

### SHIRE REPORT

by Councillor Brett Owen, Central Ward

Well budget time is upon us again at council for 2010/2011. This year the dynamics are no less challenging. We have less income from commercial sales in the Business Park area in Pakenham leaving a \$2 million challenge to fill. This is the impact on council of the Global financial crisis. We have increased our population in the shire with now 6 families a day moving in instead of 4 families only 18 months ago.

impact The Beaconsfield is that Holm Park Road Project is still on course in Stage 1 with nearly \$6 million spent so far. The ovals are well underway and will be ready for play in 2011. The

renovation of Beaconsfield reserve is still on course.

The building of an access road to the Woolworths Car park is getting closer. It will be built behind the pub and shops, and will improve safety.

We are still aggressively lobbying for traffic lights to the corner of Princes Highway and the cross over leading into the Main street of Beaconsfield from the Panorama estate end, improving safety.

Council voted against the May Road pokey development and will represent residents in VCAT to oppose development.

Summer has come to end and the milder weather this season has seen a reduced number of grass & scrub fires we have had to attend. This did not make it any less busy as we responded to numerous structure fires & motor vehicle accidents in our area as well as in our neighbouring brigades.

The recent upgrades to Tanker 2, thanks to the communities support, proved to be a valuable asset when attending to these incidents.

Daylight savings has ended which is a timely reminder that when you changed your clock, change the batteries in your Smoke Detectors. The slogan SMOKE DETECTORS SAVES LIVES is one of the ways of detecting a fire early allowing persons a chance to get to safety.

With the cooler days and nights starting it's time to start thinking of winter safety around the home. If you have a wood fire have you chimney or flue checked and cleaned, also Gas heaters and ducts may need checking and cleaning.

Electric blankets need to be checked for wear and tear. When using an electric blanket ensure that nothing is placed on the bed when they are on as this can create a pressure spot and cause the blanket to over heat and in some cases catch fire.







# SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

#### AMENDING TAX RETURNS

It is sometimes necessary to amend an income tax return prepared pursuant to self-assessment regime. after lodgement even if income tax assessments are issued and tax paid or refunded. Amendments may be necessary as result of additional information received to decrease increase or income and deductions or to amend tax offsets including dependant spouse, medical expenses, private health insurance etc. An amendment may be necessary as a result of checking the accuracy of tax returns or due to new information received eg. subsequent changes to taxable and exempt income payments from Centrelink or Department Veterans' Affairs.

The legislation changes from 1st January 2006 were introduced by Tax Laws Amendment (Improvements to Self Assessment) Acts. The objective of the changes was to improve certainty for taxpayers, reducing the period of time the Australian Taxation Office can increase a taxpayers' tax liability and also reductions in penalties interest where taxpayers errors resulted

from uncertainties in the self-assessment system.

Amendments for individual taxpayers and small business entities must now be done within two years (previously four years). Most other categories for amendment are now either two or four years. Anti avoidance including IVA amendment period has been reduced from six to four years. The amendment period for fraud and evasion remains unlimited.

All taxpayers should be aware of the time period restraints for amendments hence you should take action to amend income returns, as soon as you become aware errors in income. deductions or tax offsets. Voluntary disclosure may save you some penalties and/or general interest charges. Discuss your Accountant.

The Council has confirmed that two of the three ovals planned for the reserve will be available for junior use in 2011 and will be supplemented by temporary facilities including toilets. However, the planned \$1.5 million social club pavilion, which was originally intended to be operational at the same time as the two ovals, is now subject Council's budgetary process, process. This which will determine expenditure council for the next four years, is under deliberation. In part, this unexpected delay is due to the works already undertaken at the reserve costing more anticipated. was

As a result of our meeting, Council has agreed to provide clarification to the Beaconsfield Football Club, particularly in the provision of a firm timeline for the delivery of each part of the project. It will also specify to the club exactly what items will be funded as part of the project so the club has certainty about what will be included when it moves to its new home at the Holm Park Rd Recreation Reserve.

Given the unexpected delay in the construction of the new pavilion, which will also affect the Beaconsfield Netball Club, I have asked the Council to assist both clubs to improve the existing amenities for netball and football in the interim period, and it has agreed to look into the proposal. These improvements may include additional facilities for netball players, such as toilets, office space and a changing room, along with essential maintenance for the current pavilion such as roof repairs.





Irene Jensen was a foundation member of Make and Mingle and contributed in many ways to our group teaching craft and sharing her poetry. She made beautiful bread dough jewellery, crocheted card boxes, fabric beads knitted and was an excellent dressmaker.

She had a real gift of caring for others and was always there for someone who needed a kind word or some prayer or helped them in a practical way.

Irene was born in 1931 and lived in Burwood for some of her childhood and met her husband Ivan at Hawthorn Baptist Church. Ivan had a motor bike and the two of them could be seen everywhere on that bike.

They had 5 children, Irene, Sue, Harold, Neil and Ashley. When the children were young they purchased a house in Upwey, which in those days was considered a long way out. They had an old house with a wood fired oven in the kitchen, the hub of the family.

She made clothes for all her five children and then for her 12 grandchildren. She had 14 great grand children

Irene and Ivan later moved to Narre Warren and attended Beaconsfield Baptist Church. First, in the little wooden Church in Railway Avenue over 25 years ago and then in the church building on the Old Princes Highway which had previously been a Mobil service station

and the 'Yellow rose of Texas' roadhouse. Many Beaconsfield residents will also remember Ivan's shop in the old workshop of the service station next to the church and he sold second hand furniture, antiques and bric a brac. He loved to play his old 78 records and these could be heard on a visit to the shop. His son Ashley often helped out in the shop as well. Sadly Ivan passed away in June1998. This site is now the 'Beaconsfield Hub' shopping complex and home of the Beaconsfield Bendigo Community Bank. The Beaconsfield Baptist Church relocated Desmond court in 2007 in a new building.

We give thanks for the contribution Ivan and Irene made to the Church, Make and Mingle, The Evergreens group and the wider Beaconsfield Community.


IN **GOFF** STREET BEACONSFIELD is a little street with speed humps and a bend, ideal for a walk and the home of some long time Beaconsfield residents. It runs from Old Princes Hwy through to Beaconsfield Avenue and is opposite Primary School. the

was named It after William Henry Goff (1842-1906) to recognise the considerable contribution he made to the community Beaconsfield. council he was a strong supporter of Beaconsfield and supported Brisbane campaigning for Beaconsfield to be the fourth riding in the Berwick Shire. The other ridings were Berwick, Pakenham and Scorsby. Goff was a popular and exceptionally talented man and a well respected Councillor for eleven years. He was twice elected Shire President in 1890-91 and again in


1895-96. He was well educated and noted for his sense of humour and tact. During these years, Beaconsfield was small town just starting to grow with the Gippsland Hotel and a few houses. The railway station was opened in 1879 and land was subdivided around Lyle Avenue in 1888. The primary school opened in 1890. was

William Henry Goff was Roscommon born in Ireland in 1842. He was a brilliant mathematician graduated from and Trinity College in Dublin with first prizeman in Natural Sciences, Dublin Scholar Mathematical Exhibitioner. He and Rose married Helen Clayton in 1867 and they had eight children.

In 1870 a school to be known as All Saints Grammar was being built in the grounds of All

Saints Church in East St Kilda, Melbourne, When the school opened in June 1871, William Goff was invited to be the first headmaster a post he held for 31 years. In 1876 he selected land in Upper Beaconsfield, a 20acre allotment and in the following year built his country home "Harpfields" which overlooked the Dandenong Hills. The house was destroyed in the Ash Wednesday fires, but later rebuilt. Harpfields Road in Upper Beaconsfield took name from his property.

Goffwas also very involved in the community of Upper Beaconsfield where he lived and together with other community minded people he worked tirelessly for a local hall built in 1884 which is still in use as the Upper Beaconsfield Community Complex. He was a trustee for the St Johns Church which was built in 1923. The original St Johns was destroyed in the Ash Wednesday

fires of 1983 and later rebuilt as it is today.

There are a number of Beaconsfield buildings and landmarks represented on the Cardinian Embroidery along with the current St Johns Church and the Upper Beaconsfield Community Complex. The Cardinian Embroidery is a community project that depicts the heritage and tradition of Cardinia Shire as seen in 2005. The eight original panels can be viewed at the Cardinia Cultural Centre, Lakeside Pakenham. A reproduction the Beaconsfield of Panel can be seen in the fover of the Beaconsfield Community Complex.

#### **OUR NATURAL WORLD**

by Peter Hansen

There's an old saying, "that there's nothing new under the sun "and a study of history and ancient writings seem to bear this out on many levels. This world of ours is full of mysteries, many known now. many unknown perhaps forever, but the story of a rocket being launched into space from the City of Sibiu in Rumania in 1529 does focus the somewhat. attention

Thousands of witnesses were present at the experiment which crowned with success, as was also the case Portuguese the at 1709 when Court Gusmao demonstrated machine. his flying Historians have never referred to this "unimportant "episode of history which has therefore been lost the mists of time. The honor of making the Space Rocket belongs Conrad Haas, pyrotechnician, or Master Gunner, whose drawings description discovered in 1961 by Doru Todericin Professor of Science and Technology at the University of Bucharest, when he stumbled across an old manuscript in the archives of the Sibiu library and published in Rumanian Historical Review in 1967 under the title "The Sibiu Manuscript."

The diagrams from the manuscript clearly show that Conrad's rocket was built in two tiers with different diameters, one fitting inside the other. The rocket used in the experiment 1555 had 3 tiers. Solid fuel was used in both types and was made up of specially

powdery prepared though substances, these could be prepared by a mixture whose base was ethyl acetate ammoniac. with other chemical components. The manuscript makes it clear that ethyl acetate was obtained from vinegar and alcohol; the ammonia was distilled from Urine.

Conrad Haas also used delta wings, which have become modern solutions to the problem of steering stabilizing rockets. The list of inventions mentioned in the Sibiu Manuscript is as follows. Two tierignition rocket 1529. Three tier rocket 1529. 1529. Rocket fuel "1536. "Flying cabin Tests for types of ignition needed in multirockets 1555. tiered of Use Delta wings 1555. for stabilization these details are correct and come from the records of the day.

Why were these inventions never given the recognition they deserved? We can only guess. Maybe the Church quashed it, they were against any science that may have threatened their seat of power over the mindsofmillionsofpeasants and free thinkers. Look what they did to Galileo! Perhaps there were no funds for further research, perhaps it struck terror into the hearts and minds of the local population? All is supposition so we have to leave it here, as little mystery. another Perhaps everything has already been discovered and all we do is to rediscover it. As usual more questions than answers!

#### TALKING WEATHER

February saw minimal rainfall with only 32mm of rain falling over 3 days. This however was way higher than February last year when only 2mm fell.

The rain started to fall at the beginning of March with 65mm recorded over the long weekend.

It was some of the heaviest rain I have seen fall in the area. Fortunately Beaconsfield was spared major damage that the storms created over that weekend. The large hail and wind that swept over Melbourne that weekend missed Beaconsfield. The totals we recorded for the 3 days were Saturday 30mm, Sunday 20<sub>mm</sub> and 15mm. Monday

The March total was 85mm. This is the highest March total since 1989 when there was 94mm.


The total for the first 3 months of the year is 156mm. This is the highest since 2006 when there was also 156mm.

While we are talking records, Melbourne has also recorded the longest streak of days where the temperature has gone above 20°c. The record was 78 days which was recorded in 2000/2001. The new recorded which is still going up daily is at 114.
