The Booklet is also available from the Beaconsfield Community Complex, Berwick Mechanics Institute Library and the National Trust Shop in Berwick.

We have received a Grant of \$10,000 from Federal GovernmentDepartmentof Veterans Affairs. The Grant is for a digital display, book and launch. It will record names, military history and life stories for the service people from Beaconsfield.



#### Glismann Road Development Plan

Council has developed a revised Development Plan (master plan) in response to the submissions received during the public exhibition of the Draft Development Plan dated 3rd November 2014. The revised Development Plan is presently again on public exhibition. Council invites residents and owners of the affected land to review

#### Holm Park Reserve Playground

A new playground has been built adjacent to the netball courts at Holm Park Reserve. The playground features swings, slides and a climbing net. The playground was funded by Council at a cost of \$60,000 and is identified in the Holm Park Reserve

Master Plan and in the recently adopted Cardinia Shire Play Space Strategy.

# Holm Park Reserve Netball Lighting

Council have worked with the Beaconsfield Netball Club to install lighting on the 2 new netball courts at Holm Park Reserve. The lighting will allow the club to utilise all 4 courts for training.

#### Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve Tennis Court

Council have been working Beaconsfield with the Tennis Club to convert the old asphalt netball court at the reserve into a new synthetic grass court with new fencing floodlighting. The court was completed in June 2015 at total cost of approx. \$56,000, with the tennis club committing \$25,000 and the remaining \$31,000 provided Council. See page 33.

### Community Capital Works And Major Equipment Grants Program

Beaconsfield groups recently shared in council's Community Capital Works Major Equipment Grants program. These projects add much value to our community and would not be possible without volunteers who devote many hours to managing these projects from start finish. Beaconsfield Kindergarten received a grant to extend their existing verandah. Also the Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve Committee of Management received grant to purchase mower to maintain the turf cricket pitch.

lighting inside and outside the facility. The centre's lighting consumption has been reduced by approximately half. The facility is being considered for a solar electricity system in the future to continue to decrease its energy demand and costs.

Cat Protection Society, Assistance Dogs, Friends of the Helmeted Honeyeater, International Fund for Animal Welfare and recently the Dolphin Research Institute. addition despite no formal scientific background, Viv likes to keep her challenged mind by being the Animal Welfare Representative on the Animal Ethics Committees Medical Monash

Centre, Monash School of Biological Sciences, and the Australian Synchrotron. She believes that she is making a difference to the lives of research animals

As a community member regular involvement includes Emerald Ladies Probus, Caring Women's Selby Group. CFA. Dandenong Ranges Feeding Group of the CFA, and the Emerald Uniting Church Opportunity Shop. She also supports the Stroke Foundation, Fred Hollows Foundation, Alola [East Timor] and OXFAM.

On an individual basis Viv is willing to assist people and animals in need such as minding pets while their owners are in hospital, rescuing and feeding wildlife and fostering injured and underage animals.

Viv has her own small flock of alpacas and shares her home with several rescue dogs including a retired Guide dog, and a very spoilt cat. As she frequently says "There is always room for one more".





# SNIPPETS FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

# SINGLE TOUCH PAYROLL

The Government has announced its intention to introduce from 1 July 2016, electronic simplification of tax and superannuation reporting obligations through "Single Touch Payroll".

Under this system, employers will be required electronically report payroll and superannuation information to the at the time employees are paid using Standard Business Reporting enabled software. The system will also streamline tax file number declarations and super choice forms for new employees and cut red tape notifying superannuation funds and Government Agencies employee when employment. ceases

The Single Touch Payroll will require appropriate payroll software to administer the system.

From an employer's view the system will require on time reporting and immediate payment of the PAYG withholding and Superannuation. This will bring forward the timing of these payments which may create cash flow issues. For employees, the risk of not remitting these payments is significantly reduced and contributions paid to Super Funds earlier.

Consultations are taking place for transitional arrangements, minimising implementation and compliance costs and staggering start dates for different sized businesses. The Single Touch Payroll reporting obligations will significantly change the administration and payment of tax superannuation reporting obligations.

# Jason Wood Fights for Beaconsfield Interchange

Recently I've been getting a lot of feedback on how difficult it is to manage poor traffic flows in our area. What's not so affectionately referred to as the "Monash Carpark" is one of the most commonly cited problems with record peak hour travel times growing regularly in and out of the CBD from the outer south-east on a daily basis. In response to this, I am now fighting for an additional two lanes on the Monash Freeway from the South Gippsland Freeway split outbound, and an additional two lanes inbound until the South Gippsland Freeway merge.

However I recognise that this is not the only necessary roads project we need in our community – we need to make travel

between our local hubs easier so that we can enable local employment and business growth.

To develop this, I am also pushing for Beaconsfield Interchange connection Soldiers to Road. The connection of O'Shea Road from Soldiers Road to the M1 Freeway Beaconsfield Interchange would open up a new connection between Casey and Cardinia, as well as providing a parallel eastwest route to the Monash Freeway for travellers heading from Beaconsfield, Officer and Pakenham through Hampton Park the employment Dandenong areas of South and Kingston.

These vital road projects

need to be completed if we are to grow as a community and to provide employment opportunities to the next generation of our communities.

# Beaconsfield Football Club-125 Years In The Making

125 years ago on the 21st April 1890, at a public meeting held at Gippsland Gissing's Hotel, Beaconsfield (now the Central Hotel), it was agreed to form a football club. A team representing the town of Beaconsfield played a number matches that year, the first against Cranbourne on the 14th June 1890. This was held at the Beaconsfield ground. which was located in the centre of the racetrack adjacent to the Gippsland Hotel on the Princes Hwy. Cranbourne won that initial match 3.9 to 1.6 and the Beaconsfield team for that game was captained by Mr W Keating. The initial club secretary was Mr Mangen and the president Mr L.L.Smith M.P. In this initial game the team is referred to as the Yellow and Black men and the newspaper reports on the female supporters wearing these colours to support their team. A well known district name in the original Beaconsfield team was an Adamson and many of that family were represented in the football team during the first 70 years of the club's history.

report from the Dandenong Advertiser of June 1890 as follows -"Lower Beaconsfield Town notes - Dandenong Advertiser June 12th 1890 Next Saturday is going to be a gala day. The members of the local football club have challenged the Cranbourne boys to a friendly game to open the season of the Beaconsfield team. After the match the locals have invited the Cranbourneites to partake in a dinner at the Gippsland hotel. The affair is being looked forward to by all the people up here as the great event of the year, and the hon. Secretary, Mr. Mangen, is leaving no stone unturned to make the affair a great success. This is the first football club that has been established up here. and most of the players are novices at the game, and there is no doubt that those

who have the good fortune to be present on Saturday will enjoy a pleasant day's fun at the instance of the yellow and black. There is one thing certain the field umpire will have a merry time of it. I hope, however, that the day will be fine, and that a friendly repast will send them home in good "spirits". What price free kicks? One of the residents says that it's 100 to nil Cranbourne wins."


An article from the Dandenong Advertiser on July 10th 1890 under the heading Lower Beaconsfield Notes reflects growth of the town which now featured, a hotel, a school and a football team.

"Lower Beaconsfield is now possessed of a general store, bootmaker's shop, hotel, milliner's shop, carpenter and builder, State School, and blacksmith's shop, but there are yet two more DESIDERATUMS – a bakery and butcher's shop. Now the former is a

want which we have been labouring under for some time, and it is a strange thing that some enterprising man has not started a business before now. It was your journal, Mr Editor, that advised a blacksmith and a bootmaker to start, and they have both done well, and the same opening remains for a baker and a butcher. There are really good premises for a butchering business. which could be obtained in easy terms from the proprietor, and I am quite sure that if these two trades came into our midst they would receive the hearty support of the residents. and would be encouraged in their undertaking. Now is the appointed time. The railway contract will soon be let, and look at the quantity of men that will need to be supplied with these two products. Let us express the hope that some enterprising tradesmen may read this paragraph and profit thereby."

Beaconsfield then went onto play Berwick and Pakenham, and had return matches against these three clubs during 1890.

The club did not win any of these "friendly" matches during this initial season. Details are very sketchy after this, but photos of Beaconsfield teams of 1909, 1911, 1923 & 1931 indicate that the club was competing during these early years. The 1909 team photo shows a number of the players wearing jumpers with a star in the centre and the team photo has the heading Beaconsfield Stars.

At this time the club's home groundwaslocatedjusteast of the Central Hotel with the racecourse bordering it. After a recess during the war years, the club reformed in 1947 as Officer-Beaconsfield, competing in the Dandenong & District Football Association. In 1948 it reverted to the Beaconsfield Football Club and a couple of years later moved grounds to its recent location at Perc Allison oval next to the Cardinia Creek.

Beaconsfield achieved its first premiership in 1953 when it defeated Keysborough in the B grade Grand Final under captain-coach Mick Mears. In 1954 Beaconsfield was a foundation member of the South West Gippsland Football League, along Rythdale-Cardinia, with Cranbourne. Berwick, Tooradin-Dalmore, Narre-Hallam and Officer. It is interesting to note that in the initial year, the season only lasted from May1st to the Grand Final on September 4th and a membership ticket at Beaconsfield was 10s (ten shillings).

Beaconsfield struggled in the early years but became a powerhouse in the 70's under legendary coach Jim Read, with premierships in 1974, 1980 & 81. In 1993 the club moved to the country atmosphere of the West Gippsland League Football incorporated their U/15 & U/17 teams along with the revived Netball club into a busy Family Saturday. Theclubenjoyedimmediate success at Reserves and Junior team level but it had to wait until 1999 for their initial Senior premiership Gippsland West in Russell under coach, Rowe. It was followed up with another Senior premiership in 2001 when coached by Leigh Clifford. club also won The Reserves, three five U/17's & three U/15 premierships during this eight year period in the West Gippsland League.

A major VCFL restructure saw Beaconsfield join the Mornington Peninsula Nepean League in 2002 and senior premierships were achieved in 2003/2004

under Leigh Clifford, as part of the Peninsula division. The club then became part of the Casey Cardinia Division which resembles the area and clubs covered under the former South West Gippsland League, and won its first premiership in that division with the U/18's team in 2006.

A most memorable and emotional day in the club's history was the final match at Perc Allison oval on August 18th 2012 which the saw the locals victorious over Doveton in the "famous" Beacy mud to seal a finals spot.

The new era of Beaconsfield came on the 13th April 2013 when Beaconsfield defeated Berwick in front of a packed crowd at the new state of the art facility iust up the road at Holm Park Rd recreation reserve. This was the culmination of many years work and effort from so many determined Beaconsfield people along council with local and government assistance. This move has seen the facility open to & being utilised by the wider local community and the club

continues to grow and prosper. On field in 2013 the club hosted the preliminary final as well making that game against Cranbourne while in 2014 the team again hosted finals matches. In a wonderful finish to the season Beaconsfield their inaugural opponent Cranbourne in a grand final for the very first time and came out victorious for their ninth senior premiership

The local league is now the South East Football League with Beaconsfield part of one of the fastest growing areas in Australia. This is reflected in the growth

of the Beaconsfield club as we now have 4 teams in the Senior competition -Seniors, Reserves, U/19's & U/18's. There 23 teams in the South East Junior competition including our Youth girls teams, as well as 4 Super Rules teams, plus 13 netball teams all under the Beaconsfield name. In our proud 125th year Beaconsfield FC have grown from being part of a small country town with a new school, a hotel and a couple of shops to being one of the biggest sporting clubs across Australia.


#### Club Colours the initial match

In the initial match the Beaconsfield team was referred to as the Yellow and Black men but there is no description or evidence of the jumper design. The 1909 team photo shows a number of the players wearing jumpers a star in the centre and the team photo has the heading Beaconsfield Stars. A picture of young Beaconsfield footballers from the same era also shows them with jumpers with the star on them. The team photos from the 1920's shows the players wearing a dark jumper with a sash but the colours are unknown. In the 1931 team photo the players are in a tri coloured striped jumper. I


In the late 1940's the club iumper was a royal blue with a gold Vee, and by the premiership year of 1953 this had changed to royal blue jumper with a yellow BFC monogram. It then became royal blue and gold vertical stripes in the mid 1950's. The club changed to the Tiger's black with gold sash in 1965 when Richmond made two sets available as part of a player transfer deal. This stayed as the uniform for the rest of the club's time in the South West Gippsland FL.

The uniform had to change again when entering the West Gippsland League in 1993 and the club reverted to the royal blue and gold vertical stripes. The most recent change occurred in 2000 with the Navy, Gold & White West Coast Eagles jumper being adopted.

# "The Life and Times of a Vet"

At the Beaconsfield Vet we have decided to take a change from the advice we often give people about looking after your pets in this article and substitute it with some tales from past experiences. By now you know if you need our help you know you can find us on 9769 8777. If you don't need our help, sit back and enjoy the tale. There are more to come.

Those of you who have been following the Beaconsfield Banner for over 10 years may recall this story, but it's one of my favourites.

A long time ago, when I was a new Vet to the large animal side (cows and horses etc) of things I was sent out to a cow with an abscess on the side of her face. These aren't uncommon occurrences as grass seeds often cause the issue, but as a newer graduate and a new member to the practice I was nervous. I had just

started work in a country town, having moved from a mixed practice (small and large ie dogs, cats, cows and horses) and I had to try and prove myself. I recall visiting a property in the first week or so owned by a long time generation of farmers. I had to help with a calving at about 10pm, and after half an hour or so in the beautifully cold mud and rain, out appeared a healthy calf. After unsticking myself from the mud and other stuff, I stood up and smiled at the farmer. His response was "Good job, in another 20 years you will be a local". In all honesty, I was already questioning why I was there, let alone in 20 years' time.

Things progressed well over the next few months and I was starting to be "requested" by some clients. I was feeling more comfortable knowing that it was only 19 years until I became a local and I had

a handle on some of the issues I would encounter.

Then the day finally arrived when I was accepted into the fold. A cow had an abscess on the side of her face and it needed draining. In Veterinary terms this was an easy job, and despite the 50km drive to get to the property. I was first to volunteer. As a newbie, I went through all the possibilities as to the cause on the drive there, even though it all seemed straight forward from the phone call. A lump has appeared on the check of a cow and it had been there for 4-5 days. All it needed was a quick lance from a scalpel blade and it would be another successful outcome to improve my standing as a vet in the country.

When I arrived at the property, the farmer already had the cow in the crush and its head was in a halter, so the cheek

was turned facing me. As I walked towards it. there was a 5-10cm lump on the side of the cow's face, very typical in size and feel for an abscess. I was convinced it was an abscess. I retrieved the necessary equipment from my car and as I was about to cut down on it to lance it for some unknown reason to me one of my lecturer's voices came into my head, "Work it up thoroughly". I have no idea why this happened, still don't to this day, it was a small soft perfectly formed abscess, and it needed to be lanced.

Instead, I took a needle from the box and placed it into the abscess, expecting to see pus, yep pus. Every Vet's dream. But no, no pus and just a weird "swishing" sound. I was confused, the farmer was too so I decided to have a feel inside the cow's mouth. I reached in and found not an abscess but ...

The idea to set up the



# TALKING WEATHER


The last 2 months have seen a stark contrast in weather in Beaconsfield. At the time of writing this, Winter has finally arrived and the wet and cold weather have set in.

Often I talk about new records for Beaconsfield and again in June there was one but this one is not one that I like to talk about. With only 20mm of rain for the month it was the driest June since 2006 when there was only 14mm. The rain fell over 10 days and half of the monthly total 10mm fell was on the 9th.

July was a different story and finally the cold weather set in and the rain, hail and well nearly snow fell in Beaconsfield. There was 93mm of rain and it fell over 17 days. The highest daily total was recorded on the 12th when there was 21mm of rain. In July, the coldest temperature was recorded in the town for a very long time. When for 2 nights in a row it dropped below 0°. I have never seen it like this before when it caused open puddles to freeze. A truly magical sight to see. July was 20mm above average and this resulted in the yearly total to climb to 407mm. We are still on track for an average year of around 800mm.


The water storage has climbed to 70.6%. This is below what it was to the same time as last year when it was at 78.9%.

So for now stay dry and warm as winter rolls on and the warmer weather of Spring is just around the corner.


