring a warm and welcoming atmosphere to a home.

The old time favourites such as the tall russell lupins, foxgloves, poppies, lavender with all their different shades of mauve and purple. The purple chinese bell flower (platycodon) can be planted in Autumn or Spring and blends nicely with other perennial flowers. This flower needs to be planted at 40cm. spacings, then do not disturb after growth begins, as they do not like to be disturbed. After flowering, propogation can be made from divisions of the white, fleshy roots, but are best grown by seed, which can be sown outdoors and will germinate in about 2 weeks.

Don't forget the smaller plants such as polyanthus, violets, pansies, the miniature cyclamens that are grown in the garden. These and many other small plants make very colourful and delightful borders in gardens.

Colourful gardens are so pleasant on the eye, and a pleasure to look upon.

Residents in our local community are paying STD rates for calls and cannot access ADSL services.



I am very concerned about this issue as I believe it is essential to provide, equitable access necessary communication tools for residents.



SELF EDUCATION EXPENSES

Expenditure incurred in undertaking a selfeducation course at a tertiary institution may be tax deductible if the course is connected with your current employment. If the successful completion of the course leads to a salary increase and/or promotion it would indicate that the course was tax deductible. The costs incurred in obtaining an initial degree to enable you to obtain employment in that field would normally be deemed to be a non-deductible expense. Work related conferences and seminars are deductible however a deduction is only available for amounts paid personally by taxpayers as most would normally be paid or reimbursed by an employer. Some study tours are deductible to the extent they are work related however diary and documentary evidence must be held to substantiate the work related portion of the total expenditure incurred.

The usual deductible self education expenses includes:

- 1. Course, student union and tuition fees
- 2. Photocopying, printing, stationery and reference books
- 3. Depreciation of Equipment used eg Computers

- 4. Telephone and Internet costs
- 5. Car Expenses in travelling from work to the place of education and return to work. Also deductible are some trips to/from home to place of education. These claims are usually based on distances travelled applying klm rates
- 6. Transport costs including airfares and also accommodation and meals if required to live away from home for the night

Non-deductible selfeducation expenses would include:

- 1. Government charges for HECS or HELP payments
- 2. Car expenses in travelling from a place of education to work
- 3. Child minding or Child Care expenses
- 4. Meals unless staying away from home overnight

Generally the first \$250 of self-education expenditure is not allowable however this amount can be reduced by non-deductible expenses, as follows:

- 1. Capital cost of equipment purchased subject to depreciation claims eg Computer
- 2. Travel Expenses that are not deductible
- 3. Child Minding and Child Care expenses

LUCKY LILY

This article is written with the permission of Lily's owners.

"Lily is a 6 month old female Maltese x Shihtzu puppy. She was found one morning weak and wobbly by her owners and presented to Beaconsfield Vet Centre for examination.

Her gums were pale. She was able to walk slowly around the consulting room without appearing wobbly but was definitely much quieter than usual.

A blood test confirmed Lily had a blood clotting problem and she was admitted to hospital for further treatment. Further blood tests revealed that she was anaemic and after a good hunt around Lily's backyard her owners found an empty pack of rat poison that had been placed under the house months before Lily was even a member of the family.

Rat poisons contain anticoagulants, which are absorbed from the gut and act by depleting body stores of vitamin K. Vitamin K is necessary to activate some of the blood clotting factors in the body. Without the necessary blood clotting factors, persistent bleeding can occur from the nose, gums, bowel and any wounds, although external bleeding is not always present. Pale mucous membranes, depression. lethargy, weakness, lack of appetite and anaemia are frequent signs.

Lily was treated with Vitamin K by injection to replace lost body stores and hospitalised to provide cage confinement. She was placed onto intravenous fluids to maintain adequate blood pressure and blood supply to vital organs.

The next day Lily had laboured breathing and muffled heart sounds and it was suspected she was bleeding into her chest cavity. An X-ray confirmed this. Another blood test revealed she had become more anaemic and she needed a blood transfusion to replace the blood she was losing.

Lily responded quickly to a blood transfusion but remained in hospital for another 2 days for treatment. A blood test on the last day confirmed her blood clotting time had improved markedly. She was discharged from hospital with a supply of vitamin K tablets and needed to be kept strictly confined for at least 7 days to avoid further haemorrhage.

Lily is currently going very well at home.

All claims for employment related self-education costs subject substantiation requirements hence accurate record-keeping and retention documentation supporting payments is important. Care must be taken to ensure these claims are correct as they are separately shown in a personal income tax return (item d4). You should discuss with vour Accountant your individual history of employment and qualifications before advice can be provided on the deductibility of work related self-education expenses.



Lorna has faithfully represented the home using textures and colours for the wall panels and the detailing of roofing and the distinctive windows.


The beautiful old railway house is being worked in Black work and the fabulous Bunya Bunya tree looks quite spectacular in free-Machine embroidery.





- 6. Seed collecting day from various sites in the catchment starting from the Upper Beaconsfield Indigenous Nursery at 9.30am Sunday, November 27th.



So far this year, after 9 months, we have had a total of 565ml of rain and at the same time last year we had 592ml and in 2003 we only had 544ml.


In September 2005 there were 14 days where it rained, slightly more than August of 12 days.
