Construction of the pavilion at the Holm Park Reserve will commence soon. with Council appointing the successful tenderer Council's January. budget for the pavilion construction along with State Government grants and the Beaconsfield Football Club's contribution will fund the \$2,498,515 construction cost. The proposed works under the contract includes, a two level pavilion with ground floor consisting



in Stirling Circuit within Panorama. A new network of exposed aggregate concrete paths will be created. Future staged works will include the installation of new seats, new fencing around the playground area, new soft fall mulch in the playground area and tree planting along the path network and throughout the park.

Kath Roberts Reserve has also undergone recent improvements. Theseworks involved the installation of new drainage lines surrounding the playground



area, the installation of the seat and picnic setting and increased lighting.

In December, council resolved to meet with petition representatives to discuss their concerns, to conduct new traffic counts and safety audits of the road/roundabout and to provide a more detailed assessment

of the impact of the future opening of Pink Hill Hotel on Scott Lee Drive. Council officers will report back to a future council meeting with the results of the further investigations and a decision of council will then be made regarding the future of the road.

Last year's event which took place at Akoonah Park in Berwick had an overwhelming community response with over 2,200 registered attendees and a total amount raised of \$266,866. This year the volunteer committee and teams hope to exceed the 2011 figures and make this another year to remember!

Funds raised at Relay For Life help the Cancer Council provide support services and resources for local cancer patients and their families. Funds also support critical cancer research and community education programs designed to teach people how to reduce their risk developing cancer.

In 2010 around 1,302 Cardinia Casey and residents utilised Cancer Council's Helpline service, which provides information supportforanyoneaffected by cancer (13 11 20).

"Cancer Council's Relay for Life is more than just a fundraiser", said Casey Cardinia Relay For Life Volunteer Chair Manager, Karen Rycken. Relay For people bring their tents and camp overnight as a community. There will entertainment, live kids' activities and teams

dress up to add to the atmosphere," great Ms Rycken said. "Ceremonies will also be held throughout the event to honour locals who have been touched by cancer. With your continued support and donations, generous we hope that one day soon we can conquer this disease," she said.

The current climatic conditions have made thing a little easier for members of the Volunteer Beaconsfield Fire Brigade, the normal hot dry summer appears to have passed us by and been replaced by damp conditions periods of high humidity. With that said we have still had plenty on our plate and have attended 29 fires and incidents since the last issue of the Banner. It would appear that we won't be experiencing a busy summer but are well aware that it could only take a few dry hot days to create conditions that will make a fire difficult for us to control. There are huge

expanses of dry fuel in the Wimmera and Mallee areas of Victoria, a fire starting in these areas on a windy day could see the volunteers of Beaconsfield being called on to supply crews and appliances to these areas. Victoria is only half way through our fire season and as yet has been fortunate not to have very many significant fires,. Knowing this we have continued to maintain a high level of readiness. our members have been busy training for every conceivable scenario.

Last issue we welcomed six new recruits to the brigade, Robert Smith, Hayden Powell, Ashley Sanders, James Brewer, O'Conner Robert Charleston, These recruits have been very diligent with their training and have displayed a high level of competence during the recruit process. Each of these recruits has now made the first step as volunteer fire-fighters reaching basic fire-fighter level. This allows them to start attending fire calls and put their newly learned skills to use protecting their community and the membership looks forward to working with each of them long into the future.



Whilst you spend a lot of time making sure you and your family are eating a complete and balanced diet, have you stopped to think about whether your pet is getting same attention? the

Just like us, dogs and cats require a certain balance of protein, carbohydrates, fats and minerals to live a long & healthy life. Preliminary Report Released For Cardinia Shire Council Electoral Representation Review

Media Release by Victorian Electoral Commission

The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) today releases a preliminary report outlining four options for the electoral structure of Cardinia Shire Council.

The VEC has considered a range of information, including public submissions, to form its recommendations for an electoral structure that will provide fair and equitable representation for the voters of Cardinia Shire Council.

As its preferred option, the VEC recommends that Cardinia Shire Council be represented by seven councillors elected from three wards. The preferred option consists of one three-councillor ward and two two-councillor wards. alternative options are also being presented for public including comment. two unsubdivided models.

The VEC welcomes responses to the preliminary report. All submissions must be made in writing and be received by 5.00 pm on Wednesday, 29 February.

A public hearing will be held at 6.30 pm on Thursday, 8 March at the Council Chamber, Council Offices, Henty Way, Pakenham. People can speak at the hearing if they have requested to do so in their formal submission.

The preliminary report is available on the VEC website (vec.vic.gov. au) or by calling 131 VEC (131 832). Copies are also available at the Cardinia Shire Council Offices, Henty Way, Pakenham.

A final report containing the VEC's recommendation to the Minister for Local Government will be released on Wednesday, 28 March.

Hillcrest Christian College Belgrave Heights College will both have training centres trade located at their schools. allowing local students from a range of schools to acquire the vocational skills they need to succeed in tomorrow's workforce.

This is one of the many education initiatives that our electorate is benefitting from. Here are a few of the

things that the Federal Government has delivered in education in this area and around the country:

- * more than 780,000 new school computers – one for every student in Years 9 – 12 this year;
- * delivered new or rebuilt facilities at around 9,500 schools – including 500 Language and Science Centres, 2900 covered outdoor learning areas and 3,100 libraries;
- * nearly doubled the national schools budget, to a record high of more than \$65 billion over four years;
- * boosted the Education Tax Refund to cover uniforms as well as other school needs;
- * delivered record funding through national partnerships, including \$540m for literacy and numeracy programs, \$550m to attract and retain



quality teachers, and \$1.5 billion to address localised educational disadvantage.

- * \$30 million in additional funding for schools with working high Aboriginal numbers of and **Torres** Straight Islander students; and
- * committed an extra \$200 million for students with disabilities



First day of School!



Lic Vic Roads Vehicle Tester



I feel compelled to write in response to the column by David Morland entitled "Producing Good Citizens." In his article, he says that someone alone in a car park, when confronted by a group of 8 or 9 young men, can feel comforted about perceived safety concerns upon realising the group has come from a church function.

If only life were so simple and predictable. In fact, perpetrators of violence can come from any walk of life, including from religious backgrounds and highlyesteemed professions. The longstanding evidence about priestly abuse of children and this. youth confirms Although those of us who were raised in a churchgoing family sought solace refuge from the church, we have all learnt that religious affiliation is no definite marker about worth of character. Atheists, agnostics and people of any faith, or no faith at all, can have moral standings. hiah

Personal character is not dictated or determined by belonging to a faith-based organisation. Personal character and moral values are demonstrated by how we treat others every single day of our lives, including caring for those less fortunate than ourselves.

In terms of violence, VicHealth statistics show that it is the biggest contributor to ill-health and premature death in women aged 15 to 44 years old: more damaging obesity, smoking or high blood pressure. The major perpetrators of violence against women are not strangers but men they know, such as husbands or boyfriends.

Mr Morland's article encourages people have confidence about people's character solely membership of church. This is potentially a very harmful piece of advice. Simultaneously, relinquishes opportunity to alert people - especially women - that dangers the greatest they confront in terms in violence is not from strangers on the street but men they know.

Producing good citizens does not come about from membership to any church or organisation. It is how those values are displayed in everyday life. It is inappropriate to make assumptions about people's character how they look, what their backgrounds cultural are, or what church they belong to. Instead, let their actions speak for them.

SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

by GRAEME J. TAYLOR, F.C.A.

The new business year has started in full swing with a large number of reforms announced that will affect many tax payers. These include the following:

- 1. From 1 July 2012 the dependant spouse Tax Offset is restricted to spouses born before 1 July 1952. This will not affect some spouses e.g. an invalid or carer and also where zone or overseas forces tax offsets are claimed.
- 2. From 1 July 2012, individuals earning less than \$37,000 will not have to pay the 15% contributions tax on SGC contributions. The contributions tax will be

refunded to a taxpayer's Superannuation Account. If taxpayers are not required to lodge an income tax return then eligibility will be based on income data held by the Australian Taxation Office.

- 3. There is a 25% reduction in minimum payments from account-based, allocated and market linked pensions in the 2012/13 year.
- 4. The Government has deferred until 1 July 2013 other reforms including the start date of standard deductions for work related expenses, 50% reduction in interest assessable income, introduction of a new tax system for managed investment trusts

and not to apply indexation to superannuation concessional contributions cap for one year.

- 5. The Clean Energy Act 2011 and other related Bills have now received Royal Assent imposing a carbon price of \$23 per tonne on the 500 largest polluters from 1 July 2012 For individuals the benefits include increasing the tax free threshold from\$6,000 to \$18,200 and increasing government payments including pensioner increases and household assistance payments. However consumer prices of goods and services will increase.
- 6. The ATO will match

data from external sources to individual records including: tax -Centrelink payments of Family Tax Benefit B and Parental Leave payments -Temporary Visa Recipients -Workcover payments -Owners of pleasure crafts valued at over \$25,000 motor vehicles valued at over \$10,000 -Credit and Debit Card data

CARDINIA RESERVOIR AND THE BEACONSFIELD CONNECTION

Cardinia Reservoir is a lovely spotforwalks, picnics & barbeques. You are able to take a return walk along the top of the dam wall and take in the amazing views. The reservoir park area has native bushland and a kangaroo viewing trail where you can watch Eastern Grey kangaroos feeding.

Work on the reservoir commenced in 1970 and was completed in 1973. It covers a total area of 3,000 acres and can hold up to 63,500 million gallons of water. The land required for the dam came from Emerald and Clematis and from the old township of Dewhurst.

The original township of Dewhurst was totally covered by the reservoir area and no longer exists, however in 1996 another small area north of Upper Beaconsfield was named Dewhurst, as a legacy to the past.

Beaconsfield had roots in Dewhurst with the Shanks –Bishop Family. Frances Bishop (nee Shanks) grew up in the North Beaconsfield area and it is thanks to Frances

that the town was named Dewhurst. She told me that it was originally called North Beaconsfield and when she was a child at a township meeting votes were taken on two names for the town and she was given the casting vote and chose Dewhurst.

Frances is now 99 years young and regularly visited by her children, grandchildren and great grandchildren, who live in the Beaconsfield township and surrounding areas.

The second link to Beaconsfield with the Cardinia Reservoir was the old Beaconsfield School This wooden hall Hall. with offices was originally used by the workmen during the construction of the dam and then moved to the Beaconsfield Primary School mid the 1970's.

It was in constant use by the school and the community until sadly destroyed by fire in the mid 1990's. This hall was very important to Beaconsfield as it not only was used by the school children but by the whole community.



The town's first hall built in 1905 by James Adamson was originally situated on the old Princes Highway next to the Beaconsfield Hotel and was demolished in 1974 when the highway was duplicated. The school 'reservoir' hall was used by the community out of school hours; we all went there to vote and for numerous meetings and classes in the hall.

The school hall was used for assemblies, concerts, PMP, canteen, uniform shop and for fun jobs like painting scenery for school plays.

The photo (page 23) shows the hall beside the Cardinia wall before being removed to the school.

Next time you visit Cardinia Reservoir you will remember its links with Beaconsfield.





TALKING WEATHER

Wow, what a year 2011 was. It was a year of records that was for sure.

December saw it rain on only 5 days but there was still 91mm of rainfall highest recorded. The daily total was 43mm. this was on the 9th. With this rain it saw the yearly total climb to 1211mm. This is the highest yearly total I have in my records. previous highest was the year before with 1072mm. The total is 400mm above average.

2011 was the year where alot of records were broken.

Highest yearly total: 1211mm.

Highest daily total: 155mm (Feb 4)

Highest monthly total for any month:

249mm, February

Wettest November on

record: 180mm

I am sure there was plenty more across the state and regions as well but this is all I track.

With the wet weather of 2011 behind us, the rainfall has been considerably less in 2012. January had only 42 mm of rain and fell over 10 days. With us heading into the hottest part of the year Melbourne's water storage is now at 64.8%. This is 10.8% higher than the same time last year and 30% higher than the same time 2 years ago.


The storms and hail we received last year were very severe and like nothing we have seen before. I hope we don't get too many of those events again but we unfortunately can't control the weather.

What will the weather throw at us this year? Only time will tell.
