



# News From Ranges Ward Councillors :

In the lead up to the November state election, council is advocating to all sides of politics to commit to the construction of the eastern ramps onto the Pakenham Bypass to make a full diamond interchange.


The extension of O'Shea the Road to Beaconsfield interchange is also being advocated for. This will reduce pressure on the Clyde Road/Princes Freeway interchange, which has been experiencing congestion for a number of years.

These much needed road upgrades will improve connections between Cardinia and Casey and improve access to employment and health and recreational facilities.

Work at Holm Park Reserve continues. (Pictured above)

The netball clubrooms anticipated to be completed and handed over to the Beaconsfield Netball Club in June/July. Other recent works at Holm Park include improvements to the path around oval number 2, general cleanup of the reserve along the Holm Park Rd boundary, sealing of the entry road, installation of street lights and improved signage. **Future** works include additional courts, skate park and a playground.

As part of Council's annual footpath program, council recently constructed a new gravel path through the Cardinia Creek Reserve. The 1.2 km path, winds from Inglis Road to the north and Perc Allison Reserve to the south. The rock blend used, included a layer of Tynong toppings



which is specifically designed so cyclists, horse riders and pedestrians now have a hard, tight surface. Drainage culverts and fences were also installed where required. The upgrading of the path has been well received by users of the Reserve.

Council has negotiated with Vic Roads to assume



maintenance and lawn mowing responsibilities of the interchange of the Old Princes Highway/ Princes Highway and vicinity. This is in addition to the existing areas that form part of the current maintenance agreement. Council decided take responsibility of maintenance, after concerns were raised about the previous frequency of maintenance delivered by Vic Roads contractors. (Four cuts annually). Council has negotiated a variation to the existing Vic Roads Maintenance Works Agreement to ensure an increased level of service and improved presentation to the entrance of the Beaconsfield Township.




Member Bruce Adamson who was an inaugural member of the brigade prior to the formation of the CFA. It was great to have Bruce in attendance for this special night.

Life Membership was bestowed on our long serving secretary Glenn Dorning who is a tireless worker and manager within our team and a dedicated firefighter.


Our annual dinner is the brigade's way of recognising the commitment and tireless work carried out by our volunteers and is an event we look forward to each year.

#### Beaconsfield Mower and Tractor Centre Closes




The business had one final auction day in April, which saw the streets lined with cars and the yard and showroom packed with people waiting to place their bids and wishing Peter well in his next phase of his live.

# Improved Infrastructure And Services

Member for Gembrook Brad Battin MP has welcomed multi-million dollar investments to build a better Gembrook in the Victorian Coalition Government's 2014-15 State Budget.

Mr Battin said the State Budget would deliver improved infrastructure and services for local families and businesses to build a better, more connected Victoria.

The Victorian Coalition Government has outlined significant expenditure in the 2014-15 Budget that will help strengthen the local community, including: \$13 million for Stage Officer of the Secondary College. \* The \$2 - \$2.5 billion rail project to boost capacity Cranbournethe Pakenham line by 30 per cent, carrying more people more often, and a new train maintenance depot Pakenham, creating 100 ongoing local jobs. \$40 million for the Regional Connectivity Program, which will help fix mobile black spots.

In the future passengers on the Pakenham Railway line will be able to travel to the Airport, with trains travelling from the City to Melbourne Airport every 10 minutes. "This Budget is a game-changer for local families that will deliver better rail and better schools in our region," Mr Battin said.

The investments build upon the already announced Coalition Government initiative of restructuring



public transport fares to make Zone 1 + 2 travel for the price of a Zone 1 fare, saving daily commuters into the city around \$1200 a year.

"By rebuilding Victoria's finances and keeping the economy strong, the Coalition Government has been able to put a massive \$27 billion towards key projects across the state," Mr Battin said.

"Premier Denis Napthine the Coalition Government team building a better Victoria by delivering a strong budget with record investment in roads, rail, education, health and ensuring growth, jobs and opportunities in Gembrook.

"This is in stark contrast to the risk that Daniel Andrews and Labor pose to Victoria's economy and prosperity. Victorians cannot afford more Labor cost blow-outs like the desalination plant and myki.

"Only the Coalition can be trusted to deliver these important projects on time and on budget," Mr Battin said.

#### Tales from The Kitchen Bench...

Recipes, Tips And Morsels Of Food History By Cindy Tomamichel

#### **Apple Crumble Surprise**

No sticky fingers from rubbing in butter! Serves 4 (generously) – 6 (more restrained)

#### Ingredients:

a small (400gm) tin of pie apple 3 cups of cornflakes 60gms butter 1/4 cup brown sugar



#### Method:

- -preheat oven to 180C.
- -put apple in casserole type dish.
- -melt butter and brown sugar in large saucepan. Take it off the heat when the brown sugar starts to bubble, keep stirring.
- -add cornflakes, and stir until coated.
- -spread cornflake mix over the apple and put in oven. -bake for about ½ hour, until apple is heated through. Test this by inserting a knife into the middle.
- -serve with ice cream, cream or custard. Also good cold.

#### Variations:

trv:

- -adding spices like cloves, cinnamon, or ginger to the apple or cornflakes:
- -using pears or other fruit such as stewed quinces instead of, or with the apple;
- -use rolled oats or muesli instead of cornflakes;
- -add nuts like almonds, pecans or macadamias to the topping.

#### Cooking Tip:

Lightly oil measuring spoons before measuring sticky things like honey or golden syrup. It won't stick to the spoons, and your measuring will be more accurate.

#### **Food History** morsel:

Anzac biscuits were originally made with lard instead of butter, as this gave them greater keeping qualities for shipping overseas to the troops.

Hope you enjoy the recipe, and make it your own with your favourite variations.


Thailand is also involved in the production of videos and teaching aids for deaf people. This year marks their 35th year of mission, a wonderful achievement.



# SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANTS DESK

#### **BUDGET NEWS**

The Budget recently handed down by the Federal Treasurer contains many expenditure and benefit cuts spread amongst all citizens and taxpayers. Many announcements will not apply until years later in line with long-term strategy growth and reduction in Government debt. Some changes affecting businesses and taxation include the following:

- A commitment but no date to lower Company Income Tax by 1.5% but no confirmation of the proposed parental leave scheme or the 1.5%levy on big businesses to pay for the scheme.
- The Automotive sector has had many programs cut short or cancelled in response to announced closure of Australian car manufacturing.
- The mining industry will benefit from the abolition of the Mineral Resource Rent Tax and small explorers will be able to access Exploration Development Incentives.
- The creation of Entrepreneurs Infrastructure Program to support commercialisation of good ideas and provide market and industry advice. This body will consolidate numerous separate industry assistance programs
- The creation of one Industry Skills Fund to support training needs of small and medium enterprises focusing on health, mining and manufacturing. Business will co-contribute to the cost of training.
- Cuts to renewable energy and scientific research funding with big boost to medical research.
- Extra funding for the newly named Small
  Business and Family Enterprise Ombudsman
  with extra powers to act on a one-stop shop for
  small business interactions with Government.
- Reduction of funding to Australian Securities and Investments Commission, Australian Taxation Office, ABC and SBS.
- Superannuation guarantee will increase to 9.5% from 1 July 2014 then frozen until 30 June 2018.
- First Home Saver Accounts closed to new accounts from Budget night.
- Dependent Spouse Tax Offset and Mature Age Tax Offset will be abolished from 1 July.
- Higher Petrol costs with CPI increases for fuel excise each six months.
- Temporary Budget Repair Levy at 2% of income in excess of \$180,000.

All measures need to be passed through Parliament, so be aware and discuss with your Accountant.


# 5000 POPPIES: A COMMUNITY TRIBUTE OF RESPECT AND REMEMBRANCE

At this years Beaconsfield Anzac Day Memorial Service held on April 27th 2014, Ken Adamson gave an address about his families involvement in WW1 and afterwards when they returned to Beaconsfield.

We have printed the address below.

ANZAC Service

– Sunday April 27th,
2014

Address by Ken Adamson.

Today at Beaconsfield Anzac Day Memorial Service we remember those who have served our country in war and conflict. On behalf of my extended family and descendents I'm very proud and honoured to have this opportunity to say a few words about my family - The Adamsons.

Agnes and James Adamson came from England to Australia on Christmas Day 1883 and then to Beaconsfield about 4 years later. They had 6 children, Florence, James, John,

# WE REMEMBER THE ADAMSON BOYS

Effie, Robert and Arthur. 3 of the boys, James, John and Robert all served in WW1.

JAMES Randle Adamson (Service No 19) was aged 31 when he enlisted in November 1915. He served in 29th Infantry Battalion.

The 29th Battalion fought it's first major battle at Fromelle on 19th July 1916. The battle was summed up by a soldier at the time and is recorded on the Australian War Memorial

site, stating "The novelty of being a soldier wore off in about five seconds; it was a bloody butcher's shop".

James was my grandfather and I remember a story he told of being fined 2 days' pay for not shaving for inspection one morning. The tradition continues as vou can see. James awarded was Military medal.

JOHN Adamson (Service Number 10131) was 27 when he enlisted. He served in the 1st & 2nd Australian Stationary Hospital 16 Reinforcements. Dermatological Hospital Reinforcements. the 1st the 2nd and the Australian Casualty 3rd Stations Clearing 1-Reinforcements. and the1st Sanitary Section 1-5 Reinforcements

He embarked on the **RMS** Orontes on 29th March 1916. Like so many others, he didn't talk about his time in the Armed forces much. although he did make a remark one day about the difficulties and horror of being a stretcher bearer. On his way to the battle fields, he passed by shell holes filled with water, not being able to stop and pick up wounded soldiers, stuck with him for many years.

ROBERT Sym Adamson (Service number 631) was 22 years when he enlisted in the 13th Light Horse Regiment. 1-7 Reinforcements. As an infantry man, Robert's reinforcement was last one to arrive on the shores of Gallipoli and was also the last one to leave.



This must have been such a difficult time for the family to have their 3 boys in active service with little or no communication for the 4 years they were away. Eachoftheboyshadnarrow escapes during battle.

Effie, their sister, recalled years later, "most of the young lads volunteered for services overseas. It was a sad sight as one by one they left Beaconsfield". In 1919 and 1920 those who were spared returned -but somehow life seemed to have changed. In fact the world had changed.

The Adamson boys returned to Australia in 1919

and settled once again into life in Beaconsfield. All boys bought land in the soldier settlement, named "The Chirnside Estate".

James, known as Jim, married Ethel Sedgman; they had 3 children Elvie, Jim and Frank. Their land fronted onto Soldier Road. James died in 1958, aged 74 and is buried in Berwick Cemetery.

John, known as Jack, lived next door to his brother Jim in a house he built at the end of "Adamson Road". Jack married Elaine Pell in 1923 and had 3 children Bill, Bruce and Hugh, (better known as Peter).

Jack continued as a carpenter for over 70 years and died in 1978 aged 90 years.

Robert, known as Bob, married Mary Trotter and had 4 children – Pat, Nole, Robert and Mervyn. Bob died 1952 aged 60 and is also buried in the Berwick Cemetery.

The Adamsons built many of the private and public buildings around Beaconsfield including the Beaconsfield Hall. Kenilworth Villa and the Shelter at Beaconsfield Primary School just to name a few.

The Adamson name is also associated with the Beaconsfield Football Club and many of the family represented the football team during the first 70 years of the club's history since its beginning in 1890.

As we unite here today to remember. We can only imagine the noise, the terror, the loss witnessed and the friendships by not only these 3 men, but so many other soldiers.



# RecogniseArthritisBeforeYourPetStartsToFeeIIt!

In the colder weather, we all find it a little harder to get out of bed in the mornings. Even our pets enjoy sleeping in but have you considered that your furry friend may be struggling to get moving because of sore joints?

Arthritis is a disease that can sneak up on your pet. Arthritis affects the smooth cartilage that covers the ends of the bones of a moveable joint. Normal 'healthy' cartilage covers the ends of the long bones and, in conjunction with synovial fluid, provides an almost frictionless, wear weight-bearing resistant, surface. In arthritis, the cartilage is eroded away and the synovial fluid which lubricates the joint thins out, resulting in a further loss of mobility. Movement is also restricted by swelling of the joints. All of these factors



combine to cause your pet discomfort and pain.

Arthritis can develop due to a number of different factors. Age is a leading cause as most pets will suffer to some degree from joint problems as they get older. Other factors can include the breed, for example large breeds can be more susceptible to joint problems. Extra weight unnecessary places undue stress on Injuries such ioints. trauma from an accident, everyday wear and tear from vigorous activity and other disorders such as hip or elbow dysplasia can also lead to joint problems.

Some of the signs to watch out for which may indicate your pet is suffering from arthritis can include: Difficulty jumping into the car, up on the furniture or climbing stairs.

Stiffness especially in the morning.

Difficulty getting up or lying

Reluctance to walk, play or chase the ball.

Sleeping or resting more. Excessively licking, chewing or grooming over

Trouble getting in and out of the litter box.

Matted or scruffy coat from not grooming well due to pain.

Don'tassumethatit's just old age or that nothing can be done. If your pet is showing any of these signs, arrange a check up with us. The earlier we detect a problem, the sooner your pet can be helped and the progression of arthritis can be slowed. There is plenty we can do to slow the progression of arthritis and help your pet live a more comfortable life. It is important we rule out any other problems first so a consultation with us is essential. We can then discuss a suitable treatment plan for your furry friend and if medication is necessary. In the meantime, here are a few things you can do at home to help make your

comfortable: pet more Keep your pet at a healthy weight. Weight reduction appropriate where can lessen the stress on damaged ioints and increase mobility. Provide a warm, dry and comfortable place to sleep in, up off the floor and away from draughts, good padding is essential. Reduce the number of stairs yourpetmustclimb, consider installing a non slip ramp. Exercise your pet moderation, gentle daily walks for dogs help keep the joints moving muscles toned, non weight bearing exercise such as swimming can also help.

Dead flowers can be clipped off (unless they produce seed heads for birds), and prune anything that looks a bit straggly. If you prune, check the clippings to see if anything will propagate, and try sticking it in a pot. Check pot plants to see if rootbound, maybe it's time to put these in the garden, or at least a bigger pot. Pots may also develop water repellent soil, so soak the entire pot in a barrow or bucket with a wetta soil product. With the place a bit tidier, it is easier to plan and see if there are any gaps to fill. For most ofus, there is always room to squeeze in one more plant!

#### Tools

If it's raining-and hopefully it will be a wet winterget out all your tools and give them a clean and oil and sharpen blades if you can and tighten screws.

Think about cleaning out the shed. Have a beer until the idea goes away! Check out the collection of empty pots and recycle any spares to your local nursery. Tidy up bags of potting mix and fertilizer bottles and any chemicals, making sure they are well labelled and out of the reachofanychildrenorpets.

#### Mulch

Hopefully your cleanup has produced a good pile of mulch. If you do get some in or use your own, there are some tips to make it work better for your plants. Over the summer. and soil existina mulch may have developed water repellent qualities. This can be checked if water runs off, doesn't soak in very well or forms a pond on the surface. There are various types of soil wetting agents. which can be sprayed on or watered in. Be careful if you have any ponds with fish or frogs, as these chemicals can hurt them.

Once this is done, then wait for a good rainfall before spreading mulch. You may also wish to scatter water crystals over the soil surface before mulching and rake them in if you can, as I have found water crystals attract snails. or at least make them little gastropods.



keep maximum moisture in the soil. A few handfuls of a fertiliser for native plants is also a good idea. Keep an eye out through Winter for interesting fungi that sprout in your mulch. Take a moment to admire your efforts and go and have a drink and put your feet up.

For the first time this year we have seen the rain start to fall and winter has now set in. While the last week of May was unseasonably warm and temperatures were above average, since then the rain has set in and looks like it will be here to stay for a while.


In April there was 110mm of rain for the month. This was 40mm above average and the highest monthly total since November last year, when we also had 110mm. There was 11 days of rain in April and the highest daily total was on the 9th, when there was 26mm of rain.


There was 42mm of rain

in May, this was down on average by 30mm. While it fell over 10 days, 8 of the days were under 5mm. The highest daily total was only 15mm and fell on the 22nd. The yearly total now sits at 268mm. This is 20mm below average for the year.

Melbourne's water storage has continued to drop over the last 2 months and it is now down to 71.4%. This is 1% less than the same time last year.


Up to Game 5, our season is well under way. On court successes have been many and we are looking forward to completing the end of the first round and then rematching against teams to gauge our improvement.


