

BEACONSFIELD FIRE BRIGADE NEWS

As this year has the potential to be of significant in regards to the fire season, it is now time to prepare ourselves for those days that pose a threat to our community. It is incumbent upon each resident to have a fire plan. Here are some CFA Key Messages for our citizens for this fire season.

Urban Fringe Grassfire

* If you live on the edge of a city or town, you are at risk from grassfire this summer.
* If you live next to grassland, you need to clear weeds, sticks and leaves, and remove firewood, rubbish and other fuel from around your property.

* If you live next to grassland and a grassfire starts, you need to quickly put two or three house blocks between you and the fire. * Avoid driving in a grassfire becauseitmaybesmokyand hard to see, and traffic jams and accidents are likely. * Act early - don't wait to receive a warning before moving two or three house blocks from a grassfire. * If you don't live directly next to a grassland and a grassfire starts, its safer to stay where you are as its unlikely the fire will spread past fences and houses. Don't try to get a closer look at a grassfire - you will put yourself and others danger.

Key Messages

Victoria is one of the most fire-prone regions in the world – the best way to stay safe is to leave the night before or on the morning of a Code Red day, or early in the morning on an Extreme or Severe day.

Make sure you know what fire weather district you live in and check the Fire Danger Rating and Total Fire Ban for that district every day over summer. Talk to everyone you live with and your neighbours so you will all know what you will do on a hot, dry, windy day.

Pack an emergency kit with important documents, photos, medications, money and clothes so you are ready to leave early. Practice leaving.

Don't rely on getting a warning – it's your responsibility to know to leave. So stay aware of your surroundings over summer. For example, check for smoke in air and listen for sirens.

Download the Fire Ready app so you can check Fire Danger Ratings and warnings and alerts, any time and any place.

Checkout CFA's website – cfa.vic.gov.au – call the Victorian Bushfire Information Line on 1800 240 667 for more information of how to stay safe this summer.

Call triple zero (000) to report a fire.

Our vineyard in Officer is producing a very high quality of Chardonnay; we are consistently winning awards for every vintage."

This award is the second accolade for both wines. The 2013 Pinot Grigio was

just awarded silver at the Royal Hobart Show and the 2012 Chardonnay won gold at the Melbourne Wine show earlier this year.

Government

Local students, netball and basketball clubs are set to benefit from \$650,000 in Victorian Coalition Government funding to build a new stadium at Officer Secondary College.

Recently I joined the Minister for Sport and Recreation, the Hon Hugh Delahunty, and the Member for Bass Ken Smith at the site to announce funding from the Community Facility Funding Program for the new sports stadium.

Sport plays such an important part in the lives of so many Victorians, and that's why projects like these are so important; they not only help provide more sporting opportunities for local students, but also strengthen the whole community by bringing local clubs, associations and people together.

The new stadium will house three new courts for basketball and netball, giving the school and local clubs the chance to develop programs, host competitions and big events in this rapidly growing area.

The facility will also include change rooms, umpire rooms, office space, kitchen, foyer, storage spaces and a car park.

At the college site Mr Delahunty also announced \$15,000 from the Community Facility Funding Program towards a new Cardinia Skate and BMX Strategy.

The Victorian Coalition Government is proud to support the development of sport and recreation infrastructure that will meet the future needs of the community.

Mr Delahunty commended the Cardinia Shire Council for its contribution of more than \$2.3 million to the projects.

The new Federal Government made various announcements during the Election Campaign relating to income tax that now needs to be legislated.

Some of the proposals include the following: -abolish the Carbon Tax

-remove the Minerals Resource Rent Tax

-remove the instant writeoff for small business assets of up to \$6,500

-remove the immediate write-off for small businesses for motor vehicles of up to \$5,000 with the balance of the cost concessionally depreciated

-reduce company tax rate by 1.5% from 1 July 2015

-introduce a 1.5% levy on high net income companies to help pay for a paid parental scheme from 1 July 2015

-abandon the proposal to abolish the statutory formula method of valuing cars for FBT purposes with effect from 1 April 2014

-examine existing tax incentive regime for innovation and R and D investment.



Glismann

Glismann Road, Beaconsfield is named after the first permanent settler of Beaconsfield Upper, Johann Glismann.

Johann was born on 24th July 1835 in Elmshorn, Schleswig-Holstein, Germany, 32 km north of Hamburg. He was the 13th child of Hans and Abel Glismann, a farming family. It was a large loving family but Johann had a keen sense of adventure. schooling After working on the orchard at 18 years old he enlisted for the Crimean War in 1854. With his knowledge of produce Johann became a cook during the campaign which ended in 1856.

Johann's next adventure was to join the shipping industry transporting cargo all over the world. Once again, Johann was employed as a cook. In March 1859 heleft Hamburg on the ship "Malvina Vidal". It was described as "An A1 Hamburg ship, a fine vessel being very lofty and spacious between decks, well suited to both cargo and passengers".

Malvina Vidal arrived in Hobson's Bay, Melbourne, Australia in March 1859. On 9th April 1859 ship Captain Kessal reported numerous deserters including Johann Glismann. Johann was described as 25 years of age, 5ft 8 or 9 inch tall, light complexion, course red whiskers, reddish hair, full faced, a stout German Desertion was sailor. common in the 1800's the most famous Australian

deserter was John Simpson Kirkpatrick who was honoured for his heroics moving injured soldiers on a donkey in WW1.

entrenched Johann himself in the bustle of Melbourne during Gold rush years. He lived and worked in Lonsdale Street, Melbourne as a cook. After his marriage in 1864 to Sarah Brady a young Irish girl, he knew farming was his future. Their first child Hans was born in 1865, followed by Elizabeth in 1869 and David in 1871. Originally Johann and Sarah were granted a small selection of land at the South-West corner of Heatherton Road and Dandenong Road, Dandenong, where they grew fruit trees and took the produce to market. the location Although was convenient for the Johann knew market the small parcel of land could not sustain them financially in the long term.

In early January 1873 after looking at a number of selections, a friend suggested a place situated among the foothills of the Dandenong Ranges, good land, well watered with a supply of good splitting timber. Although right in the middle of the bush now and miles away from any other house, in the future it ought to be very good place. Johann loaded the buggy up with enough provisions to last a week and two horses. He and his friend set off to view the new country. On the fourth day they found a forest

which looked suitable and the process of gaining land selection permission began. Johann returned to the site with a group of men to clear away some of the timber for his new home. Two pit saws were carried there and the men sat one on top, the other at the bottom, sawing away from morning to night. The timber was then used to construct the house and completion Johann moved his family there.

On the 1st January 1875 his application for a Crown Grant of his selection license was approved. The first 25 acres of the orchard consisted of apples, cherries and pears followed by chestnut and walnut trees. In later


years Elizabeth and David married and moved away from the district, neither have any descendants.


Hans Glismann became a carpenter and builder, a well-known resident. He married Harriet Audsley the local school teacher in 1895. Hans built many fine homes, including his own "Laluma" in St Georges Road, Beaconsfield Upper and the St John's Anglican Church. He was an active community member. Vestry man of St John's Church, Trustee of the Assembly Hall, and Secretary formany years, for the Beaconsfield sports club particularly cricket, Scoutmaster of the 1st Beaconsfield Upper Boy Scouts, the first School committee for the District of the Shire of Berwick, Beaconsfield and Secretary Riding Beaconsfield of the Gembrook Fruit and Association. Growers

Many of the Glismann descendants live the district and their commitment Beaconsfield to the community continues.

in printing techniques Christmas cards and greeting cards were very popular in the 20th Century and many based round themes or designs.

For Local Christmas Cards, Cardinian embroidery Cards are available. This is a set of 8 cards depicting features of the towns of Cardinia. There is a card for Beaconsfield showing many of our well known buildings and features, the townships of Officer, Cardinia and Rythdale are also pictured.



TALKING WEATHER

A year has gone by and Melbourne continues to live up to the reputation of having 4 seasons in one day. Well sometimes that can be in one hour as well. I started to write this report and it was 36°c. I am finishing this report and it is 15°c and pouring with rain. As a whole, Melbourne and Beaconsfield has fantastic weather and again this year we have seen a lot of rainfall in the town.

October saw 74mm of rainfall over 11 days. The highest daily totals for October were recorded on the 2nd and 22nd when there was 17mm.


November saw the rainfall increase. While it fell on fewer days, we recorded a lot more rain for the month. We had 110mm of rain this is 40mm above average for the month. It fell over 10 days. The highest daily totals were recorded on the 12th and 13th. The 2 days saw 50mm fall in the town. 24mm on the 12th and 26mm on the 13th.

These totals also climb

above the yearly average and there is still a month to go. So far for the year we have had 882mm fall and we are on track for another year above 900mm this will be the 4th year in a row and the 5th year in a row where we will have above average rainfall for the year.

Melbourne's water storage has now climbed to 80.3% full. This is the same as last year and we have seen that this figure will drop over the coming months as we head into summer. It was interesting to see that on Melbourne Water's website they now have the water storage levels going back to 1940. In December 1940 the storage level was 86.7%. The highest ever December % was in 1964 when it was 98.8%. The lowlight was 5 years ago when it was 34.4% in 2008. Interesting to have a look at and see what happens Melbourne's water during the whole year.
