

Welcome to all residents and owners/employees of businesses and I trust that the Association can continue in 2013 to represent your interests and concerns, particularly at Local and State Government level.

One of the Association's priorities this year is to have input in the Beaconsfield Strategy Plan. This document is a blueprint for planning the future of Beaconsfield. Further consultation meetings will be held before the Strategy Plan is finalised.

The Association as a notfor-profit organisation has limited funds available. The principal source of revenue is from the advertisers the Beaconsfield Banner which covers the production, printing and distribution costs. Expenditure on projects can usually only proceed if we are able to secure Grants usually from Local Government. State As an example, we were recently successful in receiving a Grant from Cardinia Shire Council for Community Notice Boards. All Grants have to meet specific requirements and are usually time consuming to prepare for which I appreciate the work done by Committee members as it is the Community that benefits.

The construction work on the Holm Park Road ovals, clubroom, roads, parking areasandassociatedworks has been busy to enable facilities to be available for the 2013 football season. The clubrooms are taking shape and the ovals are already used for cricket and for football training. The complex will be a magnificent recreational facility for Beaconsfield that residents can utilise and enjoy.

It is great to see the car park at the Beaconsfield train station completed and being used. The car park has extensive lighting security cameras and will alleviate parking in residential streets and will benefit residents close to the station.

Finally, the BPA was a partner in the Carols by the Creek held on 16th December arranged by the Baptist Church. The weather was fine and attended by around 800 people and was a very successful community event. Thanks to the Beaconsfield **Baptist** Church and also to BPA members, particularly Willem Boon, that assisted.

The Draft Cardinia Shire Tourism Strategy is now open for public consultation. This is the opportunity for you to help shape tourism in Cardinia Shire.

A copy of the draft strategy and summary document as well as how to make a submission is available on council's website. Submissions close end of business 15 March 2013. There

will also be a forum to feedback on provide Tuesday 12th February at the Beaconsfield Community Complex on O'Neil Road Beaconsfield (Melways map: 214 B1). There are two different timed sessions to choose from: Session One: 2pm-4pm or Session Two: 5pm-7pm. (It also needs to be noted, that each of the other above Plans/Policies have community consultation campaigns in place and everyone will get a chance to have their say. Please keep an eye on your local newspapers, notice boards, the Cardinia Shire website as well as your Councillor's FaceBook pages further information.)

Further to this concept of community engagement, we just want to remind Cardinia Shire residents of our modern Merit System of reporting an issue to Council. Residents and ratepayers are encouraged to notify The Shire Officers of Council-related issues and problems affecting them, by using this system.

From our website page, or by downloading the latest app to your smart phone. you can submit an online form to advise Council of an issue. When you submit your form, the website will provide you with a reference number. If you don't like the online method you can also call Customer Service on 1300 787 624 during office hours to obtain your Merit Number.

Once your submitted request or report has been entered into Council's customer tracking system, it will be allocated to the relevant business unit for attention.



You will be contacted by the customer service officer who enters your request to confirm the lodgment.

You can use these numbers to refer to your submission if you need to contact Council's Customer Service Centre again regarding the same issue.

And finally, Council is in the process of formulating the next four year council plan! So, if you have some time and want to have a say, please consider emailing your responses to the following ideas: like you do What about where you live? If you could change one thing what would it be? What would make Cardinia Shire a better place? AND

What do you think Council's priorities should be over the next four years?



RAILWAY STATION CAR PARK COMPLETED

The Victorian Coalition Government has more than doubled the number of free commuter car parks at Beaconsfield Railway Station, with 157 additional spaces opened in December.

December On Parliamentary joined Secretary for Transport, O'Donohue, Edward Member for Bass, Ken Cardinia Shire Smith, Mayor Cr Brett Owen and City of Casey Mayor Cr Amanda Stapledon to announce the completion of the car park extension.

The car park extension brought the total number of parks at Beaconsfield to 337 and continues the significant improvements the Coalition has made to the busy rail services in the south-east.

The Coalition has made huge investments to rail services in the growth corridor, with in excess of 1500 free commuter car spaces being added across Beaconsfield, Narre Warren, Berwick, Cardinia Road, Merinda Park, Lynbrook and Pakenham stations.

These improvements will help the many commuters in the south-eastern suburbs access their local stations every day.

Parking has been an issue at Beaconsfield for years, with some commuters parking illegally to access the station.



I'm pleased to see the car parks open and exceed the 2010 election commitment for 100 new spaces at Beaconsfield.

Beaconsfield Railway Station also received further upgrades as part of the project including improved lighting, CCTV and landscaping works.

I would like to thank the local community for their patience during the construction, and the contractor MTM and Public Transport Victoria for delivering the upgrade. For more information visit www.ptv.vic.gov.au



SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

Recent changes announced by the government include the following.

Pension Deeming Rates

With reductions in official interest rates as reflected in Term Depositrates offered by Banks, earnings of pensioners have reduced. To compensate, the government has announced that it will reduce deeming rates, which determine earnings on financial assets and amount of pension.

The deemed rates have been reduced by 0.5% as follows:

Single Pensions Couples

Assets up to \$45,400 2.5% \$75,600 2.5% (was 3%)

Assets over \$45,400 4.0% \$75,6004.0%(was 4.5%)

Superannuation Fund Investment Earnings

Concerns on uncertainty on whether tax is exempt on income derived by superannuation funds after death of a pensioner has been addressed by the Government to amend the law from 22 October 2012 to ensure that investment earnings that were supporting a pension will continue to be tax exempt following the death of the pensioner recipient until the benefits are paid as soon as practical. However lump sums benefits paid to a deceased estate may be taxable if not paid to a spouse or dependent child under 18 years.

Baby Bonus

Under the recent Family Assistance Amendment Bill, the Baby Bonus will reduce to \$3,000 for second and subsequent children born after 1 July 2013. The bonus of \$5,000 continues to be paid for a family's first child.

Tax on Excess Superannuation Contributions

Extreme care needs to be taken in ensuring that concessional and non-concessional contributions to superannuation funds do not exceed allowable limits otherwise tax of up to 93% can be charged on excess contributions. A recent AAT decision case upheld this excess tax.

our ability to independently care for ourselves. At the moment, the services and support that people with disability receive depends on where they live, what disability they have and how they came to have that disability.

The Federal Government asked an expert body, the Productivity Commission, to look at what needed to be done to make that system better. It recommended a 'National Disability Insurance Scheme'.

In a nutshell, a National Insurance Disability Scheme makes funding for disability based on the actual need of the with disability person across their lifetime. It will mean that people with disability will have a much greater ability to decide what services they need, rather than those services always being dictated

by particular funding. The Federal Government has allocated \$1 billion in funding to launch the scheme and is working with states and territories around the country to get them to be part of Disability Care Australia.

The number of people who attended showed the high level of local interest in the new Disability Care Australia system, which will bring real benefit in so many practical ways to our community.

I want to thank all those from Outlook Community Centre who helped with the organisation of the day, and to Beaconsfield Neighbourhood House for hosting the event .

ANZAC Community Grants

Around 300 residents from our area served in

the First World War and I know that there is always a great deal of interest in our ANZAC history in our community, particularly amongst local schools. Many of us have friends or family who served in war or who have been part of broader war efforts, and on April 25 every year we honour their contribution.

Next year marks the start of the commemoration of the ANZAC Centenary, recognising the efforts of ourservicemen and women during the First World War.

To honour their stories and reflect upon the milestone the Federal Government will make available \$100,000 for each electorate around Australia so community groups can apply to start projects honouring those who served between 1914 and 1918.

Applications will open on 31 May 2013 and close on 28 February 2014, and grant funding will be available from 1 July 2013.

In the meantime, I look forward to taking part in the annual Beaconsfield Anzac Day Memorial Service on Sunday 21 April from 2pm.



KEEPING YOU UP TO DATE

It's been another busy few months in Casey-Cardinia.

Firstly, I have to offer my congratulations to the Berwick Show Society on another job well done. The 2013 show may be over but I am sure they are already working hard towards the next one.

The Berwick Show Society is a group of people that volunteer their time yearround to create a huge community event for the enjoyment of others. Thank you for giving your time so generously, often without thanks or fanfare.

From the traditional agricultural and horticultural events that the show has hosted for more than 160 years, to the newer additions like the motorbike show and fireworks display. show really does have something for everyone.

I had a community stand at the show again this

year and spoke to many local residents. A number of people asked about the recent funding cuts that were potentially going to affect the opening hours of Casey Hospital's Emergency Department.

In October last year, the Federal Government cut millions of dollars from the health budget of States Territories across Australia. This included a \$475 million cut to Victoria's health budget.

Following pressure from the community and the State Government, the Federal Government reinstated just \$107 million of this money. Hospitals, Casev. includina need the remaining \$368 million the Commonwealth has stripped from funding. health

You can sign my petition calling on the Federal Government to reinstate the rest of the hospital's funding - visit my office

at 5/6-8 Langmore Lane, to add your Berwick, voice to the campaign.

On another note, the launch of the Casev-Cardinia Business Group means local business owners will now have a united voice to advocate for their needs and interests.

The Victorian Coalition Government has provided a \$20,000 grant so that the City of Casey can work with Cardinia Shire Council and local traders' associations to get the group off the ground.

Before entering parliament I was a small business owner. I understand it can be hard to find the time for anything extra on top of the day-to-day logistics of running a business.

The traders' associations andchambersofcommerce across the south-east do a great job in their communities, and will now have the Casey-Cardinia Business Group to look to for support and to unify the interests of businesses across different suburbs.



Another great initiative supported by the State Government is the Stride for Life walk planned for 20 April in Berwick.


The Victorian Coalition Government has provided \$3,500 to help facilitate the walk, which is the brainchild of a local Beaconhills College student.

CHANGING YOUR PET'S DIET

As your pets reach different stages of their lives, they often need to change their diet. The reasoning behind diet change can be due to manydifferentfactors. Some of these may be weight loss, medical reasons such as kidney disease and life stage eg puppy to adult. Whateverthe reason behind diet change, the hardest part can often be convincing your pet that the new diet is what they need to eat!

The most important thing to remember when changing diets is to take it slow! A sudden change in diet can often come as a shock to your pet, particularly if the food has a very different texture or taste, and a negative first impression can mean a constant battle between you and your pets.

First Introduction

It is essential to make sure that their first introduction to the new diet is a positive one. This can be done by using small pieces of the new diet as a treat when they have done something good, as positive reinforcement.

Once they have tasted the new food, you can start slowly introducing the new food into the old one. This should be done gradually over a one week period minimum (when dealing with fussy cats this can take up to 4 weeks). The first meal should include 90% old diet, 10% new diet. This can mean simply adding a few kibbles to the bowl. As your pet becomes accustomed to the new diet, you can slowly increase the percentage of the new diet, and reduce the old diet by 10% each time.

This not only gets them used to the new flavour, but also allows time for their stomach to get used to the new food, which can avoid upset tummies!

Tips For Helping Your Pet Accept Their New Diet

Often animals notice the smallest of changes, such as a different food bowl. For some particularly fussy animals, this can be enough to make them wary of their new food. A great idea can be to buy a new food bowl, and place the old diet in the new bowl. Then place the new diet in their old bowl and place the bowls next to each other. This change can often be enough to entice the animal to the new food as they smell and see familiarity on the old food bowl.

Make feeding time fun! For most pets feeding time is the best part of the day, so why not make it a game too? Turing feeding time into play time can help encourage lazy animals to exercise, and also create a fun bonding experience between you and your pet. Scatter feeding is one of

many ideas. For dogs, throw a small handful of food out into an open area of short grass so the dogs can find their food. This not only gives them an introduction to the new food, but also provides environmental enrichment and stimulation for energetic dogs. You can also do this for playful cats by simply throwing a small handful of food into a smaller area such as the kitchen or somewhere in the house with tiled floors.



Use feeding toys! Our clinic has a great range of feeding toys which are created to entertain your pet whilst providing food! However, you can also make feeding toys at home with everyday items. For example, for particularly active cats you can make a feeding toy by taking a small empty cardboard box and sticking some toilet paper rolls in there with some tape. Place a few kibbles in each roll, and then lay it on its side. This works as it plays to cats' wild instincts of reaching for food with their paws.





Claud and Cuthbert Story

A photograph yellowed with age, shows two, brave fresh-faced young men departing on a ship bound for the battlefields of France. Only two years later, a very different photograph, paints a different scene of a young man burying his friend in a makeshift cemetery after his life was lost during a tragic battle.

Penny Harris Jennings wondered why a photograph of a soldier, unrelated to her family, hung on the wall of her grandfather's library. She knew the soldier's name was Cuthbert and her father was named after the man, yet she did not know why.

Intrigued by the mystery of the soldier, Penny spoke to elderly members of her family and used the internet to piece together the story of Cuthbert Urwin, the 28 year-old son of a successful business man from Williamstown Victoria and friend of her grandfather, Claud Harris.

When WW1 was declared in 1914, the two mates enlisted in the 10th Field Ambulance Third Division (Victoria) and set off together for a life of adventure. The men set sail on Board the Runic on 20th June 1916, bound for England.

On 21st April 1918, German fighter pilot Baron Manfred von Richthofen (The Red Baron) was shot down near Morlancourt Ridge. Claud and Cuthbert were one of the first ambulance units to arrive on the scene. The men recovered small pieces of the historic aircraft and sent a small piece of red canvas home to their families. In the days that followed, the Germans inflicted heavy assault upon the allies and Cuthbert Urwin was passing away injured, from mortal injuries on 24th April 1918. Claud buried his friend that day at the Querrieu British Cemetery in France.

Penny has pieced together her family's history in an attempt to understand the mystery of the soldier in her grandfather's library, which ultimately turned out to be a symbol of enduring friendship between two men bound in life and death.

Claud Alfred Harris

was born in Kew, Victoria.

In the late 1890's Claud's parents Solomon and Rosetta Harris along with their children moved to "Bangles" RixRoad, Officer.

Claud and his sisters attended Officer Primary School. In later years Claud attended Canterbury Grammer were it is presumed he met his new friend Cuthbert Urwin.

They both were employed at William Angliss when they enlisted for WW1.

Upon returning home Claud's parents now owned land in Dewhurst and Beaconsfield Upper. Claud began his own cartage business and in 1924 married a local girl Ellen Glismann.

Hewasanactivecommunity Life, member member Berwick RSL, the District representative for the Soldiers Settlement Commission. Member of the Masonic Lodge. Member and Life President of the Berwick Agricultural Society and Berwick Shire President.

Claud passed away in 1969, aged 80 years.

TALKING WEATHER

by Nathan Boon

With Summer now over, it was a very dry 3 months Beaconsfield. There was only 121mm of rain for the 3 month period. This was 50mm below the same 3 month average. highest The temperature for summer was recorded at 41.4°c on Friday 4th of January. coolest day was Wednesday 5th on of December when 18.2°c. it only got to daily The average for temperature summer 27.4°c. was The warmest night for summer was on the 24th December when it only dropped to 24.4°c.

In March there was also one of the longest hot spells we have had ever. There was 9 days in a row when the temperature was above 30°c with the highest of 37°c on Monday 11th of March. The

warmest night was on the 26th of March when it only dropped to 26.5°c. The interesting thing about this day was it only reached a top of 27.2°c after a cool change rolled through early in the morning.


The last 2 months has seen a total of 106mm of rain with 46mm in February and 60mm in March. This fell over 11 days with the 2 highest daily readings being 29mm on 26th of Feb and 26mm on the 27th of March.

This lack of rainfall has seen our water catchments drop to 73.3%. It is however higher than at the same time last year when it was at 65%.



BEACONSFIELD RAINFALL






