





SLOW INTERNET IN BEACONSFIELD

Have you noticed that sometimes your internet access is really, really slow, particularly at night time and the weekend and on school holidays? Yu might notice that websites take a long time to load (f at all) and that anything that requires interactivity (such as online games) are virtually impossible to play.

If you are a resident of Berwick Views/Bowman's Track and probably most new parts of Beaconsfield and Officer), you connect to the internet for your ADSL via a Remote Integrated Multiplexer (or RIM)- one of the big green boxes you see around the estate (like the one on Beaconsfield-Emerald Road in front of the lake)

No matter which internet service provider (SP) you choose to use for your ADSL service, your connection is delivered to you through this big box which Telstra own. Even if you choose another ISP for your internet service, you have to use this Telstra infrastructure.


This is because the RIM you are connected to is oversubscribed. That means that too many people are trying to get

their internet service through the RIM and this slows the internet to a crawl. This slow down in performance is called 'congestion'. The only way to fix this congestion is for Telstra to upgrade the RIM. And they are refusing to do this.

We have been complaining to our ISP for the last 10 months about the slow speed. They conducted investigations and asked Telstra to do the same. Telstra investigated and confirmed that the problem with the slow internet was congestion. However. even though Telstra have admitted there are issues with internet speed, they have no plans to upgrade capacity".

So we are all paying for a service that Telstra know is defective, yet they refuse to fix.

If you are sick of slow internet, websites taking a long time to load and not being able to play your favourite online games, speak to your ISP so they can in turn pressure Telstra to upgrade the capacity on these RIMs and provide us all with the service we're paying for.



Beaconsfield CFA Getting Ready For Summer

Council Steps Up To Improve Pedestrian Access

Have you ever had the experience of trying to navigate through chairs, tables and signage unnecessarily blocking the footpath while you are shopping?

Dangerously cluttered footpaths will now be a thing of the past with the introduction of guidelines for footpath trading coming into effect on 1 August 2009.

Over the past 12 months Council has been footpath investigating throughout trading Cardinia Shire in order to manage and maintain pedestrian safety, traffic flow and improve visual The outcome amenity. of Council's investigation is the introduction

the Footpath Trading Code which will ensure a consistent approach to the issuing of Footpath Occupancy Permits and compliance with the Disability Discrimination Act 1992.

ManagerofLocalLawsAlan Giachin said the Footpath Trading Code has been introduced to maintain a practical balance between pedestrian safety and the activities of traders, as well as regulate all commercial activities on footpaths across the Shire to achieve fairness and equity between traders.

"The Code is designed to ensure that Cardinia's shopping experience remains as enjoyable as possible for all people

who live, work in or visit the Shire, while at the same time ensuring that everyone in the community is able to exercise their right to access our footpaths in a safe, dignified and unhindered manner," Mr Giachin said.

Under the Disability Discrimination Act, it is against the law for any public place to be inaccessible to people with a disability. This includes shops and department stores and public footpaths and walkways.

The aims of the Footpath Trading Code are to improve access and safety benefits for everyone through improved traffic flow and sightlines for pedestrians and traffic, as well as improved business amenity and appeal for traders and shoppers in Cardinia Shire.

"Many other Councils who have strip shopping areas have similar policies. We are looking forward to working with everyone to ensure the best possible outcome for businesses and compliance the Footpath Trading Code and the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 in Cardinia Shire." Mr. Giachin said.

SNIPPETS FROM THE **ACCOUNTANT'S** DESK

HENRY REVIEW OF **TAXATION**

Dr Henry is currently reviewing the taation system and will provide a Report to Commonwealth the Government during December 2009 on his recommendations. The measures will include the simplification of the tax system for the benefit of Australian tapayers.

In late October 2009 some proposals were leaked and were reported in the media. The Henry Report is exected to recommend that wage and salary earners will receive a mini" one page income tax return and will be allowed to claim standard work deductions rumoured to be \$00.

Currently employees claiming more than \$00 work deductions must have receipts and be able to substantiate deductions but without limiting the amount claimable. The approach of a standard deduction goes back many years before the substantiation requirements. Many tapayers are entitled claim more than \$00 in deductions and tapayers may receive much smaller income tax refunds than previously. recommendations could also result in the abolition of income tax returns adopting United Kingdom model. Consideration must also be directed on the impact of up to 40 tax offsets to which tapayers may be currently entitled to.

The Henry Report is creating much anticipated interest and all tapayers familiarise should themselves and make their opinions known otherwise income tax refunds may be substantially reduced. The Accounting bodies and Taation Associations will be active in voicing their opinions.





Christmas Wish for No More Violence

Christmas is a time of peace and joy across the community, as we mark one of the most important days on the religious calendar and enjoy holiday time with friends and family.

Unfortunately for some, however, Christmas can also be a time of incredible stress and unhappiness, as family budgets are stretched and people spend more time with each other than usual, so that emotions may spill over.

One of the most common ways this stress is played out in the community is the increase in the incidence of family violence, most commonly inflicted by men against women.

This violence takes many forms but new VicHealth research released in November has shown that 75,000 women across the country each year experience violence by a current or former partner.

It also showed that the number of Australian women who experience sexual assault each year would fill every single seat in the MCG with another 20,000 women in the standing room areas.

These distressing figures not only demonstrate that human right abuses are occurring right here and now in our communities, but these abuses also come at a tremendous cost, both in human terms and in economic ones.

Violence is still the biggest single cause of death, disability and ill-health in women between the ages of 15 to 44. It impacts on women in all social classes and cultures, in every suburb and town.

The government has initiated a number of prevention initiatives to address this massive problem in communities, including in workplaces

and football clubs as well as in community health programs. VicHealth is currently investing just over \$2 million in violence prevention programs across a variety community settings. addition, police officers have greater powers to intervene to address this issue and people are being encouraged to speak up about these crimes rather than maintaining a veil of silence.

However, we all have a role in shaping our communities to be respectful and supportive of its citizens and creating safe and welcoming environments. This Christmas, we need to demonstrate by our actions and attitudes that we care for those around us and we are not prepared to let others be subjected to inappropriate behaviour, or violence or abuse.

I urge each of you to take up the challenge this Christmas and help



your homes, workplaces and social functions be occasions that embody the Christmas spirit of peace and love and provide safe environments for all women, children and men to enjoy, free of violence.

Beware of What You Feed Your Pets

Feeding pets food that we enjoy is not only wrong, it can also be fatal. There are some foodstuffs that humans enjoy which cause illness and even death if eaten by pets.

Macadamia nuts, garlic, chocolate, pips and onions are good examples. Each of these foods contains chemicals which rarely cause problems for humans, but for dogs, these same chemicals can be deadly.

Onion and garlic poisoning

Onions and garlic contain the toxic ingredient thiosulphate. An ingredient that causes sickness in dogs, cats and also livestock.

All forms of onion can be a problem including dehydrated onions, raw onions, cooked onions and table scraps containing cooked onions and/or garlic. Left over pizza, Chinese dishes and commercial baby food containing onion, sometimes fed as a supplement to young pets, can cause illness.

The poisoning occurs a

few days after the pet has eaten the onion. At first, pets affected by onion poisoning have vomiting and diarrhoea, show no interest in food and will be dull and weak. Your animal may become breathless and have red urine.

While garlic also contains the toxic ingredient thiosulphate, it seems that garlic is less toxic and large amounts would need to be eaten to cause illness.

The danger of macadamia nuts

The toxic compound is unknown but the affect of macadamia nuts is to cause locomotory difficulties. Dogs develop a tremor of the skeletal muscles, and weakness or paralysis of the hindquarters. Affected dogs are often unable to rise and are distressed, usually Some affected dogs have swollen limbs and show pain when the limbs are manipulated.

Dogs have been affected by eating as few as six macadamia kernels (nuts without the shell). Some dogs had also been given macadamia butter and icecream.

Avocados

The toxic ingredient in avocado is called persin. Symptoms include difficulty breathing, abdominal enlargement, and abnormal fluid accumulations in the chest, abdomen and sac around the heart.

Pips!

Pear pips, the kernels of plums, peaches and apricots and apple core pips all contain cyanogenic glycosides resulting in cyanide poisoning.

Signs can occur within 15-20 min to a few hours after animals consume toxic pips. Excitement can be displayed initially, accompanied by rapid respiration rate. Breathlessness follows shortly, with increased heart Salivation. excess rate. tears, and voiding of urine and feces may occur. Muscle tremors are common and progresses to generalised spasms before death. Gums are bright red but may become blue terminally. It is very important that you do not let your animals eat pips! In addition to cyanide toxicity the pips can get stuck in the intestines and cause a blockage.

Chocolates

It may seem like a good idea to give your dog a piece of chocolate as a treat for good behaviour but this can be a major mistake!

Chocolate contains theobromine which is known to be toxic to dogs. After eating chocolate, signs of toxicity may arise within 24hrs and may last up to three days. These signs usually include vomiting, stomach pain, salivation, increased thirst and urination, wobbliness and restlessness. In severe cases there may also be diarrhoea, tremors and even seizures and death.

If you know your pet has eaten chocolate you should seek veterinary assistance immediately. Generally the more they eat and the darker the chocolate, the worse the outcome.

Raisins

With Christmas just around the cornerthe consumption of grapes and raisins presents a potential health threat to dogs. It causes acute renal failure with anuria (a lack of urine production).

The reason why some dogs develop renal failure following ingestion of grapes and raisins is not known. Types of grapes include both seedless and seeded.

Clinical signs are vomiting diarrhoea. this often the first symptoms of grape or raisin toxicity. This occurs within a few hours of ingestion. Pieces of grapes or raisins may be present in the stool. Further symptoms include weakness. not eating, increased drinking. and abdominal pain. Acute renal failure develops within 48 hours of ingestion.

Pets' owners should not assume that human food is always safe for pets. Be sure that your pets can't get into your stash of chocolates, that food scraps are disposed of carefully to prevent onion and garlic toxicity and is prevented from picking up macadamia nuts.

HISTORY OF 1ST BEACONSFIELD SCOUT HALL

Scouting began in Beaconsfield in February, 1957 with twelve boys between ages of eight and eleven years, being the foundation members of the Cub Pack. Meetings were held in the Public Hall that was next to the Hotel. This hall was later demolished to make way for the dual highway.

At the start of 1959 the Scouts had their meetings in a building on the cnr. Wood Street and Beaconsfield Avenue, which once was a Slipper Factory and belonged to Mrs Kath Roberts.

In the beginning of 1962 we moved to the Buffalo Lodge Hall in Railway Avenue,



which later became the Dancing School. This building had previously been the Tynong State School.

The Railways Department in July 1964 granted the Group the lease of land 74 ft x 130 ft. in Beaconsfield Avenue, for a period of 21 years. The rental was three pounds per year and the Committee held a fete at the end of that year and raised another 120 pounds.

"Work begins on the New Hall" was the headline in the local paper in April, 1966. With many hours of voluntary work, and money raised from very successful Bazaars, regular waste paper and bottle collections, the Committee had \$1000 in hand by the end of the year and were able to get the Hall to lock up stage.

The Scout Hall was officially opened on 3rd May 1969 by the then Scout Headquarters Commissioner – John

Campbell. There were 180 people in attendance. including many local and Scouting dignitaries. It was a very proud day for all people associated with the Group. At that stage the Hall structure ended level with the front porch and included the kitchen and Scouters' Den. It was extended in 1971. The walls and ceiling were also lined in later years.

In the latter part of 2008, the Scout Association was informed that due to asbestos contamination the Beaconsfield Scout Hall would have to be demolished.

After serving the training and the needs of many of the youth members of the local community for 40 years, the Scout Hall was finally demolished in May, 2009.







As a general rule when comedy and horror collides it is a good idea to run for the hills (the ones without eyes) and hide until it's gone, but with 'Zombieland' that rule goes right out the window. In fact 'Zombieland' even out does 'Shaun Of The Dead' and certainly deserves to be mentioned among some of this year's best films.

Columbus (Jesse Eisenberg – 'Adventureland', 'The Hunting Party') is one of the small number of people who have managed to survive a worldwide

zombie outbreak... sums it up by declaring, "this is no longer the United States Of America, it is the United States Of Zombie". Columbus has survived this long because he has a set of rules he follows as he tries to head home to see if his parents have survived the onslaught. Along the way he meets Tallahassee (Woody Harrelson - '2012', 'Defendor'). rough nut who has discovered he is an expert zombie killer. When they team up with the untrustworthy, (Emma Stone Wichita - 'Paper Man', 'Ghosts Of Girlfriends Past') and Little Rock (Abigail Breslin - 'My

Sister's Island', 'Nim's Island'), they realise the only way to survive is to try and work together.

The writers of 'Zombieland' are clearly talented. Each of the characters are three dimensional in that they all have personalities and quirks of their own... there are no one-dimensional cutouts to be seen. And while the story probably could have gone further there is enough suspense. humour and even a few touching moments to keep the film chugging enjoyably along. The fact that the team have managed to incorporate both horror and comedy without letting either side lack savs a lot about their ability... so many have tried this and fallen well short.

Director, Ruben Fleischer ('The Girls Guitar Club'. TV's 'Jimmy Kimmel Live') shows a lot of potential as a director. He brings a great 'style' to this film that is new and inventive. Even small things like having the various 'rules' appear throughout the film (you'll know what I'm talking about when you see it) is a small stroke of genius. It was a risk but it works amazingly well. He is also well backed up by his cast. While all are very good Jesse Eisenberg Woody Harrelson are standouts. Eisenberg is certainly an actor on the rise, he was what made 'Adventureland' such an enjoyable film, and here in 'Zombieland' he once again plays 'the lonesome loser' to a tee. And following up from his standout performance in '2012' Harrelson has once again shown Hollywood that he is worth considering for any of the quirky roles out there.

'Zombieland' is one of the big surprises of the year. I'd be lying if I said that I was looking forward to this film, I was convinced it would be bad, really bad. Instead I was pleasantly surprised. This is one time where the comedy/horror crossover works amazingly well, and I'm proud to say that this is one of my films of the year..



TALKING WEATHER

Weather was again a talking point in the media for the month of November.

The month started out with a string of hot days and finished with a lot of rain. Melbourne once again lived up to its reputation of four seasons in one day on more than one occasion.

November saw 121mm of rain; this was well above the November average of 69mm. While 121mm is not the highest total it was much needed rain for the area before the long hot summer.

The highest daily total was 57mm. This fell on the 21st of November. This rain which fell overnight in Beaconsfield caused some minor flooding on the Sunday morning.

The heavy down pours and storms that moved through the area on the 26th caused havoc in places bringing down trees and causing further minor flash flooding.


The yearly total now sits at 774mm which is 246mm above the same point as last year. Beaconsfield has almost eclipsed it yearly average which sits at 776mm.

While the rain was helpful it only took the storage level to 37.9% his is still higher than the same time as last year.

With a long hot summer ahead of us, now is the time to make every drop count.



Justin has had a good start to the year. After 7 rounds


he has made 183 runs and taking 12 wickets. We wish Justin all the best for the remainder of the season.


Training for all players is extremely important as it gives players both senior and junior a chance to work on their game and improve vital aspects of the game. For all training details go to the club website.

Make A Scarecrow

appearance and personality of your scarecrow is only limited by your imagination

You will need:

- * Strong sticks one as high as yourself and the other half as high
- * Old pair of overalls
- * Old shirt
- * Old hat, pair of gloves,
- Old pantyhose for tying
- * Old pillow case to cover the head
- * Newspaper
- * Masking tape and glue
- * Paint for the face of buttons sew on to the face
- * Bright coloured wool
- Straw (newspaper or plastic bags can be used as an alternative)

Method:

 Tie the sticks firmly together with the old pantyhose. The shorter stick is for the arms and is

- tied at right angles to the taller stick a little way down from the top.
- 2. Wind the newspaper around the top end of the taller stick to make the head. Use masking tape to keep it together.
- Cover the newspaper with a pillow case. Paint or sew a face on to it. Glue or sew on some wool for hair. 4. Place the long stick down
- one leg of the overalls and put each end of the shorter stick through the shirt and overall arms.
- 5. Stuff the overalls with straw until they make a firm body.
- 6. Place the hold hat on its head, the scarf around it neck and tie in the gloves. Put some straw n the pockets
- 7. Tie the scarecrow to a stake if you want it stand upright in the garden.
- 8. Give your scarecrow a name. 7


