# A TRIBUTE TO TONY

A large group of friends, from the many varied groups that Tony was involved with, gathered with Tony's wife, Dulcie family Bruce & Kathy, Paul, Simone and grandchildren Darren, Melissa and Lachlan to hear Jack Rae. Akoonah Park Committee President Labato, Tammy and Member for Gembrook pay tribute to the much respected community man.

Tony Rushton died in a car accident near Swan Hill on 6th April 2007.

Tony an electrician by trade had worked countless jobs for Akoonah Park including preparation work on the new Shed B where the plaque is set in a rock from the former Berwick Quarry now Wilsons Botanic Park. The Committee had wanted to recognise the

enormous contribution Tony had made to his community.

Tammy Lobato spoke of the many aspects of Tony's life including many of her own thoughts and reflections. "Tony is a person for whom it is not possible to pay too many tributes. He has left a lasting mark on so many people in the community and on so many local organisations and every person from each of those groups has nothing but the highest praise for him. That is a magnificent legacy that most of us will only ever aspire to."

# SHIRE REPORT

The 2008/2009 council budget provides for some exciting projects Beaconsfield. number one Capital Works project in this budget is the commencement of Stage 1 of the sports reserve Park Holm Road. Beaconsfield. \$1.56 million has been allocated to commence construction of new ovals at the reserve. Council is committed to construction of this reserve, despite not receiving any state government financial assistance.

The budget also includes:

\* \$100,000 for the
Beaconsfield Tennis Club
to construct a new club
pavilion.

\*\$450,000 for construction of new footpaths across the Shire, which will include new footpaths in Beaconsfield.

- \* \$150,000 towards the cost of a Youth Bus to provide outreach services including information/ programs and activities for young people in Cardinia's growth areas and rural townships.
- \* \$7500 towards the cost of a feasibility study for a future Beaconsfield Community Bendigo Bank.

TheBeaconsfieldTownship Strategy was prepared in 2001 and since that time significant changes have occurred. New residential/ commercial development in Beaconsfield and the construction of the Bryn Mawr link between Kangan Drive and Manuka Road in Casey, along with the construction of the Pakenham Bypass have changed traffic conditions on local roads.


Areview of the current Traffic Management Strategy for Beaconsfield has commenced. Consultation with relevant community groups will form an essential component of the Strategy review.

Council has completed its Gaming Survey of residents in Beaconsfield. Officer and Pakenham. Responses are currently being evaluated and the final report of results will be made public shortly. Meanwhile. the DSL's May Road Sport Club and Pakenham Racing Club's Gaming Venue Planning applications

have been withdrawn by the applicants.

Beaconsfield Progress Association has been successful in receiving a \$1600 from Council's 2008 Heritage Grant Scheme.

grant will The assist the BPA to restore the "Beaconsfield Park" sign which is located at the entrance to Beaconsfield Park and Recreation Reserve on the Corner of the Beaconsfield Emerald Road and the Old Princes Highway. I congratulate the BPA, particularly Ann Taylor for their efforts to preserve Beaconsfield's History.

# **CONQUERING KOKODA**

Local resident and mother of three, Marion Hayes recently completed an adventure of a lifetime by completing the infamous Kokoda Trail in Papua New Guinea.

Her trek commenced at the Owers Corner end of the trail, and took the trekkers north through 96 kilometres of rainforest to the village of Kokoda. Marion took the journey with ten other trekers led by Kokoda Spirit, a tour guide company. The trek took 9 long days to complete, with each day starting at 5.30 am and walking all day till 5.00 to 6.00 pm in the evening.

The weather conditions were very challenging, with

30 degree temperatures and high humidity and heavy rain most days. This made the trail very slippery and dangerous, with mud up to the knees in some areas.

Thanks to 6 months of training prior to the trip including 2 gym sessions a week and the 1000 steps at Ferntree Gully and Montrose fire trail every weekend, Marion managed to complete the trail with only one small blister on her foot. Asked if she would do it again, she said she would do it all again tomorrow!

# WOOD STREET PROPOSAL

Council in recent times have received some complaints regarding speeding vehicle activity along Wood Street, Beaconsfield. As a result, council arranged for a traffic survey to confirm these claims. The results indicated that there was some speeding activity.


Council has explored a number of options to address this issue. Council spoke to the local CFA, MAS and bus services to adopt a traffic management device that would address the speeding issue but did not impact on the operation of these stakeholders.


Council has previously used a treatment called speed/road cushions (at other locations) with some success. They are recycled rubber devices that are attached to the road pavement in the shape of speed humps (as

seen in the photographs). The advantages in using this product are:

- \* They are flexible enough to remove/relocate if there is a need
- \* Are sized as such that cars would need to slow down but the larger vehicles can straddle them, having minimal impact on response time for the emergency services
- \* They operate with minimal noise when compared to conventional speed humps

Council is considering such a treatment for Wood Street. Council is requesting feedback whether positive and negative for such possible treatment. Please contact Paul Healy, Manager Assets and Development at Cardinia Shire on phone 5945 4322

# NATURAL IS BETTER

Many people are surprised when I tell them that in my own household, I use butter in preference to margarine. as they mistakenly believe that margarine is healthier. Butter is a natural fat that, eaten in moderation. can be incorporated as part of a healthy eating plan. Although it does contain saturated fat, it also contains Vitamins A & E and is free from genetically modified (GM) ingredients.

Most margarines, on the other hand, contain GM ingredients, such as soy, cotton and corn. These are not labelled, since GM oils do not require labelling under existing regulations. Margarine is a synthetic food that is highly processed and far removed in terms of taste and ingredients from the natural butter that our grandparents used. Many brands of margarine also contain trans-fatty acids, which are far more damaging to heart health that the natural fats found in butter.

Yoghurt is another example of a product that can be a lot less healthy than it first appears, depending on what has been done to it. Many low fat yoghurts, for example, contain artificial thickeners to replace some of the creamy consistency that exists naturally in the full-fat product. So our efforts to only eat low-fat does not just mean the removal of fat, but also the addition of a whole heap of other components to play the role in taste and texture of the fat we have removed.

The more we fiddle with food, and it becomes a factory-processed item rather than something grown and produced on the land, the more likely we are to get it wrong. When we remove natural recognisable ingredients from our foodstuffs and replace them instead with manufactured. artificial substances. including GM substances, artificial colours and preservatives, we are relinquishing our health into the hand of corporations, denying our farmers a decent living. I hope you have received my recent Handy Hints Newsletter that provides detailed information about additives and preservatives and how to eat and live naturally to ensure your family's wellbeing.

On another note, it was wonderful to be able to announce extra funding early childhood for designed services improve the facilities children's centres. at Many facilities across Cardinia were successful receiving grants, including the Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Centre, which will receive \$3355.00 towards the costs of new shade sails. Beaconsfield Kindergarten has been granted \$4900.00 and Beaconsfield Out of School Hours Care & Vacation Program will receive \$5000.00. These grants for practical items such as playground equipment, heating, cooling, fencing



and water tanks, can make an enormous difference to the quality of the service provided.

I was also pleased to be able to launch the Volunteer Manual new the Beaconsfield for Neighbourhood Centre. which was funded by a \$2770 grant from the State Government's Victorian Volunteer Small Grants Program. The neighbourhood centre also runs a fantastic toy library which I would recommend to parents. The library offers a way to give children access to toys without having to buy them only to be discarded a few weeks later. Toy libraries, as well as an economical choice, are a good environmental option as well.

Please remember that I am always delighted to provide letters of support for local organisations applying for funding, so do not hesitate to contact my office if I can assist. Please contact my office also for advice or support on other matters.

# SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANTS' DESK

1st July 2008 From many changes have been introduced by the Government including recent Budget the amendments that will effect most taxpavers. Some of the important changes, include the following:

- 1. Personal Income Tax cuts apply from 1st July 2008. In addition, there will be further income tax cuts in the 2009/2010 and 2010/11 years.
- 2. The Low Income Tax Offset has been increased from \$750 to \$1.200 from 1st July 2008. Taxpayers eligible for this Tax Offset will not pay any income tax if their taxable income does not exceed \$14,000 (previously \$11,000 for 2007/08). Minors can earn annual income of \$2.667 before income tax is payable (previously \$1,667 for 2007/08).
- 3. The Child Care Tax Rebate has been increased effective from 1st July 2008 from 30% to 50% of out of pocket expenses and the maximum claim to \$7,500 per child (previously \$4,354). These amounts are paid by Family Assistance Office.
- 4. The new Education Tax Refund applies from 1st July 2008 for students undertaking primary or

- secondary studies. The families must be receiving Family Tax Benefit Part 'A'. The 50% tax offset is limited to \$375 per Primary School Child and \$750 per Secondary School Child.
- 5. Dependant Spouse Tax Offsets can only be claimed provided the taxpayers' income is less than \$150,000 for 2008/09 year onwards.
- 6. Family Tax Benefit Part 'B' can only be claimed by families where the primary income earner has an adjusted taxable income of less than \$150,000.
- 7. The eligibility to the Entrepreneurs Tax Offset from 1st July 2008, will only be available provided that the taxable incomes of the taxpayer and the family are less than \$75,000 and \$120,000 respectively.
- 8. Medicare Levy Surcharge thresholds have been increased from 1st July 2008 to \$100,000 for Singles and \$150,000 for a Family.

Make sure that you discuss your accountancy and taxation needs with your Accountant to ensure that you receive income tax benefits and Family Tax benefits that you are entitled to.

# FIRE SAFETY IN THE HOME

There are about 11,000 house fires in Australia each year. House fires are more prevalent in the winter months when people are using heaters, fires and other electrical equipment. Unfortunately 50 people die each year as a result of house fires. Working smoke alarms provide a vital early warning in the event of a fire to ensure that people sleeping in a house wake up and evacuate. Smoke alarms should be checked regularly and batteries replaced with the end of daylight savings. If you haven't changed the batteries in the last 12 months, do it now.

While a smoke alarm helps save lives in the event of a fire, there are many simple things you can do to prevent a fire occurring in the first place.

These include:

- Never leave cooking unattended
- -Never place electric cords, curtains, tea towels, and oven clothes to close to the stove.
- Never leave candles or oil burners left on at night or burning while you are not at home.
- Never leave electric blankets on while you are not around and don't rest heavy items on top of them.
- Never overload power points and power boards, and avoid using double adapters completely.
- Always extinguish cigarette butts before placing in a bin.
- Always clean lint filters in clothes dryers after each
- Ensure that chimneys for fireplaces and wood heaters are cleaned to avoid a build up of material in the chimney.





# **LOCAL HISTORY**

# HARDWARE STORES

Beaconsfield now has a large comprehensive hardware store.

Congratulations to Rohan Treasure on the opening of his new 'Home' Hardware store in June 2008 on Old Princes Hwy.

Rohan and his father Gerald Treasure originally opened Beaconsfield Timber and Hardware in Beaconsfield Avenue in 1983 and have provided an excellent service to local customers and residents with a good range of timber and hardware supplies along with helpful advice and friendly service.

Beaconsfield has a long history of excellent family owned and run hardware stores. The little wooden shop at No 26 Wood Street was Adamson's Hardware (pictured on page 20). This was originally started in 1906 by James Adamson supplied (senior) and hardware to Beaconsfield until 1983. residents Today the shop contains Attic quilts and Hairco.

James and Agnes Adamson came to Beaconsfield in 1888 and had six children James, Florence Grace, John, Effie, Robert and Arthur.

During the war, Arthur Adamson (1897-1983) the youngest son, helped his



father at the shop and then continued to run the store for many years whilst living on the premises until he died in 1983. Adamson's Hardware was also the agency for the State Bank which was quite busy. This store provided many of the needs of Beaconsfield residents from 1 screw (not sold in packets in those days) and the usual tools and hardware products.

Along with hardware, there was also tinned fruit and biscuits, again not sold in packets but stored in large biscuits tins and weighed out and sold in paper bags.

Every Sunday Arthur would ring the fire siren before going to Melbourne by train. Arthur was also generous in his sponsorship of beds for various hospitals in Melbourne.

His father James was a carpenter and joiner

by trade and built many homes in Beaconsfield and the Beaconsfield Public hall which stood on the highway and was demolished in 1974 when the highway was duplicated.

Brothers John, James and Robert Adamson all served in World War I and their pictures are on the Beaconsfield Roll of Honor Board which can be seen in the Beaconsfield Community Complex.

Bruce Adamson, grandson of James (senior) grew up and lived in Beaconsfield until late 1990's and currently living Chirnside Park. He has great recollections community life, the people and businesses in the town. The Adamsons were one of the early families in Beaconsfield and were very active in the community.







# Feline Fear and stressful situations...

There are many scenarios which can induce fear or stress into your household pet. Moving house is stressful enough for us, just imagine how it would be for your pet who has no clue as to what's going on. All of a sudden everything he or she has ever known is taken away and their world is turned upside down.

Even something as simple as rearranging the furniture can spook your household pet. Other situations which may induce fear or stress include trips to the vet, having visitors or new arrivals into the home.

So it's up to us to make these changes or transitions as stress free as possible for your pet. Start by keeping familiar toys or blankets and moving them into easily accessible areas so your pet is comfortable in its new surroundings.

For dogs, keep them occupied with toys or bones to chew. Re-assure them and normally you don't get many complications. With cats it is another story.

Stress in our feline friends can present a few different ways including:

- \* Urine marking
- \* Vertical scratching
- \* Loss of appetite
- \* Reduced desire to play/ interact
- \* Aggression
- \* Overgrooming
- \* Hiding
- \* Toileting problems.

But there is help! 'Feliway' is a synthetic form of a naturally occurring facial pheromone of cats.

Pheromones are used as a communication device between animals of the same species. Think of it as a different scent. For example, a cat can release warning pheromones to scare off another cat sexual pheromones attract them. The pheromones in Feliway convey a message of well-being and a feeling of security which we cannot detect, but can make a great deal of difference to them. Your cats are actually marking us with their facial pheromone when they rub up against your leg.

Feliway is available in two forms. A plug-in diffuser or a spray formula. The introduction of Feliway into the environment can comfort the cat and help prevent or control behavioural problems that may arise due to stress (such as those mentioned above).


