


The Association has been extremely busy recently including the following:

will have a senior size and a junior size ground and netballers will enjoy more than one court to play on.



BEACONSFIELD FIRE BRIGADE NEWS

AS SUMMER APPROACHES

The Volunteers at the Beaconsfield Fire Brigade would like to wish everyone in the Beaconsfield community a safe and joyous Christmas and new year. For those who plan to travel on the roads over the holiday period we would like to encourage you to take your time on the roads and make sure you take plenty of rest breaks if driving for long periods.

A holiday should start before you leave home and not when you arrive at your destination so there is no need to take risks on the roads just so you can arrive a few minutes earlier. When staying away from home over the summer it is important that you assess the risk of fire in the area you are staying. Many coastal towns or rural areas which are popular for holiday makers are in high risk areas for bushfires, it is

important to stay informed of the fire weather forecast in the area you are staying and plan your actions on days of high fire risk.

The CFA website has free "Aps" available for smart phones to help you to easily access your local fire weather forecast and keep you informed. Local ABC radio can also supply valuable up-to-date information on emergencies and fire weather forecasts.

Seasonal Outlook

Any summer in Australia brings with it the risk of fire and this season is no exception.



The above average rainfall across Victoria should not be seen as a reason to relax our attitudes to the threat of bush fires. The CFA is preparing for a potential season of dangerous grass fires. Recent rains has promoted massive growth in the grasslands and hills, areas that in previous years had a fuel height of about 200-300mm now has grass growing to well above a metre. It does not take long for these fine fuels to dry out and become a high fire risk, a few weeks of dry weather will see lush green grass turn yellow and dry.

Protecting Yourself From Grassfires

* Grassfires can start quickly and spread rapidly, catching people off guard.
* Grassfires are very hot and can produce huge amounts of radiant heat that can kill anyone caught out in the open.
* The safest place to be during a grassfire is well away from the threat.

Shelter From Radiant Heat

Shelter yourself from radiant heat bv: * going inside a building prepared that is well actively defended * going inside a private or community fire shelter that meets current regulations * as a last resort, go to a Neighbourhood Safer Place

(Place of Last Resort). If there is no such place, then a ploughed paddock, dam, swimming pool or other large water body may offer some protection from radiant heat. This does not include a water tank. Dams may not be reliable as their water levels fluctuate and they may be empty in summer. offer Cars very protection from radiant heat. A car is unlikely to protect you from the radiant heat of a grassfire. However, it offers more protection than being caught on foot in the open. If you are in a car and become caught in a grassfire, do not get out and run.

Protective Clothing

If you are threatened by a grassfire, always protect vourself by covering up exposed skin with protective clothing. Protective clothing includes: * Long-sleeved shirt and pants made from a natural fibre such as cotton or wool boots Sturdy and socks woollen Tough leather gloves A wide-brimmed hat A face mask or towel to cover your mouth and nose protection such Eye smoke goggles. You need to shield yourself from radiant heat behind a solid structure such as a building.

2011-2012 Fire Season.

The Brigade has been busy with our own preparations for the 2011-2012 fire season. The fire season could see crews from Beaconsfield being deployed to fires anywhere in Victoria or even interstate and it's important we are fully prepared to respond at any stage. At this time of the year our training

focuses on the bushfire risk and you may see us out in the area pumping from dams or creeks, practicing our hose drills and even fighting imaginary fires in bush land or grass areas. You should feel free to stop and observe our training or ask some questions should you ever come across us running our drills.

Six New Recruits

The Brigade would like welcome six new recruit firefighters to the team, Robert Smith, Ashley Sanders, Robert Charlston, Hayden Powell, Ryan O'Connor and James Brewer have joined the brigade and are working through the initial minimum skills training that they are required to complete before they can start responding to fires and incidents. The recruits are keen to learn, there is a lot of information to take on and new skills to learn as a recruit firefighter and they are progressing well. Congratulations on your achievements so far, the brigade is looking forward to seeing you achieve operational firefighter status when you will be able to put your new skills to use helping to protect your community.

The Brigade has attended 26 fires and incidents in October and November, a significant motor vehicle accident at the intersection of Old Princess Highway and O'Neil Road saw a female driver airlifted to hospital after her car collided with another vehicle and then into the path of an oncoming truck. The truck was rolled onto its side as a result of the impact. All other occupants were treated at the scene officers. Ambulance



SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

Many of the changes previously announced by the Government are now being implemented. These changes include the following:

Small Business Benchmarks

-The Tax Office has undertaken significant research calculate to Benchmark ratios identify businesses that may not be reporting all of their income. -New industries to have Benchmarks are Motor Landscapers, Vehicle Retailers-New and Used, Panel Beaters, Lawn Mowing Gardening, **Tattooists** and Pharmacists.

-Benchmarks for other industries have revised. heen -The Tax Office identifies taxpavers for audit where businesses are at variance with Benchmarks emphasis those operating the economy.

Standard Tax Deductions

-An Exposure Draft has been released allowing taxpayers accept standard deduction for work expenses tax agent fees. -The proposal is to allow a deduction of \$500 in 2012/3 and up to \$1,000 in 2013/4 and later years. -Taxpavers accepting

these deductions are not required to substantiate the expenses but the standard deductions may be less than amounts actually incurred.

Superannuation Guarantee

-The Government acting on the Henry Review including: -Affirmed its commitment to increase the minimum superannuation guarantee amounts from current rate of 9% 12% by 2019/20 year. -From 1st July effectively ensure no tax is to be paid on the 9% Superannuation Contributions for Australians earning less than \$37,000 by the Government making direct contributions into Superannuation Funds of eligible members.

All taxpayers should be aware of constant changes and discuss with their Accountant.

A Very Cuddly Visitor

We recently were lucky enough to meet "Sparkles", an orphaned 6 month Swamp wallaby. Sparkles was being cared for by a local wildlife carer, who noticed that something did not seem quite right "down there". The carer brought Sparkles to our clinic for a check up. After an examination by our vet Tarni, she was diagnosed with having a rectal prolapse. This means that tissue from the rectum had been pushed outwards, causing swelling. discomfort hindered normal and defecation. Left untreated, this could lead to severe infection. constipation death. possibly and

A decision was made to anaesthetise Sparkles to repair the prolapse. Under anaesthetic, Sparkles was closely monitored by one of our vet nurses Sian, while Tarni performed a surgical procedure to replace the rectal tissue back into position. This tissue was held in place by a stitch to prevent it recurring while the swelling was reducing. Sparkles recovered well from the anaesthetic and was able to return to her wildlife carer that evening with some pain relief and anti-biotics.

Over the next few days, Sparkles continued to improve and eat well. Afew days after the surgery, Sparkles returned to have her stitch removed. Once removed, it was obvious everything had stayed in place and the swelling had reduced. She also had a visit to Healesville Sanctuary and was given a clean bill of health.

Sparkles has continued to grow well, without any recurrence of the prolapse. She is still with her wildlife carer, but has graduated to a larger, more open enclosure to graze and hop around. Once old enough, she will eventually be released back into the wild.

So whatever else we may want to say about the bible and church we all know that by and large it produces good citizens.





National Disability Insurance Scheme

As we near the end of the year and head into the festive season, I will be visiting schools across our electorate to speak to local students and present the La Trobe Student Leadership and Community Service Award.

Each school selects an award recipient and I hope that the students who receive the award will be encouraged to continue to lead by example. engage with others compassionately and encourage others to contribute to their school wider and community.

I was delighted to visit Harkaway Primary School to present their school leadership award to school leader Jamie Wills. While there I also officially opened their new classroom block funded by the Federal Government.

The investment in Harkaway Primary enabled the school to update the 135 year-old historic buildings with impressive new classrooms and a 21st century library whilst supporting the employment of 20 workers at the site.

In further education news,

it was great to formally open the new stadium at St Michael's Primary School in Berwick, which will be used by the school and wider community for sport and performing arts. As always, the principal, children and whole school community were delighted to have a new building for their school now and into the future.

The Minister for Mental Health and Ageing Mark Butler and recently met with local seniors at Akoonah Park as part of national conversation on healthy and positive ageing. Our senior citizens play a very important role in our local community and deserve to age with dignity and security with more choice and control over the way they live. To capture the opportunities presented by an ageing population, we need to provide support and encouragement to older Australians to continue contributing our community - whether work. in retirement in caring roles. or

This year has seen some significant reforms, not least of which is the National Disability Insurance Scheme. Working towards the introduction of a NDIS is one of the most important things that I will do as a Member of Parliament. It will be a new support system for people with a disability, their families and carers. It will transform the way services are funded and delivered, ensuring people are better supported and enabling them to have greater choice and control. I recently held a local forum with Federal Minister for Community Services, Jenny Macklin, to discuss our work to lay the foundations for a NDIS.

Many local residents, carers, and service providers came along to share their experiences and offer ideas on how we can improve disability services to ensure that people receive the assistance they need to lead a life of dignity and independence.

Another major reform of interest to the community in and around Beaconsfield are the new low income superannuation reforms. There's no use working hard all your life only to retire poor. This reform will help hard working people, including mums and dads working part time, shop assistants, child care workers, hairdressers, aged care and disability workers, hospitality and bar staff and other Australians, who currently pay up to \$500 a year in tax on their superannuation, more for their retirement.

And as a big supporter of small business, I welcome the Federal Government's plan to offer a big tax cut to every local small business. The tax cut will mean local small business owners would be able to instantly write off every asset they buy valued below \$6500 and the first \$5000 of any motor vehicle.

Those tax cuts will be funded from the products of the mining tax which is currently before the Federal Parliament. The mining tax will also enable us to fund more superannuation for all Australian workers, it will allow us to invest more in infrastructure and will ensure that the benefits of the mining boom are shared amongst all Australians



We believe this will also be an excellent educational resource for the local schools projects. Indeed we hope that this book will be available in their school libraries to be used as a reference book for local history projects.


It will also make the ideal Christmas Gift. I am sure that it is something that everyone would be pleased to receive. So I hope everyone here tonight will help us get this book out into the community.

The tiny black kitten, now eight months old, was named Cougar by the staff at Beaconsfield Veterinary Clinic who very kindly took over the care of the kittens when Lindsev and Robert couldn't keep Cougar and his them. sister Jamie were adopted out, but unfortunately Cougar was returned. The Clinic staff took him in once more, hoping that a new owner would soon be found. His affectionate nature and obvious intelligence made him a favourite. But he was also growing up to be a very active young cat and, as the weeks passed, the staff became concerned about his surgery lifestyle being too restrictive.

Meanwhile, Kim, a muchloved cat in Lindsey's home, had been diagnosed with cancer, and the time came when the kindest thing to do was have him put to sleep. The staff at

Beaconsfield Vet Clinic asked if the family would consider taking Cougar. Lindsey's mother did not feel ready for another cat, but Kim's passing meant there was room for one more furry friend, and the family policy has always been to adopt neglected or unwanted animals. At this stage they had no idea that this handsome young black cat was the scrawny. dehydrated. half-dead kitten that Lindsey and Robert had pulled off a rubbish dump five months previously.

Cougar quickly purred his way into the hearts of Lindsey, her mother and all their visitors, including Robert. He was soon trained not to jump up on benches to steal food or to raid the kitchen tidy for chop bones, although he still enjoys pinching sink plugs and leaving them up and down the hallway. Like all cats, Cougar's natural tendency is to be active at night but he has settled into a routine of supervised playtime in the backyard during daylight hours, and cuddling up with a human at night. His new





family does not allow cats outside after dark because this is when they are most likely to kill wildlife, get attacked by other cats, or injured by a car.

SeveralweeksafterCougar had come to live with them, Lindsey, her mother and Robert came across a photo of the kittens they had rescued, and noticed that the black one had an expression remarkably similar to Cougar's. The kitten also had a distinctive patch of white hairs on one side of his chest - exactly matching the same marking on Cougar. Could it be ... ? Lindsey's mother checked with the surgery - and sure enough, their new cat was none other than the rescued kitten.

Everybody is delighted with this outcome. Some things are just meant to be. Lindsey and Robert once again wish to thank the wonderful staff at Beaconsfield Veterinary Clinic for the way they go over and above the call of duty to care for animals.





Wow what a wet year it has been in Beaconsfield. With now well over 1000mm of rain for the year it is the wettest year ever for Beaconsfield that I have on my records.

We have had 4 months were there has been over 100mm for the month and there has been 3 months were over 90mm was recorded. The yearly total is now at 1120mm this is the highest figure that I have in my records but there is also 1 month to go as well.

October saw 95mm of rain fall in Beaconsfield. This is 20mm above average for October. The rain fell over 11 days, with the highest daily total falling on the 28th when 35mm of rain fell. On of the biggest storms

that I have ever seen came through Beaconsfield on Wednesday 9th November. At about 6.30pm the storm rolled in and while not alot of rain fell during the storm it was the hail that caused the damage this time. Hail stones the size of golf ball pelted the town causing damage in the area.


November saw the rain get heavier and there was 180mm of rain for the month. This was the highest November total I had in my records. The previous highest was in November 2004 when there was 160mm. There was rain on 12 days and 8 of those days were over 10mm. The highest daily total was recorded on the 26th when 49mm fell.

From the commencement of Term 4, junior soccer started up in Beaconsfield for those young champions in the making to be the next Beckham to come out and show off their skills.




