In the past two months it has been extremely busy. but fulfilling, particularly due to events associated with the Anzac Centenary of the landing at Gallipoli.

There was a lot of interest and resultant publicity from the official opening of the Avenue of Honour Plaques and launch of the booklet and digital material on 13 March. This included local newspaper articles and Facebook numerous sites.

Our Anzac Memorial Service held on 19 April was well attended even with the bad weather forecast for the day. The feedback was that the service was something we could all be proud of and truly reflected on all servicemen and women who served for our country. Thanks to the many people involved who make this day possible

I attended the Dawn Anzac Day Service at Pakenham and also the re-opening of the Officer Memorial Gates and their Anzac Day Service on behalf of the Beaconsfield Progress Association Inc. Despite the wet weather, it was a great morning with fantastic hospitality. The project to relocate the gates will have lasting significance for the Officer community future generations.

On of behalf the Association I attended the 2015 Cardinia Shire Volunteers Reception. This function was well attended

reflecting the depth of the work done by many volunteers in the Shire. I also attended the Casey Cardinia History Day at Narre Warren Mechanics Institute Hall. It was very interesting and is held annually. Thanks to Margaret Boon and Ann Taylor for representing BPA with displays using our Toucan Display Boards.

In respect of Planning matters, the Application for a Bottle Shop at 1/55 Old Princes Hwy, Beaconsfield (Old Video Shop) was considered and refused at the Cardinia Shire Planning Meeting held on 4 May 2015. The development at 37 Woods Street may have breached permit conditions and clarification has been sought from Cardinia Shire Council.

After much discussion in the community, it was pleasing to hear that the State Government has announced that it will purchase land in Woods Street and will build a new fire station. is a good result for our Beaconsfield community as the expansion of the population desperately requires larger premises.

Our Association is always keen to represent residents and businesses as a voice of the community to all levels of government. Our Association is seeking more people to attend meetings. contribute and assist us in our representation of views on behalf of Beaconsfield.

We are coming up to the end of the financial year and ward councillors want to say a big thank you to those of you who attended the Rates Information Night held on May 10th and have made submissions to the upcoming Cardinia Shire Council budget.

Every year at this time Council invite ratepayers to get involved in the budget process. If you missed out and are interested to find out more can I suggest that you go to the Cardinia Shire website to check out the podcast and power point presentation of the rates evening; as well as download the draft budget from the website (www. cardinia.vic.gov.au/budget) and if you are on social media, try 'Liking' council's FaceBook page. If you want even more details about what's happening in your local community Ranges Ward Councillors have their own individual FaceBook pages as well as a joint one called 'Friends Of Ranges Ward'.

interesting night this year with the General Managers of the staff also giving a rundown on their responsibilities as well as the challenges for the shire in the future. So on this, we thought we might share some interesting facts with vou.

#### DID YOU KNOW .....?

- Cardinia's population in 2003 was 50,000 people; in 2013 was 80,000; and is forecast to be 175,000.
- That council provide many and varied services to the community including:

Food Safety inspections, Maternal and Child Health care, public toilets, Planning controls, School Crossings/ Supervisors, Home Care, parks maintenance, Community Health programs, Local laws compliance, public lighting, local roads maintenance, Community Facilities (like tennis, basketball and netball courts, football and rugby ovals, cricket and soccer pitches, walking and bike trails as well as your local swimming, baseball and athletics facilities)and

Emergency Management,

their maintenance, Libraries, Youth Services, footpath installations and maintenance, local halls and community centres, bridges, Children's Services (like kindergartens and immunisations), Strategic planning, Waste and Recycling management, Community Resilience.... And the list goes on and

- Local councils collect only 3.5c of every tax dollar raised nationally.
- The main reason for fluctuation in your rates notice is not the %rates increase imposed by council each year but the change in property valuations (as mandated under state law) completed by an independent valuer and checked by the Valuer General every 2 years. In fact if Council, in a revaluation year, decided not to increase rate revenue at all there would still be changes to rates on individual properties!
- Even though Council has delivered on its promise of reducing rate rises (Ranging from 5.5% to 4.25%), Council's debt level is forecast to reduce from \$64m to \$56m over the next four year period of the plan whilst still keeping the books in surplus so we can stay ahead of asset renewals.
- In fact, council are proposing to put over \$20M into Capital Works this next financial year alone, by reinvesting the surplus back into the community we have added nearly \$3M than previously forecast.
- The average rates paid in Cardinia are within \$100 of Casey, South Gippsland, Yarra Ranges and Baw Baw Shire's averages. Some slightly dearer some cheaper.

- New projects in the upcoming budget include Officer Secondary College stadium and Community Hub (\$2.2m total), Hill's Community Hub Redevelopment @ the Emerald Hall (\$1.5m), IYU Recreation Reserve (regional soccer facility) (\$1.4m), Lang Lang sporting facilities (\$1.3m), Arena kindergarten (\$1.2m), Emerald netball facility (\$1.1m) and Heatherbrae Recreation Reserve (\$1.0m).
- Council have received more New Lot applications (new developments) in the first 3/4 of this current financial year than in the total of the previous year. Cardinia is experiencing more than FOUR families moving into the shire every calendar day (yes you did not read that wrong!) and has been for some time but this is now

on the increase.

- There are 14,592 dogs registered in the shire and 3764 cats
- Council maintains a total of 619 klms of sealed roads, 874 klms of unsealed roads and 548 klms of pathways in this shire. As well as 1177ha of reserves, 94 playgrounds and 277 buildings.
- Cardinia have set a target to be carbon neutral by 2024 by the reduction of energy consumption and carbon emissions at a number of strategic Council buildings including Cardinia Life, Beaconsfield Community Complex, Cardinia Cultural Centre; as well as the conversion of existing decorative street lighting to energy efficient alternatives
- Illegal activity has a massive impact on our budget. In fact, Graffiti Removal cost \$110K

approximately in the 2014/15 year and Dumped Rubbish \$150K.

If you are a pensioner you can claim \$208 as a rebate off your rates.





## SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

## **FEDERAL BUDGET 2015**

The Federal Budget for the 2015/16 year recently presented by the Treasurer did not have many benefits for personal income tax payers. There was no proposed change to personal income tax rates. two methods of claiming motor vehicle expenses were removed, zone tax offsets restricted and HELP debt repayment obligations now extended to taxpayers residing and working overseas.

For Small Business taxpayers with an annual turnover of less than \$2 million there were a number of benefits including:

- 1. Company tax rate reduced by 1.5% to 28.5% from the 2015/2016 year.
- 2. Unincorporated Businesses e.g. Sole Traders are entitled to a 5% discount of income tax payable, capped at \$1,000 per individual from the 2015/16 year.
- Immediate write
   off of depreciable assets
   costing less than \$20,000

each including Motor Vehicles, Machinery and Equipment. This applies to purchases from 12 May 2015 to 30 June 2017.

- 4. Assets costing more than \$20,000 are placed in the Small Business Depreciation Pool and depreciated at 15% (part year) or 30% (full year). The Pool can be immediately deducted if the balance is less than \$20,000.
- 5. There will be an immediate deduction for a range of professional expenses associated with the set-up of a new business e.g. Professional legal and accounting fees from the 2015/16 year.
- 6. CGT Roll over relief has been extended for changes of legal structure from the 2016/17 year.

You should check with your Accountant for additional deductions available for Small Businesses with annual turnover of less than \$2 million.

## Tales From The Potting Bench... Australian Native Garden Mishaps And Marvels

Australian Native Bees
We at Wilson Botanic Park
APS were fortunate in
having Dr. Ken Walker do
a presentation on native
bees. It was a great night,
and inspired our members
to go and really look at their
gardens to see exactly what
all the critters are doing.

In 1822 the first European honey bee arrived. While this may be seen as another ecological disaster. the bee was essential. Without the honeybee, most crops fail due to lack of pollination. It is estimated that the honeybee provides Australia with millions of dollars of free pollination services. In the USA, this is a more managed process. with hives being transported pollination times. Australia has the most unique bee fauna in the world. We also have the smallest bee at 2.1 mm long, and most native bees are solitary, making the usual hive practices unworkable honev production. Native bees actually eat the pollen and nectar, as well as packing pollen into hairs on their bodies. They use the pollen collected to produce a pollen 'pudding' which is placed in a nest as food for the next Australian generation. plants rely on native bees for pollination, and in turn, native bees rely on Australian plants for food.

So how can you encourage these stingless helpers into your backyard? The first thing is to provide food and water, so plant natives and exotics that produce flowers throughout the spring and summer when the bees are active. I have had blue banded bees on fuchsias, rosemary and grevilleas. Provide some water, such as shallow bowls. Don't use chemical sprays. Lastly you may wish to provide shelter by building an insect hotel. There are plenty of ideas on the internet on design.

A bee hotel can be a few wooden blocks with holes 6 and 8mm drilled in them. Place in a sheltered area. Or a bundle of bamboo canes and spongey-centred branches. Another is to have a block of clay-sand mixture or bare soil for them to burrow into as well. Different bees prefer different nest materials,

so a mixture of types is probably worthwhile, as you may not be aware of all the bee visitors to your yard.

## Beaconsfield CFA, New Station for the Future

Beaconsfield CFA Station is tired, outdated, unsafe and cannot provide the space for the required training our professional volunteers need to protect the community.

Last month the Beaconsfield community supported the local volunteers in successfully lobbying the State Government to fund a new station for Beaconsfield.

In 2014 the Coalition Government committed to building a new station with improved training areas, larger meeting rooms, safer preparation areas and carparks for volunteers to safely leave their vehicles. However, the Andrews Government failed to match this commitment prior to the election, and in a letter to my office in March stated to the volunteers to work with the CFA management, not Government.

The Beaconsfield community rallied together to show their support for their local CFA volunteers with hundreds of residents signing the local petition and many turning up in a show of strength to tell Daniel Andrews Beaconsfield will not be quiet, build the station for the community.

The petition was tabled in Parliament; I raised the matter as one of urgency for the local community. The community had spoken and the Brigade's Captain Paul Hayes received the fantastic news that they would be receiving a new station.

Land was located in Woods St and negotiations started early 2014, however due to matters out of control of the seller and Government of the day could not be signed until April this year. The land in Woods St, opposite the current site that was built in 1944, will be the new home for Beaconsfield CFA.

This new site will improve safety for volunteers, provide better training to protect the community and provide a long term solution for the local area.

Congratulations to the local community, your voice was heard loud and clear. Thanks to the Beaconsfield Banner, local business groups, local ward Councillors, community representatives and more important our local Volunteers.




## BEACONSFIELD ANZAC MEMORIAL SERVICE

The Great War Association had a great display of information and memorabilia that was enjoyed by everyone. (Pictured below)




## The Officer Memorial Gates

Officer Memorial The Gates were re-opened on Anzac Day, Saturday 25 April 2015, and a large number of people gathered for this important event.



## **Rat Bait Your Pet**

Heading into winter we like to put rat bait pellets or blocks out around the house in common areas such as cupboards, the garage and under the house. However, we often forget that rat bait is very dangerous to our beloved cats and dogs. Despite many rat bait products marketing available "petas themselves friendly" it is important to remember that there is no such thing as nontoxic or pet-safe rat bait.

Both cats and dogs can be affected by ingesting rat bait directly or by ingesting rodents which have ingested rat bait. It is a condition to be taken seriously and early diagnosis and treatment lifesaving. may prove

So why would our pets even want to eat rat bait? Rat bait products come in a pellet or block form and can look very similar to their regular dry food. It is often formulated with other food products such as rice, oats and grains. While ingredients aimed at attracting rats, they unfortunately also attract other animals too.

There are two major types of rat bait; older products with the active ingredient Warfarin, which have a short duration of action and require ingestion over a long period of time to be fatal, and newer products with the active ingredient Brodifacoum, which have a long duration of action and a single dose may prove fatal. Regardless product what consumed, both are very dangerous to your pet. Rat bait acts as an anticoagulant (prevents the blood from clotting) by depleting the body's supply of vitamin Vitamin K is a fat soluble vitamin which is essential in the formation of clotting agents in the blood stream.

It can take anywhere from 1-5 days after ingestion for signs of toxicity to begin. A lot of the time, the first symptoms of rat bait poisoning are just unexplained fatigue, or the pet is just not acting normally. Indications of poisoning are associated with bleeding and can range from very subtle signs such as pin point bruising on the gums to frank bleeding from anywhere that doesn't stop, unexplained bruising, blood in the faeces, vomit or urine, coughing or other problems. respiratory


If you have witnessed or suspect your pet may have eaten rat bait the most important thing

a vet straight away. If your pet has recently ingested it the vet will make them vomit to stop any further poison from being absorbed into their system. Further treatment can vary and largely depends on the severity of the toxicity and timing of ingestion. In all cases of rat bait ingestion blood samples will need to be taken for clotting tests and to assess for anemia. Treatment may be as simple as giving vitamin K tablets for 4-6 weeks or may require more intensive treatment such as blood transfusions hospitalisation. some cases even with the most intensive treatment some animals may die.

Many factors influence the outcome of a pet that has eaten rat bait, including the amount consumed, the health status of your pet, but most importantly how soon your pet is attended to and treatment implemented. If you suspect that your pet has eaten rat bait, don'thesitateandcontact the closest veterinarian as soon as possible!







## **TALKING WEATHER**

by Nathan Boon

We have seen only slightly more rain this year as we had to the same point at the end of May last year. To me, the summer we had, did not seem as hot as we have had in the past but as we move into winter we hopefully will see the rain start to fall.

In April we had 72mm of rain that fell over 12 days. The highest daily total we recorded was on Tuesday the 7th with 21mm of rain. This was above the monthly average that is 67mm.

In May there was 83mm for the month, this fell over a record of 17 days. The highest daily total was 16mm on the 12th. This has taken the yearly total up to 294mm which is above last year to the same time. This would put us on track to have

between 850mm and 900mm for the year.


I was looking at the data and the wettest day this year is the 13th day of each month. There has been 62mm of rainfall on each of these days so far this year. The next highest is 33mm on the 7th day of each month.

Our water storage is still falling and as we head in to winter we should start to see a rise from July. It is at 69.4% and at the same time last year it was 71.9%. It should rise over the coming months so that by October we are again around the 80% capacity.

The AGM also brought about significant changes in our Executive and Committee.




