RESIDENTS SAY NO TO POKIES

The Shire of Cardinia has received applications to install over 200 gaming machines at 3 separate locations in the townships of Beaconsfield and Officer.

Residents have attended both Beaconsfield and Officer Progress Association February meetings and voiced their total disapproval to the applications.

Residents agreed to work together to make their objections unified and very clear - Say No to Pokies. It will be the demonstration of public opposition that will have the major affect. Petitions for signing are at the Beaconsfield Community Complex.

If these applications were to be successful, townships would have a concentration of electronic gaming machines that is significantly higher than level deemed acceptable by the local community. The state average is 10 per 1000 but here it will be 70 per 1000.

Current Gaming Applications before council:

There are three current planning applications in the Officer/Beaconsfield area that involves electronic gaming machines:

- Castello's Hotels at 365
 Princes Hwy involving 60
 EGM's
- Pakenham Racing Club, 325 Princes Hwy, west of the Castello's application involving 80 EGM's
- DSL Investments in May Road, Beaconsfield involving 75 EGM's.

May Road (DSL) -There have been no changes to the original application. The objections that have been received already will be included in the application when it goes to council for a decision. There will be no re-advertising unless the application is considerable changed from the original proposal. It has been advised that this application is likely to come before councillors for a decision in the next couple of months.



The forthcoming year will be a great one for Beaconsfield. Over the coming months, council will be adopting the Holm Park Road Reserve Master plan. The sports needs assessment for the Beaconsfield community has been completed.

The results confirmed the urgent need for additional playing ovals for football/ cricket and courts for netball and tennis. The master plan will address sporting these needs. Work gaining the on necessary environmental and heritage approvals for the development of the site is continuing. Council will be allocating a substantial amount of funds in the upcomina 2008/2009 budget to commence stage 1 of construction of the new sporting facilities. Council has also submitted a grant application to the state government through Sport and Recreation Victoria. State/Federal government assistance financial vital to ensure that council is able to provide these sporting facilities at Holm Park Road in a timely manner.

You may or may not be aware that Vic Track is seeking to build 12 factories on the land bounded by the Railway Line to the south, Station St to the East, along Beaconsfield Ave to the West stopping at our property "Railway House" i.e. 20 Beaconsfield Ave.

This development will also include the area directly behind our house......see photo below.

At present the Scout Hall and the Original Community Centre occupy part of this site on land zoned PUZ6 which is Public Use Local Government.... community use.

BEACONSFIELD DISTRICT COMMUNITY BANK - ACT NOW

There has been an encouraging response to the launch on 31st October 2007 of a proposed Community Bank to be operated under franchise licence by Bendigo Bank Ltd.

The Steering Committee appointed to undertake the publicity and Community awareness program decided that sufficient community support from businesses and residents to proceed to the Pledge stage of the awareness program.

The Pledge program seeks written pledges of support to the concept of a Community Bank and to utilise the Community Bank in the future for some or all banking needs. The

Community Bank will have full Bank facilities provided by Bendigo Bank including Loans, Credit Cards and Financial Planning. The Community Bank receives a share of revenue derived from banking business and pays for operating costs of the Branch including Rent and premises costs, Salaries and other administration expenses. Based on recently set-up similar Community Banks they generally become profitable after 12-24 months.

After deducting initial trading losses and setup costs, the profits of a Community Bank are mostly paid as Grants, Sponsorships etc to nonprofit organisations eg Schools, Kinders, Sporting Clubs etc (up to 80%) with the balance accumulated as Reserves or paid as dividends (up to 20%).

The Pledge stage of the program is due for completion by the end of March. Pledges received to date amount to approx 20% of the required capital needed (59 pledges received for approximately \$200,000). Our aim is for 300 pledges for approximately \$750,000.

On behalf of the Steering Committee, we seek assistance of businesses and residents of Beaconsfield and surrounding areas by completing Pledge Forms and return to the persons /

addresses on the Forms. If you require Pledge Forms or any further information do not hesitate to contact me.



NEWS FROM THE BEACONSFIELD FIRE BRIGADE

Fortunately the bushfire season in Victoria has got of to a quiet start compared to recent fire seasons, but the risk of bushfire and grassfires in our local and surrounding areas through to the end of April is still high, and the community is urged to take care to ensure their actions do not cause a fire.

In particular:

- . observe fire restrictions that are in force.
- . never leave a fire (including a solid fuel bbq) unattended and ensure it is cool to touch before leaving.
- . avoid driving through, or using grinders or welders in long dry grass.

The Brigade has been kept busy over the last couple of months including a tanker and composite crew from Beaconsfield, Upper Beaconsfield and NarNarGoon being deployed to the Kangaroo Island fires in early December for 4 days. A strike team also attended the grassland fire at Dromana in January.

Beaconsfield Locally were called to support Officer to a large shed fire in a backyard. The fire threatened the house and neighbouring property. Some aggressive fighting saw the house and ajoining properties being saved. The shed fire took guite some time to contain. due to the large amount of fuel containers exploding and an LPG cylinder venting. Appliances from Berwick. Beaconsfield. Officer, Pakenham and Frankston attended the fire.

CHANGE TO 3807 BOUNDARY

The change to locality boundary of Beaconsfield/ Officer was registered in November 2007. Areas of Eden Rise Estate, May Road, Panorama Estate will now belong to the 3807 postcode. Residents have been notified of these changes.

The new area is bounded by O'Neil Road N/S border road to Whiteside Road, all even numbers on west side, Whiteside Road N/ S border road in whole, all odd numbers on west side. Then Brunt Road, N/s border road in whole, all even numbers on west side and Rix Road, E/W border road from Brunt Road junction, all even numbers on north side.

FROM THE ACCOUNTANTS' DESK

TAX OFFSETS REDUCE YOUR TAX

the preparation of personal income tax returns, the claims for Tax Offsets and Rebates can significantly change the amount of your tax refund. Tax Offsets reduce income tax payable to the extent of income tax payable. Any excess Tax Offsets cannot refunded be except for Private Health Insurance, Baby Bonus and Child Care, which can be transferred to your Spouse. Some of the more significant Tax Offsets and Rebates include the following:

- 1. Dependant Spouse Basic full year tax offset of \$2,100 reduces when spouse income exceeds \$282. However, a Spouse with dependent Child and Sole Parents should claim Family Tax Benefit from Family Assistance Office.
- 2. Parent of the taxpayer or of Spouse Currently \$1,540 but income tested on the Parents income.
- 3. Baby Bonus available for first child born after 1st July 2001 and before 1st July 2004. The maximum tax offset is \$2,500 but reduces by the Spouse taxable income.
- 4. Medical Expenses A tax offset of 20% of the amount expended on medical etc expenses after re-imbursements from Medicare and Private Health Funds in excess of \$1,500.
- 5. Zone Tax Offsets

- applicable to taxpayers residing for more than half the year in prescribed remote areas. The highest tax offset of \$1,173 plus 50% of notional dependent and children tax offset applies in Special Remote areas more than 250 kms from an urban area.
- 6. Mature Age Tax Offset of up to \$500 for persons over 55 years earning employment, partnership or business income less deductions related thereto. The tax offset is income tested and cuts out at \$63,000 for 2006/07.
- 7. Senior Australian Tax Offset of up to \$2,230 for a Single and \$1,602 each for married persons in 2006/07 year, if of Age Pension age. This Tax Offset allows single taxpayers to earn \$24,867 and married couples \$20,680 each annually and not pay any income tax. Reduced tax offsets apply over these amounts.



- 13. Low Income Earner Tax Offset of currently \$750 for taxable incomes up to \$30,000 and reduces over that amount and cuts out at \$48,750.

ASH WEDNESDAY COMMEMORATIVE SERVICE

This February marks 25 years since the tragedies of the Ash Wednesday bushfires. 27 of the 47 lives lost in Victoria were within mv electorate including in towns such as Upper Beaconsfield. The scars of that time are still being felt deeply all these years later. On 17 February, the Governor of Victoria was among those who, along with me and many members of the community, attended a commemorative service Luke's at St Church Cockatoo. These occasions are important and we all need to remember the sacrifices

made by those to protect people and homes.

I have received plenty of positive reports about the new car park at Beaconsfield railway station. I am pleased that with this major upgrade commuters now have a safe, sealed area to park vehicles.

The State Government has provided agrant of \$2770.00 to the Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Centre (BNC) to help with the recruitment and training of more volunteers. This grant will allow the BNC to develop a manual to

assist in equipping new volunteers to deal with the issues involved in this important community work. I am always so impressed with the range and quality of courses that are offered at the centre ranging from dance to art and craft. I know that the childcare, playgroups and toy library sessions are greatly appreciated by the new parents moving into Beaconsfield and I urge new residents to take advantage of the facilities.

I was pleased to welcome members of the Berwick Central Probus Club to Parliament House recently. which has many members from Beaconsfield. The visitors were impressed by the quality and atmosphere of the building, and the library and gardens were favourites. As the seat of democracy in the state, I would urge those who have yet to visit Parliament House to attend one of the open days or, alternatively, to organise a school or group tour. It is most



worthwhile and is a great outing for all ages.

I am continuing my fight to keep Victoria free of genetically modified (GM) crops. The existing moratorium on GM canola expires at the end of February and it is unclear how many farmers will opt to grow GM seeds. On 8 February, the South Australian Government decided to continue its ban on GM crops, bringing it into line with Western Australia and Tasmania. I have serious doubts that Victoria's produce will continue to be seen as clean and green when our neighbour states are making the right move to stay free of GM. Foodland is the latest supermarket chain to state that it would not stock GM products and the future income stream for farmers is in serious trouble with Japan- our biggest market- also vowing to stay GM-free.

USE OF ACUPUNCTURE IN ANIMALS

What is Acupuncture?

Acupuncture is the stimulation specific of points on the body which have the ability to alter various biochemical and physiological conditions in order to achieve a healing effect, it is not a cure-ail, but it works well where indicated and when used alone or in combination with traditional veterinary medicine.

Veterinary acupuncture has been used to treat animals for nearly 4,000 years in China. In North America, and Australia, it has been used for decades, in both domestic and exotic animals. Acupuncture is one of a variety of therapies a veterinarian may use to treat your pet.

How Does Acupuncture Work?

Ancient Chinese medical philosophy believes that disease is a result of an imbalance of energy in the body. Acupuncture is believed to balance this energy, and thereby assist the body in healing disease, in Western terms, acupuncture can assist the body's efforts to heal itself by causing certain physiological changes.

For example, acupuncture can stimulate nerves, increase blood circulation, relieve muscle spasms, and cause the release of hormones, such as endorphins (one of the body's pain control chemicals) or cortisol (a natural steroid).

What are some of the uses of Acupuncture?

Acupuncture is known to have therapeutic effects in a wide variety of animal diseases. Examples of clinical conditions where veterinary acupuncture may be used are:

- Musculoskeletal disorders
- ·Gastrointestinal disorders
- Spinal conditions
- »Head trauma
- ·Respiratory problems
- Urinary disorders
- Dermatological problems

Howlong do acupuncture treatments last, and how often are they needed?

The length and frequency of treatments depends on the problem and condition of your pet. Stimulation of an individual acupuncture point may be for as little as 10 seconds or as long as 20 or even 30 minutes. Generally, acute problems require less time and frequency of treatment in chronic cases.

For example, an acute sprain may require only one treatment, whereas more severe or chronic ailments require multiple may treatments. positive response is generally seen after the first to third treatment in chronic cases. Once optimum response is achieved, treatments are tapered off so the greatest amount of symptom-free elapses between time them.

OUR NATURAL WORLD

There's an old saying "That the more things change the more they remain the same". This certainly applies to many things but not to the physical changes that have taken place in the last 100 years. One of the fascinating effects of getting older is the ability to surprise your children and grandchildren with true reflections on how life was in your younger years. How their eyes widen when you tell them that being a "bush" boy meant that there was no electricity, no running water, no refrigerators, few motor cars, and that in small outback towns horse and cart was the main mode of transport. especially during the dark days of the Second World War when petrol was rationed.

How surprised (and not a little skeptical) when you tell them that most cars in order to run at all used charcoal burners mounted the rear bumper bars, with an enormous expanding gas bag on the roof, as the main means of getting around. All you needed was a large box of charcoal somewhere in or on the car in order to chuff around and a strong ability to tolerate the smell. It was deadly to the motor which in time gave up the ghost and a replacement sought.

In this day and age of super highways and well sealed roads almost everywhere, telling of the country roads then was not all that easy. How could one describe the unending potholes, broken or non-existent shoulders, the dust or mud depending on the season?

The roads today are sheer heaven when looking back: and people still complain?

Doctors were few and far between.andBushNursing Hospitals were the main Medical Centres located in the Towns. I had to avail myself of them twice as a kid, once when bucked off a horse on a steep hillside onto a very large and unyielding rock which broke some bones, and a little later shot in the leg far from the Homestead. A long horse ride home and then a long rough car ride over unmade roads to the nearest Hospital 30 miles away to receive basic treatment, was the order of the day. This sounds dramatic in the telling but in those days it was accepted as the norm. Today's generation, an Ambulance expect and Paramedics on site within minutes and are auite horrified when told things like this. Country boys were a little wild and very independent then and most could ride and handle farm machinery while still at Primary School. To get breakfast meant getting up early and chopping the wood so mum could light the big black stove in the kitchen, doing other chores, and getting to school many miles away. Walking or riding to school through the bush was no big deal and you always felt safe, something kids of today are missing, mores the pity.

There's good and bad in every generation, some you miss, some you never would. To know a little bit of the past is to appreciate the present.



JIMMY PARKES

Wood Street Beaconsfield has many old and interesting buildings with a history to tell.

One of the best known is Jimmy Parkes' Butcher Shop. This is now the Woods Street Sushi Restaurant. The book "The Cardinian Embroidery" edited by Eleanor Taylor tells us 'The shop was built around 1920 and was first a mixed business run by the Bradford family, then became a butcher's shop run by the Coles family. Jim Parkes was their apprentice who later took over the business, apprenticing his son Bryan

who later took over from Jim.'

In Jim's day the bullocks came from Clyde to the abattoirs in the Pink Hill area. Many young children remember this traditional butcher's shop and spent their time playing in

the sawdust on the floor of the shop while Mum was ordering her meat.

Jim Parkes was well known and was part of the town, he is remembered with the JIM PARKES RESERVE in Souter Street where many children have played

on the play equipment and dogs have had their walks.

The shop was empty for a time and then became 'Bull's Raw' Steak and Sushi Restaurant and it is now 'Woods Street Sushi Restaurant'.

The Cardinian Embroidery represents the Shire of Cardinia in 2005 and is depicted on 8 beautiful panels for viewing at the Cardinia Cultural Centre Pakenham, Lakeside Monday – Friday and Sundays. Beaconsfield and Officer are depicted on the third panel.

CHEESE SELECTION AND STORAGE

Australia has many cheese types available for cooking and eating. When selecting table cheese, personal selection is usually the best guide. Once the selection has been made use practical knowledge to enjoy what you have selected as in qualities and types.

To retain the high quality of the cheese you have purchased in many cases it is better to buy small portions frequently rather than large portions where storage can be a problem. Generally, this applies to the softer cheese such as Camembert, Brie, Blue Vein, Cottage, etc. After purchase, cheese should be kept below 4?C. Not known by many, Camembert and Brie are terrific to freeze for further use as after thawing

they are practically exactly the same. Therefore if you purchase large portions for a change, cut to the desired size, package and freeze. most cases, these cheeses are at their best close to the "Best Before" date. Even in cold storage these cheeses keep on maturing, therefore become softer which is preferred by most consumers. Most other cheeses can frozen but tend to be slightly more crumbly when thawed out. As a rule of thumb, the slower the cheeses are thawed out, the better. Therefore placing into the refrigerator is desirable.

Other types of cheese can be purchased in larger qualities. These include the hard grating cheese such as Parmesan, Romano, Pecorino, Pepato, etc, and the all purpose popular cheddar, which is classed as a firm cheese. With these types, the maturation process is generally complete (except "fresh" types) and will not change very much in the refrigerator.

One good tip, especially for cheddar, use a cling wrap to help preserve your cheese. Wrap around squeezing as much air out as possible. The main problem is spoilage by yeast and moulds. Their spores travel around in the air and look for somewhere to settle and grow. Most are aerobic which means they require air to grow. So the better the seal, the better the chance of stopping spoilage and drying out.

The most common mould

is blue mould which is not pathogenic, many people just remove it. Again as a rule of thumb, if the yeasts or moulds are of a bright colour, be very careful as they many be pathogenic and should not be ingested. With these, the "poisons" can be further into the cheese than is visible.

Other ways of storage can be in foil, glass jars or similar containers. Glass jars are good for storing strong flavoured cheeses as its aroma can flavour other foods unpleasantly.

If refrigeration is a problem, a damp cloth wrung out in vinegar may be used to cover cheese kept in a cool spot. Small pieces left over from table use may be grated and stored in containers for later use in sauces or other cooked dishes requiring cheese.

TALKING WEATHER



December saw a very wet month which took our yearly total above the previous 7 years.

There was 172mm of rain recorded in December. This was the highest December total I have recorded and the highest monthly total I have. The previous was 171mm which was recorded in January 2005. December rain fell over 6 days with the highest daily total being 50mm recorded on the 21st. December also saw 10 days where temperature rose above 30c. The hottest day was December 31st were we reached a temperature of 42c.

The yearly total for 2007 was 839mm. This was the highest since 2000 when there was 845mm recorded.

2008. January saw only 16mm of rain fall with 5 days where the temperature rose above 30c. The hottest day was January 10th where a temperature of 42c was reached. This is the lowest January rainfall total since 1997 when only 11mm fell.



This is must for people who loved films such as 'The Safety Of Objects'.



As with most foods, the flavours of cheese decreases when dulled by cold, so it is recommended that the cheese be removed from the refrigerator an hour or so before consumption to come to room temperature to ensure full flavour. The one exception is cottage cheese which is usually served chilled.

Next time cooking of cheese and recipes will be explored.


