



The Association has lodged a submission regarding the recently released draft of the Beaconsfield Structure Plan. We appreciate the comprehensive information from Belinda Powell, Senior Strategic Planner Cardinia Shire Council and her staff and await the finalisation of the Structure Plan.

We have commenced a review of our existing Statement of Purpose and Rules and Regulations in view of changes needed to comply with the

Associations Incorporation Reforms Act 2012(Vic). Beaconsfield Nature Conservation Reserve - Overview

The Cardinia Environment Coalition (CEC) has been appointed as the Committee of Management by the Department of **Environment and Primary** Industries (DEPI) administerthemanagement for Beaconsfield Nature Conservation Reserve (BNCR). of the public land reserves managed by are located on the traditional country of the Boonwurrung Nation and Bunurong people; part of the Kulin alliance of Aboriginal Nation.

The reserve encompasses the closed catchment of the now decommissioned Beaconsfield Reservoir; which was supplied via an open aqueduct from the Tarago

Reservoir near Neerim South. Much infrastructure the associated with the water storageremainsintactwithin the reserve, and together with the Haunted Gully gold diggings, is listed on Victorian the Heritage Register. The reserve totals 172 Hectares and comprises the main reservoir catchment block and the smaller Haunted Gully block, south of the reservoir.

The reserve is significant for its natural heritage values and contains substantial threatened flora communities and threatened plant species. Threatened fauna species recorded in the reserve include three bird species, and one

amphibian species. Over thirty bird species have been recorded; and five native mammal species. There is a diversity of plant species including a range of native orchids represented.

Access to the reserve for passive recreation activities such bushwalking, photography. and wildlife watching encouraged and can be arranged by contacting the

M a n a g e m e n t responsibilities for CEC include pest animal and weed control; asset maintenance; project d e v e I o p m e n t; engagement with the local community; and enabling appropriate visitor access. Risk management for fire

within the reserve is the responsibility for **DEPI** and **BNCR** is now included in the Port Phillip fire operations plan. Members of the local community have the opportunity and are encouraged to become involved with the management activities: and to provide input into development projects within the reserve.

Cardinia Shire Council -Emergency Water Tanks To Help Keep Residents Fire Safe

Four new emergency water tanks have been installed high fire-risk areas across Cardinia Shire. Council has collaborated with the Country Fire Authority (CFA) to provide 30.000 the litre concrete tanks. The new tanks are located in Beaconsfield (Payne Road), Upper Beaconsfield (corner of Dickie and Carpenter roads), Cardinia (E Gunton Recreation Reserve) and Cora Lynn (Cora Lynn Recreation Reserve).

The tanks have been strategically positioned in locations which currently have limited or no piped They water supply. the complement existing thirteen tanks already installed in high fire-risk areas across the municipality. Cardinia Shire Mayor Cr Brett Owen said the tanks will reduce the impact of a fire emergency on Cardinia residents

Cr Owen urged residents in bushfire prone areas of the Shire to implement or review their bushfire survival plan and prepare property their in readiness for the 2013/14 bushfire season. "The 'fire ready kit' on the CFA website www.cfa. vic.gov.au is an excellent resource," Cr Owen said. "Summer is just around the corner, and we want everyone to stay safe. It's crucial residents and organisations in high-risk areas are ready for the very real risk of bushfires."

I am delighted to be able to contribute to the Beaconsfield Banner once again as the Federal Member for LaTrobe.

Following a long and tiring election campaign I am honoured to have been re-elected as your representative in the House of Representatives and look forward to serving the constituents of my electorate. During the campaign I made two specific election commitments which will affect the residents of Beaconsfield and the surrounding area.

Firstly, I have committed to the Beaconsfield Nature Reserve Conservation (BNCR) which will be one of the first sites nationally benefit under Coalition's Green Army program. The project will establish a trail network within the BNCR suitable for mountain bike riders and walkers. The site is adjacent to the Officer scout camp and Lysterfield Park which is a well-known mountain bike destination.



Secondly, а Federal Coalition Government will allocate \$1.5 million to enable completion of the Insight specialist primary school for blind and vision impaired students the Berwick campus of Monash University. 



SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

ATO INCOME TAX COMPLIANCE

During July 2013 the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) released its annual "Compliance in Focus" plan on areas of Compliance. The plan is the focus for compliance during the 2013/14 year and includes the following:

- 1. For individuals the focus is on fraudulent returns, failure to declare income or making incorrect claims for deductions and tax offsets.
- **Employers** are scrutinised for correct reporting of PAYG withholding and Fringe Benefits, correct treatment of persons as employees contractors or and compliance superannuation guarantee obligations.
- 3. Businesses operating as Trusts are being targeted by the newly established Trust Taskforce. In addition

the disclosure of Capital Gains events and claiming of business concessions is on the ATO plan.

4. Compliance of GST activities will focus on mining, wholesale trade, manufacturing, financial and insurance services as well as usual integrity checks on GST refunds and reporting of GST on real estate transactions.

It is most important for individuals and businesses to have your accounting and taxation records in order and be able to meet compliance checks by the ATO. Further information is available on Compliance in Focus 2013-14 at ato. gov.au. Always discuss with your accountant.

of wonderful Christmas card ideas to make as well as Christmas gifts and decorations.



Renselier Barnes was born on 18/5/1871 in Berwick and lived in Tasmania for the earlier part of his life. He married Alice Sheriff born 24/11/1882 and they had their first child in Tasmania and then came to Victoria where Renselier worked as a farmer on his property.


Their holdings were small, but they were able to raise pigs, sheep and cattle. They also cut and carted wood. The Beaconsfield Station had just been opened on the Sale line and this was a good mode of transport for the area. At one time Alice Barnes had a guest house in the Quamby Road house. One of the earlier historic photos shows a horse and cart at the Beaconsfield Station with the word Quamby on the side waiting for passengers to take them up to Quamby Road. (Pictured below)

Therewere a number of guest houses in the Beaconsfield, Upper Beaconsfield area and these were extremely popular with the Melbournians who loved coming to this area for the lovely landscape and fresh air.

The Barnes children went to the Beaconsfield Primary School and walked each day, a long trip with poor roads.

The children grew up in the area and stayedandmarriedlocalsfromthearea.

William born 1906 married Sarah and had five children. Masie, John, Jim, Tom and Ted. Nellie born 1908 married Leonard James and had children Alan, Arthur and Robert. Frank born 1911 married Gladys and had 2 children Jeanette and Pauline. James Donald born 1912 married Jean and they had 2 children Joy and lan Lily May born 1914 died in infancy.

Frank Barnes was well known in the area and everyone remembers him on the gate of the football ground and he always had time for a chat and was there no matter what the weather. Later on a shelter was built at the gate to protect him from the weather. (Pictured left)

Frank's wife Gladys worked in Melbourne at the Pelaco shirt factory and then in the Grosby slipper factory in Beaconsfield on the corner of Woods Street and Beaconsfield Avenue around 1945-1951. girls from the Grosby Factory were good friends and had Christmas parties at the Central Hotel each (Pictured below)

James Barnes became known by his middle name Don and worked mainly as a log contractor working with Clydesdale horses in the bush and he also owned a small 17 acre farm. His wife Jean worked as a Millinery machinist before she was married. She loved doing tapestry and long stitch pictures and knitting and sewing for her family.

The Beaconsfield Primary celebrated their centenary in 1990 and many of the families gathered on that day and Bill Barnes was honoured to cut the centenary cake. (Pictured below)



Lillie born 1916 married John Cooper and had 5 children Jean. Valma, John, Judith and Lynette. Henry Charles born 1917 married Dorothy and had 2 children and Lawrence Raymond. Minnie born 1923 married Harold and had 3 children Joan, June and Jan.



Weight Management for Pets

Did you know that almost 50% of the pet population is overweight? Carrying even a little bit of extra weight can impact the quality of life of our pets- it can reduce their ability and willingness to play, influence general and mobility health. Being overweight is a predisposing factor in several health conditions diabetes and including arthritis. A number of factors influence weight gain including genetics, the quality and ingredients of pet food, feeding exercise. habits, and

Many commercial pet foods are high in fat and salt. While both of these greatly improve taste, they also contribute to weight gain. Weight reducing diets are both high in dietary fibre and lower in calories so your pet feels more satisfied without the need to eat a larger amount of food.

In conjunction with a suitable, high quality weight reducing diet, frequent exercise plays a vital role in assisting our pets reach their ideal weight. For cats, this may be encouraging them to follow you around the house, as well as toys to encourage play. For dogs, regular walks on different surfaces (such as sand) and different inclines provides extra resistance.

It is important to remember when feeding our pets that we should follow feeding guidelines based on their ideal weight rather than their current weight. Please do not hesitate to contact the clinic to have a friendly discussion regarding your pet's ideal weight, and appropriate feeding amount or simply come in to weigh your pet on our scales at any time!



Back in 2010, Annie, then a 2 year old Golden Retriever, was morbidly obese weighing in owners Annie's 55kg. had noticed her weight creeping up over time. They mentioned this to the vet during her annual health check and vaccination, looking for solution. a

Subsequently, Annie was started on a strict weight loss diet low in calories and high in fibre. Annie attended the clinic fortnightly to monitor her weight, and to adjust her dietary intake accordingly.

Fast forward to 2013, Annie is now 21kg and now has a new lease on life. Annie's owners have noticed that she is now far more energetic and happy.

TALKING WEATHER

Weather, it's a fascinating thing. It's something we talk about every day but we can do absolutely nothing about.


Not that long ago I was at a wedding and I was sitting next to a farmer from central Victoria and having a good chat to him. large part of our conversation was to do with rain. He was hoping for some in the next few weeks so that his crops would be fine for the year. It is funny how 2 people can have a conversation about the same thing and it affects them in different ways. I work in retail and rain or poor weather can have a negative impact on us as they don't go shopping. There are so many things in the world we can control but weather is not one of them yet it is something we live with and discuss everyday. I wish this farmer well for the year as he did get rain when he needed it.

While on the topic of rain we have seen a lot fall in the past 2 months. It has been the wettest 2 month period (Aug/Sep) that I have in my records. We had a total of 268mm. 148mm in August and 120mm in September. The rain fell in August over 19 days. We had mostly totals around the 10mm mark. The highest total was on the 7th when 18mm fell. In September it fell over 12 days and the highest daily total was 27mm which fell on the 25th. We now had have 698mm for the year and are on track again to reach around the 900mm mark, which is above the average for Beaconsfield.

Melbourne water storage is currently at 78.9%. This is the same as last year and is on track to climb above 80% before summer is here.






