## **President's Report**



Welcome to this Autumn edition of the Beaconsfield Banner. The Banner is available on our BPA website <u>www.beaconsfield.org.au</u> and printed copies are available in the town at

businesses including the Beaconsfield Post Office and Beaconsfield Pharmacy.

The most significant local issue we are dealing with is the Level Crossing Removal Project (LXRP) and, in particular, the Level Crossing at Station Street, Beaconsfield. Work on the Project continues at a fast rate, and at times works are happening 24/7. In particular, works have commenced on the overpass which will significantly change the landscape. The Level Crossing Removal Project team have held an online information session on 13 February to provide an update on the road bridge and a construction update. Unfortunately many locals could not participate due to loss of power after the storm that afternoon. Local Upper House MP Michael Galea hosted a Community Reference Group for the Station Street, Beaconsfield Project. The Reference Group raised several matters affecting the area, residents, traffic flow, etc. There will be further meetings arranged by LXRP and the Reference Group. If any residents want to have input on this project please contact us.

The Beaconsfield ANZAC Memorial Service will be held on Sunday 21 April commencing at 2pm. As previously the service will be held at the Beaconsfield War Memorial. Prior to the service, there will be a march from the Fire Station along Woods Street. Cardinia Shire Council will be undertaking landscape works at Bonette Reserve. The Tender for the works has been awarded to Blue Peak Constructions Pty Ltd. Works are due to be completed prior to the date of the ANZAC Memorial Service .

The latest information on the future accessibility of the Beaconsfield Nature Conservation Reserve is uncertain. Cardinia Environment Coalition, the current land managers of the Nature Conservation Reserve, have announced that they are not in a position to continue their role. We await further developments. The proposed refurbishment of the Beaconsfield Reservoir by Melbourne Water is unchanged.

Cardinia Shire Council Grants are now open for the 2024/2025 year and will close on 29 March, 2024. It is proposed that our Association will apply for a Grant for next year's Beaconsfield ANZAC Memorial Service and a Grant of up to \$1,000 to purchase Christmas trees and decorations for Beaconsfield.

The Beaconsfield Carols by the Creek was held on Sunday 17 December at Bob Burgess Reserve. The Carols were organised by Beaconsfield Baptist Church and BPA and was a wonderful community event. The weather was fine and the crowd of approx. 1200 enjoyed the family friendly event.



The Victorian Government Container Deposit Scheme has started in Beaconsfield. The Machine is located at Mitre 10 Beaconsfield. Community members receive 10 cents for each eligible can, carton or bottle they return. This is a great way to recycle instead of items ending up in land fill.

Our Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of each month except January and December and start at 7.30pm. Thanks to the Beaconsfield Neighbourhood Centre for their assistance in allowing us to use this venue. All local residents, business owners and others keen to be kept informed on matters predominately related to Beaconsfield are welcome to come to meetings.

Council anticipates the upgrade works will be completed by April 2024.

## Station St Beaconsfield Level Crossing Removal

The project is progressing with major concrete piling and bridge abutment works

well underway on both sides of the railway line and into the Melbourne Water catchment area.

The recent full closure of Kenilworth Avenue and the Beaconsfield Avenue underpass is complete, and both are reopened, with Kenilworth Avenue only in an Easterly direction which will remain for several months.

Council Officers are continuing to visit the site to ensure LXRP are following all their conditions and a recent spike in carparking overflows is also being investigated by Council Compliance Team.

A recent online Community update meeting was held where LXRP went through their most recent design updates and another meeting date will be announced by LXRP soon.



## Brunt Road Level Crossing Removal

Major concrete works are taking place on the bridge now with the preparation well underway for the future

tie into Brunt Rd, which will see traffic, pedestrians, and cyclists using the new bridge by mid-year.

An announcement on this timing is coming from LXRP very soon and the LXRP site compound entry has moved around into Pioneer Way in readiness for this.

The closure of Kenilworth Avenue to Brunt Road and its new connection to Copper Beech Road will be completed within the next 2 weeks and this has reduced construction traffic on Brunt Rd over the last week or so.

There are several other short closures of Janice St and Just Joey Drive for services relocations in the coming weeks and works notices have been sent out to all affected residents and LXRP will also be holding more community events in the coming months for further updates.

Residents are encouraged to sign up to the SMS service which provides updates on disruptions and closures in the area.

## Lighting Upgrade - Perc Allison Reserve Oval

In February, council awarded the tender for new sports field lighting at 5 reserves across the shire which included the Perc Allison Reserve's Oval.

During 2022 condition audits were undertaken for sports lighting infrastructure within the shire. The audits identified and ranked priority works across the recreation reserves and sports facilities. Where assets were determined to be a risk, they were made safe, and a cyclic program of design and replacement established.

The sports field lighting will be replaced with current generation LED, poles, wiring and supporting infrastructure.

I look forward to the much-needed lighting upgrade to support our local sporting clubs.

## Village Green Playground Renewal

As part of Council's annual playground renewal

program, Village Green playground on Stirling Circuit in Beaconsfield is being renewed. Village Green is located within the Panorama Estate in Beaconsfield and is within walking distance to the local childcare centre and Lifestyle community.

Late last year, residents were asked for their feedback on design options. Thanks to those residents who provided feedback on the design options for the playground renewal. The chosen design was option 4 and construction has commenced.

## **Beaconsfield CFA**



The brigade celebrates its 80th anniversary in March 2024 having been established in March 1944 following the devastating Black Friday Fires in 1939. Much has changed since then in terms of

members, equipment and the number and type of calls, but the commitment to serving the community remains strong.

The brigade has been busy attending 217 emergency calls since July 2023. A large number of calls are for alarms in hospitals, nursing homes and education facilities. Since the opening of the Princes Freeway/ O'Shea Road interchange, the brigade has also



regularly attended car accidents at this intersection. Take care when using this intersection and be vigilant to the actions of other drivers even if you have a green light! On Tuesday 13 February, the brigade along with other CFA crews supported the Emerald SES with clearing trees from roads following severe storms which saw over half a million homes lose power in Victoria. Having seen the storm impact at Emerald, Beaconsfield was very fortunate to avoid the brunt of the storms.

The brigade attended the Berwick Show on the weekend of 24 and 25 February along with Berwick and Upper Beaconsfield Fire Brigades to show the community some of our trucks, talk about what we do, and fire safety. A highlight was Berwick's original 1926 Buick fire truck on display which is being restored by the Berwick Fire Brigade. The brigade was proud to be awarded a second place ribbon for a trade display.

## **January Flooding in Beaconsfield**

The previous big flood of this magnitude in Beaconsfield was in Jan 2011. This was the last time that Soldiers Road was closed near the Beaconsfield Railway Station. This year, on January 8th following heavy rain, we again saw Soldiers Road closed, and over one metre of water was measured under the viaduct at Beaconsfield Station. There was also wide spread flooding at Akoonah Park and the footbridge at the tennis courts was completely cut off, with a raging torrent of water flowing down Cardinia Creek. This was quite an event for the town and there were many people roaming around to see the event for themselves.

Beaconsfield registered 61mm of rain on this day which was exacerbated by 20mm the day before causing the ground to already be saturated.

Beaconsfield Kindergarten has welcomed another cohort of children, who are all settling well into their new kindergarten environment. Our initial orientation program provided an opportunity for educators to support children in their transition to kindergarten, particularly in empowering each child to successfully part from their loved ones and enjoy their time at kinder.

The smaller groups that are offered during the orientation program support children as they begin to build their confidence and develop relationships with kindergarten staff and their peers. This is particularly important for children who are new to our service, especially our three-year-old groups. During this time, educators work on building trusting relationships with each child as they begin to learn about the children and establish routines and guidelines that are important for everybody to be able to contribute to and feel safe in a large group setting.

With the orientation program now over, we have continued our focus on belonging and community. Our community engagement has started with family nights at kinder for each of our 4yo group, and stay and play sessions for our 3yo groups. We decorated wooden animals for display at the Berwick Show, and some children were very proud to attend the Show and see their work on display in the community. During March we will be celebrating Harmony Day – a time to recognise our diversity and bring together Australians from all different backgrounds to show that we all belong.

## **Oh Christmas Tree**

As Beaconsfield residents embraced Christmas in their front yards, with lights flashing on fences and trees and blow-up characters waving to passersby, very little was acknowledged in public spaces like the shopping precinct and parks. Some time ago councils across many municipalities decided not to continue decorating public arenas, however, they do offer small grants to community organizations who chose to put in an effort to add some Christmas joy around the neighbourhood. These grants cutoff in March each year.

After reading several posts from residents in a local Facebook group, expressing their dismay that the town is not embracing the Christmas spirit, Beaconsfield Progress Association contacted council to see if we could set up a display safely with their approval. After numerous emails it was agreed by both parties to install a small Christmas tree display on the corner of Beaconsfield Emerald Road and Fieldstone Blvd. BPA were too late to ask for a grant from the council to pay for the display, however, it was decided BPA could afford four trees with lighting and bright decorations.

As December approached, council quickly installed four metal posts, so the Christmas trees remained upright. BPA chose the wettest day in December to install and decorate the trees. For three weeks, the trees endured rain, wind, and hail, often loosing their decorations, only to be replaced by kind passersby. The feedback BPA received was overwhelming with some residents posting photo's as they enjoyed the display.

We would like to express our gratitude to Samantha from council, for putting in the extra effort to ensure we could get our display up in a very short time. Also, a big thank you to Yolanda and Jackson for stopping and helping us through a difficult time.



## A Tribute to Rob Porter

Sadly, Rob Porter passed away on 25 December 2023.



Rob's commitment to the community of Officer was steadfast and absolute.

Rob's father, James Porter, arrived in Officer from Ireland in the 1930's. He was a bridge builder, employed by the Country Roads Board. James married local girl Jean Tivendale on 16 November 1935 at the Officer Union Church. They had four sons, Edward, George, Robert and Russell. All the boys attended Officer Primary School.

After completing Primary School Rob then went on to Dandenong Technical School serving his apprenticeship in Plumbing with Graham Edwards from Nar Nar Goon.

Rob won the Victorian Plumbing Top Apprenticeship of the year in 1962.

On completion of his apprenticeship Rob established

his own business, Porter Plumbing Service.

Rob loved sport, especially football. He played for the Officer Football Club, where he won best and fairest Award for the South West Gippsland League. Rob was thrilled when he had a season playing for Hawthorn Football Club.

In January 1966 Rob married his childhood sweetheart Carol Gilbert in the Officer Union Church. They built their home in Officer and had two sons, Geoffrey and Gavin.

Rob and Carol enjoyed being involved in the local community groups. Rob coached the Officer Football Club senior team, he was President of the Officer Football Club and for 51 years President of the Officer

Recreation Reserve Committee. He was awarded a life membership for both the Officer Football Club and the Cricket Club.

He was on many committees throughout his life including, Officer and District Community Association, the Officer Public Hall Committee, Officer Scouts and the Officer Union Church Committee.

Rob was nominated and won several community awards, the Cardinia Shire Stan Henwood Award 2015 and the Senior Citizen Award 2020.

Family, friends and the Officer community will be forever grateful to Rob, he gave his best and we are all the better for having known him.








## **Recycling in Beaconsfield**
