

COMMUNITY BANK PROSPECTUS LAUNCH

Graeme J Taylor - Director



A Public Meeting was held on 1stApril 2009 to officially launch the Prospectus to enable the raising of Share Capital necessary to set up the Beaconsfield District Community Bank branch of Bendigo Bank.

The Meeting was well attended by Pledgees and members of the community to hear from the Banks Chairman Michael Muaremov of the work done to date by Directors of Beaconsfield District Community Financial Services Ltd.



Special Guest Speakers were Michael Petering, Bendigo Bank Regional Manager for Mornington Peninsula area and also Jim Christie the Founding Chairman of the East Doncaster Community Bank who has provided great support and advice as Mentor to the Directors he detailed and benefits of a Community Bank. In addition, Bendigo Bank personnel attended to answer questions and meet attendees.

The next step in the process is to receive Share Capital of at least \$720,000. All pledgees should ensure that they complete a Share Application Form in the Prospectus and forward, together with a cheque for the Share Capital, to the address detailed in the Prospectus. Even if you did not complete a Pledge Form, you can still apply for shares by contacting

a Director to obtain a Prospectus. The Share Capital Offer will be closed when the minimum capital is received but no earlier than 23rd April 2009 so do not wait. The Share Capital raised on the night of the launch amounted to \$300,000.

After the required Share Capital has been received, the Beaconsfield District Community Bank will formalise a Lease and will proceed with the fitout of the Bank premises. In addition, staff will be employed and they will undertake training of 4 – 6 weeks in preparation of opening the Bank hopefully in June.



GOING SOLAR

The Federal Government has Grants of \$8,000 available for homeowners whose family taxable is less than income \$100,000 and who install Solar Panels to produce your own electricity. The Grant ends on 30th June 2009 when there will be an increase in renewable energy credits however this increase will almost certainly be less than the \$8,000 Grant.

The benefits of producing your own solar power include:

- generate power from the sun rather than relying mostly on coal powered electricity
- reduced carbon footprints

emitted from your home

- assists in having a cleaner atmosphere and protect against possible detrimental effects on the climate
- protects against rising electricity costs.

A typical 1kwh system will consist of 6 solar panels that are usually fixed onto a roof preferably facing N, W, NE or NW without interference from trees. An inverter converts to a mains voltage and a digital meter is connected. An existing analogue electrical switchboard would need replacement by a digital meter to read the amount of excess power generated. Solar power produced reduces daily usage and excess power is sold back to the grid.

After various rebates and credits including the Government Grant of \$8,000, a typical 1kwh system would cost in the vicinity of \$2,500. This cost would be recouped in 5 to 10 years. There are many suppliers and our local councils are supportive.

If you are interested it is best to act before 30th June 2009 to qualify for the \$8,000 Federal Government Rebate to reduce the net cost to homeowners and start producing solar power.

Assistance Is Available For 4c's Crisis Centre

The 4C's Crisis Centre is able to assist with payment of utility accounts, phone accounts, pharmacy and rent arrears.

If anyone needs help they can contact the centre for an appointment on a Tuesday or Thursday between 10.30am - 2.30pm. Also food assistance is available 5 days aweek between the same hours.

These services are open to any resident within the shire who may be in crisis. That means people who are on Centrelink, or wages.





Council Shows How To Wipe Out Graffiti

Community demonstrations of free graffiti removal kits, which are available as part of Cardinia Shire Council's commitment to crime prevention, were held on Saturday (28 March).

Chair of Cardinia Shire's Community Safety Committee Cr Brett Owen said the aim of the demonstrations was to show residents and businesses how to use the kits.

The demonstrations were held in Main St, Pakenham at 11am, near Bob Burgess Reserve in Beaconsfield at 1pm and in Murphys Lane in Emerald at 3pm.

"The aim of the demonstration was to show people how they can take

action against unsightly vandalism throughout the Shire by removing it from private or commercial property," Cr Owen said.

"The removal of 1000 incidences of graffiti during Council's Shirewide cleanup last year has gone a long way to improving the situation and the effort of residents and businesses to remove the new graffiti quickly will make a significant difference for the future," Cr Owen said.





SNIPPETS FROM THE **ACCOUNTANT'S** DESK

SMALL BUSINESS TAX BREAK

The Federal Government announced an additional tax deduction for capital investment by businesses. additional tax deduction applies assets used in carrying on a business for which a deduction is available under Capital Allowance (Depreciation) provisions under Division 40 ITAA 1997. The deduction allowed is in addition the usual Capital Allowance (Depreciation). Land, Intangible Assets. and Trading Stocks are ineligible.

The deduction is available when the asset is installed ready for use. The tax bonus applies to assets acquired from 13th December 2008 and by 31st December 2009.

respect of small businesses with a turnover of less than \$2 million a year, a deduction is available in the year of installing the assets, as follows:

- Minimum expenditure \$1,000
- Acquired between 13th December 2008 and 30th June 2009 and installed by 30th June 2010 -Deduction of 30%
- -Acquired between 1st July 2009 and 31st December 2009 and installed by 31st December 2010 -Deduction of 10%

In respect of businesses other than small businesses, the tax bonus applies to minimum expenditure threshold of \$10,000.

To claim the highest bonus deduction of 30%, the depreciable assets must be acquired by 30th June 2009. Discuss with your Accountant to ensure that you claim any tax deduction you are entitled

PLATYPUS BABY BOOM IN CARDINIA CREEK

Six new juvenile platypus were recorded in Cardinia Creek in the course of a survey conducted by Australian **Platypus** Conservancy biologists.

Platypuswerereintroduced to Cardinia Creek in 2004 by the APC and Melbourne Water after the original became population extinct following the Ash Wednesday bushfires. breeding Successful 2006 commenced in and has continued every vear since. The total of six babies encountered this year has set a new record, suggesting that the population is flourishing along this reliably flowing stream.

Director, Geoff APC Williams, said that the result was a great boost to the efforts to reestablish Cardinia Creek's population. However, he

warned that the success of the project was still at risk.

"The deaths of at least two platypus in folding "opera house" yabby traps last December was a clear reminder of the problems that platypus still face along Cardinia Creek and elsewhere," he said. "Soon these youngsters will set off to seek territories they can occupy as adults. Because they are small and inexperienced, they are particularly vulnerable to entering opera house nets (which have been prohibited in Victorian inland public waters since 2001) and then drowning."

In addition, the high level of litter found at some spots along Cardinia Creek poses a major hazard for the animals. Surveys across the metropolitan region have shown that many platypus have litter caught around them, interfering with their ability to swim and feed properly and often resulting in serious injury or death. Discarded nylon fishing line and a wide assortment of plastic rings - including such apparently innocuous as children's bracelets and the sealing rings found around the mouths of food jars and plastic milk containers - are particularly dangerous.

"The future of Cardinia Creek platypus reintroduction is ultimately in the hands of the community," said Geoff. "We urge everyone to watch out for illegal folding yabby and crayfish nets and report them immediately to Fisheries Officers on 13-FISH. We also hope everyone living around Melbourne will get behind efforts to keep litter out of the environment across the metropolitan area."

Cardinia Creek The platypus reintroduction project is the first of kind in Australia. At a time when many populations are under extreme threat because of prolonged drought and possible climate change, techniques being developed will potentially be valuable in the longterm conservation of this unique mammal.

Primary Schools Encouraged To Join Active Wednesdays

Bushfires A Sobering Reminder For Us All

The recent Victorian bushfires were an unwelcome reminder to many of the devastation which occurred twenty six years ago on Ash Wednesday when Upper Beaconsfield and Cockatoo were among the towns which were devastated by fire. It has been hard for us to come to terms with the massive loss of life and property with this year's tragedy. It has been harder still to envisage the scale of the tragedy when many of us believed that the loss of life on Ash Wednesday would never again be repeated.

Perhaps it is because so many people in this experienced Ash Wednesday first hand that I have been overwhelmed by the outpourings of generosity from those who wish to assist the bushfire survivors, whether with goods or money or time. It has also made us all question our practices and ask ourselves whether we have slipped into bad

habits and neglected to take the time to draw up fire plans and reduce fire hazards on our properties. The local CFA brigade does a wonderful job in educating and informing local communities with residents many new moving here who have never experienced bushfires before. However, it is up to all of us to take their advice seriously and commit to developing fire plans and sticking to them.

Withthe Royal Commission into these bushfires now underway, everyone has the opportunity to make a submission and provide input. I have also decided conduct my own community bushfire forums to gather information from residents and compile them into a submission. electorate Since my extends past Warburton, and includes large tracts of the Bunyip State Park as well as the O'Shannassy Dam and the Upper Yarra Dam, I had many residents who evacuated-not once, or twice, but many times over the course of a few weeks.

Beaconsfield residents are invited to participate in these forums and share their experiences suggestions. The first is scheduled for Monday 27 April, 7pm at the Warburton Mechanics Institute Hall in Warburton. There is another on Thursday 30 April, also commencing at 7pm, which will be held at the Gembrook Community Centre in Gembrook.

Alternatively, you can make your own submission to the Royal Commission by sending it to: Submissions, 2009 Victorian Bushfires Royal Commission, GPO Melbourne Box 4358, VIC 3001. The Royal Commission has its own website at www. royalcommission.vic. gov.au and telephone enquiries can be directed to Tel: 1800 243 650.

If you or anyone you know is in need of assistance

because of bushfire related issues, I would urge you to contact me as the State Government is providing many grants, including for businesses affected by the fires as well as for families needing financial and other assistance. The Victorian Bushfire Reconstruction and Recovery Authority also has a comprehensive website now operating at www.willrebuild.vic.gov. au with information on the types of support available.

Finally, I would like to say a special thank you to all those involved in the bushfire effort, particularly the CFA volunteers. I know Beaconsfield that the brigade helped save the Labertouche Primary School from burning down on Black Saturday which meant that children in this devastated community were able to at least have some parts of their life regain a semblance of normality.

Speaking Out

On 25 February 1956 Nikita Khrushchev was addressing the 20th Congress of the Party Communist of the Soviet Union. In his address he denounced Josef Stalin. For the first time in public a member of the elite listed some of the worst of the atrocities committed under Stalin.

From the auditorium came a shout, "And what were you doing at the time?" It was a pointed question: Khrushchev had been a loyal Stalinist and had worked closely with Stalin himself. Khrushchev had been part of Stalin's inner circle. Khrushchev looked up from his speech at the lectern and asked in a voice that was deadly: "Who said that?" There was utter silence in the hall. A silence of fear. To be arrested by the KGB was not a fate to contemplate. Into the silence Khrushchev said: "That's what I was doing".

Speaking out is always an uncomfortable thing to do. To be a "whistleblower" takes real fortitude. But a healthy society requires active and enquiring citizens. The best governments be they Local, State or Federal are those that are constantly being called to account and who are constantly being subjected to scrutiny.

If we wish to live in a society that is free of corruption and abuse then we must be willing to do at least some of the work of finding out what is going on and ask some of the awkward questions.

Meetings like local **Progress** Association meetings may look "Mickey-mouse" but it is at meetings like these that ordinary citizens like you and I express what we are thinking and ask questions. **Progress** Association meetings and their like are a constant reminder to our elected representatives that there are citizens deeply concerned for their society and who are willing to ask questions.



OLIVER

'Oliver', the Miniature Schnauzer, was going about his normal morning ritual of 'watering' the garden plants when his owner noticed that his urine was a strange dark brown colour. Examination at the Beaconsfield Vet Centre found this brown colour to be the result of blood in the urine. Furthermore. Oliver's urine also contained a number of unusual looking crystals.


Crystals are commonly found in the urine of animals that have underlying urinary tract problems. Larger stones within the bladder or even the bladder wall itself can act as a source for crystals in the urine. The condition of crystals within the urine is known as crystalluria and can have a

number of consequences for the animal. This ranges from being a source of infection, causing frequent and painful urination and even obstructing the urinary tract which can prevent urination and can ultimately lead to death.

X rays of Oliver's bladder were taken to determine if he had any larger stones. An impressive number of stones were detected and the decision was made to

remove them surgically.In total, a massive thirteen stones removed were from Oliver's bladder. The stones had an unusual sharp edged appearance and were sent off to Minnesota State University to be examined by specialist pathologists where they were finally identified as calcium oxalate crystals. In some cases it is possible to dissolve urinary stones by altering the pH of the urine through dietary modification however this was not possible in Oliver's case.


Oliver made a rapid and successful recovery from his surgery. He has since been placed on a special diet to reduce the chances of reformation in the future.



Not all activities however are so serious. On Saturday, lst April, Beaconsfield will be holding a community fair at the Squash Court grounds in Wood Street. Live music, an art show, barbecues and craft display plus much more is planned for this day. We invite any local organisation wishing to raise funds for themselves to participate with a stall. The purpose of the fair is mainly to recognise Yakkerboo Week. It is hoped that Miss Beaconsfield may officiate and that also Beaconsfield may enter a float in the grand procession on the weekend following.

Other activities of the Progress Association will include keeping a scrap book of local photos, newspaper cuttings and historical memorabilia as a permanent record.

The Jim Parkes Reserve was officially opened in February 1990 by the Pakenham Shire President Cr Ted Owen in response to a request from Beaconsfield Kindergarten in 'recognition of the many years of service Jim had given to the community and as the original trustee of the Beaconsfield Kindergarten.'

Jim and his twin brother were born in 1923 and the family lived in Wood Street, Beaconsfield. At the age of 6 he attended the one-roomed Beaconsfield Primary school.

His family later moved to Railway Avenue and Jim earned pocket money by selling and delivering newspapers. In 1937 at the age of 14 he left school and worked for the late Dick Cole in the butcher shop on the highway. The shop was later shifted to Wood Street.

In 1942, Jim joined the army and served for 5 years. He returned to Cole's butchery until the late 50's when the business was sold to Mr. Pat Sweeney and Jim was appointed manager. Jim finally bought the business in 1968 and formed Beaconsfield Meat Supply.

He built up one of the best butcher shops in the district. Later his son Bryan took over the business. It

was a traditional butcher shop with sawdust on the floor and meat hanging in the cool room.

Jim is especially remembered for his support and involvement in the local community.


He was the first life member of the Beaconsfield Football Club and served as secretary and then President. He was also secretary of the public hall committee and enjoyed being MC at the local dances. (The Old Public Hall was built by the Adamson family and on the Old Princes Hwy near the Beaconsfield Hotel, but was demolished in the early 1970's when the highway was duplicated.)

Jim also served on committees of the Recreation Reserve Committee, Beaconsfield Primary School and the Scout Group. He was a trustee of the Beaconsfield War Memorial and the Beaconsfield Kindergarten.

Jim was able to be present at the opening of the Reserve and also at the Beaconsfield Primary School Centenary celebrations before his death later in the same year.

Today the play equipment in the reserve has been renewed and some new trees planted, but this park is as popular as ever as a playground for children and walking area for Beaconsfield residents. Jim's park is on the corner of Horner and Souter Street, Beaconsfield.





While Baz Luhrmann may have tried hard to tell a true Aboriginal story, his efforts with 'Australia' pale in significance when compared to the story that writer/director Warwick Thornton tells in new film 'Samson & Delilah'.

This is one film that does not hold back its punches and shows a side of Australia that most Australians would prefer to pretend doesn't exist. Samson (Rowena McNamara) and Delilah (Marissa Gibson) live in an Aboriginal community in the middle of the Northern

Territory. Samson only gets through each day thanks to his petrol sniffing habit and his now-present crush on Delilah. When tragedy strikes Delilah and boredom finally gets the best of Samson the pair head for the bright lights of Alice Springs where they hope they can turn their lives around.

What makes this film so special is that Thornton manages to incorporate the Aboriginal way of communicating without using words. The silence and glances between McNamara and Gibson

say more than ten pages of dialogue could ever do... and their performances are some of the best we have seen in Australia for a long time. While 'Samson & Delilah' may not be the easiest film to watch it is one that will have a lasting impact on anyone that sees it. You will be talking about it for ages afterwards.

Another great film to check out is Irish film 'A Film With Me In It'. A film that shows once and for all just how great a comedic talent, Dylan Moran (from TV's 'Black Books') really is. This black comedy has the potential of making an audience laugh until they cry... it certainly did to all the reviewers in the media screening I attended.

I won't give away much about the storyline of 'A

Film With Me In It' as this is the kind of film where you needed to be shocked (and in hysterics) as things unfurl throughout the film.

These two great films are well worth a look and don't forget that the countdown for the new 'Harry Potter' film has finally started. It should be here June/July.

OUR NATURAL WORLD

Our world is full of mysterious happenings and events which do not always lend themselves to rational explanations. events often These appear in daily papers, magazines, and various media reports. The Nuns who were present thought he would catch fire on the candles but moments later he flew back down the Church and began to dance and sing as he chanted the name of the Virgin.

Later when in the presence of the Pope, he was again filled with ecstasy and rose into the air. He continued to do so during the remainder of his life—he lived to be sixty—witnessed by hundreds of people. He rose into the air like a balloon every time he was overwhelmed by sudden joy. His case is the most witnessed and

documented example of levitation on record.

Another well known case was that of Daniel Dunglas Home, a remarkable Medium of 19th century England. He was a gifted Medium but his biggest event was in levitation. In August 1852 sitting in a circle he floated up to the ceiling, a feat that became virtually his trademark.

One day, surrounded by many of the leading lights of English Society of the time, he levitated and floated out of a first story window above the street, and floated back inside through another open window a little way along. Even Royalty of the day witnessed these amazing events and is well documented by people of good repute. His long life of inexplicable acts were never found to be false even though many tried to discredit him.

These are just a handful of mysteries, there are thousands more, and others just as strange. The world we live in is stranger than we know, and I believe this to be a good thing. Without mystery, life is empty.





TALKING WEATHER

The weather in the last 2 months has been some of the most extreme conditions ever seen in the Melbourne area.


The rainfall in February was only 2mm which fell on the 3rd. The rest of the month was hot with the hottest day being Saturday 7th when it reached the hottest Melbourne day ever at 46.4c. The average temperature for February was 28c. The monthly total of 2mm is the lowest February total since 1991.

March there was 58mm of rain which fell over 7 days. The highest daily total for March was 20mm which fell on the 14th. This took the yearly total to 73mm. This is just less than at the same time last year. The average Melbourne daily temperature was 24.3c.

The total rainfall of 73mm is the lowest since 1997 when there was only 32mm recorded in the first three months.

Cardinia Shire Council's Environmental Health team are encouraging families to immunise against Pertussis, which is commonly know as whooping cough.

State health authorities have reported a marked increase in cases cough whooping Victoria.

The number of notified cases increased sharply, with a 48 per cent increase occurring between December 2007 and December 2008, in Victoria.

has been There increase in the number of cases in babies aged less than 12 months, with 55 cases in 2008 compared to 25 in 2007.

Pertussis is most serious in babies under 12 month of age often requiring admission to hospital.

Council's Senior **Environmental** Health Officer. Gareth Little-Hales said children are immunised at two, four, six months, at four years of age and in year ten as part of the National Immunisation Program to guard against the disease.

"A child which has received less than three doses of pertiussis containing vaccine is considered at risk of pertiussis.

"Much of the concern around parents contracting the disease and then passing it on to children who may have not had a full course of the vaccinations."

Apertussis booster vaccine is recommended for adults before planning pregnancy, for both parents as soon as possible after the birth of a child, for adults working or caring for very young babies, especially childcare workers, and any adult wishing to protect themselves.

"Parent and grandparents can attend our routine session immunisations and receive a single does Boostrix to protect themselves and their families from the disease," Mr Little-Hales said.

The cost is \$36 per person.




