
Council continues to progress the Holm Park reserve Master Plan. The two additional netball courts have been installed. A playground is in the planning stages and will be installed soon.

SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

ATO Data Matching

As part of the compliance program, the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) extensively uses data from external sources to match to income tax returns of taxpayers. This mostly involves matching of income as well as certain claims for deductions. In addition, it may highlight taxpayers who not meeting their requirement to lodge income tax returns.

Some of these data matching programs include the following: -Information received on electronic payments made to businesses through payments specialised system e.g. BPay, PayPal, EzyPay. The ATO collects details of merchant and biller transactions and settlement amounts matches amounts to income tax returns.

-A new Share Transactions data matching program will obtain details of transactions from some major Share Registries back to 20 September 1985. The ATO estimates that this will involve 95 million records of 1.2 million investors.

The records will electronically matched identify noncompliance of lodgement, reporting and payment obligations. In particular, the emphasis appears to relate to disclosures of Sales for Capital Gains Tax Purposes.

-A new Motor Vehicle data matching program will collect information from Vic Roads on individuals or businesses acquiring a vehicle costing \$10,000 or more in the 2011/12 2012/13 financial and vears. The data will be electronically matched particularly those involved in buying and selling of motor vehicles to meet income tax obligations. disclosure of income and also for non-lodgers.





The Walk provides information on the 32 servicemen from Emerald and surrounding areas who made the long journey to the Western Front and never returning.

The memorial at ANZAC Place in Emerald includes a beautifully wooden carved statue of the Unknown Soldier. This statue was created by local artist Ronnie Sexton who has done an outstanding job.

I am honoured to have been a part of the grants process made possible by the Coalition, which has delivered an aesthetically enhanced destination for commemoration and reflection in the Gembrook electorate.

This ANZAC centenary I encourage the community to visit both memorials and attend their local ANZAC services to remember those before us in our local community who fought so heroically for our future.

BEACONSFIELD AVENUE OF HONOUR PLAQUES

Speech given by G. Taylor, President B.P.A.

After World War I Beaconsfield placed an Honour Board in the local hall in 1916 adding the names of other soldiers who were connected to the District after the duration of the war. A Cenotaph was erected in 1920 on the corner of Woods Street and Old Princes Highway.

In an article in The Argus on 6 July 1928, it was noted that Beaconsfield Progress Association applied to the Roads Board for permission to plant an Avenue of Honour after the main road through Beaconsfield was completed in 1928.

Ada Armytage, a local philanthropist of Holm Park, Beaconsfield generously donated funds for the planting of the 123 Hybrid Black Poplars in 1929.

The Avenue of Trees has been well preserved and still stands proudly along the roadside from Beaconsfield at Cardinia Creek bridge to the hill crest of Berwick.

Individual metal name plates were made for each serviceman but for various reasons were never displayed near the trees. Extensive research has discovered that these

plates were found stored in Adamson's old Hardware Store in Woods Street then handed over in the 1980's to the City of Casey. After the split of Shire boundaries in 1973, Beaconsfield Avenue of Honour is now in the City of Casey.

The late Tony Rushton, a local Beaconsfield resident and invaluable member of the Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. located the original metal plates at the City of Casey Depot. He was responsible for initiating the project that would see the names of the 65 servicemen being displayed on new plaques within the Beaconsfield area; this is why we are here today.

With support from the Victorian Government and Victorian Veterans Council a 'Restoring Community War Memorials Grant' was received in 2013. Penny Harris Jennings undertook the research to ensure servicemen's names and service numbers were accurate. We are indebted to Penny for the many hours she spent ensuring accuracy the of the information, painstakingly checking service records and service numbers each serviceman.



Her commitment revealed some discrepancies in spelling of names on the old plates which have now been corrected to ensure the information displayed on the new plaques is correct.

The original Honour Board shows the names of 33 servicemen from the Beaconsfield District. Nine of these soldiers made the supreme sacrifice and their names are also listed on the Cenotaph.

The Avenue of Honour list includes these 33 servicemen from the Honour Board as well as 32 other servicemen from the Beaconsfield District or servicemen who had moved to the Beaconsfield District after the war. Servicemen from the Armytage family are also included on this list.


In 2014, new bronze plaques were made and installed here next to the Beaconsfield Park Sign. The sign and entrance gate were originally built in 1939 as a memorial to the soldiers who served in WW I, made possible by a generous donation from the Craven sisters of Beaconsfield.

Beaconsfield Park was beautified and the Gateway restored in 2011 by Cardinia Shire utilising a Federal Government Grant and contribution from Cardinia Shire, making the Park an excellent place to display the new Avenue of Honour plaques.

In 2014 the Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. with support from Victorian Government and Victorian Veterans Council received an 'Anzac Centenary Community Grant' to enable the publication of the booklet and digital material for the information and stories about the 65 servicemen whose names are on the plaques. Much of this information had been unavailable until the research was done for the new plaques.

On behalf of Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc., I sincerely thank everyone for attending today and for the many people who worked tirelessly to bring this project to fruition. The Plaques will be a lasting monument for 65 servicemen from Beaconsfield and District.

BEACONSFIELD AVENUE OF HONOUR 1914-1918 In 1928 Beaconsfield Progress Association applied to the Country Roads Board to plant the Avenue and funding was provided by Ada Armystage. Black poplar trees were planted in 1929 to honour the 65 servicemen from Beaconsfield and district who served in World War I. Metal nameplates were made and later found in storage, but in poor condition. In 2014 The Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. and Cardinia Shire Council erected bronze name plaques for the servicemen with funding provided by the State Government of Victoria. The trees can be viewed looking up the highway from Beaconsfield to Berwick.



Their Final Resting Place

Our Beaconsfield cenotaph, our Beaconsfield monument, was erected in 1920 and officially opened on Saturday March 13th, 1920 by General Brand.

This cenotaph honours the soldiers whose remains are entombed elsewhere. The nine soldiers listed made supreme sacrifice.

Last year, my husband Willem and I travelled to WW1 battlefields in the area of Ypres and Fromelles.

Each year we hear the the WW1 names of soldiers being read at the Beaconsfield Anzac Memorial Service and view their photos around the base of the cenotaph trying to ensure they are not forgotten.

To see these same names etched into stone thousands kilometres away, amongst the thousands of headstones in endless rows of fallen soldiers is one not easily forgotten. None of these men were closely related to us but the bond of our home town makes them family. stand at the base of each memorial and think about these men who never returned to smell the gum trees or watched the water flow in the Cardinia Creek, never again to share time with family and friends or join us to sing Advance Australia Fair, saddened us deeply.

After leaving Australia even today, it is remarkable how important the bond of a home town is.

When reading "A Valley in France", written by Elizabeth Whiteside, her father Clair Whiteside writes to his Mother on 26th February, 1916, I quote - " Have just come in from having an hour or more chat with a Beaconsfield group which has found my tent. Jim Adamson, Jack Harbour, Mick McNaughton with Bragg and young Perce Brown. Met Hugo A'Vard, a signaller in Tiveys, the square dinkums. He is looking jolly well



 has grown a fine ginger mow. Had a cup of cocoa together though auite possibly he would have better enjoyed a shandy."

Wehavevisited7gravesides of the nine WW1 men listed on the Beaconsfield cenotaph. At each we left a small but significant reminder of home, a gum leaf from the banks of the Cardinia Creek together with a photo of the creek with the caption - "Home among the Gum Trees". Thanks to the generosity of

Jason Woods office we also left a small Australian flag.

It is difficult to envisage the landscape of today as a battlefield of vesterday, but to stand on the ground where these men fought and fell. leaves a feeling of emptiness and emotion. The memories and feelings will stay with us forever.



FELINE LOWER URINARY TRACT DISEASE (FLUTD)

Urinary Lower Feline Tract Disease or FLUTD umbrella term is an for a number of lower urinary tract disorders, the most common being Feline Idiopathic Cystitis. Common signs of this are: * Painful or difficult urination * Prolonged and frequent attempts to urinate Bloody urine Urination outside the litter box or in unusual areas around the house. *Affected cats may also look like they are constipated. Feline Idiopathic Cystitis caused (FIC) is inflammation of the urinary tract and bladder. The cause of this inflammation is unknown, however, there are several risk factors which may contribute to this disease. Desexed male cats in particular are prone to this disorder. Increased weight, an indoor lifestyle and anxiety or stress are also risk factors and may contribute to FIC and in some cases this can lead urethral blockages. to

Urethral blockages may also be caused by crystals within the urine and mucuscrystal plugs in the urethra/ penis. As male cats have a narrower longer urethra, they tend to be more prone to this. Crystals in the urine multiple have causes. diet, including liver or kidney dysfunction or other metabolic disease. most common crystal found in blocked cats is struvite crystal. Struvite crystals are mainly caused by diet and a too alkaline pH of the urine. Bladder infections can also cause blockages and difficult urination. (Struvite crystals that can cause urinary blockages)

Treatment

Treatment for affected depends animals on of their the severity visit condition. On their to the veterinarian, they will have their bladder palpated to check the size of the bladder and if they have a complete or partial Your vet will blockage. also perform a urinalysis

to look for an infection in the bladder, and possibly x-rays to determine if there are stones or tumours.

Cats with bladder inflammation or a urinary infection are usually treated with a course of antibiotics and an anti-inflammatory. Cats with urethral blockages are admitted into hospital and will have a urinary catheter placed so that their bladder can be emptied. They will also be placed on IV fluids to correct any electrolyte imbalances or shock which can occur with this condition. Cats will often be kept in hospital until they are able to urinate by themselves. Often cats will be placed on medications such as smooth muscle relaxants or antiinflammatories to help ease inflammation in the bladder and allow the cat to pass urine more comfortably. However. for of FLUTD, types the most important form of prevention is management.


Management

The primary method of managing FLUTD is altering urine pH through dietary

modification. Studies have shown that a pH of 6.2-6.4 is best for managing struvite and calcium oxalate crystals. A prescription diet such as the Hill's c/d is often recommended. This diet increases the acidity of urine and also controls the quantity of magnesium and phosphorous in the diet.

The other key factor in management of FLUTD cats is increasing water intake. Increased water intake means that urine is more dilute, which reduces the chance of crystal formation, and there is more regular flushing of the bladder, which also reduces the crystal retention. There are several methods of increasing water intake. These include feeding canned food and increasing number of water bowls around the house. Environmental enrichment can reduce stress on the cat, which in turn reduces the chance of inflammation in the bladder. This can be done through water fountains. which also encourage cats to drink, feeding using toys making a 'treasure hunt' with food, playing with toys, and providing extra litter boxes. The rule of thumb for litter boxes is generally one more litter box than there are cats in the household. pheromone product called Feliway which comes in a spray or diffuser can also be used as an aid to reduce stress.

If you suspect your cat may be suffering from a urinary condition please contact the clinic as soon as possible because if left untreated it can lead to a serious medical emergency. For after hours advice please contact the Animal Emergency Centre in Hallam on 8795 7020.







TALKING WEATHER

by Nathan Boon

While it may have been a fairly dry start to the year there has been enough rain to at least achieve more than we did last year. Over the last 2 months have had a total 86mm of rain which slightly below the average, which is 98mm.

In February there was 60mm. This is above the average for the month which is 51mm. The rain fell over 6 days and the highest daily total was recorded on the 13th when we had half of the monthly

While it may have been a damp start to the year, it dried up in March. This should not be a surprise as the monthly average is the lowest for the year 46mm. While may seem low we only

total in one day of 30mm.

recorded 26mm for March. This was the lowest March total since 2008. This is also the lowest monthly total since April 2013 when there was only 19mm. The rain fell over 9 days and the highest daily total was only 6mm and that was recorded on the 4th.


The yearly total has risen to 139mm and we are on track for another vear over 800mm.

Melbourne water storage after the summer has dropped to 70.8% from 76% at the start of the year.

The other disappointing news is that the storage level is also lower than the same time as last year when it was 73.4%.
