

SHIRE REPORT

by Councillor Brett Owen, Central Ward

At the December council meeting, council resolved to refuse to grant a permit for the proposed Hill Hotel, May Road, Beaconsfield. The application had included a proposal for 60 electronic machines. gaming Reasons for refusing the permit included the lack of car parking, inappropriate access to the site, the impact on the amenity of nearby residents and that the installation of gaming machines in the premises would have had a detrimental social and economic impact the community, particularly having regard to the proximity Beaconsfield the Community Complex and the community attitude towards gaming. applicant has since lodged an appeal against council's refusal at the Victorian and Civil Administrative Tribunal (VCAT), A hearing date for the appeal has not vet been set.

Federal and State elections will both be held in 2010. In the lead up to these elections, council

will be communicating and meeting with candidates seeking support commitments. election Some of these priorities in Beaconsfield will include the installation of traffic signals at the intersection Old Princes Hwy of and Princes Freeway. additional car parking Beaconsfield Railway Station car park and additional financial assistance towards the development of the reserve in Holm Park Road.

Council will be reviewing the Beaconsfield Township Strategyin2010. Thereview will see a Beaconsfield Structure Plan replace the Beaconsfield Township Strategy which adopted in 2001. Council willbeconductingextensive community consultations in the first half of this year to obtain the community's input. encourage residents to become involved in the process by attending the community sessions conducted council planners, making submissions and by attending meetings of the Beaconsfield **Progress** Association.

NOTICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL CLEAN-UP Beaconsfield Avenue, Beaconsfield



Environmental clean-up works will be carried out on railway land at Beaconsfield Avenue.

Starting in late January, VicTrack is carrying out an \$80,000 environmental clean-up of railway land at Beaconsfield Avenue Beaconsfield. In partnership with expert environmental consultants and a clean-up firm, VicTrack will remove soil at the site that is contaminated with asbestos and complete a general site clean-up.

Expert environmental tests and a plan for the clean-up

In 2009, environmental experts AECOM were asked to survey the site buildings and assess the soil for potential asbestos contaminated materials. Asbestos was identified in the two buildings and the soil, which led to a plan to clean-up the site, including the demolition of the two buildings, completed last year. VicTrack worked with Scouts Australia to deal with asbestos on site.

The site was fenced off to ensure the community could not come into contact with the asbestos. Experienced asbestos removalist company, Zealmore (aust) Pty Ltd will conduct the clean-up works over several weeks. Work areas will be defined with appropriate work practices and safety signage to ensure the safety of the community.

Ouestions and Answers

O. What's planned for the asbestos clean-up?

 VicTrack is carrying out an \$80,000 environmental clean-up of railway land at Beaconsfield Avenue Beaconsfield starting in late January.

In partnership with expert environmental consultants and a clean-up firm, VicTrack will remove soil at the site that is contaminated with

Works will include a general site and weed clean-up and the removal of the asbestos

O. What's the extent of asbestos at the site?

A. A number of expert environmental studies into land use at Beaconsfield identified asbestos in the two meeting halls previously on site.

Q. How has VicTrack protected community health?

A. There is no direct threat to community health. Once asbestos was identified in the buildings and soil on site, VicTrack, in liaison with the tenants, worked through a plan to remove all asbestos from the site.

Once the buildings were safely demolished the site was fenced off. VicTrack is now working with an expert asbestos removalist firm to ensure that the site can never be a risk to community health and that it can be used for future transport and community purposes.

Q. What are the benefits of the clean-up for the community?

A. VicTrack has invested over \$100,000 in the clean-up of site. The removal of the asbestos-ridden buildings and the asbestos in the soil will remove any risk to community health. The works will also improve the visual amenity of railway land and allow for future transport or community uses for the site

Q. What are the working hours for the clean-up?

A. Starting in late January 2010, hours of work will be limited to 7.00am - 6.00pm Monday to Friday

A. VicTrack is owner of Victorian railway land. VicTrack adds value to railway assets through supporting rail operations, undertaking station and car park upgrades and other activities

Alex's Sahara Stroll

In April, starting on the 4th of April and finishing on the 10th, local "lad" Alex Williams will be flying the Aussie flag across the Sahara desert in Morocco. Alex is walking 250km across some of the harshest landscape on the planet in temperatures up to 50C, while carrying all of his gear, safety equipment and food on his back.

Alex is taking this as an opportunity to highlight for the public the vital difference between type 1 and type 2 diabetes. Alex is himself a type 1 diabetic, having been diagnosed with this life threatening illness at the age of 17. As our "lad" is now 53, that means he has managed this awful illness for 36 having years. around 36,000 injections (so far) in order to stay alive.

The training for this year's Marathon des Sables started in May 2008. Since then Alex has covered

3000 between 5000km in training all over and around Beaconsfield. Officer, Pakenham and all parts in between. You may have seen him slugging along with his desert hat on. As with so many things associated with type 1 diabetes, he has had to do more training than other people to prepare for the event. Not only did he have to prepare himself physically, he had to relearn everything he knew about his food, his insulin and controlling his blood sugar levels. He will be facing a life or death challenge in the Sahara, so needed all the training and practice he could get to lessen the dangers.

Alex has been recording his experiences during his training in an online blog, which you can find at www.train2gain. biz/My_Sahara_Stroll_2010/nhome.html. You will be able to follow Alex's progress on the



web as he crosses the Sahara, as he is carrying a satellite tracking device that automatically shows where he is on a web page. You will find the link in his training blog.

There are 98,000 people following Alex's progress on Facebook, where he has been able to show many other type 1 diabetics around the world that their illness needn't stop them from doing adventurous things.



SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

TAX/BAS AGENT REGISTRATIONS

The tax and accounting profession are about to undergo major changes with the introduction of the new Tax Agents Services Act 2009. It will affect existing Tax Agents and also Business Activity Statement (BAS) preparers. A new eleven member Tax Practitioners Board has been announced to replace existing State based Boards.

Tax Agents and BAS Agents will be required to register with the Tax Practitioners Board. Both Agents will be required to follow a National Code of Conduct. Tax Agents currently registered will only need to apply when their current registration comes up for renewal.

However, BAS Agents who charge a fee for related advice including preparation of BAS Returns will now need registration with the Tax Practitioners Board. A person who

only enters data, prepares bank reconciliation etc. on instructions provided may not need registration. The new requirements for registration include a mixture of qualifications, experience and meeting the fit and proper person's test.

The scheme is due to commence on 1st March 2010. Guidelines are not yet available but may require Professional Indemnity Insurance and Professional Development training.

Ensure that the Tax Agent or BAS Agent that you use is registered with the Tax Practitioners Board and meets the guidelines and Code of Conduct. The objective is to enhance consistent high standards and make Agents accountable for penalties if they fail to meet the ethical standards.

I was saddened to learn of the closure of 'The Organic Source' in Beaconsfield as not only was it a unique shop selling fresh wholesome produce, its owners Darren and Denise Powell are passionate advocates for food free of genetic modification. I wish the Powell family all the best with their future endeavours.

Darren'spassiontranslated into local advocacy for Beaconsfield residents when the news broke late last year that genetically modified crops being secretly grown right here in the local area in a property along Soldiers Rd. He was one of many locals who stood alongside me to protest against experimentation this on our doorsteps. With so many children living in Beaconsfield, and a considerable number suffering from already allergy problems, it is distressing to think that children have now been

exposed to the potential from genetically risks modified crops.

The risks from the crop exacerbated by were extensive sewerage works at the property which meant that contaminated soil could have spread throughout the district. I immediately intervened with the City of Casey and South East Water and after raising my concerns, both authorities agreed to implement best practice measures. This meant that all vehicles and machinery were thoroughly cleaned, the construction site was fenced off and sediment control mechanisms were put in place. Both South East Water and the City of Casey correctly realised that genetically modified crops pose a genuine risk to both human and health. environmental However, it is a pity that concerns have to be raised in order to get some action, instead of comprehensive management plans being

put in place when these crops are grown. I will advocate continue to protection stronger for residents, especially for those too young to advocate for themselves.

On a happier note, a new cookbook titled 'Creating Cooks' has been launched designed to encourage children to learn to cook and understand food and what it means for our health. I was fortunate to be asked to contribute to the book, both with a recipe and in the foreword. It is a terrific way to introduce children to the various skills required for food preparation. Anyone who would like a copy of the book for the very reasonable price of \$10 can contact my office. All proceeds go to the Children's Whole Health Foundation.

On the planning front, many residents would know that I lodged an objection to the 'Pink Hill' proposal for



a large hotel and gaming venue adjacent to the Beaconsfield Community Complex. The application was rejected by council but the decision is now being appealed at VCAT. I will continue to advocate for residents who are firmly opposed to such a development which is totally out of keeping with the local area. Just maybe those thousands of millions of folk who pray to God every day are more in touch with reality than we may dare to believe. Just maybe those untold millions who claim to know Jesus are on to something.



BRUISES ON THE INSIDE

By Jennifer Hepburn

Jennifer Hepburn's story of psychological and emotional abuse certainly isn't unique, but her choice to share it with others is. Jennifer has bravely written her account of her experience of a type of abuse which is all too common but not easily talked about. Her debut book 'Bruises on the Inside' shows that while broken bones and bruises will eventually heal, these forms of abuse can sometimes take far longer, hence the title for the book. It was the drive to help other people in abusive relationships that motivated her to share her story. 'Many people don't know that what they are living in constitutes abuse' says Ms Hepburn. 'It is often not until they are out of the relationship, as I did, that they realise just how abusive it really was.'

Jennifer was married to her abusive partner for 10 years, sharing a son Marcus, adopted daughter Julitha and a daughter from her previous marriage Beccy. She said the abuse began very quickly, but she ignored it, as so many do, because she yearned for love and he seemingly 'swept her off her feet'. 'You want to protect the dream of the love you believe you have found. And you feel the shame that it has happened so when he apologizes, as he always does, you want to put it in the past. You desperately want to believe him.'

But when it came to protecting her children, in 2004 Jennifer decided she needed to finally leave. "I realised that it was no longer just me who had to deal with this, but my children were being raised in this environment. We

had 'walked on eggshells' for so long. We lived to accommodate his needs and anticipate his moods."

So finally in 2005 she worked up the courage to leave, "but it took a good six months to break free". Ms Hepburn said she was stalked and harassed by her abuser for months after leaving.

It can also be difficult for people leaving, as Ms Hepburn experienced, as this is the most dangerous time, when his violent behaviour can escalate because the abuser cannot cope with losing control. 'It is important to know what to do to protect yourself and where to go for support' says Ms Hepburn. "I have included practical advice in the book, not only on how the abuser targets their victim and how their mind works, but also where to find the support that is so critical. I also hope to have answered the most asked questions like 'Why does she keep going back? Why doesn't she just leave?'

Not all abuse is physical as Ms Hepburn's book shows. 'It was the mind games that broke me,' she says. After Ms Hepburn finally broke free, he turned his attention to their two children, manipulating them into agreeing to live with him. 'It took him some time but he

finally brainwashed them as well,' she said. 'When I lost custody of my children, it was the most devastating thing that had ever happened to me. I thought he would take them overseas to his birth country and I would never see them again. It was a nightmare. It really was a living nightmare.'

'Bruises on the Inside' is an intensely personal and harrowing story. 'Writing the book was a lot harder than I thought,' said Ms Hepburn. 'I initially started it as an account of what happened to me, I wanted a record. I wanted my children to know how much I love them and how hard I fought for them.' Ms Hepburn found that so many women share her story, and that whilst the details and specifics differ with each case, the fundamental behaviour and pattern is the same.

She hopes that by writing 'Bruises on the Inside' she can help people recognise this, and show them that they can break free and change their lives for the better. 'Hopefully people will realise they can get through it, they can regain their life back. My book includes a checklist that helps readers work out if they think the relationship they are in is abusive. There are also helpful websites to search. I want victims to realise that they don't have to take the monumental step to leave on their own. There is help out there. There is support. You are not alone.'

Remarking upon the recent assault on pop singer Rihanna, for which herex-boyfriend was convicted for domestic violence, Ms



Hepburn says this proved that it could happen to anyone. "You can be young, rich and famous, and it can still happen to you. Abuse is not selective, and you don't have to be beaten to be abused."

Ms Hepburn's children have now returned to her, and have no contact with their father. 'They feel hurt and betrayed by him. They came back of their own accord and I am so proud of them, but the legacy he has left them with will take time to heal,' said Ms Hepburn.

Ms Hepburn is now 46 years old, and has remarried - to a friend she knew more than 20 years ago. She lives with her three children, and her husband's daughter, Sarah.

As Ms Hepburn says, 'If I can help just one person walk away, stand strong, and go on to live the life they were meant to, writing the book will have been worth it. It is only by speaking out we can stop this epidemic.'

STREET NAMES - SOUTER STREET



Sophia Souter

Many of the streets in Beaconsfield are named after early settlers in this area.

SOUTER STREET off

Old Princes Highway with Georgios on the corner and Beaconsfield Hub on the other corner runs through to Beaconsfield Avenue but is not a through road. Jim Parkes Reserve with the playground is in Souter Street on the corner of Horner Street.

Souter Street is named after the Souter family. Charles and Sophia Souter travelled from England on the S.S. Swiftsure in 1868 and settled in Hotham which is now known as Port Melbourne. In the Bailiere's Directory 1875, Charles Souter is

listed as Hotel Keeper, Pakenham and the hotel is the Gippsland Hotel in Beaconsfield. In the Shire of Berwick Rates Book he is listed in 1875 as owning an hotel and 200 acres in the Pakenham Riding of the Shire of Berwick. In the following years he owned 2 shops in Pakenham and 320 acres in Gembrook which his sister Mary had leased from the crown since 1875.

Sophia Souter played a large part in running the Hotel from 1877-1880, after the failure of the Provincial & Suburban Bank she was listed in the South Bourke and Mornington Journal as insolvent. For a short period Mr. A. Norman ran the Hotel and then Charles

AND THE HOTEL IN BEACONSFIELD

sister Mary took over for around 12 months. Charles still owned the Hotel at this stage and leased it to Edward Key for some years. It was sold to the Gissing family in 1886 after leasing it from Charles for about 1 year.

Charles was elected to the Shire of Berwick Council in August 1879, representing the Pakenham Riding until 1886. During that time he served on many committees in the area and was made a Justice of the Peace in October 1881.

Around 1887 Charles and Sophia moved to the Frankston area and the rates book of the Shire of Mornington shows he

bought and sold property in that area. In August 1888 he was elected to Mornington Shire the Council and represented the North/East Riding of the Shire. He continued as a Councillor for 3 years becoming Shire President in his final year. After resigning from the Council he received an Illuminated Address from the people of Frankston. Charles and Sophia moved back Beaconsfield around to Charles had lost 1892. most of his fortune in the disastrous land boom in the early 1890s.

Charles died 3 years later on 9th July, 1895 at North Beaconsfield. Sophia lived at North Beaconsfield for some time and then moved to Berwick where she lived until she died on 15th August, 1937 aged 96. Both are buried in Berwick Cemetery.

Note: The original town of North Beaconsfield became Dewhurst in 1923 and in 1968 became part of the Cardinia Reservoir Reserve. A new area of Upper Beaconsfield has recently been named Dewhurst.

The Gippsland Hotel was built by the Bowmans in 1855 and first called Bowman's Inn. Janet Bowman later changed the name to Gippsland Hotel The present building

known as the Central Hotel was built around 1928 in the Spanish Mission style, similar to the Pakenham Hotel and replaced the Gippsland Hotel.

The Shire of Berwick later became Shire of Pakenham and the City of Berwick and more recently with new boundaries, renamed Shire of Cardinia and City of Casey.

Much of this article has been taken with permission from articles written by Darren Souter in previous issues of the Beaconsfield Banner and the Pakenham Gazette. Darren and his family still live in the Beaconsfield area and with their wider family regularly meet for family reunions.





Sick of the Hoons

Residents of Beaconsfield have had enough of the reckless and careless driving in local car parks, local railway stations and local streets.

As an ex police officer working in Dandenong and Prahran I have seen all too often the results of "Hoon" driving. Too often in the media we hear about the results of a group of young people who are out for a night of fun that ends in a tragedy that changes the lives of many.

The driving I saw on the streets in Dandenong and Prahran is not behaviour we want to see increase in our local area. The amount of police resources used in operations to control illegal drag racing was detrimental to the quality of policing made available to the community.

The police have attempted to curb the behaviour of young drivers, however they are only able to work within the laws they have. The current punishment




resulting in 2 day's car impoundment is not adequate enough. And the continued rise in road trauma created by reckless and careless driving reflects this.

We have areas in Beaconsfield that are regularly affected by "Hoon" drivers affecting residents' day to day lives. The need for stronger laws and an increase in proactive patrols in these areas is the only way to deter this behaviour.

A Coalition Government would increase the penalty to impound their car for 30 days for a first offence, then increase the penalty to their car being stripped and parts sold prior to crushing, for the third offence. The requirement for all offenders would be to participate in a defensive driving course at their own expense which will educate them with the responsibility that comes when you have a drivers licence.

Hoon laws cover most antisocial driving behaviours, including excessive speed, drag racing and burnouts.

OUR NATURAL WORLD

This world of ours is full of mystery, but one of the biggest is surely that of time. It was the late Professor Joad, who in his book, "Guide to Modern Thought," used the phrase, "the undoubted queerness of time." Certainly time is queer and great minds throughout history have tried to explain it in language that could be understood by all. We're still waiting.

In his book he refers to two ladies, Charlotte Moberly Eleanor Jourdain, successive Principals of an Oxford College who published a book in 1911. called "An Adventure". On August the 10th, 1901, the two ladies visited the Trianon Park in Versailles and were surprised to encounter a number of people in 18th century dress. Two "gardeners" gave them directions and a man who hurries past them warned them not to take a certain path. They passed a woman in old fashioned dress who was drawing but only Miss Moberly saw her. Both ladies felt oddly depressed and experienced a dream - like sensation.


The following year Miss Jourdain returned alone to Versailles on a cold rainy afternoon and again experienced the same eerie feeling and felt that she had somehow " crossed a line and was suddenly in a circle of influence". She saw two labourers in bright tunics and hoods loading a cart and when she looked back

a second later they had vanished, even though she could see a long way in both directions. She heard the rustling of silk dresses around her and heard voices but she saw no one.

When the two ladies returned to the gardens 3 years later they found everything totally changed. The trees had vanished; so had a rustic bridge, a ravine, a cascade, and a "kiosk". Convinced by now that they had seen the gardens as it was in the reign of Marie Antoinette and Louis XVI, they studied books on the period and concluded that they had seen historical personages of the period just before the Revolution, and that the woman seen by Charlotte Moberly could well have been Marie Antoinette. After publication of their book in 1911, three people who had lived in a house overlooking the park told them that they had experienced the same kind of thing so often that they had ceased to pay any attention to it.

This book created quite a lot of controversy but the story still stands and nobody to date has ever been able to explain what happened, or how it happened. The two ladies were women of standing in the community and professional educators of repute in England so were hardly the type to falsify such a story.

It was an adventure in time and just one more mystery of this world.

TALKING WEATHER

2009 saw our wettest year since 1995. There was 840mm of rain recorded in Beaconsfield last year.

Now this is not the highest ever recorded in Beaconsfield in my records, that was 939mm and recorded in 1992. The average yearly total for Beaconsfield is 763mm.

In December we had 66mm of rain. This fell over 8 days. This is just below the average for the month.

January had 39mm and this fell over 5 days. This is well below the January average but it was the highest for January since 2007.


While this year has not been as hot as last and more rain has fallen we are still in the driest months of the year. Target 155 was a campaign launched a couple of years ago by the Victorian government. The campaign was for all Victorians to use less the 155 litres of water per person per day. With the warmer months now here Victorians are using much more than that. Now is the time to save water.

Melbourne's water storage is currently at 35.5% this is well above the same point as last year when it was only 32%.


