President's Report

Welcome to this 2019 Winter edition of the Beaconsfield Banner. I hope you enjoy reading the Banner which continues to inform residents on what is happening. The Banner is available on our BPA Website www.beaconsfield.org.au and printed copies are available from a number of local businesses including the Beaconsfield Post Office.

The Beaconsfield Anzac Memorial Service conducted by our Association was held on Sunday 21 April. Despite the date falling during Easter and School Holidays the service went ahead and was well attended. Thanks to everyone involved. See separate article for details.

The Interactive Touchscreen for the Beaconsfield Honour Board and World War 1 Soldiers is complete and operational. The Touchscreen was used after the Anzac Memorial Service and was popular particularly by members of the Luke family. The Touchscreen was also used on Harmony Day held by Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Centre.

In recent years, our Association has advocated for improvements to traffic intersections in Beaconsfield. On behalf of the Commonwealth Government, Jason Wood MP committed \$18 million for upgrades to a number of intersections. These include Old Princes Hwy intersections at O'Neil Rd, Beaconsfield Ave/Glismann Rd. and Brunt/Whiteside Rd. We look forward to these intersections being improved for safety and traffic flow.

The State and Federal Governments are reviewing upgrades to be done to the Beaconsfield Railway Station. This includes Platform Shelters, extra car spaces and possible additional entry/exit point to the platform.

Melbourne Water is undertaking a Dam Safety Upgrade Project for Beaconsfield Reservoir. Meetings and Community Information Sessions have been held with interested groups and residents to discuss options. See separate article for details.

As many Candidates were unavailable, the Meet the Candidates Forum planned to be held on 7 May was cancelled. Our Association will continue to run Forums for Federal, State and Local Government Elections if there is sufficient interest.

Beaconsfield Progress Assoc. Inc. is the voice of the community and is always willing to advocate on township matters to Councils, Government and Government Authorities. Meetings are held on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at the Beaconsfield

Community Complex commencing at 7.30pm. Your attendance and input is welcome.

Beaconsfield Reservoir Refurbishment

Beaconsfield Reservoir was constructed in 1918 to provide a reliable water supply to the Mornington Peninsula. Water was fed from Tarago via an Aqueduct to Beaconsfield Reservoir. The water supply ceased use after being disconnected in the early 1990s. To manage the Dam and Infrastructure and ensure safety of surrounding areas, Melbourne Water needs to undertake works to minimise any possible risks posed by the Dam. Refurbishment of the Dam provides an opportunity to enhance the ecological values of the Beaconsfield Nature Conservation Reserve while improving the Dam embankment.



Public Meetings have been held and also Public Information Sessions were held by Melbourne Water. The two preferred options are to either:

- 1.Reduce the water level and dam crest height minimising dam wall risk.
- 2.Safety Upgrade of existing dam wall at current water level.

The Safety Upgrade option 2 cost is greater and there will only be minimal amenities provided. The partial decommissioning option 1 will cost less and there will be more amenities provided. Amenities proposed include provision of boardwalks, steel creek crossing,

viewing platforms, walking trails, expansive indigenous wetlands and grasses, bird hides and recreation activities.

The Feedback received is being considered by Melbourne Water the owners responsible for the Dam and related Infrastructure and also by DELWP the owner responsible for the Beaconsfield Nature Conservation Reserve. It is hoped that the Reservoir and Conservation Reserve will be available in the future for use and enjoyment by residents and the wider community.

Beaconsfield Comfort Station



Beaconsfield Comfort Station / Public Toilet

The Beaconsfield Comfort Station (public toilet) on the south side of the Old Princes Highway has reopened after a recent council upgrade. We thank residents for their patience during the works. The upgrade included replacement of fittings, fixtures, new flooring, wall tiles, lighting, and an upgrade to external finishes.

Council has also been working with shopping centre management to ensure that the toilet amenities adjacent to Woolworths continue to be made available to the public during shopping hours. Council's public toilet is located further away from the shopping centre and while it still has good public use, council acknowledges the community spirit of management in making this toilet available for residents and customers.

Kindergarten registrations

Families are encouraged to register for 2020 kindergarten places by 5pm, Friday 28 June 2019, for first round offers. Kindergarten is a play-based learning program that builds children's confidence, enhances their social and language skills, expands their physical abilities and prepares them for schooling.

Cardinia Shire Council provides a central registration service for both three-year-old and four-year-old community kindergarten programs offered in its facilities.

The four-year-old kindergarten program is partially funded by the Victorian Government for up to 15-hours per week for eligible children who are four years-old on or before 30 April in the year they attend kindergarten. Additionally, other subsidies may be available depending on different criteria.

The three-year-old kindergarten program is not currently government funded and usually only includes sessions up to six hours per week. To register in a three-year-old program the child needs to have turned three years old by the time they will start the program.

We understand kindergarten is an important step for families so we've worked hard to simplify the registration process as much as possible. Parents can easily submit registrations online through the kindergarten portal

at kindergarten.cardinia.vic.gov.au

First round offers for four-year-old kindergarten will be emailed to parents from Monday 8 July 2019. Any registrations received after 5pm on Friday 28 June 2019 will be processed in later rounds and throughout the year as places become available or as required. Cardinia Shire Council will email first round offers for families for the 2020 three-year-old kindergarten places from Monday 5 August 2019.

Perc Allison Recreation Reserve Upgrade

Council has been successful in its application for \$500,000 through the Sport Australia Community Sport Infrastructure Grant Program to upgrade the existing change rooms at Perc Allison Recreation Reserve in Beaconsfield. Council is also contributing \$130,000 to this project bringing the total project funding to \$630,000. The project involves a retrofit of the existing change rooms to provide unisex facilities for players and umpires to support all genders, ages and abilities. Council will work with the clubs using this reserve and the Reserve Committee of Management to progress the project through detailed design and implementation.

Intersection Upgrades

Council has been successful in obtaining funding from the federal government to bring forward the delivery of critical intersection upgrades.

Eight intersections along the Princes Highway between Pakenham and Beaconsfield are to be upgraded, to address the congestion along the Princes Highway and improve safety for all road users.

The intersections proposed to be upgraded are:

- Beaconsfield Avenue/Glismann Road Intersection
- O'Neil Road Intersection
- Brunt Road/Whiteside Road Intersection
- Bayview Road Intersection
- Tivendale Road/Station Street Intersection
- McMullen Road Intersection
- Arena Parade Intersection
- Thewlis Road Intersection

The intersections will be upgraded separately and staggered to attempt to minimise the traffic impact to the area. Planning works is already underway to enable construction works to commence soon.

Kenilworth Avenue



In response to resident concerns, Kenilworth Avenue has been temporarily closed to through-traffic. Short-term measures have been implemented under the Freeway overpass to close through-traffic. This will encourage road users to use the surrounding sealed road network and significantly reduce the amount of traffic using Kenilworth Avenue as a thoroughfare.

Council continues to broker a way forward between the developer and contractor to have Kenilworth Avenue constructed as soon as possible. Council is unable to advise of a recommencement date for construction works as this is between the developer and contractor to determine.

Council understands residents' frustrations and we remain committed to continuing advocating until construction recommences on Kenilworth Avenue.



Honour Board & Mr Edmund Luke

In 1910 Edmund Luke purchased the property that is now known as "Montuna" Golf Club and Driving Range at Beaconsfield/ Guys Hill. The Luke family settled into country life on the farm, building a home and establishing a large garden.

Mr Luke was the well accomplished photographic artist of "The Age" and "The Leader" newspaper.

In 1914 Britain declared war, Beaconsfield was a small country town with a population of 450, it was predominantly a farming, fruit growing and agricultural district. But as all small communities the powerful drive to serve "king and Country" was met with great enthusiasm, this included the Luke family.

By June 1915 many of the local young men had enlisted. The recruitment meeting held at the local hall on 19 July 1915 was "A most enthusiastic recruiting meeting" with "a large attendance and great interest was taken in the proceedings". In recognition of the admiration residents felt, the recruits were given seats on the platform and "honoured with three healthy cheers".

Mr Luke's own son Victor Mason Luke enlisted on 30 June 1915.

Various groups were formed to support the soldiers such as the Soldier's Farewell Committee. Members would keenly instigate fundraising occasions to generate funds, predominantly to give soldiers a gift on their departure such as a wristlet watch or binoculars.

In October 1915 the committee agreed for Edmund Luke to photograph each soldier and produce an Honour Board. Individual "flashlight" photos were taken of the recruits in uniform to form the Honour Board. The finished board had a grand unveiling in the local hall and was considered "a beautiful piece of work".

Originally there were 23 servicemen within the frame and later another 10 servicemen were added to the lower end of the frame.

There were nine soldiers who made the supreme sacrifice and this is indicated by the star on their photograph.

The Honour Board was proudly displayed in the Beaconsfield Public Hall until the hall was demolished in 1970 to allow for the widening of the Princes Highway, the main road to Gippsland.

The Honour Board was relocated to the Beaconsfield Upper RSL for safekeeping while Beaconsfield awaited a new community centre to display the board.

In 1999, a replica Honour Board was produced to display in the original Beaconsfield Community Centre. When the new Beaconsfield Community Centre was completed in 2004 the original Honour Board was returned to Beaconsfield and the replica is now at the Beaconsfield Upper RSL. The Beaconsfield Honour Board is now displayed in a purpose-built display case at the centre.




