Items included:

-the need for new educational facilities

-roads (including a signalised intersection at

the Old Princes Highway and the commencement of the Berwick Bypass, Beaconsfield),

-funding for youth facilities/services, community infrastructure and recreational facilities such as Holm Park Road Reserve.

As chair of council's Youth Strategy Committee, I was extremely pleased that council recently adopted the Cardinia Shire Youth Policy and Strategy 2007-2011

- The provision of a youth bus outreaching young people across the shire


This strategy/policy demonstrates council's commitment to improving access to youth services, information and activities for our young people.

The Church Moves To Its New Home.


Over four hundred people turned up for the opening of the new building of the Beaconsfield Baptist Church. The 350 seat auditorium was packed and extra seats were needed for the over flow. The opening ceremony was followed by a huge afternoon tea. The meeting was honoured with the presence of our Federal Member, Jason Wood and our Ward Councillor, Brett Owen.

The building and land together cost \$3.3 million. The Beaconsfield church neither community received nor sought any grants or external support. The church community is totally self supporting. The building was designed by the 160 people who attend the church. In both design and implementation it was a communal effort. The primary goal was to have a functional building with prettiness a secondary consideration, although the final product looks mighty fine. The building has three main spaces, the auditorium used for Sunday services, a multi purpose hall and a substantial lobby.

For the last 21 years the church has made do with its old inadequate service station building and it was with much relief that the church finally moved out. Yet a new building does not mean a new church. The people and the programs are the same as ever. The church prides its self on being a useful part of the Beaconsfield community. Certainly a warm welcome would await anyone and everyone at any of the church's various services and gatherings.

COMMUNITY BANK AT BEACONSFIELD

Steering Committee is working to establish Community Bank а Branch of Bendigo Bank Beaconsfield. The Beaconsfield District Community Bank will be to everyone available to service the banking needs of residents and businessesofBeaconsfield and neighbouring towns.

Since the initial concept approximately 4 months the ago, support residents and businesses to the awareness program has continued to gain support as demonstrated by the successful launch on 31st October 2007. Community Bank concept is supported by Beaconsfield **Business** Group and Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc.

The Community Bank already model has been successfully used by Bendigo Bank in establishing over 200 Branches. A Community Bank is operated under Franchise from Bendigo Bank and provides full bank facilities. The Community Bank is owned by members of the Community who subscribe for Share Capital (Minimum \$500, Maximum \$10,000) and are eligible for Dividends or Capital return when the Community Bank is profitable.

The majority of profits however are directed into Community Projects and Sponsorships eg. Schools, Sporting Clubs, Kindergartens, Charities, the Arts etc.

In order to proceed to the next stage of having a Feasibility Study and Business Plan prepared it is necessary to demonstrate to Bendigo Bank that there sufficient support to establish the Beaconsfield District Community Bank, It is necessary to have pledges of support to raise Share Capital of approximately \$700,000. The Campaign for Pledges of support is due to be completed by January 2008 and Pledges of almost \$100,000 have already been received.

NEWS FROM THE BEACONSFIELD FIRE BRIGADE

Once again the year has flown by, and the summer fire season is fast approaching. The Beaconsfield Fire Brigade wishes everyone a happy and safe Christmas and summer holiday period.

Summer Fire Safety -Have you and your family prepared your Bushfire Survival Plan?

CFA is advising that people living in high risk areas need to be self-reliant to protect themselves against bushfires.

"You may not get someone banging on your door to warn that a bushfire is close," said CFA Brigade Support Officer Ellisa Bourne.

"You may not see a fire truck arrive at your house in the nick of time. This is why you should prepare your own bushfire survival plan now before the fire season gets started."

It is important that you obtain information about what needs to be done before making your decision. Will you leave early or stay and defend?

CFA recommends that people make their decision well before the summer fire season to either stay and actively defend their property or leave the area before fire threatens.

Research shows that many people make unsafe choices that can have serious consequences. CFA advises people not to stay with an unprepared property and not to leave their property too late such as when the fire is very

close, or return to your home during a bushfire.

If you would like a CFA "Living in the Bush" workbook to assist you with your plan call the Victorian Bushfire Information Line on 1800 240 667 to obtain a copy.

Victorian Bushfire Information Line

Victorian Bushfire Information Line is a 24 hour, seven days a week service which provides recorded information regarding fire restrictions, Total Fire Bans and information to assist you to prepare for the fire season. During the summer fire period you can obtain personal advice from trained operators from 8am to 8pm weekdays.

In the event of a major incident the information line can be staffed 24 hours a day in order to provide incident updates and advice on actions to take during bushfires. For example if you work out of the area but during the day a bushfire develops you could call this number to ascertain whether it is safe to return to your home. The number to call is 1800 240 667. It would be a great idea to program this number into your phone.

Alternatively check the CFA website www.cfa.vic.gov. au for more information on preparing for the summer season.



FROM THE ACCOUNTANTS' DESK

INVESTMENT PROPERTIES

The receipt of rental income from an investment property requires inclusion in an income tax return the owner(s) as well as claims for deductions incurred. Statistics provided by the Australian Taxation Office disclose that overall rental deductions claimed exceed rental income resulting in net income tax benefits to taxpayers. Due to the significant cost to income tax revenue, the Australian Taxation Office has a compliance program review and monitor amounts of rental income and deductions disclosed in income tax returns and particularly for new property owners.

Some matters to be borne in mind when disclosing rental property transactions are:

- 1. Rent received when privately tennanted particularly to relatives. must be at market rentals otherwise deductions can usually only be claimed to the amount of rent received.
- Repairs and Improvements initial repairs before the property is rented and any renovations are usually not deductible and are added to the capital cost. Repairs that are deductible include expenses to bring a property back to the condition at the time of purchase.
- 3. Interest paid in connection monies borrowed

and directly applied for the purchase of a property including stamp duty, legal fees, capital renovations etc are deductible. However, difficulties occur in claiming a deduction for interest if loans are mixed with an existing loan or where loans are re-negotiated.

- 4. Travel costs can be claimed by the owners if needed to undertake repairs, property inspections etc however records of trips must be maintained.
- 5. Expenses can only be claimed in respect of the period that a property is rented out or genuinely made available for rent. Taxation Ruling IT2167 states the Australian Taxation Office view on what constitutes the property being available for rent and includes coastal and holiday homes.
- Depreciation Capital Allowances can be claimed on plant, equipment, fixtures and fittings and also the building cost if built after the mid 1980's. If the property is relatively new it would be advisable to obtain a Quantity Surveyor's Report to claim these deductions.

The disclosure of rental property income and expenses should be carefully examined as the Australian Taxation Office undertakes compliance activities. If in doubt you should discuss any relevant matters with the your Accountant.



It has been pleasing to see the progress that has been made with the works at the Beaconsfield train station car park. Once works are completed, 123 fully sealed car parking spaces will be available for commuter use. Along with the recent \$230,000 upgrade to the pedestrian crossing, the car parks are another step towards improving the amenity of the station.

Also new to Beaconsfield pedestrian the are lights installed on the Princes Highway outside Beaconsfield Primary School and funded through the State Government. The crossing is known as a PUFFIN crossing, which means that it has sensor technology that can track a pedestrian's progress across the road and adjust accordingly the amount of time they need to cross. I have already tremendous received parents feedback from

saying how relieved they are that their children can now cross, not only with the assistance of the ever-reliable "lollipop" crossing attendants but also now with traffic signals.

I was delighted to welcome students from Beaconsfield Primary School recently to Parliament House in Spring St. Melbourne. I was able to conduct a tour for them through both the building and the grounds of the Parliament and they were able to listen to debate in both the Legislative Assembly (Lower House) Legislative and the Council (Upper House). They also had plenty of intelligent **auestions** about how Parliament and Government works and about the role of a local Member of Parliament, I commend the school for encouraging students to learn the fundamentals of how our democratic system works, so that they will be able to be active and informed citizens. The students seemed to really enjoy their visit and were quite amazed with the building itself. For those residents who have never been to Parliament House. regular public tours are conducted and there are annual open days. Alternatively, you may want to attend when Parliament is sitting to hear legislation being debated. New refuelling tankers for aircraft that allow planes to be refuelled on the fireground rather than having to return to an airport, will be in use for the first time. In all, there will be 34 aircraft in use this year including the Erikson Aircrane 'Elvis'.

We can all assist this fire season by ensuring our properties have been cleared appropriately and that bushfire survival plans are in place. We all have a role to play in minimising the dangers.




Try-athlon H.P.V. Series



Wednesday 7 November was a terrible day at Jokela Secondary School in Finland, which has 400 pupils. During a lesson mid morning a young gunman came to the school and opened fire killing five boys, two girls and the rfemale principal. The 18 year old gunmen then shot himself. Before he went on his rampage Pekka-Eric Auvinen posted a video of himself on You Tube along with other blogs. There he shares his understanding of life and reality.


For Pekka-Eric there was no ultimate purpose for life. He speaks of humanity being over rated, of death not being a tragedy and not all human lives as being important. He said he saw himself as one who should eliminate all who were unfit for the human race. It was as if he saw himself as helping evolution along by removing inadequate people from the gene pool.

Pekka-Eric Auvinen was manifestly a deeply disturbed teenager. Nevertheless it worries me that when he tried to figure

out the meaning of life his only picture was one of being part of a species that had evolved from the slime and in which the individual was of ultimately no value.

Pekka-Eric Auvinen had followed to its logical conclusion the theory of the evolution of humans. For Pekka-Eric Auvinen humans were nothing more than the next step along the never ending development of life. The fittest will survive and the weakest will not and should not. And so for Pekka-Eric Auvinen the individual, including himself, was of no consequence at all.

There is another view of the life which says God created. If this view is correct then every individual is significant and precious. We did not simply come by accident from the some earlier primitive form of life. We were specifically designed to live lives that are useful and helpful. If God is our creator then every one of us has a meaningful and important life to live.

PRIMARY SCHOOL HISTORY

The last issue of the Banner detailed the opening of the fantastic second stage of the Beaconsfield Primary School's new facilities.

Did you know that the school is over 100 years old?

The book The Cardinian Embroidery edited by Eleanor Taylor provides history p. 24.

"Beaconsfield Railway Station School no. 3033 was officially opened on June 5th 1890 and celebrated its centenary in 1990. For a few years from 1891 this school

was known as lower Beaconsfield State School, but changed back. The railway station part of the name was dropped in 1951. The first school room was brick and measured 18'x24'- unusually large

and solid for a school building of this time. In 1930 a weatherboard room formerly part of Narre Warren School was brought to the school and a new office and classroom were added in 1955.

Since then many other buildings have been added including the purchase in 1974 of the site office of the Cardinia dam to be used as a hall, canteen, storage The original area etc. buildings were demolished in 1997 and replaced with a new school complex where some of the original handmade bricks, windows frames and a door step from the old school have been incorporated into the new buildings.

The freestanding brick pillar at the entrance to the school(shown in the embroidery) is built from the original handmade bricks."

If you would like to read more about the school and its history you can read Audrey Dodson's book Beaconsfield PS. 18901990; The School and its District. Available from local libraries.

Many of the students from Beaconsfield Primary added their stitches to the name panel of the Embroidery and you can view the completed panels at the Cardinia Cultural Centre at Lakeside Pakenham.

You can also purchase souvenir books and cards available from Cardinia Cultural Centre and Beaconsfield Community Centre.







Clean up for Christmas

Pakenham, Beaconsfield and Officer residents have been encouraged to take the chance to clean up before Christmas.

Cardinia Shire Council has responded to requests to resume a shirewide twiceyearly collection of green and hard waste.

Residents in Central Ward will have their rubbish collected in the week beginning Monday 17 December.

Central Ward Councillor Brett Owen encouraged residents to take advantage of the hard waste collection. "This is a perfect opportunity to have a good clean out prior to Christmas," he said.

"Previously residents had

to contact the Council to book in a pick-up. That's no longer the case.

"This improved service will cover the entire shire and the rubbish will be picked up by Council's contractor at the designated times, without residents having to phone ahead to request a collection."

Cr Owen said suitable items for the collection included scrap metal, furniture, mattresses, small car parts and whitegoods. Tree branches tied in bundles and less than 1.5 metres long and 15 centimetres in diameter will also be collected.

From one week before the advertised collection date for their area, residents

can leave up to two cubic metres of hard and green waste on their nature strip for collection.

A second collection will be in all wards in June/July next year.

To help with recycling, Cr Owen asked residents to please place green waste, mattresses, scrap metal and remaining hard waste in separate piles.

Items that will not be collected include batteries, asbestos sheeting, chemicals, large car parts, tyres, gas bottles, car springs and any other dangerous materials.

The collection is being carried out for Council by WM Waste Management

Services, who can be contacted on 9721 1915.



TALKING WEATHER

With summer now here and the weather warming up, now is the best time to conserve every drop of rain that falls.

In the last 2 months we have seen 142mm of rain fall. 38mm in October and 104mm in November.

The rain fell over 12 days with 6 days in October and 6 days in November.

The 2 monthly total was not the highest recorded for these two months. This was recorded in 1992 when 251mm of rain fell.

The total for the year is 667mm, this is already 58mm more than last year and there is still a month to go.

Victoria's water storages are currently at 39.7% full.



I recently had the pleasure of catching up with one of Australia's best up-and-coming film directors, a man by the name of Shane Abbess. What impressed me about Shane is that he isn't one of these filmmakers that have had everything handed to him on a gold platter. He has worked jolly hard for his debut feature film, 'Gabriel' to come into fruition.

Lots of Aussie filmmakers have recently tried to make an independent feature, but most of those have been a dialogue-driven drama with very few, simplistic sets, Shane's is very different to that... So how does 'Gabriel' look? Well to be honest you can't tell that the film didn't cost millions to make. The story is simple enough, seven archangels from hell and seven archangels from heaven are battling for the right to control the souls of people on earth. The catch is that six of heaven's angels have been defeated and it is now up to 'Gabriel' to save the day.

In the way it is shot, 'Gabriel' is a masterpiece, every shot captures the doom-and-gloom of this new world and the ever present rain and thunder adds an atmosphere that has to be seen to be believed.

'Gabriel' is also well cast. Newcomer, Andy Whitfield is terrific in the role of 'Gabriel' while ex-model, Erika Heynatz steals the show in her role of the very evil, Lilith.

If you can provide a bedroom, a place at your table and a kind loving environment for a young person from another country, you've got what it takes to be a host family.






