PLANNING PERMIT FOR 'PINK HILL' POKIE VENUE

VCAT has now issued its decision in relation to both the hotel and subdivision appeals, and has ordered that Council issue a planning permit for both applications despite strong opposition from both residents and the local council.

The application was lodged in mid 2009 and Cardinia Shire councillors refused a proposal for the development and use of a hotel, installation and use of 60 electronic

gaming machines (EGM) and use of land for the sale and consumption of alcohol at 13 May Road, Beaconsfield, known as 'Pink Hill'.

Councillor Brett Owen commented about his disappointment of the VCAT decision, "Overall, it is not the outcome Council were seeking, however there were some positives in terms of the operating hours, car parking and access arrangements".

Local Government plays a key role in advocating state and federal governments for improved infrastructure that benefits residents. our Council is currently advocating for the installation of a full diamond interchange onto the Princes/Monash Freeway at Beaconsfield. This would provide direct freeway access for Beaconsfield residents travelling to and from Pakenham and Gippsland. The connector road from the Princes Highway to Soldiers Road and O'Shea Road is also needed.

In August, Beaconsfield resident Angelo D'Amelio and I presented a petition to the member for Gembrook, Brad Battin. The petition contained over 1500 signatures advocating to the state parliament for urgent improvements the Monash/Princes Freeway, to relieve traffic congestion. We currently await a response from the government on this issue.

Works on the reserve in Holm Park Road continue. The construction of the entrance road is now completed. Grass on the main oval is beginning to run and create coverage andthesecondovalisbeing prepared for sprigging of the warm season grass. Flood lighting for reserve is expected to be completed in October. Council continues to liaise with the Beaconsfield Football Club to finalise the building design for the pavilion. Once the plans specifications agreed upon, the proposed

The 52 page document prepared by VCAT details their findings. They noted the installation and use of gaming machines was surrounded by contention, noting that number significant objections were received by the council opposing this aspect of the proposal.

At the hearing held in August, Council argued for a reduction in the operating hours, which VCAT agreed with. As such, the operating hours have been reduced to 8am to midnight (Sunday to Thursday) and 8am to 1am (Friday and Saturday). The gaming hours have been restricted to 10am to 1am (Monday to Sunday).

VCAT determined that this

reduction in hours is likely to overcome any significant amenity issues occurring nearby residential properties, subject further noise assessment studies being undertaken at appropriate times once the venue is operating.

Council argued at the hearing that insufficient car parking was provided for the proposal, which VCAT has agreed with and has ordered the applicant to amend their plans to provide an extra 50 car parking spaces in the north-eastern corner of the site. In addition, a deceleration lane must be provided into the site, which Council argued for, and VCAT agreed with

LUCKY ESCAPE FOR YOUNG PLATYPUS

A platypus has been saved from a painful death after a plastic ring of only 6centimetre diameter was removed from around its chest. The young female was found during earlier survey last month by the Australian **Platypus** Conservancy along Cardinia Creek.

APC biologist Geoff Williams said that the animal was a juvenile from last summer's breeding season. The ring probably had slipped over her head and shoulders several weeks ago when she was still tiny. Now she was about 75% fully grown and the plastic was starting to cut into her, having already caused a lesion about 2 centimetres long on her right side. Fortunately, the ring was removed just in time, as the wound had not yet caused serious injury.


"It was pure luck that she turned up in our survey when she did," said Geoff. "Otherwise, as she grew bigger over the next few weeks, the ring would have cut deeper and deeper into her, causing a slow and agonising death."

In addition to saving the life of this young platypus, the Cardinia Creek survey also produced other good news. The total of five platypus recorded—two young males and three juvenile females—was the highest for a spring-time survey since the project to re-introduce platypus to Cardinia Creek

commenced in 2004 (the original population having gone extinct after the Ash Wednesday bushfires). The result suggests that the new population was becoming well-established, especially as the finding of more juveniles indicated that breeding was now occurring routinely.

The project received a set-back a few years ago when at least two platypus were killed in illegal opera house yabby traps.


L. Geoff Williams with plastic ring removed from platypus Below: Close up of plastic ring with ruler



"We are still concerned about the evidence of illegal yabbying and fishing activities along the creek," said Geoff. "However, it is obvious that litter also poses a significant threat. In addition to the young female who nearly died because of the plastic ring, one of the males had large ragged scars on his bill, suggesting that it had encountered a sharp object in the water, such as broken glass or discarded wire."

Conservancy biologists were assisted in this week's volunteers survey by from Cardinia Catchment Landcare. President the Glenn of group Macmillan said he hoped the community would get behind Landcare's efforts to improve Cardinia Creek as a home for platypus.

"We are making great progress in planting more native vegetation throughout the Cardinia Creek catchment, which will eventually provide better conditions these wonderful animals. However, it's no good having a great habitat if platypus are being killed by litter and fishing, so we hope people will start to recognise the need to take greater care."

Storm

We would like to welcome a new canine addition to the Beaconsfield Vet Centre. Recently our Veterinary Nurse Leesa bought a Border Collie pup to add to her family. 'Storm' arrived home when she was 8 weeks old and it has been a lot different to having an old kelpie. She is a lovable and cheeky pup and has given Leesa a good insight into what clients go through when getting a new puppy for themselves.

'Storm' started puppy preschool run through the Beaconsfield Vet Centre, by Alpha Dog Training when she was 8 weeks old and has since gone on to further puppy training. 'It was a great experience taking her to training where she could play with other puppies in a safe environment and learn the basics. It is also good to talk with other clients and trainers who know what you are going through,

such as toilet training, jumping up at visitors and mouthing'. Since training started Leesa has been able to address these concerns with 'Storm' and with consistent training and effort she is turning into a well behaved puppy.

Storm was recently in for her 12 week vaccination and worming tablet. After her consultation to ensure she was healthy she had her vaccination and her history was sent to a pet insurance company. This will ensure she will always be covered, and helps to reduce financial concerns

when considering the best option/procedure for her. 'One of the best times to get pet insurance is when they are a puppy, as any conditions they have been seen for before getting insured will not be covered. 

SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

Investment Properties Damaged By A Natural Disaster

Unfortunately the incidence of natural disasters including floods, fires, cyclones and earthquakes seems to be increasing hence the tax treatment of repairs and rebuilding costs and insurance proceeds must be carefully considered. The following may be of assistance:

1. Repairs to make good damage, defects deterioration of the property are normally deductible eg walls, flooring etc damaged by natural disasters. 2. Expenditure replacing Capital items eg heater, stove cannot be claimed as an immediate deduction if the cost exceeds \$300 however a deduction for depreciation is allowable over the useful life of the capital item.

- 3. Expenditure on other capital expenditure replacement of kitchen cupboards, bathroom and laundry items usually deemed to improvements. No deduction for the total cost of the improvements allowed however a claim for depreciation or capital works deduction usually available.
- 4. Repairs to depreciable items are allowable deductions however a replacement cost eg

carpet damaged by flood would be depreciable but a write-off allowed for the written-down value of the asset destroyed.

- 5. Where a building is destroyed by a natural disaster, the rebuilding cost is capital expenditure and a capital works deductions is normally allowable (over a forty year period).
- 6. Insurance Compensation payments received are treated, as follows:

 Loss of rent payments are assessable income.

 For loss of depreciating assets, treat as a disposal and have a balancing adjustment of profit or loss.

 Loss of a Capital Gains Asset eg Investment Building then Capital Gains Taxgainorlosswouldapply.

Same Sex Marriage

There has been much campaigning for Same Sex Marriage and many of the arguments are cogent and compelling. Nevertheless my personal conviction is that marriage is an agreement that can only be established between a man and a woman.

Nevertheless am sympathetic to the desire of homosexual couples to have the sanctions and the legal benefits of a marriage contract. But relationship which the two people of the same sex establish cannot be marriage. Homosexual couples do not have heterosexual what couples have; in that the homosexual couple cannot produce children.

Are we are dealing simply with labels and names? Perhaps we should let homosexual couples have the tag "marriage" and a new label be given to the relationship in which members of the opposite sex form a lifelong exclusive relationship in which the possibility of producing children exists.



National Disability Insurance Scheme

Since I last wrote for the banner I have been busy both locally and in Canberra, representing the community's interests and ensuring a fairgo for local residents.

I am proud to report that the Federal Government has taken a lead in reforming of disability services by asking the Productivity Commission to examine the feasibility, costs and replacing benefits of the current system with new approach beginning the work needed set Australia's up first National Disability Insurance Scheme.

Local resident Adam Cope recently explained what the NDIS would mean to him. He says he could be far more independent and secure. "What the name implies is insurance but the "I" means much more than that. For me the 'I' means independence, integration and involvement. NDIS would give me a means to have hope and be supported to do what I want to do. It would also let mum and dad off the hook and they could then have a life. After 38 years I think they deserve it", Adam said. Adam's words are very powerful and from my conversations with people

with disabilities, carers and their families, I think that they reflect views that are shared by so many in our society. People with disability in our community need support, but they also need independence and a better opportunity to control their own lives. I believe that Government can help achieve that and that's why I believe the need NDIS.

The Federal Government has undertaken this work because our disability support system is simply not equipped to provide the kind of care or support we want to see for some of our most vulnerable people, and reform is necessary.

The report suggested a major change to the way people with disability are supported and I look forward to hearing from

residents about how the Government can best support the needs of people with disabilities and their carers so that I can take those views to Canberra and to the Minister. 
From around 7:30 am, the children were up and about; they had lots of time and freedom to play on the rope swing, play golf, try out the unicycles and talk to the animals!

THE CARDINIAN FLORA AND FAUNA EMBROIDERY

by A. Taylor

The Cardinian Embroidery makers are at it again, working to produce a sequel or companion piece to the original eight panels which were finished and hung in the Cardinian Cultural Centre in November 2006.

The Flora and Fauna panels will include all those indigenous creatures and features that would not have been seen on the other panels, due to the set scale.

There will be four landscape panels representing the four general categories of environmental habitats as described in the Cardinia Environment Coalition's Booklet "Birds of Cardinia" Temperate These are Rainforest, Woodlands. Wetlands. Rural and

As in the earlier panels, features will be embroidered separately. using a variety of hand and machine embroidery techniques. Small creatures and endangered species will be shown life -size in the foregrounds of the four landscapes, with more common shrubs. trees, birds and animals shown decreasing in size towards the background.

We are starting at ground level and experimenting with different techniques to embroider realistic leaf litter to serve as a background to the native orchids, crawling insects and birds pecking for food.

This set of five panels will eventually be completely portable and available for exhibition on request around the Shire first, then elsewhere in Victoria and perhaps interstate.

'Friends of the Cardinian Embroidery Inc.' (FOTCE) are working independently on this project, so we are looking for sponsorsbusinesses. community aroups. families and individuals who can donate a set amount to cover the cost of materials for a particular embroidered creature or feature. Cost materials for small insects. wildflowers. etc. is \$15, while larger shrubs, trees, animals. birds, and so on cost \$25.

We are also looking for good photos of plants and animals, etc. which will provide us with clear details of colour, texture and size. This will help us avoid any breaches of copyright by not using previously published images. The photographer might even wish sponsor that creature on the Embroidery especially if they have a particular interest in its preservation. All those who assist in any way will be credited in the booklet we hope to produce (finances permitting) names where the providers of images. sponsors and stitchers will be recorded against each separate embroidery.

Both ARTHUR STREET AND ADAMSON ROAD in Beaconsfield are named after the ADAMSON family who were pioneers in Beaconsfield. James and Agnes came to Australia from England in 1883 and then to Beaconsfield 4 James and vears later. Agnes had 5 children Florence, James, John, Fffe and Arthur, James and his sons were local builders and built many private and

public buildings in the area.

The little wooden shop at No 26 Wood Street (Just down from Arthur Street) was Adamsons Hardware from 1906 and supplied hardware to Beaconsfield residents until 1983. Today the shop is Hairco. Arthur Adamson (1897-1983) ran the store for many years and lived on the premises. This store provided many of the needs of Beaconsfield residents from 1 screw (not sold in packets in those days) and the usual tools and hardware products.

Along with hardware, there was also tinned fruit and biscuits, again not sold in packets but stored in large biscuits tins and weighed out and sold in paper bags.

Adamson's hardware was also the agency for the Commonwealth bank which was quite busy and every Sunday Arthur would ring the fire siren.

Arthur was also generous in his sponsorship of beds for various hospitals in Melbourne.

Today we have Kenilworth Avenue, named after the

house which was built in 1887 and all the joinery work was reputedly carried out by James Adamson. The 'Villa' was built for Charles Nott, gentleman and included an extensive garden, some of which remains still today. There was also a coach house. This was made of handmade bricks on bluestone foundations and included room for coaches and a coachman's room and a loft on the first floor for storing feed.

Unfortunately Charles Nott lost his money in the 1890's crash and had to sell his property to a city lawyer Montage Cohen. The property was then purchased in 1916 by the Berry Street Foundling Home. This was home to many babies, children and nursing staff and has many interesting stories. The coach house was converted into а laundry until Berry Street finally closed the home in 1946. The property was then leased. but fell into disrepair. In 1963, the Tozer family purchased the property and demolished the old house and rebuilt a new house using some of the original handmade bricks and stained glass windows in their home. The property was purchased in 1971 by Doreen and Jim Sanders. The coach house had become separate a residence by this time.

The Sanders family built a bridge to the island created by Nott and planted it with native species to attract native birds. The DVA acquired the island with

38 acres of the property.

Today the remaining property has been subdivided into 'Coach Lane'. House The 1960's Tozer house still remains and thankfully Old Coach house the has been retained and although almost lost when it fell into disrepair, it has been carefully restored into a home. Some of the original garden still stands with its Bunya Bunya pines and cypress.

James Adamson also built Kenilworth Cottage in 1888 for Charles Nott, possibly first used as a gatehouse and later as a ladies college and then became the Railway House and is still standing today near the railway station. It has been loving restored and is a tribute to James Adamson's fine workmanship. Bunya Bunya Pine out the front is thought to be linked the original garden to Kenilworth Villa. at

James Adamson and his sons built the original Beaconsfield Hall, which was the centre of town activities for many years. The hall was built in 1905 for 100 pounds with two rooms added



for 31 pounds. The hall was opened by Premier Thomas Bent in 1906 and stood on Old Princes Hwy in the area between the Central Hotel and where the medical centre is now. The hall was demolished around 1974 when the highway was duplicated.

The Adamsons built a number of other houses, only a few are still in existence. They also built thelovely lattice shelter shed which was at Beaconsfield Primary school and can be seen in the early photos of the school.

James' daughter Florence was the first pupil to be enrolled at Beaconsfield Primary school (known then as Beaconsfield Station School) and his three older sons, John, James and Robert all served in World War I and they are on the Beaconsfield Honour Board which is in the Beaconsfield Community /Complex. Adamson Road is in the original soldier settlement land in Beaconsfield.







TALKING WEATHER

by Nathan Boon

The wet year we are having Beaconsfield in continues as the rain still keeps falling. Another 131mm of rain fell in the last 2 months and with this the dam levels continues to rise. This time last year it was at 47.7%. It is now at 63%, this is the highest since December 2000 when it reach a very similar level as to what it is at the moment. With the winter now behind us hopefully we can now start to enjoy some nice sunny days.

August saw 7 days where it rained for a total of 34mm. The highest daily total of 12mm fell on the 10th. This was the lowest August total since 2002 when only

27mm fell in Beaconsfield.

September saw the rain return and 97mm fell in Beaconsfield over 8 days. The highest daily total was 35mm this fell on the 28th.

The yearly total has now climbed to 845mm as at the end of September. This is still higher than at the same time last year when we had recorded 673mm. This total for the year so far is the wettest I have on record. Of the 27 years of full year rainfall records that I have for Beaconsfield, it will only required a further 227 mm in the last 3 months of this year to be the highest yearly total on record for Beaconsfield.






