Council Asks For Feedback On Draft Beaconsfield Structure Plan

Cardinia Shire Council's draft Beaconsfield Structure Plan will be on public exhibition from Monday 22 July to Monday 2 September.

Council invites residents to have their say on the draft plan, which will guide Beaconsfield's growth and development over the next 10 to 15 years. Residents can view the draft plan on Council's website www.cardinia.vic. gov.auonthe'Haveyoursay'webpage.

"Once finalised, this structure plan will give the local community, developers and investors greater certainly and confidence about Beaconsfield's future development," said Council's Strategic Planning Manager John Holland. "The strategy will also outline the conditions and requirements

for future Beaconsfield planning applications submitted to Council, as well as give direction for capital works projects, intersection designs and pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure," Mr Holland said.

Baxter Tania also urged Beaconsfield residents to take the time to give their feedback on the draft strategy. "Community feedback will really help Council to develop a document which reflects the priorities of those who call Beaconsfield home. "By having a say, residents can help us to shape a great future for the Baxter suburb." Cr said.

Garage Sale Trail

This year council has agreed to take part in the national Garage Sale Trail event on October 26. The Garage Sale Trail is a national not for profit organisation aiming create positive social and environmental change. It does this by working with to encourage Councils communities on an annual basis to hold a national garage sale on the same day. With the idea that this will reduce waste to Landfill, enable new neighbourly connections, stimulate local economies and provide a platform for fundraising. Originally starting in Bondi, Sydney in 2010 the program has since expanded and is now a national event.

Last year over 40,000 wheelie bins of items were saved from Landfill

with more than 600,000 items listed for sale/re-use. Households, schools, libraries, community groups and cultural organisations all got involved. On average each sale generated \$400 of income. Referendum

This year a referendum will be held at the same time as the Federal election. The Referendum will ask Australians to cast a vote on the "financial" recognition of local government through amendment of Section 96 of the Constitution. If passed, the amendment would enable the Commonwealth to continue

to provide direct funding to local government for vital community services and infrastructure, something governments from both sides of politics have been doing for over a decade. The referendum will not change the status of local government. The States will still be able to amalgamate councils, change council boundaries and dismiss non-performing councils. Direct Federal funding important because the Federal Government collects more than 80% of all tax revenue in Australia. The local services and infrastructure funded directly by the Federal Government cannot be funded by the State Governments because thev don't have the revenue. The change being proposed is a simple change to address a problem which has arisen

over recent years and will protect the current funding that Council receives.

We would encourage all voters to become as informed as possible about this issue prior to the referendum.

Council Launches New Strategy To Keep The Shire 'Age-friendly'

Council launched second positive ageing strategy at Pakenham Library's supper room. Developed in consultation the community, the strategy outlines how Council will work partnership with in providers and service community organisations positively influence lives of Cardinia Shire's older residents.

Representatives from local service providers, local community groups and older residents from the Shire attended the launch event. which included a morning tea. The strategy looks at factors which influence an older person's health and wellbeing, including education, employment, housing, gender, income, transport and safety. It then sets out actions in these areas to help ensure Cardinia Shire is

'age-friendly' place for its older population. Cardinia Shire Mayor Cr Brett Owen said Council had revised and refined its positive ageing strategy because it believes everyone deserves to get the most out of the later years of their life. "We want to see the Shire's older people living more active, happy and fulfilled lives," Mayor Cr Owen said.

Mayor Cr Owen explained that while Cardinia Shire Council does not deliver direct services to older residents, "we continue to build strong relationships with our partners who do. "Through by partnerships and sharing expertise and resources, we can all help achieve an agefriendly environment and address the diversity of needs in our community," Mayor Cr Owen said.

Cr Jodie Owen, a member of the positive ageing steering committee and a strong advocate for the Shire's older residents said she was pleased and proud of the strategy and what it sets out to achieve. "The strategy reflects Council's commitment to working with our partners to help older residents maintain their health, stay independent, feel secure and be given opportunities to be connected and valued members of the community," Cr Owen said.

"Cardinia Shire's population is projected to be an ageing one, so it's important we plan for this. "We need to ensure there are services and facilities to allow people to age in our smaller, more rural townships, as well as in the faster growing areas of our Shire," Cr Owen said.

Cr Owen added that

Council would continue to advocate for suitable housing options for older residents as they downsize and move from the land, as well as for the many older people moving to Cardinia Shire to be closer to their families.

The launch was also a chance to celebrate the community service and volunteering achievements of the area's older residents. Cardinia Shire's 2013 senior citizen of the year Charles Huyskens spoke at the event to express his support for the strategy.

Cardinia Shire's community health services expo was also held at Pakenham Library. The expo promoted and raised awareness about the range of community health and wellbeing services available to residents, and gave them the chance to find out more about available support services and address any questions service providers.

YMCA Cardinia Life, Connections, Southern Migrant and Refugee Centre, Mecwacare, Koo Wee Rup Regional Health and 4C's were among the local organisations to participate in the expo.


is more than doing sums. We use maths to investigate (eg. statistics), to represent ideas (eg. Graphs) and to help us interpret situations and

problem solve in our personal and work life. In primary school, our curriculum presents our students with an in depth study of the critical skills and engages the children with interesting and challenging tasks to help our children make connections between maths and real life!

Our theme for Term 2 was community. So, our end of term maths night was based around different occupations, how they use maths and testing out student skills with their parents, to solve real life situations. SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

Federal 2013/14 Budget Changes

The Budget tabled for the 2013/14 year contained many changes affecting most individuals and businesses in future years. Some of the changes affecting the year 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2014 include the following:

- 1. Medical Expenses Tax Offset is to be phased out and only those claiming the tax offset in 2012/13 year will be eligible for the following year.
- 2. A higher superannuation concessional deductible contributions cap of \$35,000 will be available for people aged 60 or more .From 2014/15 year, people aged 50 or more will be able to access the \$35,000 cap. The cap of \$25,000 for people less than 50 will be indexed until it reaches \$35,000.
- 3. From 1 January 2014, the higher education debt repayment discounts

of 10% upfront and 5% voluntary payments of \$500 or more will be abolished.

4. The Baby Bonus will be abolished from 1 March 2014 and replaced by extra payments of \$2,000 (first child) and \$1,000(Subsequent children) provided that families are eligible for Family Tax Benefit Part A. Also and most importantly families who choose to defer claims until after the end of the financial year will only have a further 12 months to claim benefits instead of 2 years previously.

It is recommended that you keep abreast of the numerous changes and discuss with your Accountant if they impact on you.

The second photo shows Beaconsfield Park Sign in 1939 with some local lads and the park gates behind. This photo was taken in 1939 and is thought to be at the opening of the memorial gates.

The gates and sign were a gift to the town from the Craven sisters, Belinda, Mattie and Alice who ran the Post Office in Beaconsfield. The gates were a memorial to the soldiers from the Great War 1914-1918.

The men in the picture are Harold Harbour, 'Slim' Parkes and Jimmy (Bluey) Parkes. The Parkes family are known for their butcher shop which was in Woods Street. The Beaconsfield Park sign can still be seen in the park opposite the pizza shop and is an icon and marker for people coming into the town.

MEMORIAL GATES

A pair of brick and iron gates has been erected at the entrance to the Beaconsfield Park in memory of the soldiers who took part in the Great War. The gates were the gift of the Misses Craven, who for many years were in charge of the Beaconsfield Post-office.

This must have been a regular occurrence for the government of the day to pay for a hut to be built and the men had a telescope to watch for any ships coming into the bay. When the ships did enter Western Port, a smoke signal would be lit on the mountain and another stockman would ride off to raise the alarm. The last remnants of the hut remained until just a few years before the unveiling of the memorial in 1972. It is thought that the land was owned by Captain Robert Gardiner and was part of the Mount Misery Cattle run.

It is important to make sure our beloved pets are safe during stormy Some doas periods. experience thunderstorm phobia or anxiety- a fear of thunderstorms. This is a real behavioural issue that can have an impact on the whole household. Some dogs detect a storm coming long before you hear the first clap of thunder and become very distressed.

On a stormy day, does your dog:

- Start barking, whining or howling?
- Wander around aimlessly?
- Behave destructively (e.g. chewing, pawing, or scratching at windows and doors)?
- Seem unsettled, distressed or nervous?
- Hide under beds, under furniture, in cupboards?
- Attempt to escape your property?

If so, your pet may be experiencing thunderstorm phobia.

How can we doas with manage thunderstorm phobia? If your dog is affected by thunderstorm phobia, we recommend a consultation with a vet to discuss how to best manage anxiety. dog's your Some recommended include: methods

Desensitization: This is the process of gentle and gradual exposure to the sound(s) that your dog is afraid of. An audio CD is available to replicate the sounds of storms. The technique is to play the CD at a very low level, and reward your dog for calm behaviour. Over time, the volume can be gradually increased. If at any time your dog shows signs of stress, the sound level should be reduced until the pet no longer reacts, gradually working back up.

These CDs can be ordered from us at your request.

ThunderShirt (Compression): ThunderShirt is a coat that gently hugs your dog's body. Its gentle constant pressure has a dramatic calming effect on the nervous system and can be used to relieve anxiety, fearful and overexcited behaviours in dogs. The ThunderShirt comes in a range of sizes and has a money back guarantee. If after 45 days of purchase you are not happy with the ThunderShirt you can return it for a full refund.

In more difficult cases, your vet may recommend the use of behaviour-modifying medication or referral for a consultationwith a specialist Veterinary Behaviourist.

The important thing to remember is to be gentle, calm and patient with your dog, rewarding desirable behaviour. Dogs who have thunderstorm phobia are not being "disobedient" — they are truly fearful and in a state of panic and are looking for your guidance to help them deal with this traumatic event.

TALKING WEATHER

by Nathan Boon

As winter draws to a close, the rainfall over the last couple of months has been right on the monthly average. While there has not been as many days of rain it has been larger amounts.

In June we received 70mm of rain over 7 days. The highest daily total was recorded on the 12th of June when we received 23mm.

July was very warm and Melbourne recorded its warmest July day on record when it reached 23.3 on the 18th.

The month of July again had average rainfall with 68mm falling. This fell over 8 days with the highest on the 19th again with 23mm recorded.


Our total for the year is now 430mm and we are again on track for a 800mm+ year. While it may seem at the moment that it is very wet we are 260mm behind last year at the end of July.

Melbourne's water storage is on the rise at the moment and is at 72.5%. This is a rise of 2.5% since the start of June. The closest water storage to Beaconsfield is the Cardinia Reservoir, it is currently at 70% capacity.

Beaconsfield Tennis Club Receives \$36,000 In Two Shire Grants

The Beaconsfield Tennis Club has been awarded \$35,000 towards resurfacing the old plexipave tennis courts (3 and 4) in the 2013/14 Cardinia Shire Community Grants scheme.

Courts 3 and 4 (together with courts 1 & 2 now resurfaced with synthetic grass) were constructed in 1978 and are now developing severe cracks and an uneven surface in places. The resurfacing works will include improving under court drainage and installing electrical cabling and footings for later work on new light towers, and then installing a new court surface.

The second grant gives the club \$1000 to improve drainage surrounding the two water tanks to reduce flooding at the base of the tanks, under the storage shed, and along the tennis club paths and the recreation reserve path outside the fence. The Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve will also contribute funds to this work.



Thanks must go to Jasmin Bishop our committee member for her hard work on preparing the court resurfacing grant and to Andrew Peart and Greg Tomichael (Recreation Reserve) for their work on the drainage grant.

Disability Access And Court Maintenance

The Shire is also funding an upgrade to our facilities to provide full disability access to all areas of our complex and so enhance our club as being one that welcomes and caters for all. To this end we are also pleased to shortly commence employing the services of Villa Maria Gateway personnel to assist with ongoing maintenance of our courts.


