



Jeanette graduated from Melbourne KindergartenTeachersCollegein1973 and has worked as a Kindergarten teacher for 37 years, with the last 25 years at Beaconsfield Kindergarten.

# Local Infrastructure Funding

Dear readers.

I am very pleased to be able to let you know some of the things that have been happening in the La Trobe electorate since the last edition:

#### Health care funding:

- Three medical clinics in our area have been nominated to receive funding under the first round of Primary Care Grants so that they can undertake work to be able to provide improved community healthcare. These are the Mandala Clinic at Emerald, the Belgrave Medical Clinic and Hills Medical. - The Casey After Hours GP Clinic has also received funding from the Federal Government to increase after hours care

#### Local infrastructure funding:

- The Federal Government is funding 8 local infrastructure projects in La Trobe including installing AFL-standard lighting at Holm Park Recreation Reserve in Beaconsfield.

- The infrastructure

funding in La Trobe will go to projects supported by our local councils and the funding will be very important to supporting around 25 local jobs.

#### **Paid Parental Leave**

- Next month, on 1 January 2011, Australia will have its first Paid Parental Leave Scheme. It is important that expecting parents take an opportunity to complete the paperwork for the scheme and we know that many people in our community are already starting this and making plans with their employers. You can apply online at www.familyassist.gov.au.

#### **Education Tax Refund**

- For eligible parents with kids going to school in 2011, please remember to keep your receipts for school expenses so that you can claim the Education Tax Refund.

#### La Trobe Leadership and Community Service Award

- Over the last few weeks I have been visiting as many of the 64 schools in our electorate as possible to recognise a student at each campus who has shown his or her commitment our community organisations and who has shown leadership at school. I hope that all of those excellent students who have received the award this year will get involved in community activities comina in La Trobe in 2011.

I hope that you have a relaxing break over the Christmas and New Year period and that you and your families stay safe over the holiday season. I look forward to keeping you updated in 2011. All the best at Christmas.

Everyone by now should be preparing their property for the coming fire season by cleaning up around the home removing any excess fuel. Residents in the built area of the town should be aware that this need for preparation relates to them as well. The grass and scrub lands north of the Beaconsfield township has the potential to threaten homes from ember attacked should a fire occur in that area. #### What is that worth?


Many years ago I read an article by Simon Longstaff. The point he made has staved with me. But before I go there let me tell you about my neighbour. He decided to sell his house. But before the house could be sold it had to be valued. How do you measure the value of a house? Well my neighbour had a good feel for what his home was worth. Then an agent called and did all sorts of ascertaining; listing the value of other houses in the street, the age of the house, the size of the house, the size of the land the condition of the house. The agent then decided what the home was worth.

Lastly there were the prospective buyers. Each one would come to the open inspection and sum up for themselves what they thought the home was worth. Then there were the neighbours who too were rather interested in what it was worth and who sought to measure its worth by considering what their own homes were worth.

I tell you before that house was finally sold there were a whole bunch of folk who had worked out what it was worth. We are pretty good at doing this. We all know what our homes are worth, we know what our cars are worth, and we know what our TVs are worth. But Longstaff suggests, and I think he is right, we often do not know the real value of intangible things.

What is the value of a kind word or a decent friend or a loving family or a warm smile? In fact these things are priceless.

Lastly may lask do we know the value of Christmas? It comes around every year. It's a time for gift giving and family get togethers. But is that all it is? In fact it is a celebration of birth of Jesus. Do we know the value of the birth of Jesus? Can we calculate all the good he has brought into this world? Christmas might be a good time some evaluating. do



The second Annual General Meeting of Beaconsfield District Community Financial Services Ltd was held on Tuesday, 30 November 2010.



#### **Over Indulging At Christmas**

by Beaconsfield Veterinary Centre

Christmas time has come around again, and it's this time of year that Christmas parties become a common event. Christmas parties can consist of a variety of meats, sides and desserts which are great treats for us, but can contain high levels of fat that are not suitable for your pets.

Animals can develop a disease known as pancreatitis. This can occur after your pet ingests a meal high in fat, such as leftovers from Christmas parties or BBQ's. During pancreatitis the enzymes that normally digest food leak out into the tissue of the pancreas, and start to digest it. This leads to the pancreas becoming

inflamed, which left untreated, can be fatal.

Symptoms of pancreatitis can include vomiting, diarrhoea, abdominal pain fever. and Animals diagnosed with pancreatitis may need to spend several days in the hospital whilst being treated. Depending on the severity of the inflammation treatments can include intravenous fluids. antibiotics and anti-inflammatories. Food and water intake is also stopped for a period of time. Once there has been no vomiting for up to 48 hours small amounts of a low fat prescription food and water can be offered. Animals will also need to

be sent home with a low fat prescription food while the pancreas is healing. Some animals may need to be on this food for life.

So next time you, family or friends want to give your pet left overs think twice as it can cause a great deal of pain for them and an expensive trip to the vet for you.

#### **BEACONSFIELD PARK**

Cardinia Shire Council is currently undertaking works at Beaconsfield Park. The park is situated at the corner of Beaconsfield Emerald Road and Old princes Highway Beaconsfield. This area is just over the Cardinia Creek Bridge and is the gateway to Cardinia Shire and Beaconsfield.

Cardinia Shire council initially provided \$10,000 to have plans developed for this area and then were successful in gaining a Federal government grant of \$112,572 to have these works carried out.

This will include new drainage and footpath and extensive landscaping and planting of native and indigenous plants. Stage one of these works will cover

the front entrance of the park and then future works will include a boardwalk and post and rail fencing.

Over the past 3-4 years the Cardinia Catchment Landcare Group with some of the local schools has carried out indigenous plantings along the Cardinia Creek in Beaconsfield Park. This planting has restored the riparian area and will enhance the park restoration works.

In 2008 Beaconsfield Progress Association was successful in gaining a Cardinia Shire Council Heritage grant to have the old 'Beaconsfield Park' sign restored and again in 2009 gained funding to have pillars built for the signage.

Now that the landscaping of the park is been carried out, the restored sign and pillars can be constructed. The new plans for the park also incorporate sandstone on the pillars and a low wall along the pathway. This will give a beautiful vista into Beaconsfield and the restoration of the historic park sign and pillars.

The Argus newspaper 26th January 1939 reported that 'Memorial gates' had been erected at the entrance to the Beaconsfield Park. A pair of iron gates and brick pillars erected in memory of the soldiers who took part in the Great War. The gates were the gift of the Craven sisters Belinda, Mattie and Alice who previously had the Beaconsfield Post Office.



The late Tony Rushton, who lived in Beaconsfield and had a passion for local history, had this photo in his collection. It is thought to be taken at the opening of the gates. In the group second from the left is Harold Harbour. third from left 'Slim' Parkes and on the right 'Bluey' Jim Parkes. Tony Rushton had expressed a desire to see the sign and pillars restored, and now this will finally be taking place.

#### BEACONSFIELD AVENUE OF HONOUR

The beautiful Beaconsfield Avenue of Honour runs along Old Princes Hwy (High Street) Berwick from the Cardinia Creek Bridge to Peel Street. 123 Black Poplars trees were originally planted in 1939.

The trees have been listed on the Victorian register of significant trees. The trees were planted by Ada Armytage of Holm Park as a tribute to the Soldiers from Beaconsfield who served in the Great War. In 1973 the Berwick Shire became the City of Berwick and the Shire of Pakenham. The boundary was the Cardinia Creek and this meant that the Beaconsfield Avenue of Honour was now in City of Berwick. In 1994 the City of Berwick was renamed City of Casey and the Shire of Pakenham was renamed Shire of Cardinia.

There are seven Avenues of Honour in the City of Casey these are;

1. Beaconsfield Avenue of Honour High Street (Old Princes Highway) Berwick. 123 trees originally planted in 19**1**9. Black Poplar

2. South Gippsland Highway Cranbourne. 59 trees planted in August 1919. English oak, Portuguese oak.

- 3. Memorial Drive, Narre Warren North 60 trees originally planted in 1919. English Oak.
- 4. Harkaway Road, Harkaway. 29 trees planted in 1919. Red flowering gum
- 5. Church Street Berwick 9 trees originally planted in 1919 Pin oak, English oak. 6. South Gippsland Highway, Tooradin 18 trees originally planted in 1918. Red flowering gums
- 7. Wilson and Scanlon Streets, Berwick. Approximately 35 trees originally planted in September 1918 English oak, Pin oak.

After the formation of the National Trust Casey Cardinia Branch on 2002. a separate Avenues of Honour Committee was established under the auspices of the local National Trust branch and chaired by lan

Goode (Vice President)

This Avenues of Honour Committee included Representatives from Special Interest groups, Military Historians and Community Volunteers, passionate residents. including the late Tony Rushton from Beaconsfield; Casey History Cardinia Local Officer, representatives from the RSL; History and ProgressAssociationsfrom Tooradin. Beaconsfield. Narre Warren North as well as several National Trust Branch Members.

A submission to Casey Council for review and staged upgrade gained the support of Cr Neil Lucas when he was Mayor. This resulted in subsequent resolutions confirming that council's commitment, restoration, ongoing maintenance and appropriate signage would be a priority. Casey council provided \$30,000 as its commitment to maintain the Casev Avenues of Honour and the Government Victorian

provided \$10,000 through the Heritage Grants Programme.

On Remembrance Day, Thursday 11th November 2010. a number dedicated residents. groups and community heritage leaders gathered on Church Street Berwick witness the launch of the City of Casey's new Avenues of Honour New signage Signage. will also be installed at the other 6 Avenues of Honour in the coming weeks. Beaconsfield's signage will be placed at the beginning of the Avenue of Honour just over Cardinia Creek in front of Hailebury College.

This new signage reflects an important and tangible link to our heritage and the necessity to ensure that all Avenues will be in first class condition for the Centenary of ANZAC in 2015.





The new signage includes Heritage Logo (illustrated) and this was developed and adopted by both councils in conjunction with the National Trust in 2006. The Logo shows the Cardinia Creek which is the boundary between the municipalities; representative style homestead, symbolizing built environment and a tree, symbolizing the natural environment.



Beaconsfield has also remembered their soldiers with the Beaconsfield WW1 Honor Board and the Beaconsfield War Memorial ...

The War Memorial on the corner of Wood Street and Old Princes Highway is of

polished granite and was unveiled in March 1920 by Brigadier General Brand. The inscription on the base reads:" Erected as a tribute to men who enlisted from Beaconsfield and District and in memory of those who made the supreme sacrifice in the Great War

1914-1919." The names of the nine fallen soldiers from WW I are listed, and after WW II the names of three fallen soldiers were added. The memorial was restored in 2006.

Beaconsfield War The Memorial is pictured on the Cardinian Embroidery. reproduction of the Cardinian Embroidery Officer Beaconsfield panel can be seen at the Beaconsfield Community Complex and the original eight embroidered panels can be viewed at the Cardinia Cultural complex.

The Beaconsfield WWI Honour Board can be viewed at the Beaconsfield Community Complex 35 Serviceman with their photos are named on the Honor Board. A booklet 'Beaconsfield's WWI Honour Board

provides Military History and Family History of each of the serviceman.





#### TALKING WEATHER

by Nathan Boon

Well it's time for another banner weather report and it's raining again as I write the article. It has not seemed to have stopped in the last 2 months. With record falls in Beaconsfield this year - it has a very wet year.

In October we saw 167mm of rain fall. This is the highest monthly total for October I have on record dating from 1985. The rain fell over 9 days with the highest daily totals being 33mm on the 6th and the 15th. The average for October is 75mm.

In November we had another total of over 100mm. We had 130mm, this fell over 14 days. The highest daily total was 35mm this was on the 27th.

With all this rain it has seen the yearly total soar up to 970mm at the end of November. This is now the highest yearly total I have and we still have a month to go. With the rain fall in the first few days of December the total has now gone over the 1000mm for the first time in a very long time.


With the falling of all this rain it has increased Melbourne's water storage to 52.4% full. This is the highest since April 2006.

In the early issues of the Beaconsfield Banner, Dr. Dick Webb contributed articles about the rainfall in Beaconsfield. After the passing of Dr. Webb, I was honored to be given his records dated from 1985 which I have continued to use and refer to.




