Many locals both Beaconsfield and neighbouring townships became excited when they saw road works begin on the Monash Freeway between Beaconsfield and Narre Warren. This excitement was short lived as they realised that this was not going to be any works that would help relieve the everyday congestion on the freeway. Instead it was to install safety fences.

Beaconsfield resident Angelo D'Amelio frustrated with spending time and money sitting in bottle necks and traffic jams on the Monash Freeway decided to see how many others wanted an extra lane put in on the Monash Freeway to cut congestion that he faces on the way to work every morning.

He approached the Cardinia Council to voice his

concerns to Cr Brett Owen and together they both agreed a petition would be the best approach to take.

After standing in precinct shopping Angelo Beaconsfield commented "I was really pleased with the response that Beaconsfield residents have shown to sign the petition." The petition that is addressed to the state government urging them to begin improvements to the Monash Freeway/Princes Freeway to address traffic congestion. The petition is available for residents to sign at both the Shire of Cardinia and City of Casey Civic Offices until June 30.

Both Angelo D'Amelio and Cr. Brett Owen will be handing the completed petition to Brad Battin, State Member for Gembrook, for tabling before the state parliament.

Upgrades have also happened at Bunyip Hall, Catani Public Hall, Cardinia Cultural Centre, Koo Wee Rup Senior Citizens, Lang Lang Bowling Club, Lang Lang Foreshore, Lang Lang RSL, Pakenham South Hall, Services Central and now at Tonimbuk Hall.

The \$1 million upgrade to facilities at Emerald Lake Park has an emphasis on accessibility and inclusion and the new Pakenham Library, Hall and U3A complex will feature an extensive range of accessible

community facilities.

the Cardinia Chair of Advisory Disability Committee Elizabeth Steeper Sampson said she was extremely proud of these achievements. "They demonstrate Council's commitment ongoing the Shire making accessible welcoming. and inclusive for all," Ms Steeper Sampson said.

Central Ward Councillor and also a member of the Advisory Committee, Brett Owen added to Ms Steeper Sampson's comments by saying it was an ongoing focus for Council to ensure facilities were accessible for everyone.

"People with a disability should not be set apart from the community to which they belong.

"It is important that Council provides the highest level of access possible for all users of its facilities." Cr Owen said.

In Cardinia Shire, one in five people is affected by disability,

and for various reasons, has trouble accessing buildings, services, playgrounds, learning, sport, leisure and cultural activities.

Council is committed to playing a lead role in improving the quality of life of all residents; fostering welcoming and inclusive communities, and supporting and advocating on behalf of people with special needs.

In 2007, Council approved Access Design Guidelines which outline responsibilities of builders, developers and Council staff involved in planning, construction and maintenance of premises used by the public within the municipality.

A Footpath Trading Code was adopted by Council last year to make pedestrian access easier along shopping strip footpaths, moving chairs and tables and other displays. Its aim is to ensure people, especially mums with prams or people using wheelchairs or motorised scooters, can more easily make their way around the shopping area.



Fondly known by some as 'the sheep' she was selected and purchased from Adele Lindley 'PETS for Therapy' representative in partnership with Katie Hunter from 'Dogs for kids with Disabilities' to become a care dog for the charity CHIPS (Christians Helping

in Primary Schools) and Hillcrest Christian College.

Baileys purpose is to be a calming, fun & positive influence on the children in Beaconsfield Primary School and the other schools that I work in within my capacity as a Chaplain, (Hampton Park Primary School &

Hillcrest Christian College).

The aim of having Baileys working in schools is to bridge barriers with children who find it hard to interact socially, be a calming effect on anxious children and to providecomfortandphysical touch to grieving children coping with loss. I am also working with children with learning difficulties to learn to be good friends by teaching social skills. helped has Baileys children at crucial times of melt-down to become calmer and ready to go back into class and learn.

Sheisbusywithsocialisation and has an incredibly gentle nature and loves people especially children. She has had a great reception everywhere I go. She has already calmed down a traumatised child, provided comfort to children whose parents are separating/ leaving and is a welcome joy to the staff who need a hug! She is most effective at the present time with children with severe anxiety; due to Baileys a student will come to school to meet her despite chronic problems with absenteeism. staff member after dealing with a traumatised child with Baileys said 'she's worth her weight in gold'.

A special thank you to Beaconsfield Veterinary Centre who have supported/sponsored us with her vaccinations, worming, de-sexing, and flea and tick treatment and lots of advice; they are a great team to work with.







Election Promises

It has been a busy and exciting month in Parliament, with the Baillieu Coalition Government handing down its first State Budget.

This budget is a responsible one, with a focus on law and order, infrastructure, health, education and cost of living pressures.

It has also delivered on the election promises I made last year.

One of those commitments, to provide more car parking at Beaconsfield Railway Station, was well received locally.

The 2011-12 Budget outlines a \$1.3 million project to provide more than100 new car parking bays at the station.

This is a great boost for Beaconsfield residents and will address the chronic shortage of car parking, which has left some commuters with no choice but to park illegally or in residential streets.

Holm Park Reserve has also received a boost, with a \$500,000 grant to complete facilities.

I am looking forward to the completion of Holm Park Reserve and I am sure the new facilities will meet the demands of the many sporting enthusiasts in Beaconsfield.

Another local commitment



was to install a roundabout at Emerald-Beaconsfield Road and Salisbury Road in Upper Beaconsfield. Safety is imperative on our roads and I am pleased that this has been delivered.

Traffic will also be improved at Clyde Road, Berwick, with the Coalition investing \$23.4 million to duplicate the road from High Street to Kangan Drive.

The Coalition has made a record investment in special education. Locally, \$15 million has been allocated to build the Casey-Cardinia Special School, in Officer. I am proud that we are making such a significant commitment to improve the future of some of our most vulnerable children.

State-wide, we have introduced a number of measures to ease cost of living pressures for Victorian families.

The Coalition is halving Ambulance Victoria membership fees. We are also introducing Stamp Duty savings for first home buyers, with a 20 per cent cut to be introduced this July. This will be increased to 50 per cent by September 2014.

Casev-Cardinia Branch of the National Trust hosted the morning with members of the Casey Cardinia Corporation Library Local History Reference Group who each gave short presentation of water related theme. photograph or object collection. from their

Cr. Graeme Legge spoke about the history of Emerald Lake and the excitement of the park ranger involved in an armed robbery whilst trying to bank the takings.

Abbie Lane a City of Casey

Environment Education Officer, spoke about fresh water and covered international issues such as population growth and local issues such as the need to recognize that water is a finite resource and being careful with water.

Audrey Dodson from Berwick Pakenham Historical Society spoke about the February floods in Officer in Cardinia Creek Area with some amazing photos.

Wendy Goodman from Narre Warren family history group spoke of George & Annis Bills and their legacy which provided water troughs for horses throughout Australia. Lyn Wealands spoke of the old Lang Lang pool, enjoyed by locals and showed some fascinating old photos.

Polly Freeman spoke about the Tooradin Marine Life Centre, and educational facility sadly destroyed by arson in 2003. Some of us had memories of fascinating visits to the centre.

Bob Flavell spoke of the Edrington water tower built around 1910 and recently refurbished.

Judith Dwyer continued on the Edrington theme by talking about the Casey collection and displayed some of Lord Casey's water related books. Finally Ruth Crofts (President of the Casey Cardinia National Trust) displayed a mystery object, which none of us guessed. It was a belly warmer made of brass which could be filled with hot water and then kept the tummy of a coachman warm when it was put down his coat.

Margaret Boon and Ann Taylor represented the Beaconsfield **Progress** Association Inc. and spoke of the significance of Cardinia Creek Beaconsfield's History and showed some historical photos of the creek, bridge swimming spots.

Casey Cardinia Branch National Trust Membership





Beaconsfield is situated on Cardinia Creek. The creek is the border between Cardinia Shire and the City of Casey. Almost all of Beaconsfield is in the Shire of Cardinia, but a small section is in the City of Casey. Generally we just cross the bridges at Princes Highway and Soldiers Road and notice little peaceful creek below, however when there is really heavy rain, the water rises incredibly

quickly and a raging torrent engulfs parts of the township. Beaconsfield Park, Bob Burgess reserve and Akoonah Park are linked beneath the highway bridge covered by deep and rapid flowing waters. The double lane highway concrete bridge of today withstands the waters well but in the floods of 1934 the old wooden single lane bridge was washed away by the force of the water. Beneath the concrete bridge

when the water is low you can see the remnants of the old wooden pylons of the earlier wooden bridge.

The creek was especially important in the early 1900s.

The Victorian **Tourist** Bureau guide book 1912 describes Cardinia Creek as providing "a plentiful supply of water and fishing for those whose inclinations lie in this direction: blackfish and eels are plentiful: trout and perch are occasionally caught. Upon the creek is a fairly large sheet of water on which was held the A.N.A. aquatic carnival and it is also used for public baths, a smaller pool lower down the creek, being reserved for ladies." William Brisbane partnership with John Day had a saw mill near to the creek and campaigned to have the Beaconsfield station opened so they conveniently send sawn timber and firewood Melbourne. to

From the Soldiers Road bridge the creek winds around and is beside the viaduct that goes under the railway line at Beaconsfield station. When the rains come the viaduct very quickly fills with water from the swollen creek and the whole area is impassable.

Today the creek area is popular for walks as it

abuts parklands and is home to birds, wildlife, fish and frogs. It is the habitat for platypus and over the past few years new families have been released into the creek. A programme to track them has taken place but the survival rate has unfortunately been very low.

Land care has worked to restore much of the indigenous plants to the riverbanks with extensive planting and clearing of noxious weeds in both Guys Hill and Beaconsfield Park areas. Beaconsfield Park beside the Highway bridge has just had extensive stage one works done with a Federal government grant and Cardinia Shire History Grant to restore the original 1939 Beaconsfield Park sign which had been erected as a memorial to the soldiers in the Great War.

It was so interesting to take part in the World Heritage Day event and learn of the significance of water to all these places in the Casey/Cardinia region





Adopt **A Fire Hydrant**



CFA needs The assistance your home. protecting your Beaconsfield The Fire Brigade residents encouraging to adopt a fire hydrant. If there is a fire at your property, it is vitally important that the CFA is able to locate and access the fire hydrant as quickly as possible.

You can help by identifying the closest fire hydrant to your home and ensuring-

- The hydrant cover is clear of grass and soil and easily accessible. safety reasons do not clean inside the hydrant cover.
- The hydrant marker post is intact and easily visible from the street.
- * There should be blue reflectors on the marker post and a blue reflector on the road if the road hydrant. opposite the * Vehicles are not to be
- parkedontopofthehydrant.

Damaged maker posts, hydrant covers or missing reflectors can be reported to your local council. Leaking hydrants should reported be South East Water. In an emergency you may be able to assist the brigade by identifying the location of your nearest hydrant.

Teenagers Save Kittens From Certain Death

Two tiny kittens still have eight of their nine lives left, thanks to the efforts of two teenagers who rescued them from a pile of builders' rubbish in a housing estate on Monday 14th March.

When Berwick locals Lindsey Leigh Hobson, 19, and Robert Walerczak, 18, heard that some stray kittens had been seen in Mandalay Court, Berwick, near Beaconhills College, they immediately went to their rescue.

"We found two kittens, a black one and a tortoiseshell-coloured one," said Lindsey. "But they were so small we thought their mum, and maybe other kittens, might

be hiding somewhere close by. We looked everywhere but didn't see or hear any more cats."

Using a can of lemonflavoured tuna donated by a kindly man from a house on the other side of the court, Lindsey and Robert were able to catch the frightened kittens. Robert said they could feel all their ribs. "They mewed a lot, but as soon as we wrapped them in a blanket and I held them against my chest they started to purr really loudly. By then it was dark and because it was a public holiday we could not take them to a vet or to the pound. So we took them to Lindsey's mum in Beaconsfield. She said they were badly dehvdrated. but thev couldn't have cow's milk because it would make them sick. She thought they were only about five weeks old. She got them lapping water - they drank nearly a whole bowl once she got them going. She fed them every two hours with tiny amounts of tinned kitten food. But it was touch and go that first night, especially the black

Lindsey's mother couldn't the kittens keep long because of all her other animals. On her recommendation Lindsev and Robert took the feline waifs to the Beaconsfield Veterinary Clinic, which often takes in stray, injured dumped animals, cares and for them homes are found. "Rob and I are students and we don't have a lot of money," said Lindsey. "We decided to split the costs fifty-fifty. But the surgery wouldn't take any money. They wormed the kittens, gave them a check-up and put them in a big cage with food and toys. They grew heaps in just a few days, and look so happy, healthy and playful now. It is such a relief, and we think the staff at the surgery are just fantastic for helping them and so many other animals." homeless

Lindsey and Robert were told a few days after the rescue that another kitten with a broken leg had been found earlier in the same location. It had been taken to a vet, but its fate is unknown.

So where did the kittens come from and why had they been separated from their mother before they were too young to look after themselves? While it seems most likely that they were thoughtlessly dumped, the other possibility is that the mother was a stray who had been injured or killed.

Either according way, to Lindsev and Robert. irresponsible and uncaring pet owners are to blame. "There are too unwanted pets and not enough good homes to go round. The kittens we found were just helpless. scared little babies. They would have died a sad and horrible death on that pile of rubbish, and the one with the broken leg must have been in a lot of pain. There should be a law that says people have to get their dogs and cats neutered before they are old enough to breed. It is illegal for people to dump animals, but there should be much tougher penalties."

Lindsey and Robert have this advice for people who know of dumped animals: "Don't just leave them – try to catch them, or phone the Council or your local vet to get advice. And if you can identify the people who dumped them, don't tell yourself it's not your problem. Cruelty to animals is everybody's responsibility."

The kittens are now a few months old and one has recently found a loving home. The second, a tortoiseshell female (now desexed) is still looking for a kind and caring owner. If you can help, please contact Beaconsfield Veterinary Clinic, 14 Woods Street, Beaconsfield; 9769 phone 8777.





GOLF AT CARDINIA BEACONHILLS

Despite the wet and cold weather, Cardinia Beaconhills Golf Course is in good condition, with enjoyed by play being both members and public social players. The course is the location for various Peninsula District Golf Association Events and will host an Australian Seniors pro-am PGA later this year. event

Cardinia Beaconhills Golf Links renamed in 2010 is located in Stoney Creek Road Upper Beaconsfield and has a history dating back to 1928 when the first nine holes were cleared by bullock team to a layout designed by Dick Banks. A guest house built

in the early 1930's from local timber and stone is now the club house and has been subsequently extended and modernized. The first land owner was Mr Charles Ford who also managed the Dorchester Restaurant. Subsequent owners were Frederick Adcock and Colonial Mutual Assurance until 1947 when the Beaconhills Country Golf Club was formed.

The course has 27 holes and green fees players are most welcome to play and also enjoy the Clubhouse, Bar and Dining facilities. Head Professional Mark Griffin has a fully stocked Pro Shop. Lessons utilize modern indoor teaching

TALKING WEATHER

With significant rainfall over the last 2 months we have again seen over 200mm for the period. With this being the wettest start to the year on my records. Beaconsfield should once again reach over 1000mm for the year. We have received 600mm to the start of June.

April saw 103mm fall in the area. This was the highest April monthly total since 2006. The average rainfall for April is 66mm. The highest daily total was 30mm which fell on the 11th of April. rain was recorded over 10 days.

May saw us fall just shy of the 100mm mark falling with 99mm Beaconsfield. With rain falling on thalf the days in May the highest daily total was 14mm which fell on the 10th. It was the wettest May since 2000 when we received 142mm; this is also the highest total I have on records for May. The average during the last 10 years for May is only 59mm.


With all this rain falling, it has seen Melbourne's water storage rise to its highest point since March 2006. It is currently at 54.6. At the same time last year it was only 32.7.






