  - Melbourne Water are currently putting together their business plan for the Reservoir, with the contracts to be open and completed in 2022 and the Reservoir to be open to the public by 2023.
  - Melbourne Water does not want to leave the dam at 98.5 metres, with their preferred option at 94 metres.
