Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. has been providing input on many matters as representative of the Community to promote and improve quality of life for Beaconsfield residents.


Some of the significant happenings over recent months include the following:

- The BPA held a successful Anzac Day Memorial Service on the Sunday prior to Anzac Day
- We are supportive of announcement by State Government for the installation of traffic lights for Beaconsfield at Old Princes and Princes intersection. Highway Work is to commence during June at a cost of \$1.7million. The installation of traffic lights will improve safety at the intersection and will allow motorists to safely access Monash (City Bound) freeway
- It is pleasing to see that footpaths have not been forgotten with the commencement of the construction of the Holm Park Road footpath and the announcement that Cardinia Council will be allocating over \$100,000 in the 2010/11 budget for the installation of newfootpaths

from Panorama Estate to Beaconsfield Township.

- Continued lobbying for the need for additional car parking spots at Beaconsfield Train Station
- Involvement with the Beaconsfield Park project whereby Federal a Government Stimulus Grantof\$100,000 has been approved to undertake major renovations to this park, which is the entrance Cardinia Shire. In addition, separate Cardinia Shire Grants have been received to restore the Entrance Gate. Hopefully work will commence in July.
- The significant work being undertaken in Holm Park Road on the construction of new ovals and sporting facilities.

Meetings are held on the third Tuesday evening of each month at 7.30 pm at the Beaconsfield Community Complex, O'Neil Road and everyone is welcome to attend and join up as a Member if you can spare \$5. There are usually guest speakers and meetings are a forum to discuss local issues and hear from Ward Councillor, Brett Owen.

Council welcomes the recent announcement from the state government to signalise the intersection of Old Princes Hwy and the Princes Highway, Beaconsfield (just east of O'Neil Road).

The \$1.8 million project is expected to begin in June and should be completed by December.

The installation of the traffic lights will improve safety at the intersection

for motorists and pedestrians. Motorists will be able to turn right from the Old Princes Highway to travel city bound.

In addition to this good news, Council will be allocating over \$100,000 for the installation of new footpaths to and from the signalised intersection/pedestrian crossing. The new footpaths will link the Panorama Estate to the Beaconsfield Township.

The urgent need for additional car parking at the Beaconsfield Railway Station is an issue that counciltakes very seriously.


Representatives from council met with Martin Pakula, State Minister for Public Transport in April. At this meeting, Council raised the issue with the Minister. Council will continue to advocate very strongly for additional car parking at the Beaconsfield Railway Station in the lead up to the upcoming state election.

Council continues proceed with the development of the Holm Park Recreation Reserve. In the lead up to the upcoming state and federal elections, council will be advocating very strongly to all sides of politics to commitments secure from all parties to provide financial assistance to develop further stages of the Holm Park Road Reserve Master Plan.

If council is successful securing funding commitments from new state and federal governments, it will assist council to bring forward stages of master plan. This allow council to provide the recreational facilities that the Beaconsfield community deserves. sooner rather than later.

Works on the construction of a footpath along the south side of Holm Park Road (from Beaconsfield-Emerald Road to Fieldstone Boulevard) commenced in April.

The footpath will provide an important link to the township and provide connectivity in Beaconsfield, particularly to the future reserve. It will provide safety for many pedestrians that currently walk along the road verge.




BPS Corner



SNIPPETS FROM THE **ACCOUNTANT'S** DESK

TRANSITION TO RETIREMENT PENSIONS

Are you over 55 years still working but considering retirement in the future and wish to commence income accessing an from your stream Fund? Superannuation If so, this can be done in a tax effective manner by drawing a Transition Retirement Pension.

Transition Retirement Pension may be used to increase your personal income and is often used in conjunction sacrificing with salary direct amounts into Superannuation. people earning income in the 31.5% tax rate then salary sacrificing Superannuation has a net benefit of 16.5% tax after allowing contributions tax of 15%.


In addition, if pensions paid by Superannuation Funds have come from a "taxed" Fund, then the taxpayer in receipt of the pension is eligible for a personal tax offset of 15% of the income. This applies to persons up to age 60 at which time the pensions become taxfree from taxed sources.

Another tax benefit is that the income of the Superannuation assets held to enable payment of the pension is also tax-free.

Transition to Retirement Pensions are now Account Based Pensions and yearly withdrawals are limited to 10% of the account balance. Lump Sums cannot be withdrawn however the pension is commutable when the individual has retired permanently or reached 65.

If you are over 55 with reasonable amounts Superannuation Funds, then discuss with your Accountant or Financial Advisor the merits of a Transition to Retirement Pension.

\$25.6 million has been allocated for the duplication of Clyde Rd between High St and Kangan Drive which coupled with \$30 million from the Federal Government will congestion traffic eased and travel times reduced on this important road. In Beaconsfield, right-turn lanes double be constructed at will the intersection of the Hwy and Princes the Berwick-Beaconsfield Rd. This will allow cars from Beaconsfield to turn right to access the freeway, rather than having to turn left and perform a U-turn. This \$1.7 million project also includes a pedestrian crossing so residents in estate Panorama can accessthetownshiponfoot.

Emergency services have also received a big boost

with additional money for the CFA, Incident Control and bushfire Centres Environment warnings. funding in the budget includes \$300,000 Cardinia Reservoir Park and \$1 million for Yarra Ranges National Park. The State Budget also includes a \$9.5 billion infrastructure program that will create jobs and ensure Victoria's AAA-rated economic position is secured.

In other local news, Cr Brett Owen and I recently approached Woolworths management requesting the provision of toilets Beaconsfield their The supermarket. response that was previously toilets had been provided but were closed due to vandalism. However. because our requests, it has been agreed to open the toilets again for a 30-day trial period. I will provide information on the outcome of the trial at a later date.

Whilst we are familiar with many emergency procedures in dogs and cats, it's easy to forget that the same problems can occur in our smaller friends.


Poor Greta the guinea pig got into a pickle recently. Unfortunately, it turned out that Indy, her friend, was actually a boy and Greta's subsequent pregnancy was a problem for her. Guinea pigs have an unusual shaped pelvis that can become narrowed if they have not had babies by the age of 3 months therefore making the birthing process quite

difficult if they are past this age. With Greta being 3 years old there was a strong chance of complications occurring.

After X-rays were taken to confirm that she could not give birth naturally it was decided to undertake a caesarean in order to save both Greta's and her piglets. Whilst caesareans are reasonably routine they are complicated in this instance by the fragility of guinea pigs both under anaesthetic and in their recovery.



WOOD OR WOODS STREET?

A street sign along the Old Princes Highway has been changed! An 'S' has been added to the Wood Street to make it Woods Street. The controversy over this street name has now been resolved. The Beaconsfield Business groupcontactedtheCouncil querying the sign "Wood Street" on the Highway and Woods Street on the street pole. The Council has confirmed it is "Woods Street" and requested that Vic Roads change their 2 green directional signs to conform. The first record of Woods Street appears in the South Bourke and Mornington Journal of 5th October 1889 when the Berwick Shire Council approved the alignment of this new It was named street. after Mr. John Woods (1822-1892) a member of the Victorian Parliament from 1871 to 1893, and Commissioner for the Railways 1877-1880. When the railway line from Sale to Oakleigh was opened in April 1879, there were stations at Berwick and Officer but none at present day Beaconsfield.



1876, entrepreneur ln Brisbane William Berwick, knowing the rail line was being built, and realising there was a great demand for sawn timber and firewood in rapidly expanding Melbourne, entered into partnership with John Day, and built a sawmill near the present day Central Hotel, then called the Gippsland Hotel. Brisbane needed a rail siding to get his timber to Melbourne, and knew a siding would also benefit new selectors in the hills district - now Beaconsfield, Upper and "Little Berwick", the settlement small near later Cardinia Creek. "Beaconsfield". named Brisbane wrote to the Commissioner for Railways several times. requesting a siding at this site, but without success.

In a flamboyant gesture invited Brisbane ladies and gentlemen from Melbourne to lunch at his guesthouse in Upper Beaconsfield on Saturday November 30th 1878. The guests included three M.L.A's - Dr. L.L. Smith. Bosisto, and John Woods, all of whom had selected 20 acre blocks in the Upper Beaconsfield area, so would have benefitted from the proposed station.

The visitors were picked up in horse drawn vehicles at the Berwick Station and on the way to

Upper Beaconsfield were shown the place where a station was required. At lunch, a toast to John Woods. Commissioner for the Railways, was proposed. In reply Woods said he accepted Brisbane's suggestion. and agreed to open a station. He then proposed a toast to Brisbane.

On the 1st December 1879 Beaconsfield station opened for traffic. passengers, and goods. The station sign stated "Beaconsfield Station". "Passengers for Beaconsfield Ranges alight here". The station was an immediate boost to the local economy. The first post office was opened at the station in 1883. When State School 3033 opened No on its present site on 5th June 1890, it was officially called "Beaconsfield Railway Station School". name 1951 the shortened was to Beaconsfield School. Woods Street was so named to acknowledge John Woods, contribution to the early development Beaconsfield.

Beaconsfield soon grew as well with both homes and shops in the Woods Street area. There are still some early 20th Century cottages along Woods Street which have been lovingly restored by their owners.


In the early 1900's Adamson's hardware store was established and served the town from 1906-1983. Woods Street also had the Post Office and Jim Parkes' butcher shop along with the Grosby factory (1945-1951) and is still a mix of residential and businesses today. The

Mr. John Woods was born in Liverpool Eng, 5 November 1822. He was the son of a railway man and John trained as a locomotive engineer in Liverpool and then on the

and Dresden Leipzig He won first railway. prize for axles at the Great Exhibition. He was married to Sarah Gibbons and they arrived in Victoria in 1852 and went to the Goldfields where he led passive resistance to the licence fee. At Ararat he was elected to the local court and then to the Mining Board and from 1859-1864 he was a member of the Legislative Assembly, from 1871-1892 representing the seat of Crowlands and then the new electorate of Stawell. He sat on many Select committees, mainly about railways. He was a commissioner for the 1880 International Melbourne

exhibition and honorary commissioner to the 1883-84 Calcutta Exhibition; from 1890 he was a member of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Railways. He died on 2nd April1892. Rates Books for The this area show that John Woods purchased land, 20 acres, Lot 130 Parish of Pakenham in 1878 and held it till his death Lot 130 is off in 1892. Hughenden Road down from the intersection of Telegraph Road in Beaconsfield. Upper Woods was one of the first batch of selectors of 20 acre lots after the land was subdivided by the government in 1876-77.



OUR NATURAL WORLD

The Shroud of Turin has been in the news for quite a few years off and on and is once again stirring the hearts and minds of the Christian world. The history of the shroud is a very long one and can only be touched on briefly here. What I find interesting is the underlying obsession to know what the physical Christ looked like. Through-out the long history of Christianity thousands of images of Christ have been drawn. printed, painted, carved in statues and so on and probably no two exactly the same, That is because no on, knew what he looked like and this has strangely troubled Christians since mission on earth.

Is not the message he came and delivered more important than his appearance? His words and actions were sorely needed in a time of barbarity and cruelty. Rome held sway and ruled with a fist of iron

tolerating no challenge its imperial power. The shroud first appeared in 1356 in the hands of a French knight who wouldn't reveal its origins, and a local bishop at the time declared it to be false. Since then the shroud has been declared genuine and false. In the latest 3D test Jesus has been declared to be swarthy, 1.72 metres tall, compared to paintings of him as fair, slim and tall. Once again we must ask ourselves what does it matter what he looked like? Do the Buddhists concern themselves as to Buddha's appearance? Do the Muslims worry about the appearance of Mahomet? Why then do the Christians have such a relentless focus on Christ's appearance?

The good news then is that there is an engraved image of Christ, plus a full description of his appearance in existence. The reputed true likeness of Christ is taken from an Emerald engraved by order of Pontius Pilate presented it to Tiberius Caesar. In due course it came into the possession of the Sultan of Turkey, who parted with it as the redemption price to liberate his brother from captivity. Its present location is unknown, but has been photographed and black white.

The following is an authentic description of Christ from an ancient manuscript from Publius Lentulus, the President of the Senate of Rome. "There appeared in these our days a man of great virtue named Jesus Christ, who is yet living amongst us, and of the Gentiles is accepted for a prophet of truth: but his own disciples call him "The Son of God". He raiseth the dead and cureth all manner of diseases. A man of stature somewhat tall and comely, with a very reverend countenance. such as the beholder may both love and fear. His hair is the colour of a chestnut full ripe, plain to his ears, whence downward it is curling and waving about his shoulders. In the midst of his head is a seam or partition in his hair after the manner of the Nazarites. His forehead smooth and his face without spot or wrinkle, beautiful with a comely red. His nose and mouth so formed that nothing can be reprehended. His beard thickish, in colour like his hair but not very long. His look innocent and mature. His eyes grey, clear and quick. In reproving he is terrible in admonishing, courteous and fair - spoken; pleasant conversation, mixed with gravity. It cannot be remembered that anv have seen him laugh, but many have seen him weep. In proportion of body and arms, well shaped and perfect to behold. In speaking very temperate, modest and wise. A man for his singular beauty surpassing the children of men". A description fit for "The Son of God", is it not?



TALKING WEATHER



April saw 88mm of rain fall in Beaconsfield. It fell over 12 days, with the highest daily totals on the 20th and the 23rd both with 17mm.


May recorded a total of 59mm of rain. This is the highest May total since 2007. The rain fell over 9 days with the highest daily totals falling on the 7th and the 11th with 10mm on each of these days.

With the wet start to the year Melbourne's water storage levels have also increased. As of the 1st of June Melbourne's water storage was 32.7%. This is the highest total it has been at the start of winter since 1996.
