Welcome to all members and visitors to tonight's meeting. We do not have a guest speaker tonight so there is plenty of time for general discussion. Any thoughts for future Speakers would be appreciated.

I review Cardinia Shire Council meeting Agendas and I also review Planning Applications each week. I have not attended any Cardinia Shire Meetings since our last BPA Meeting. I read Agendas principally for matters affecting Beaconsfield. I do not believe that there were any significant Meeting matters or Planning Applications affecting Beaconsfield.

The Autumn Edition of the Beaconsfield Banner was finalised, printed and distributed by 14 March. Thanks to everyone involved in producing the Beaconsfield Banner and in particular, Editor Andrew Brewster. It is anticipated that the Touchscreen will be fully operational this week and used on Harmony Day to be run by Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Centre this Saturday. We have been busy planning the Anzac Memorial Service to be held on 21 April , 2019. The Traffic Management Plan, Site Plan, and Risk Assessment are prepared by Australian Traffic Control. The Quote from ATC for\$1,074.50 plus GST is higher than previously due to the service being held on a Public Holiday over Easter. Pakenham Police may attend and we are working with Beaconsfield Fire Brigade and others who have participated in previous years. Pakenham Police have raised security issues and use of barriers particularly on Old Princes Hwy. I plan to contact ATC later this week to resolve security requirements. Plans for the Beaconsfield Anzac Memorial Service will be discussed at this meeting. Hopefully the weather will be fine and the day a great success.
