## PEDESTRIAN SAFETY **GIVEN THE GO AHEAD**

At the September Council Meeting the tender submitted by Streetworks P/L. to install pedestrianoperated signals in Beaconsfield was accepted.

The proposed work includes - relocation of the bus bay and shelter on the north side of Old Princes Highway

- installation of traffic signals, pram ramps, paving and line marking.



Council has recently held a number of Youth Strategy public forums around the shire. The information and input received at these forums will contribute to developing the new Cardinia Youth Strategy. The updated strategy will give council the appropriate direction in meeting the needs of our youth and providing them will quality services and activities.

The increasing incidence of graffiti around our growth townships is an issue that I am very concerned about. I am currently on a

committee that is looking at ways in which council can address this issue. One of the initiatives on the agenda the implementation of an accord with local traders to restrict the sale and display of spray cans and marking pens. I also encourage residents to report graffiti on council owned property such as council buildings, light poles, signs and bus stops. lobby Vic Roads for improvements to the intersection of the Old Princes Highway, the Princes Freeway and the Princes Highway as part of the construction of the Pakenham By-Pass. Such works would improve congestion at peak times and increase safety. An improved intersection with a pedestrian crossing with signals would also allow council to improve pedestrian access from the Panorama estate to the Beaconsfield Township by providing the safest and most direct link. The footpath could be extended from Panorama Avenue along the southern side of the Princes Highway to the intersection of the Old Princes Highway and the Freeway. Lurge Vic Roads

and the state government to upgrade this intersection.

Council is hoping to implement the RECHARGE initiative within townships around the shire. RECHARGE is about supporting people in our community who may require an accessible power point to recharge their electric scooter while they are out. It will allow people who use electric wheelchairs/scooters the reassurance that they are able to visit the local shopping precinct without fear of not being able to make it home. #### Prepare for the summer fire season

Once again summer season is fast approaching, and dry conditions over winter and warm windy days in September suggest the summer fire season will arrive early this year. Now is the time for residents living in the more fire prone areas to the north of Beaconsfield to be preparing for the summer fire danger period. If you live in a fire prone area, you can expect several days on which you, your family and your house may be threatened by fire. You need to know exactly what you will do on these days. Some important questions to be asking yourself are:

- \* Do you have a plan in the event of a fire in the area?
- \* Will you stay and actively defend your property or leave early before a fire starts?
- \* Have you prepared for a fire including cleaning up leaves and flammable material in your gutters and around your home, and having the right clothing and equipment to fight a fire?



# FROM THE ACCOUNTANTS DESK

#### ATO Compliance Program 2006/07

Each year the Australian Taxation Office provides an overview of its Compliance Program and focuses on areas of concern for the next financial year. All types of organisations including Non-Profit entities and **Government Organisations** included. The Australian Taxation Office is more sophisticated in collection matching procedures and also uses data records of Federal and State Governments as well as Financial Institutions.

Some targets of the recently released 2006/07 ATO Compliance Program include the following:

#### - Individuals

Reviewing high income earners (over \$1 million), the cash economy, late lodgement of outstanding returns, checking high value tax refunds, claims for rental expenses and calculation of Capital Gain Tax Liabilities.

- Small Business
Review of registration,
lodgements and
outstanding debts, dealing
with new provisions
covering fuel tax credit and
entrepreneurs tax offset,
additional reviews of GST
Activity Statements and
compliance of employer
obligations.

Education is the key approach in this Sector.

#### - Small to Medium Enterprises

Major area is non compliance of lodgements by due dates, inadequate record keeping and noncompliant registrations, targeting wealthy individuals and integrity of returns of entities associated with the high wealth individuals.

#### - Large Businesses

The major priorities continue to be ensuring appropriate tax paid on profits and Capital Gains as well as accounting for tax on international dealings.

#### - Non Profit

Organisations Review of registrations and further education to improve information and reporting including GST and FBT.

#### - Government

Organisations Priority in checking FBT and GST refunds but mainly to pursue best practice procedures.

There are more resources available to the Australian Taxation Office and they are becoming more sophisticated in utilising this data. You should consult your Accountant on any areas of concern in compliance of taxation responsibilities.



### AN INTRODUCTION TO AUSTRALIAN CHEESES

## WALKING ON EVEN GROUND

The most popular cheese type consumed in this country is Cheddar. More and more are the 'non cheddar' varieties increasing in popularity. As wine became more sort after, so did the publics interest in these cheeses, especially when using cheese platters.

There are four different cheese groups according to the Australian Dairy Corporation. They are: hard cheeses, firm cheeses, soft ripened cheeses and soft unripened cheeses.

With the first 'hard cheeses group' they are granular in texture. Usually Italian type grating cheese. The most common are Parmesan, Romano, Pecorino and Pepato. There are now new variations eg. Chilli Pecorino ( aged and fresh).

The 'firm chesses' include such cheeses as Edam and Gouda ( Dutch type), 'eye' types, Danish Samsoe and Swiss and of course the English Cheddar.

The 'soft ripened' group of cheeses include the 'blue and white' types and the Greek style Fetta and Italian Mozzarella.

The last group contains such types Cream cheese,

Cottage and Creamed Cottage as well as smooth Ricotta.

Apart from all of these are the processed cheeses. Many of us grew up with the 'Blue Packer' Processed Cheddar Cheese or the Processed Cheese slices. Very convenient and easy to keep.

Footpath works will be carried out to link existing developments to the footpath network, create access to new buildings, link existing footpaths, and improve access to shops and facilities for all users but especially people using wheelchairs, motorised vehicles, strollers and trolleys.



## INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

by Tammy Lobato, MP, Member for Gembrook

Since my last article in the Banner, a number of important infrastructure projects have received funding. The upgrade for Beaconsfield train station has been extended to now include, not only an upgraded pedestrian crossing, but also around 120 new car parking spaces under the Bracks Government's Park and Ride program. I know these improvements are muchneeded and will make a huge difference to the many residents who rely on public transport to get to and from work and school.

Additional state government funding has also been delivered to local neighbourhood houses. For Beaconsfield Neighbourhood House, this means an extra 10 coordination hours and an increase in funding to \$49,400 for the 2006/07 financial year. This is up from \$23,678 for 2005/06

and \$12,855 in 1999/2000. Other nearby neighbourhood centres including Upper Beaconsfield. LLINC. Berwick and Emerald have also received substantial increases in funding. I think the role that neighbourhood houses play in connecting people in the community, as well as providing opportunities for locally based learning, recreation and children's services, is vital in such fast areas like growing Beaconsfield, so I welcome this extra funding.

ROC Football Club has been awarded a \$20,000 grant towards its project to upgrade lighting and install new cabling at Officer Recreation Reserve. It was one of 21 successful projects to receive funding in the Country Football and Netball Program.

In September, the Minister for Transport announced



that \$2 million would be spent to signalise the intersection of Clyde Rd and Enterprise Ave in Berwick, a business area that I know is often frequented by Beaconsfield residents. The lights will be coordinated to work in conjunction with the nearby level crossing so that there will be no unnecessary delays for through traffic.

The site for the new Berwick Technical Education has been announced, adjacent to existing buildings on the Chisholm TAFE campus at Berwick. This TEC will provide an education option for young people, helping them into a trade course prior to completing Year 12 or its TAFE

equivalent. It will deliver a range of courses and include the best technology to ensure the development of skills that our industries need and that many local young people want to learn.

Just a quick reminder that with another hot summer approaching, now is the perfect time to consider installing water saving devices. The State Government, through water retailers, is providing rebates on a range of water saving products and services, including shower roses, tap timers, dual flush toilets, greywater systems and rainwater tanks. ## SALLY'S GARDEN



#### DID YOU KNOW?

Wherever we walk we see remnants of the face of Nature as it was before technology, the still-growing spices and medicines which made life for our forefathers agreeable, possible, or both. Everyone knows about the sedative and narcotic opium poppy, from which codeine. morphine and heroin are extracted. The tall stately although foxalove. venomous, has long been used in small quantities to treat heart complaints-brave people, the early herbalists.

Yarrow is known as a cure for colds and fevers, while the ancients, including the Anglo Saxons and the Celts, pestled with grease, as a "woundwort" to heal battle-scars and enhance personal beauty.

As a healer of wounds and broken bones, Comfrey has still better claims to efficacy. Comfrey in fact extracts more Vitamin B12 from the earth than any other plant, and contains the healing allantoin, which does indeed help bones to knit. The leaves make a therapeutic tea, the roots, pounded to a poultice and allowed to dry around injuries, make both a plaster and a beneficial salve. Gerard tells us that the root, pounded in a "posset of ale", is good for backache, while Piny is of the view that the herb's presence in alcohol engenders good cheerpossibly the reason that its little brother Borage, still turns up in Pimms.

A sure remedy to cure sore throats is good human sweat.

A child who wore his father's unwashed, sweat-encrusted sock about his throat all day recovered far faster than another denied this treatment.

Medicinal herbs should be planted in plots containing species—usually nine rosemary, lavender, rue, sage (for heartburn and comfrev. coughs) wormwood, marjoram, vervain and hellebore (as a purgative, for worms and boils)- when the moon is waxing, by gardeners who curse as they plant. The vehemence of the curses does not seem to matter, provided they are as strong as each gardener can muster. This conjures interesting pictures of the great lady giving it her best, but very decorous shot, while her altogether earthier gardener fertilisers the crop with streams of obscenities.

Parsley-tea, drunk regularly, banishes pimples and ensures fertility, particularly if the male wears fresh parsley under his arm pits, at all times. Holly, like Blackthorn, should be planted near the house and never cut down or uprooted. Holly berries, which contain the blood of the old year, must not be brought into the house until Christmas Eve. and not allowed to touch glass. The same is true of Mistletoe, which was thought to contain the semen of the bare, dead oak, and so was much used in Celtic or Druids rituals.





## Cardinian **Embroidery** Project

The Cardinian Embroidery was completed at the end of July. Preparations are under way for display in the Cardinia Cultural Centre at Lakeside Pakenham and it should be ready for public viewing later this

The Cardinian Embroidery consists of eight panels each measuring 190cm high by 140cm wide. Each panel represents groups of neighbouring towns in the Shire and depicts features which are considered significant by the locals. Altogether 374 features have been individually embroidered using a variety of hand and machine embroidery techniques by a total of 217 people. The names and localities included were marked on canvas and sent out for members of each community to add their stitches.

This involved teaching males and females from the ages of three to ninety three the technique of canvas embroidery and altogether a total of 1845 people contributed to the names which were joined to the bottom of each panel.

The features of Beaconsfield township can be seen on the third panel with Rythdale Officer and Cardinia. You can see the familiar Beaconsfield railway viaduct, which has been worked in machine embroidery by Eleanor Taylor and painted by Lorraine Parnall

The history of the viaduct was described in an article in a Beaconsfield Banner in 1989 and to quote from that article.

"The viaduct was not originally built for vehicular traffic. In the early 1900's there was a level crossing at the western end of the railway station (where pedestrians cross now)

A workman on a project south of the township had to haul loads of heavy equipment out to his job and he



noticed that a flood had made a little hole in the embankment under the timber railway bridge. So he scooped out some more soil. The enlarged hole gave him a short cut from the pipe works (in a paddock northwest of the Woods Street- Beaconsfield Avenue corner) to the water pipe being laid between the Officer reservoir and Cranbourne.

Another flood swept away some more soil. Other people began using the pop-hole instead of the level crossing. which some considered was dangerous because steam trains came down the hill very quietly from Berwick."

By the early 1930's after 2 accidents on the level crossing, it was demanded that the railways close the level crossing and everyone was using the rough track and subway.







## When is the right time to say Goodbye?

We often have clients come to us with their pets that have reached the end of their time with us. The most common question we encounter is "When do we know the time is right?" We can offer you all the medical advice relating to the condition, but each case is different, and honestly, most owners know when it has become all too much for their pet, before we do. There is no definite sign to look for, it's a matter of weighing it all up and seeing how your pet is doing at home. Afterall, we can diagnose the condition in the clinic, but you know how your family member is coping with life at home. You will often know in your own mind that euthanasia is the best option. By that, I mean it is the best option for your friend, and not the best option for you! Yes, you will go through heartbreak, but you can take comfort in knowing that your friend is at peace. I believe we are fortunate to have the option not to see them fade away infront of us and suffer unnecessarily.

Unfortunately, there are limitations to the world of Veterinary Science. I have encountered this recently. My 13 year old trusty dog "Weazel" became suddenly ill. I could palpate a mass in her abdomen, which concerned me greatly, but the blood results were basically normal. This, I found, was to give me false hope. The next day I did surgery to investigate the

mass, and I found that her spleen and liver were riddled with cancer. My only option was the one I never wanted to consider. Since graduating, she was my first pet, and now is the first one that I have had to help out in this way. I miss her terribly, she was there with me for the last 13 years regardless of how I felt


Hopefully, you can see how difficult it is for us to tell you when the time is right. Please take comfort in the fact that we will be there for you during a very difficult time.

One last note. Please never ever tell your children that their pet has been "put to sleep". ## X-Wired

2006 is going to be best remembered as the year that the Australian film industry struck back. It's been a lean couple of years for good Aussie films in recent years. But 2006 has seen an abundance of good Australian films.

You would have all heard the praise given to the visually spectacular films 'Jindabyne' and 'Ten Canoes', as well to the comic genius that is 'Kenny', but there is few other films that deserve to be taken a look at.

the By far most controversial Australian film of this year has to be '2:37', and not because of it's topic of youth suicide. This is spectacular film that every Aussie parent needs to see but unfortunately some of film's shine has been taken way due to debate over whether the film's writer/ director Murali Thalluri claims that the script is based on real events that occurred at his high school. Teachers at the school and even some of Thalluri's friends have denied that the story is true, casting a shadow over the film.

Whether the film is fact or fiction, it is gritty and very real and my only real criticism is that Thalluri seems to have 'borrowed' some of his filmmaking style from Gus Van Sant's 'Elephant'.

Another good Australian film floating around is the latest film by Melbourne-based director Alkinos Tsilmidos. His latest

offering, 'Em 4 Jay' is not to be missed. Set amongst drug addicts in St Kilda, 'Em 4 Jay' is confronting but also enjoyable. Alkinos is one of the only directors I know that can create scenes that will have an audience laughing in such a dark film, and like with his previous films like 'Tom White', you will be deeply rewarded and actually be educated from the film.

I had the privilege of talking to Nick Barkla, the lead actor in 'Em 4 Jay', and he told me that Alkinos had himself and Laura Gordon go to St Kilda and 'slum it' for a few days so they could get a feel for the characters they were playing.

But the Australian film that I have enjoyed the most this year has to be '48 Shades'. This simply has to be one of the best 'comingof-age' films that we have ever seen. And while we've come to expect the visual humour of 'American Pie' to tell these stories, '48 Shades' seems more like an episode of 'Always Greener', as it tells the story through drama. But it is one of those films where you will find yourself saying 'i remember when I did that as a teenager', and is the one film all moviegoers must see this year.



The highest monthly total for August is 119 which was recorded in 2005.


#### September

#### **AUSTRALIAN PLATYPUS CONSERVANCY**

## CARDINIA CREEK PLATYPUS SURVIVE SPILL

Fears that last June's fluoride spill into Cardinia Creek may have caused the collapse of the platypus re-introduction project have proved unfounded.

Geoff Williams of the **Platypus** Australian Conservancy said that an all-night monitoring survey in early October had caught examined five platypus. This total included three of the platypus translocated to Cardinia Creek from elsewhere (two females released in April 2004 and March 2006 respectively and a male translocated there in April 2005) and the two juvenile males who were first found in the April 2006 survey (i.e. bred in Cardinia Creek, the offspring of the first translocated animals).

Geoff noted that enough time had now passed since the spill to asses whether there had been any direct or indirect impact on platypus.

"The total number of animals caught during this survey is consistent with previous results, indicating that there has been no decline in the population," he said. "Four of the platypus were caught within one kilometre of the treatment plant where the spill occurred and all animals were found at locations where they had previously been released or recorded, suggesting that there had been no movement out of the area most affected by the spill."

Accordingly, the Cardinia Creek platypus reintroduction, a joint Melbourne Water-APC conservation initiative which is the first project of its kind in Australia, remains well on track.



### **Phil Collins Donates History** to Club:

Well known local handyman and Banner advertiser Phil Collins recently donated an intriguing and well presented historical Tennis diorama to our club, currently on display at our club rooms. The glass case diorama provides snippets on the history of tennis and models of rackets used from late 1880's to mid 1900's. Some snippets are set out below.

Phil has been a supporter of our club for many years, plays regularly on Sunday and our club is most appreciative of his thoughts and donation to our club.

1880s: The first lawn tennis racquets were similar to those in real tennis. with uneven pear shaped heads.

1920s: Leather grips were introduced around this time to make the racquet easier to hold.

1928: First metal racquet. During the 1920s experimental racquets with aluminium frames were made. The fact that they were strung with piano wire did nothing for their appeal as the wool covered balls quickly wore out

The first tennis championships were held at the All England Tennis & Croquet Club, Wimbledon, London in 1877. The first U.S. tennis championship was held in 1881 at the Newport Casino in Newport, R.I.


