

CARDINIA News From Ranges Ward Councillors:

Hello Beaconsfield,

It's Council Budget time again and by the time the Beaconsfield Banner is in your hands the full draft document should be finalised and available to the public. Councillors have been working hard with the council officers to keep any rate rises as low as possible; Ranges Ward Councillors, in particular, have been lobbying decreasing for rate rises over our term.

The 2014/2015 Cardinia Shire Budget community consultation timelines are not yet finalised at the time of print for The Banner, but we do encourage residents to go online to council's website to access the document and public forum details when they are available (www.cardinia.vic.

gov.au) otherwise contact customer service for a copy on mail@cardinia.vic.gov. au or phone 1300 787 624.

At this stage we are looking to hold a public information session in April where we will explain the proposed budget and then open it up to community question time. Further to this, and as a part of the statutory process, the Draft Budget will be also open for any group or individual to make written submission to. As a result of this, their submission will be formally heard and considered a part of the budget process. The outcomes of these submissions will then become a formal part of the final report. So please get involved in the process and be heard. Let us know if you think we have too much of a focus on sporting facilities and not enough on roads

and paths for example, or even vice versa, etc. After all it IS public money!

Secondly, Ranges Ward Councillorswillbecontinuing to get out into the community 2014. including with the Mobile Councillor Office (MCO) and our monthly radio slot on 3MDR. So please keep an eye out for our MCO notices the community around and tune into 91.3 FM on the first Monday of the @ 10.30am to month keep up with what's happening in your shire.

Otherwise, if smart phone technology is more your thing, please download Cardinia Shire Council's App which has all our contact details, the latest news and events etc, as well as an easy way to report an issue by utilising the GPS and in-built camera capabilities of these devices.



Councillors also each have their own individual councillor Facebook pages thatyoucanFRIEND, aswell as a combined "Friends of Ranges Ward" page to LIKE in order to keep very current with what is happening in the shire.

Last but not least, can we encourage everyone to join some sort of community group? Even if participating in a local sporting group (as a player and/or committee), joining mothers/play group, becoming a member of the Beaconsfield Progress Association or reviving the Beaconsfield **Business** Group, investigating a local men's shed, helping your kindergarten committee, performing with an arts group, enrolling U3A, checking out your local community centre, socialising club, or even just becoming library member....it doesn't matter!

The next hard rubbish collection scheduled for Beaconsfield area is May 12th - 16th.

Important instructions for hard waste collections * Hard waste must not be placed out more than two days prior to collection. * Material must be out by 6am on the Monday of your collection week. * Missed collections must be reported by



the Tuesday following your collection week.

* Maximum of 2 cubic metres* per household.

* Items must not be longer than 1.5 metres.

* Place items in four piles – bundled green waste – scrap metal and white goods – matresses – general hard waste.

The Beaconsfield Fire Brigade has had a very busy summer with our station being involved in many fires including that threatened homes in Beaconsfield.

The summer always had the potential to be out of the ordinary with very hot days in January and a long spell without significant rain.

Their has been numerous calls ranging from car, grass and structure fires to false alarms. Brigade members have traveled to the Grampians fires to assist in this major blaze and spent time at the Morwell Open Cut which proved to be a difficult and challenging fire to fight given the dynamics of a stationery fire with ever changing situations to deal with from thick smoke, heat and carbon monoxide gas.

In February the brigade was called to a fast moving grass and scrub fire near Porchester Rd and the Princes Highway Beaconsfield It took trucks to extinguish and destroyed fencina surrounding the houses Thank you to the residents who assisted the first trucks at the fire scene



NEW TOOL TO HELP WIPE OUT GRAFFITI IN BEACONSFIELD

Beaconsfield **Business** Group is latest the group to benefit from the Victorian Coalition Government's antigraffiti program. with Member for Gembrook Brad Battin presenting a portable graffiti removal system to support a cleaner, graffiti-free community.

Mr Battin said the portable graffiti removal system would be an essential tool to help Beaconsfield Business Group combat graffiti.

"Illegal and unsightly graffiti is a blight on our local streetscape and can make people feel less safe in their own community," Mr Battin said.

"Portable graffiti removal systems are valuable assets in the ongoing fight against graffiti as they help community members remove graffiti as quickly as possible after it appears."

The graffiti removal system consists of a 120-litre wheelie bin, a high-pressure water system, graffiti removal products and personal protective equipment.

Mr Battin said the Victorian Coalition Government had made a significant investment in combating vandalism of public and private property.

"So far 58 local councils have been allocated 199 portable graffiti removal systems, equating to 73 per cent of all Victorian councils.

"A further 52 portable graffiti removal systems have been allocated so far to 48 community groups across Victoria."

The portable graffiti removal system is one of a wide range of Victorian Coalition Government initiatives to support the removal of graffiti in partnership with community groups, councils and state agencies.

Other initiatives include:
. the Community
Correctional Services'
Graffiti Removal Program

. a \$300,000 annual grants program supports councils to partner with their communities to deliver local graffiti prevention and removal solutions.

The Graffiti Removal Program has eliminated an area equal to more than 94 MCG playing fields of graffiti from Victorian c o m m u n i t i e s since it started.

The program is part of the Victorian Coalition Government's broader \$35 million Community Crime Prevention Program, which provides support funding for local communities to identify and manage local crime issues to deliver a safer, more secure Victoria.

Upgrade Pakenham And Cranbourne Railway Lines

The Victorian Coalition Government will deliver a 2-2.5 billion dollar upgrade. This upgrade will cater for growth in Casey and Cardinia and ensure a 21st century rail service with more trains carrying more people, more often.

The Coalition Government will purchase 25 new next generation, high-capacity trains for the Pakenham and Cranbourne lines.

Both lines will be upgraded to 21st century high-capacity signalling – one of the first uses of this technology in Australia.

This will see the number of peak hour trains increase and create 3000 new jobs during the construction phase of the project.

A new train maintenance depot will be built in Pakenham East, creating 100 ongoing jobs - this is great news for the area as it will be sustainable local employment.

The Cranbourne and Pakenham rail corridor serves one in 10 Melbourne commuters and this project will ensure

a more efficient, reliable journey for local residents.





Make and Mingle




5000 POPPIES: A COMMUNITY TRIBUTE OF RESPECT AND REMEMBRANCE

The ADAMSON family were pioneers in Beaconsfield. James and Agnes came to Australia from England in 1883 and then to Beaconsfield 4 years later. James and Agnes had 6 children; Florence, James, John, Effe, Robert and James and his Arthur. sons were local builders and built many private and public buildings in the area.

Arthur Adamson (1897-1983) ran the store for many years and lived on the premises. This store provided many of

needs of Beaconsfield residents from 1 screw (not sold in packets in those days) and the usual tools and hardware products. Along with hardware, there was also tinned fruit and biscuits, again not sold in packets but stored in large biscuit tins and weighed out and sold in paper bags. Adamson's Hardware was also the agency for the Commonwealth Bank which was quite busy and every Sunday Arthur would ring the fire siren.

Arthur was also generous his sponsorship various of beds for Melbourne. hospitals in

have Today we KENILWORTH Avenue. which was built in 1887 house bluestone

named after the house and all the joinery work was reputedly carried out by James Adamson. The 'Villa' was built for Charles Nott. gentleman and included an extensive garden, some of which still remains today. There was also a coach This was made of handmade bricks on foundations and included room for coaches and a coachman's room and a loft on the first floor for storing feed.

Unfortunately Charles Nott lost his money in the 1890's crash and had to sell his property to a city lawyer, Montague Cohen.

The property was then purchased in 1916 by the Berry Street Foundling Home. This was home to many babies, children and nursing staff and has many interesting stories. The coach house was converted into a laundry until Berry Street finally closed the home in 1946. The property was then leased, but fell into disrepair.

first used as a gatehouse and later as a ladies college and then became the RAILWAY HOUSE and is still standing today near the railway station. It has been lovingly restored and is a tribute to James Adamson's fine workmanship.

The Bunya Bunya Pine out the front is thought to be linked to the original garden at Kenilworth Villa.

James Adamson and his sons built the original Beaconsfield Hall, (pictured below), which was the centre of town activities for many years. The hall was built in 1905 for 100 pounds with two rooms added for 31 pounds. The hall was opened by Premier



Thomas Bent in 1906 and stood on Old Princes Hwy in the area between the Central Hotel and where the medical centre is now. The hall was demolished around 1970 when the highway was duplicated.

The old Beaconsfield hall was the place for many gatherings during and after the war. Many tributes to the servicemen were expressed at special events and fund raising events for the war effort.


The Adamsons built a number of other houses, only a few of which are still in existence. They also built thelovelylatticesheltershed which was at Beaconsfield Primary School and can be seen in the early photos of the school. (Pictured top right)

James' daughter Florence was the first pupil to be enrolled at Beaconsfield Primary School (known then as Beaconsfield Station School).

ADAMSON ROAD is in the original soldier settlement land in Beaconsfield.



BELLA'S SORE KNEE

Bella, a7 year old Doberman, went for her daily walk and when she came home she was lame on her back leg. After a week of rest Bella's sore leg hadn't improved, so her owners brought her into the vet clinic for a thorough examination. During her visit, when the vet examined Bella's knee it was very painful and there was abnormal movement in the joint. It was suspected Bella had ruptured the cruciate ligament in her knee. The cruciate ligament is a vital soft tissue structure that holds the knee in place and offers stability, and when damaged can lead to abnormal pressure on the knee joint causing pain and lameness in that leg.

As it was suspected Bella had injured her cruciate, an appointment with Dr. Wing Tip Wong, a Veterinary Orthopaedic surgeon, recommended was organise another to assessment of Bella's troublesome knee and to discuss the best treatment

options available for her. After examination Wong was able to confirm our initial diagnosis of a ruptured cruciate ligament. Based on his findings, Dr. recommended Wong surgical procedure, a Tibial Wedge Levelling Osteotomy (TWLO) to repair Bella's knee to give her the best possible outcome. While there are several techniques available to repair cruciate ligament injuries, the TWLO was the best option for Bella. given her breed and size.

Bella required a full general anaesthetic and X-rays before she had her surgery. The purpose of taking Xrays before the surgery was to measure the ideal angle of the knee joint for surgical correction. The TWLO procedure involves cutting the tibia and removing a wedge of bone and in doing so alters the angle of the weight bearing surface of the knee. This prevents the abnormal forward sliding motion of the knee joint that happens when the cranial cruciate ligament has been damaged. Following this, a plate with multiple screws is surgically implanted to ensure the new angle of the kneeremains safely in place.

The aim of this procedure is to relieve pressure on the injured ligament and thus reduces inflammation and pain in the joint, ultimately slowing the progression of arthritis. After the surgery Bella had some more X-rays to ensure proper placement of the plate and pins and to measure the new angle of the knee joint.

Bella has since made a great recovery from her surgery and is currently

great recovery from her surgery and is currently being well-rested during her rehabilitation. We look forward to seeing Bella back at the clinic to take 6-week post-operative radiographs to assess the level of her bone healing and hopefully she gets the all clear to get back to her favourite part of the day, her walks!

It has been a dry start to the year of 2014. We have only seen 116mm for the first 3 months of the year. This is about 40mm down on average and is the lowest start to the year since 2009 when we had only 73mm in the first 3 months.


In February there was 46mm of rain recorded in the town, only falling on 4 days. The highest daily total was 20mm which fell on the 19th. The monthly total of 46mm was slightly down on average.


In March we had 40mm. This fell over 5 days and was below the average for the month. The highest

daily total was recorded on the 15th when we had 15mm of rain.

Melbourne's water storage has fallen in the last few months after a hot summer. We started the year at 80% but in the last 3 months after very little rainfall and hot days it has fallen to 74.9%. This time last year it was at 74.6%. The interesting thing to know is that records show it is likely to continue to fall until at least June before we will see it rise again.


