President's Report

Welcome to this 2019 Spring edition of the Beaconsfield Banner. I hope you enjoy reading the Banner which continues to inform residents on what is happening. The Banner is available on our BPA Website www.beaconsfield.org.au and printed copies are available from a number of local businesses including the Beaconsfield Post Office.

The township of Beaconsfield was saddened by the fire that substantially destroyed the complex of shops in Old Princes Highway near Cardinia Creek. The businesses affected were established for many years. The responses by the emergency services especially by Beaconsfield CFA is much appreciated.

At the July, 2019 BPA Meeting, Brad Battin MP Liberal State Member for Gembrook was the guest speaker. He discussed many local issues affecting Beaconsfield and answered questions. If you have any State Government issues you would like to discuss, please contact the local member direct. His contact details are included in the information on Political Representatives in the Beaconsfield Banner.

Our Association continues to make representations to Councils, State and Commonwealth Governments on local issues. In recent months, we have again advocated for a reduction of the 80 kmph speed limit currently existing in some sections of the Old Princes Highway to 70 kmph to have a uniform speed limit applying to all sections of the Old Princes Highway in Beaconsfield. We note that some of our previous suggestions have been implemented at the Old Princes Highway and O'Neil Rd intersection including keep clear sign and improved line markings. We have reported the poor state of the footpath on the west side of Woods Street. There are broken sections of the concrete path and poor lighting. We look forward to repairs being done.

Amendment C238 Glismann Road Development and Development Contributions Plan was passed at the August Cardinia Shire Council Meeting. Consultations are continuing with residents and any other affected or interested parties. Anyone interested should have discussions with Cardinia Shire Council Planning staff to discuss their views on the Glismann Road Plan.

The Applications by our Association for 2019/2020 Festival and Events Grants for the Australia Day Picnic and Movie Night and also the Beaconsfield Anzac Memorial Service were approved but for lesser amounts than were claimed. We are working on how best to run these Events in 2020 and considering ways to meeting revised budget expenditure. Beaconsfield Progress Assoc. Inc. is the voice of the community and is always willing to advocate on township matters. We have some projects planned and also projects proposed and we welcome visitors to our meetings and new members to further the work being undertaken to benefit Beaconsfield. Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month at the Beaconsfield Community Complex commencing at 7.30pm and finishing at 9pm.

Princes Highway intersection upgrades

Council has obtained federal government funding towards upgrading eight intersections along Princes Highway, including Glismann Road and O' Neil Road. This funding will supplement Council funds to ensure the delivery of these intersection upgrades over the coming years. Council is engaging with consultants to progress the functional design of these intersections and then detailed designs. Once detailed designs are complete, council will then be at a stage to tender the works for construction.

Playground Renewal – Panorama Estate

Council is working with the community on plans for a new play space on Tantallon Boulevard/Hammerwood Green, Beaconsfield. The basic and insufficient existing playground will be removed and a new play space will be installed most likely adjacent to the basketball court. Council has budgeted \$65,000 for the project.

Community consultation has commenced with 4-yearold kindergarten students from the Beaconsfield Children's Hub. The children have shared their ideas on what they would enjoy seeing at the playground. Council will return to the centre shortly to further develop these ideas.

In the last election, I committed a record Federal funding for local projects, which would not only create local jobs, but also would upgrade old facilities and create new hubs. Below is a snap shot of some local projects, which I have delivered with the community or are in the planning stage ranging from major roads upgrade to sporting projects.

I understand that our success and prowess as a sporting nation begins with grassroots sports, which is why I focused the investment on local grassroots sporting facilities such as:

• Beaconsfield Netball Club received \$16,000 for a new Electronic Scoreboard.

• Beaconsfield Football Club received \$9000 for new football nets.

• Beaconsfield Recreation Reserve (Cricket Club, Scouts, Junior Football Club) received \$500,000.

• Upper Beaconsfield Scouts received \$9500 to upgrade minor capital works (kitchen and for new carpet).

• Upper Beaconsfield Cricket Club/ Scouts received \$300,000 to upgrade old changing rooms, together with improved facilities for female users, spectators, social room and toilets/kitchen.

• Beaconsfield Officer Scouts received \$300,000 for hall upgrades, extend existing storage space and to include a disabled bathroom.

I have long campaigned to make the Beaconsfield Interchange and the extension of O'Shea Road project a reality, which would greatly benefit residents in the southeast. Finally, the work starts next year, however, the money was committed back in 2016 to the State Government and I share my frustration that work has not started yet! The new Beaconsfield Interchange will also facilitate Minta City development. This is an IT and advanced manufacturing employment precinct, which is destined to bring 10,000 new jobs to our local area.

\$15 million would go towards Beaconsfield Train Station for getting people off the roads and onto trains. This investment was about getting people home sooner and safer. The Commuter Car Park Fund will enable the building of up to 500 car parking spaces.

I have been fighting for extra funding to help reduce congestion on local roads and improve safety.

That's why I am very pleased to have secured \$17.8 million of funding for upgrades to 8 intersections (Beaconsfield Avenue, O'Neil Road, Brunt Road, Bayview Road, Tivendale Road, McMullen Road, Arena Parade and Thewlis Road) on the Princes Highway from Beaconsfield to Pakenham. O'Neil Road and Bayview Road intersections are now out for tender and detailed design consultation.

There is always more work to do to make your area the best we possibly can. That's why I would appreciate your support to ensure I can continue to deliver on behalf of residents in Beaconsfield and Upper Beaconsfield, as well as the whole of La Trobe electorate.

This financial year, Beaconsfield Fire Brigade responded to 309 fire calls. This was an increase of 50 fire calls from the previous year.

The Brigade has attended two significant structure fires this month:

A house fire at officer with sadly a fatality and significant loss to the structure.

- The first of these fires was located at the shops opposite the hotel. This was a major incident with significant risk as the fire spread rapidly and damaged all the shops in the complex. The following appliances and brigades attended

- Pakenham pumper

- Dandenong Ladder platform
- Frankston Breathing apparatus unit

This was a major operation with both sides of the highway blocked as water was required from hydrants

on both sides of the highway. This fire required the Brigade to be in attendance for approximately 7 hours. The captain would like to thank the community for their understanding and behaviour whilst they were affected by the traffic diversions during the shop fire incident.

The Brigade would like to thank everyone who supports and donates money to the Brigade, in particular, the Berwick and Pakenham Op Shops, and Insight Accounting, who contribute a substantial amount to the Brigade each year. These funds are used to purchase essential equipment used by the Brigade. The Brigade has just purchased a Thermal Imaging Camera at a cost of \$12,000 with funds donated this year. This camera will allow crews to work safely within structure fires, assisting members with vision through the smoke, for searching and allowing members to read the temperature of the environment they are entering.

The Brigade is continually looking for members to assist during the daytime hours from 0900-1700hrs. Luke; Victor Mason Beaconsfield Soldier

Victor Mason Luke was the fourth child of Edmund Thomas May Luke and his wife Ida Florence (Pearson) Luke.

While Victor was born in Ballarat East in 1891 the family soon moved to Malvern, where Mr Luke built an attractive home in Normanby Road, Caulfield for the family.

Victor spent his formative years living in Caulfield before the family moved to Beaconsfield prior to the First World War.

The Luke family were all educated and well accomplished in their chosen vocations. On completion of school Victor became a sign-writer and painter.

In 1915 Victor enlisted for the First World War and embarked to serve on 29 September 1915.

The Age, Saturday 3 June 1916.

GERMANS "A BIT OF A NUISANCE."

Lance-Corporal Victor Luke, in a letter to his mother at Beaconstield, gives an account of his doings in France. He states that the unit to which he is attached was given a nice position, and was getting settled down, when the Germans shelled them out. It was most exciting, and, fortunately, no one was hurt. The Germans were "a bit of a nuisance," as snipers played round the Australian position night and day, and the machine guns were act-The enemy on one occasion burnt ive. their hut down, and then bombarded them with shrapnel in a hope of getting them as they ran for shelter, but they all "hopped" safely into a dug out. In the scramble he lost all he possessed, including his watch and curios.

Victor returned from the war to Australia on 10 June 1919 and was discharged on 2 August 1919.

After the war Victor married Nellie Elizabeth Merritt in 1919, they lived in Kew but continued to own property at Montuna Park, Beaconsfield. They had five children Verna Dorothy, Kelvin Victor, Austyn Edmund, Margaret and Trevor John. In September 1939 Great Britain, with France declared war against Germany. Victor enlisted for the Second World War on 26 August 1942 serving one year and 87 days. Following in their father's footsteps the eldest three children joined the Australian forces for World War 2, Verna, Kelvin and Austyn.

Victor's commitment to duty changed direction when in 1945 he was elected a Councillor for the ward of the City of Kew, Victoria and in 1950/51 he served as the Mayor of Kew.

After a tireless life dedicated to family, community and country Victor passed away in March of 1966.

Beaconsfield Kindergarten

At Beaconsfield Kindergarten, we pride ourselves on working with our families and community to establish strong foundations for children's lifelong learning. Each year we ask families for their input on ways that we can support them, particularly relating to any parenting topics that they are interested in learning more about. Our staff and committee then work together to provide opportunities for families to participate in development opportunities on a variety of topics.

In 2019 we have been able to provide three information sessions for families and educators. During Term 2 we hosted a session presented by Triple P – Positive Parenting Program. The aim of the program was to provide parents with strategies to:

- raise happy, confident kids
- guide kids' behaviour
- set rules and routines that everyone follows
- get on well with their kids and argue less
- balance work and family with less stress.



Movement

On Wednesday 31 July, Beaconsfield Kindergarten hosted a session presented by Robyn Papworth from Play.Move.Improve. Robyn spoke with us about the importance of movement and exercise in children's learning, about the different stages of development through a child's early years, and also how this then relates to their ongoing learning, health and wellbeing. For example, did you know that tummy time is important throughout life, not just for babies?! And that moving your head up and down and side to side regularly (through play or even just by picking a book up from the floor) helps to develop the vestibular system, which contributes to a sense of balance and spatial orientation? We have already begun using some of Robyn's tips and tricks with our kindergarten children, including this fun movement activity at our Woods St service where children work on many important motor skills such as walking heel to toe, crossing their feet over and standing on one foot – not forgetting that very important skill of waiting patiently for their turn! Children at our O'Neil Rd service are also participating in similar activities.



Kids Roar

Our third parent session was presented by Annemarie from KidsROAR and provided parents with an introduction to the KidsROAR protective behaviours program that all of our 4yo groups participated in the following week. KidsROAR aims to empower children to feel safe through awareness and education. We learnt that:

- it's important to help children identity their emotions, and the signals that their body gives when they are feeling those emotions
- children should be taught the proper names for their body parts
- there is a difference between 'safe' and 'unsafe' secrets
- all children should be able to identify 'safe' adults that they can speak to about anything that might be troubling them.

Beaconsfield Kindergarten would like to thank the providers of these sessions, the parents and educators who attended, and the Pakenham Racing Club for providing a grant to fund the KidsROAR program.

Potter's Corner



Spring is nearly here and before you know it everything will be growing like crazy.

It's time now to get your rhubarb corms in, adding lots of compost and mulching well. Rhubarb is a hungry plant and performs beautifully with a good quality fertiliser at least 3 times per year and kept moist in summer.

It's that time of year where we are thinking of spring vegetable planting but just that bit early for seedlings, seeds however can be started now. Being that inbetween period from harvesting your winter veggies and planting your spring veggies, it's a great time to compost and lime up your beds ready for spring seedlings.

Tomatoes are on the radar and will be available in stores soon but unless you have a greenhouse or are willing to bring them in each night then I would suggest holding off until September or even October as it's just too cold until then. Remember we can still have a frost or two in Spring!

Beautiful Clematis is a must have creeping plant that is in flower from Spring through summer depending on varieties. September is a great time to purchase Jackmanii Clematis with its massive flowers that produce for months. Full sun is great but it will be happy if it's well mulched and roots kept cool.

Weeping cherries and other ornamentals are now budding up for that early spring explosion so make sure you have your new plants in by now and enjoy the display. Stone fruit should have been sprayed by now with a sulphur spray for that hideous leaf curl, so unfortunately if you have not done it this year then it is now too late. Pulling off any affected leaves and collecting them from the ground will help with the spread of the fungus. If this is done then it should not affect any fruit you should get. Just keep up the plant hygiene as best you can and remember next winter to be prepared, once rose buds just form, its time to spray. Happy spring planting!
