- Brett Owen:
  - Beaconsfield Cardinia Structure Plan just one adjustment is being made, the heights of the buildings will not change.
  - The Glissman Road draft was released last night by the council, the residents are to have a say on the draft.
  - Lorna from the Council is coming to the April meeting to talk about the Glisman Road Development Plan.
  - A draft plan for O'Neil Road, will propose alignments, path adjustments, parking for the playground etc.
  - As the skate park will cost \$270k, the community and residents are heavily involved in the design that they want.
  - Mountain Boarding the council are still looking into this.
