

going to her son overseas. We will however have photos of this beautiful quilt.



Our group attended kinder for four hours, rather than their usual two and a half, and the time was carefully planned and divided up into a range of activities and experiences.

We began our session with an excursion to our local park, 'Bob Burgess Reserve'. This was a good learning opportunity for the children to see how organised we need to be before going on an excursion - there are lots of instructions and safety directions to follow. Once the children had their hats and sunscreen on, we delegatedadultstowalkwith each of the children. When we arrived, we discussed the 'safe areas' in which we were going to play.

The children were super excited about flying the kites they had made at kinder the previous week. There were many questions about how the kites stayed up in the air, why some flew higher than others and

why some stayed on the ground! There were several discussions regarding air and the way it fills and powers many different objects and machines. followed by a story about a very windy day. Finally we had our lovely picnic lunch, which was good practice for the children for when they come to kinder for much longer sessions next year. After a busy time at the park, we walked back to kinder with the help of our parents.

rituals and Creating traditionswithinthedynamic of the family unit will ensure the children grow up feeling grounded, secure and safe and experience a strong sense of family. Parents can provide opportunities for the family members to become equally invested seasonal tasks in the leading up to the day and share in the workload and in the enjoyment of Christmas. Families who bond together and share the family workload are not only invested in the spirit of Christmas but they bring that energy into their home and into their lives. Rituals such as selecting and decorating the Christmas treeandplacingdecorations around the house, planning the menu, and helping with the food preparation allow for everyone to engage interactively and to connect with the spirit of the season. Christmas is a special day for everyone to enjoy so delegate tasks to family members at an appropriate age level. crank up the Christmas music and embrace the festive season.

For the individuals who experience family tension from past difficulties, recognise the sensitive topics and triggers that create conflict. avoid meltdowns and plan strategies to reduce stress and increase positive outcomes. If necessary reduce time together or plan an exit strategy to enjoy the remainder of the day in another way or you may wish to plan your own vacation for the holiday season. Remember conflict and behavioural outbursts impact everyone in the room, so be mindful of others and diplomatic in your approach. Consider your needs and remain sensitive others. to

SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

PAYG INSTALMENTS

There were numerous changes made to Pay as you Go (PAYG) instalments from 1 July 2014. Formerly known as Provisional Tax. PAYG Instalments are charged on most net income other than Wages and Salaries, Capital Gains, ETP payments. More commonly, PAYG Instalments are charged on Business Income, Interest, Dividends, Rental income etc. The PAYG Instalments may be paid quarterly or annually depending on circumstances and are effectively income tax in advance then credited on income tax assessments after lodgement of an income tax return.

PAYG Instalment thresholds were increased on 1 July 2014 as follows:

-Minimum business and investment income now \$4,000

-Only payable if balance of assessment exceeds \$1,000

-Notional tax to exceed \$500

Many taxpayers will automatically exit the PAYG Instalment system even if registered for Goods and Service Tax.

Some taxpayers can continue to pay PAYG Instalments towards their end of year tax liability by contacting the Australian Taxation Office to voluntarily re-enter the system.

When Percival Allison's father Claude Harold Raine Allison made the move from Campbelltown, Tasmania to Benambra, Omeo, Victoria it was at the height of the gold rush in this region. The district was known as the toughest goldfield in Australia. He moved there, as did many young men, to make their fortune in mining for gold. It is a district of high plains so once the flash of gold mining had passed basically only the early cattlemen remained. Benambra to this day provides a spectacular 360 degree view of the stunning countryside. This is the place Claude met and married Ellen Mary Murphy at the Honnomuniie Methodist Church 1906. The Murphy family were well established long term residents of the Honnomunjie Station, Benambra and Omeo. Claude was 25 years old and now a farmer working with his new

Eldest son Percival Harold Allison was born, followed by another four children. Perc attended the local Omeo State School and on finishing school he joined the family in droving cattle in the high country including **Swifts** Creek. Tongio, Mossiface and Benambra. the early 1930's In Perc decided to move to Melbourne, there he worked as a gardener for the Syme family (Proprietor of The Age newspaper). The combination of Perc's skill as a horseman and his slight stature gave him the opportunity to ride as a jockey for racing stables at the Richmond Racecourse which was located between Bridge Road, Stawell Road and Westbank Terrace.

In 1934 he met Veronica BerreenfromPortMelbourne at a local dance hall. They courted for a number of years and then married in 1938. They had three sons John, Kevin and Gary.

After World War 2 they moved to Narre Warren North to sharefarm with the Rae family. They lived on the property 'The Grange' (now a quarry). John and Kevin attended Narre Warren North State School. Vera joined the Country Women's Association. Life on the farm was harsh so Perc moved on and obtained employment with the local council. He worked as a road worker, driver and other manual labourer positions for the council. The Allison family moved into a rental property on Boundary Road, Narre Warren North.

Prior to the 1900's the land we now know as Akoonah Park was Crown land and the Berwick Shire allocated the location for a pound to hold stray livestock, primarily cattle, horses and sheep. There were numerous holders of the position of Pound

Keeper prior to Perc Allison including John Dinney, A. Chalk, W. H. Foster, E. H. Sherriff and T. A. Dundas. The original dwelling was a wattle and daub hut on the banks of the Cardinia Creek. The creek provided plenty of water and the surrounding area of park area was leased for grazing by the Shire Council for a fee. Stray stock would be brought to the pound to be held in the purpose built yards until the owners their claimed wayward stock. If the owners failed to claim and pay the fee for impoundment, their animals were sold at the local stock market and the funds then

used by the Shire Council to maintain the property and feed the impounded animals. The Pound Keeper was responsible for the monthly report to Berwick Shire Council stating the costs. In 1950 Perc Allison was employed as the new Pound Keeper on the Princes Highway pound site at Beaconsfield. The local ranger was Bob Cooper, who was now responsible for rounding up the stray stock and delivering them to the pound. The animals were then advertised in the local weatherboard papers. A house was provided for the Pound Keeper near the oak tree that is still standing at Akoonah Park today. The tree is located near the function rooms. There was also a semicircular driveway from the highway which was located where the sheds now stand.

The pound was relocated and Perc's term as Pound Keeper ended with his retirement after many years' dedicated service to the Shire.

In the 1960's, after Perc's retirement, the family moved to 12 Railway Avenue, Beaconsfield.

From the time Perc and family moved into the district. Perc immersed himself in the numerous sporting activities held at the Berwick racecourse which was in Beaconsfield next to the hotel on the highway behind the old Public Hall. He held many positions including property steward, gate keeper and trainer for the local football club. Perc was the coach for the 1953 district final. Beaconsfield which won its first grand final and he was awarded a life membership in 1972. He was especially proud that all three of his sons played football for Beaconsfield and took up committee themselves. positions

John and Kevin never married; Gary married Ros Vines at St Marys Church, Dandenong. In 1973 Perc was most proud when his first grandchild, Scott, was born. Sadly his only granddaughter Kristi was born after his passing.

In 1976 Perc suffered a stroke and was placed in the Berwick Bush Nursing Hospital, he passed away in September that year. As Perc had been a well known and loved member of his local community his funeral was attended by a large number of family, friends and sporting associates.

In 1984 the sports oval near the Beaconsfield Emerald Road was named in his honour as the 'Perc Allison Oval'. He is remembered as the Little Man with the Big Voice.



BEACONSFIELD AVENUE OF HONOUR PLAQUES

New bronze plaques listing the names of 65 servicemen from Beaconsfield district who served in World War I have finally been displayed. The black poplar trees for the Avenue were planted in 1929 after the Roads Board completed the main road and the Beaconsfield **Progress** Association applied to have the trees planted in memory of these servicemen. Ada Armytage of Holm Park financed the Avenue of Honour Project.

Individual metal name plagues were made for each serviceman, but from all reports were never displayed near the trees for various reasons. After extensive research and as far as we know the plaques were stored for many years at Adamson's old hardware store in Woods These original Street. plaques are now in a fragile condition and stored at the City of Casey depot. The Beaconsfield Avenue Honour trees located on the nature strip,

either side of Old Princes Highway from Beaconsfield at Cardinia Creek bridge to the Berwick hill crest.

When the trees were first planted the whole area was known as the Shire of Berwick (established in 1868) and extended from Dandenong Creek to Bunyip. The City of Berwick and the Shire of Pakenham were formed on October 1st 1973 when the Shire of Berwick was split with the boundary being the Cardinia Creek. This then meant that the trees of Beaconsfield Avenue of Honour were

in the City of Berwick which later became the City of Casey in 1994. The late Tony Rushton located the original metal plaques at the City of Casey depot and he initiated the project to display the names of these 65 servicemen on new plaques in Beaconsfield.

The Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. decided to ensure that the new plaques were made and displayed. A Department of Veterans Affairs (Vic) grant was applied for in 2013 and research was undertaken by Penny Harris Jennings to be sure that the servicemen's names and service numbers were correct. The bronze plaques were made by Printpros

and installed by Cardinia Shire and City Wide. Thenew bronze plaques are installed at Beaconsfield Park on the corner of Beaconsfield Emerald Road and Old Princes Highway.

The Beaconsfield Park sign and gates entrance were originally built in 1939 as a memorial to soldiers in the Great War (WWI) and this memorial was donated by the Craven sisters who had the old post office prior to this time. The park and gateway were restored and refurbished in 2011 by Cardinia Shire with a Federal Government grant. This memorial site is a fitting place to display the new Avenue of Honour Plagues.

After 85 years the servicemen can finally be recognised with plaques in Beaconsfield.

Many people have worked to bring this project to fruition. the Department of Veteran Affairs (Vic) who provided the grant, the late Tony Rushton, Betty Whiteside. Graeme and Ann Taylor the Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. who oversaw the project, Penny Harris Jennings who researched all the servicemen's records, John Jennings who took photos, John Grbic who proofread the plaques, Printpros who made the plaques, Cardinia Shire and Cr Brett Owen, Cr Tania Baxter and Cr Leticia Wilmot, Neil Baker of City Wide who installed the plaques and many members of the community who shared their stories and memories. Thank you all.

A great project with a wonderful outcome, make sure you take a walk to Beaconsfield Parkto see this tribute to our Beaconsfield and district servicemen.







Pancreatitis In Pets

Christmas time is almost here again. Time for family, friends and lots of delicious food. Unfortunately, a lot of the food that we love to enjoy at Christmas can be harmful to our pets. These include fatty meats, chocolate, macadamias, raisins and grapes just to name a few.

A lot of pets are seen Christmas time around condition called for a pancreatitis. which is inflammation of the pancreas. Certain breeds of dogs like Miniature Schnauzers, Miniature Poodles, Cocker Spaniels, and Siamese cats are more likely to get this condition and it is most common in middle-aged and older dogs. Overweight animals are also more likely to get the disease. Often the trigger for the onset of pancreatitis is eating a fatty meal or overeating.

Animals with pancreatitis can develop a range of signs. Vomiting is very common in dogs but less common in cats. Dogs may show abdominal pain. Both cats and dogs may appear depressed not want to eat. In some cases they can develop icterus which is seen as vellow discolouration of the gums, the whites of the eyes and sometimes the skin. The signs can vary from mild to severe.

To diagnose pancreatitis your vet will likely need

to run a number of tests. A basic blood screen will usually be recommended initially. This may suggest pancreatitis but is not specific for it. However, this is required to determine any other conditions that may be affecting the pet and to assess for dehydration and other abnormalities that need to be corrected as part of treatment. If pancreatitis is suspected it is likely another blood test for dogs will also be run at the labthis is called the cPLI test. In some cases abdominal X-rays or ultrasound may also be required. especially in cats where a diagnosis of pancreatitis can be more complex.

Usually an animal with pancreatitis will need to be placed on a drip to rehydrate them and provide nutrition. They will need to stay with us in hospital for this. They may also receive some medications to control vomiting and pain. Sometimes if they are vomiting continuously food will be withheld, otherwise they will be offered small meals of bland food (like rice and small amounts of lean chicken). Once they are well enough to go

home this diet will usually be continued. Long term a low fat, lower protein prescription diet may be required to prevent the recurrence of signs. Overweight animals should also lose weight.

With prompt treatment the prognosis for recovery from pancreatitis is usually good so if your pet shows any of these signs please do not hesitate to contact us on 9769 8777 or the Animal Emergency Centre on 8795 7020.

TALKING WEATHER

by Nathan Boon

As the year draws to a close one thing has become clear, we are not going to achieve the record highs that we have over the last couple of years. We are on track to only have an average year. I don't think that we will even reach 900mm for the year. which if this is the case, it will be the first time since 2009 when we had 840mm. We have had 751mm this year so far and the average for Beaconsfield is 800mm. The other interesting fact is that we have only had a total of 85 days on which rain has fallen. This is also well down on the average which is 110.

October

In October there was 77mm of rain that fell in Beaconsfield. This fell on only 5 days. This is well below the average which is 11 days. The highest daily total was 30mm which fell on the 13th.

November

In November there again was average rainfall. There was only 67mm of rain and it fell over 6 days. The amazing thing was that 30mm of this total fell on the 15th. November over the past few years has been one of the wettest months so to only have 67mm was a bit of a surprise.


Melbourne water storage has started to drop slightly over the last 2 months. It is now at 78.4%.

The spring in Melbourne was the hottest in 160 years, which is since when tempertures were first recorded. The average daily temp was 2°c above normal.

Now is a timely reminder that going into summer and with predicted higher than average temperatures and lower than average rainfall, that it is a great time to save as much water as you can.




